IOWA-Though the debate over who is the best left-handed bowler on the Denny's PBA Tour will never end, Patrick Allen can lay stake to that claim for at least one week.

In a final round featuring the top three lefties currently on Tour, Allen captured his ninth career Denny's PBA Tour title and second this season with a 218-169 win over Parker Bohn III Sunday to win the 2007 Go RVing Classic at Thunderbowl.

Allen took advantage of some uncharacteristic mistakes by the 30-time titlist and PBA Hall of Famer Bohn, who missed a 8pin conversion in the 5th frame and left a 6-8 split and opened in the 8th frame to give the topseeded Allen the breaks he

As the top seed, Allen exacted some revenge in stepladder finals. The previous three times a top seed had won in the stepladder format, Allen was the victim in the title match including this season's 2007 Dick Weber Open where he fell to Jason Couch in the title match.

"Parker bowled a good game even tough he shot 170. He only missed the pocket twice, but that open in the 8th frame was the real momentum-swinger," Allen said. "Fortunately for me, I made a good ball change on the right lane and a marginal shot in the 9th carried and that was the difference.'

The fourth-seeded Bohn flagged the 7-pin in the 5th while Allen was working on a double. Allen threw his third consecutive strike in the 6th, but then made a crucial mistake of his own, leaving the 4-6-8-10 split and opening in the 7th. Bohn responded with a double but then left the 6-8 and opened, allowing Allen to clinch the match with a strike in the 9th frame.

The win was Allen's fourh in the last five events on the Chameleon pattern and fifth overall in his career.

Bohn averaged 249 in winning the first three matches to advance to the title match. He defeated second-seeded Jason Couch, who was looking for his third title of the season, 245-193, in the semifinal. Bohn also defeated third-seeded Riga Kalfas, 235-205, who was making his

first career TV appearance, and fifth-seeded Mike Edwards, 267-

Allen (Wesley Chapel, Fla.) took home \$25,000 for the win while Bohn (Jackson, N.J.) earned \$13,000 for second. Couch (Clermont, Fla.) took home \$6,500 for third, Kalfas (Florence, Ky.) earned \$5,500 for fourth while Edwards (Tulsa, Okla.) earned \$5,000 for fifth.

The Denny's PBA Tour heads to Parkersburg, W. Va., next week for the 2007 Bayer Classic at Emerson Lanes, Feb. 21-25. The live ESPN televised finals take place Sunday, Feb. 25, at 12:30 p.m. EST.






Special Olympics Part of USBC Open Championships Tradition for 17th Year

RENO—In what has become a United States Bowling Congress Open Championships tradition, the Special Olympics National Unified Bowling Tournament was conducted on the tournament lanes for the 17th time as a prelude to the opening of the 2007 USBC Open Championships.

Nearly 500 bowlers (124 four-players teams) representing 13 states competed in team and doubles competition Thursday and Friday at the National Bowling Stadium, where the Open Championships will kick off on Saturday.

Each team paired two Special Olympians with unified partners. The Special Olympics bowlers in this year's competition are 16 years of age and older and were accompanied by parents, friends and coaches. They competed for medals and ribbons in 21 average divisions in team and 43 doubles divisions.

"We're ecstatic," said Helena Schneider of Cincinnati, who with her 24-year-old daughter Jennifer earned a gold medal in doubles. "We've been bowling in Special Olympics competition for four years and to finally be able to come to the championships is a thrill for us. We're going to wear our medals proudly when we get back home to bowl league."

Bowling is becoming more and more popular with Special Olympics athletes according to Special Olympics Unified Tournament Director Marty Allen who has served in that post since 1991 in Toledo, Ohio.

"This event has really grown over the years," Allen said. "Bowling is a close second behind track and field in popularity, but it won't be long before it takes over the top spot because bowling is year round and it lasts for a lifetime.

"We always look forward to coming to Reno," Allen added. "The National Bowling Stadium is a tremendous facility. It's always a thrill for us and we are very appreciative of USBC enabling us to have our championships in such a great stadium setting."

This year's crop of Special Olympians represented Alabama, Arizona, Connecticut, Florida, Kentucky, Maryland,

RENO—It has been 30 years since the United States Bowling Congress Open Championships was first held in Reno, Nev., and the tournament's love affair with the Biggest Little City in the World continues in 2007 after the Open Championships kicked off Saturday at the National Bowling Stadium.

USBC Hall of Famer Jim Schroeder, dignitaries, The Twelve Irish Tenors, Olympic medal-winning rhythmic gymnast Maia Tabakova and 760 bowlers turned out for the opening day events, which included the traditional Mass Ball Shot Ceremony, a marriage proposal and the crowning of "Joe Bowler." Howard Babbitt of Millerton, N.Y., earned the distinction of Joe Bowler, a tradition that began in 1951, and rolled the ceremonial first ball, signifying the official start of the 2007 USBC Open Championships. The tournament will run for 135 consecutive days and more than 16,000 five-player teams are scheduled to compete before the tournament concludes

"Each year when I sit in the squad room, I hope they don't pick me," said Babbitt, who has bowled on opening day for 17 years and rolled a seven count to open the tournament. "But it was quite an amazing experience to be out there on the lanes wearing the cape and crown. I wasn't really nervous, but my thumb did stick a little bit."

Prior to the earlier squad, Cecil Whitehouse of Clarksville, Tenn., proposed to his girlfriend Maribel DeJesus and the couple shared the engagement with nearly 400 anxious bowlers.

"I've known that she was my soul mate since the day we first met three years ago," White-house said. "I was nervous because I've never been in that situation before, and it was an honor to do it on opening day at the Open Championships."



2007 USBC Junior **Gold Championships**

GREENDALE, Wis.—With a new format that allows for the largest field in the history of the event, the 2007 United States Bowling Congress Junior Gold Championships has reached ca-

pacity.
All 1,728 spots have been sold for the Junior Gold Championships, which will be held July 7-13 in Buffalo, N.Y. It is the second consecutive year the event has sold out and the third time in the

past four years.

The 2006 Junior Gold Championships in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., featured a sold-out field of 1,458 bowlers. In order to give even more bowlers an opportunity to compete, the format of the event was changed to extend qualifying by a day to allow for the addi-

tional competitors.
"Given the success of this event in the past, we decided to open it up to even more athletes and the response was enormous," said USBC Chief Officer of Tournaments and Events Roseann Kuhn. "USBC is committed to growing the sport on the youth level and this event is just another example of that commitment."

Held on USBC Sport Bowling lane conditions, the Junior Gold Championships, which is an individual competition, will feature bowlers from across the country. The competitors will battle for spots on USBC Junior Team USA as well as a record \$100,000 in

scholarship money.

The event will be held in three bowling centers in the Buffalo area. AMF Thruway Lanes will be the host center while competition will also take place at AMF Air-

port Lanes and Transit Lanes.
USBC Youth members who average 175 or better (boys) or 165 or better (girls) and who are members of the USBC Junior Gold program are eligible to qualify to advance to the Championships.


