

Belmonte Repeats as Barbasol PBA Tournament of Champions Winner *Nationally-televised finals feature historic 300 game by Sean Rash*

INDIANAPOLIS (Feb. 15, 2015) – Australian two-handed player Jason Belmonte continued his astonishing run in Professional Bowlers Association major champions Sunday, successfully defending his title in the 50th anniversary Barbasol Professional Bowlers Association Tournament of Champions with a 232-214 victory over top qualifier Rhino Page of Orlando, Fla., at Woodland Bowl for his fifth major title in the past three years.

Belmonte, the No. 2 qualifier, struck on seven of his first eight shots to lock up his victory over Page, who failed to double until the eighth and ninth frames. In addition to winning his 12th career title, Belmonte earned his second \$50,000 check in two weeks. Last Sunday, he made bowling history by winning the United States Bowling Congress Masters, also a major championship, for a record third consecutive time.

Over the past four seasons, Belmonte has advanced to the television finals in 10 of 12 PBA major championships, winning five of them.

"I don't know what's going on, but I'm going to stay on the ride as long as I can," Belmonte said. "I can't believe it myself. The ball is striking and I'm throwing great shots.'

The 31-year-old Australian, already a leading con-

tender for a third consecutive PBA Player of the Year award, started slowly in his semifinal match against Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., who also made history by throwing the PBA's 25th nationally-televised 300 game in defeating Ryan Ciminelli, 300-214, in the second match of the day.

Belmonte fell behind in his match against Rash, striking once in the first five frames. But he made a key ball change and threw six strikes in a row to end Rash's title bid, 235-203. Rash's critical error was continued on page 9

MIKE DEVANEY is Top Citrus Belt Performer at USBC Masters

GREEN BAY, WI - Mike DeVaney is currently the Citrus Belt's top PBA player. His recent fourth place finish at the USBC Masters was by far the best PBA finish by a Citrus Belt bowler this year.

While Mike averaged 215 to finish 59th during the qualifying rounds he was able to make the television show as the third seed by having a 4 - 1 match play record, then winning the four man Eliminator Match.

During match play, Mike defeated Nathan Bohr. Perry Crowell, Austin Boulds and Chad Roberts before losing a close match to Jason Belmonte 594 - 603. Jason was the eventual tournament champion. During the Eliminator Match Mike outscored Pete Weber, Martin Larsen and Francois Valois. Mike's fourth place finish in the Masters tied his best finish in a Major Tournament. He was fourth in the 2001 US Open and the 2011 Masters. Mike has won two PBA National Titles.

DeVaney is currently bowling with MOTIV bowling balls and works for JIM MUR-TISHAW in the Fast Lanes Pro Shop at Cal Oaks Bowl in Murrieta.





The Perfect Game

DOWNEY — There is no magic wand you can wave to knock down a stubborn ten-pin. No mystic amulet exists to prevent those annoying "taps." Rabbits feet won't cure "snake-bite." Rub your ball until you're blue-in-the-face, but no genie will appear to help you convert a split. Eating Lucky Charms for breakfast won't guarantee lucky strikes that night. Spells won't work; prayers won't either.

Bowlers tend to be a superstitious lot, ever hopeful that "Body English" or some inanimate object will make a difference when they deliver important shots. Here's a news flash: Once that ball leaves your hand there is nothing you can do but watch. If you "choke" when the pressure's on, it isn't because you forgot to wear your lucky shirt. The real reason is lack of preparation.

All bowlers have weaknesses in their delivery; we're human. Eliminating those shortcomings is the key to improving your scores. The bottom line is this: You can't simply wish you could bowl better. Improving requires some effort, but the process isn't hard.

It may begin with changing the way you think about practice. For many bowlers that means rolling a few extra games, after all, practice makes perfect. Right? WRONG! Doug Weidman said it best, "Practice doesn't make perfect; practice makes permanent!" In other words, rolling a few more games cements both the skills AND the flaws in your approach. It doesn't improve them.

Improvement begins with identifying a specific flaw in your delivery, then learning how to fix it. Once that's done it's time to roll those extra games. Right? WRONG AGAIN!

Games are rolled for scores which are meaningless during practice. While trying anything new, your scores should be awful. You must practice one shot at a time until comfortable with any modification to your technique! Let the meter keep track of how many frames you've rolled.

But what if you don't have time to go out and roll those extra frames? What if money's a little too tight to afford that luxury? Does that mean you're just out of luck? Absolutely not!

The quality of practice time is more important than the amount. Let me explain. Prior to the start of competition, bowlers are allowed about five minutes of "shadow-bowling." THAT IS PRACTICE TIME! Make the most of it! Here's an effective routine:

Step 1: Warm up a few minutes before the machines are turned on. Stretch a little, swing your ball a few times and perform a few false slides along the foul lines to check for sticking problems. Don't waste valuable practice time doing these things.

Step 2: Once the pinsetters are turned on, ignore the pins. They're meaningless during warmups. Your first ball should be your standard shot at the pocket. No matter the result, the next two shots must be for a ten-pin, then a seven-pin. This sequence allows you to rehearse and read the condition across the lanes.

Step 3: Continue to ignore the pins standing before you. Spend the remainder of shadow-time working on the weakest part of your game. That may mean trying something new, or shooting only at a corner pin again and again, even when it isn't there or a full rack of pins is tempting you. This also develops discipline.

When competition begins, you'll be as ready as you can be. Right? Right! Practice time will be over. Right? WRONG.....AGAIN! Five minutes of shadows has changed the lane condition. Every first ball is now practice as you fine-tune your standard shot to match the ever-changing oil pattern. Get it? Good, because there's more.

Let's say that despite your best efforts, you come down with a case of the dreaded "snake-bite." You hit the pocket over and over but leave every split imaginable (we all have those nights). What do you do? Practice adjusting!

When your standard shot isn't working, change something! For example, you might move your stance closer to, or farther back from the foul line. If that doesn't work, you can try using a higher or lower push-away. All four of the basic bowling skills can be modified, but you must never change more than one at a time. That is critical to learning "cause-and-effect." Don't be afraid to fail. Success only comes to those who do. Let's move on.

When facing an impossible split like the 4-6 or 7-10, go for the pin that is harder for you to convert. That is practice, too. If you're in a close match, ignore that advice and go after the pin you are more likely to hit (close games are often won or lost by that one pin).

Finally, the third ball in the tenth frame can be used as a practice shot also, particularly if you feel the need to test a different line. Again, your decision to do this is determined by the margin by which you, or your team, are winning or losing.

Disclaimer: Practicing while competing is only acceptable when done to legitimately solve a bowling problem with the intent of improving your scores. It should never be used as an excuse to hold down your average. That's called "sandbagging" and is the greatest sin a bowler can commit.

To summarize, if you truly want higher scores, the only thing you can rely on is.....you. Improvement of your game can happen overnight but requires effective practice, patience, discipline and realistic expectations. Good practice = good bowling = good scoring = good memories.

NOTE: Long ago, a simple device was invented by the Lamex Company in Whiner,* New York. It's a bowling aid for anyone too lazy to put some effort into improving. It's called the "Cuse" and is becoming more popular than ever as bowlers turn to technology for higher scores. The Lamex-Cuse is particularly useful when a game is on the line and a single-pin spare is missed by the second shot in the tenth frame. Unfortunately, like a talisman many rely on, it has never worked either.



Bidwell, Jones Qualify to Compete in Pan Am Games




ARLINGTON, Texas - Devin Bidwell of Wichita, Kansas, and Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, South Carolina, will represent Team USA at the prestigious 2015 Pan American Games this July in Toronto.

The qualifying process was based on performance at the 2015 United States Bowling Congress Team USA Trials and the 2015 USBC Masters. The Team USA women's representatives will be decided after the 2015 USBC Queens in May.

Bidwell topped the standings with 1,630 points, while Jones was second with 1,620 points. Kamron Doyle of Brentwood, Tennessee, will be the first alternate, finishing third with 1,540 points.

Sixty percent of the qualifying points came from the Team USA Trials - 40 percent based on overall finish and 20 percent based on daily finish. The final 40 percent was based on performance at the Masters - 30 percent based on qualifying position and 10 percent based on final position in the bracket.

"Qualifying for the Pan American Games comes as a complete surprise because at the Masters, I was totally focused on that event," said Bidwell, who earned 1,260 points at the Team USA Tri-



als and 370 points at the Masters. "This is awesome because it's not only an opportunity to do what I love, it's for my country."

Jones picked up 1,200 points at the Team USA Trials and added 420 points at the Masters to earn his spot.

"I love wearing red, white and blue, so having the chance to represent Team USA again is a dream come true," Jones said. "The Pan American Games is one of the most prestigious events our sport has to offer, so I'm excited to have the opportunity to compete."

The Pan American Games are an Americas version of the Olympic Games which includes the Olympic program sports and others that are not part of the Olympics. The United States Olympic Committee has specific requirements for selecting players to compete in the event.

Two men and two women will represent Team USA at the event, which is considered the most important event in the four-year cycle of the Team USA bowling program. In order to represent the United States at the Pan American Games, athletes must be U.S. citizens and members of Team USA in 2015.


Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York, leads the women's qualifying points with 1,520 from Team USA Trials. Shannon Pluhowsky of Dayton, Ohio, is second with 1,300, while Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, New York, is third with 1,220.

The Queens will complete the women's qualifying process when it is held May 13-18 at The Ashwaubenon Bowling Alley in Green Bay, Wisconsin.

PBA Telecast of USBC Masters on ESPN Reaches More Than 3.5 Million Viewers

Ratings increase by 62 percent over last year's telecast

ARLINGTON, TX – The Professional Bowlers Association Tour telecast of the United States Bowling Congress Masters on ESPN was the most-watched cable sports program on Sunday, reaching more than 3.5 million viewers.

The telecast, which featured two-handed Australian bowler Jason Belmonte winning a historic third-straight Masters title, averaged 1.17 million viewers in the last quarter-hour of the telecast. The two-hour telecast averaged a 0.60 household U.S. rating representing a 62 percent increase versus the 2014 USBC Masters telecast.

"Viewership numbers for the PBA on ESPN have been very encouraging," PBA Commissioner Tom Clark said. "The USBC Masters was another historic, action-packed spectacular. Sports fans nationwide are tuning in which is great for our sponsors, players and the game. When more people see bowling on TV, more people go bowling, become interested in bowling, become inspired by the best."

The Masters telecast was part of a positive household U.S. ratings increase for the PBA on ESPN this year, up 20 percent year-over-year when compared to the 2013-14 season-to-date.

The television success comes following a partnership between PBA and USBC to include the USBC Masters as part of the PBA Tour schedule in 2015 and 2016. The event had previously been planned for late summer.

"We want to thank our great partners in Green Bay for the flexibility to host the USBC Masters in the prime of bowling season," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "The move ultimately benefited the PBA, the players and product manufacturers with tremendous national exposure. USBC is committed to making decisions in the best interest of the future for the sport and this is a prime example."

Belmonte became the first bowler in the sport's history to win the Masters three consecutive years. He won a drama-filled semifinal against Hall of Famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Missouri, before defeating AJ Johnson of Oswego, Illinois, for the title.

The USBC Masters drew a sold-out field of 336 of the best bowlers in the world and awarded more than \$250,000 in prize money.

leaving a 2-8-10 split in the eighth frame, which he was unable to convert.

"I made the ball change to a more aggressive surface and once I saw it go through the pins, I knew it was the right ball," Belmonte said. "I knew Sean was capable of striking a lot, so I didn't want to come out of this tournament saying I wish I had made the change. Sometimes you're put into a position where it's all or nothing, and that kind of brings the best out of people.³

Against Ciminelli, Rash became the first player to bowl to two nationally-televised 300 games in PBA Tour competition. It was only the second 300 game ever in the TOC finals and the first since Jack Biondollilo bowled the first nationally-televised perfect game in PBA history in the 1967 finals at the TOC's long-time former home, Riveria Lanes in Fairlawn, Ohio. Rash bowled his first televised 300 game in the Wolf Open in Shawnee, Okla., in 2014.






