SMART MAKES \$7 MILLION ALLOCATION, ADDITIONAL \$1 MILLION TO PELL GRANT MATCH

ARLINGTON, Texas – The United States Bowling Congress Scholarship Management and Account Reporting for Tenpins (SMART) program is making an investment earnings allocation of \$7 million to provide additional scholarships for youth bowlers in 2024.

The \$7 million allocation is consistent with funding provided in 2022 and 2023. This allocation matches the largest investment earnings allocation in SMART history. In addition to the earnings allocation, SMART is allocating an additional \$1 million to the SMART Pell Grant Match program.

Due to policies adopted in 2021, a portion of the allocation will immediately go to new scholarships for youth bowlers. SMART is progressively paying more benefits for students every year.

In 2023, SMART processed the largest total disbursements in program history, reaching \$11.4 million. Included in this allocation (approximate numbers):

\$2.55 million in bonus scholarships to the 6,344 active SMART Recipients. These are students who used SMART funds in 2023. Each student will immediately receive a new \$400 SMART

JEFF LEWEN Leads Team to PALA CASINO League Block Wins

TEMECULA – The PALA CASINO 620 Scratch League is the TOP LEAGUE in the Citrus Belt USBC southern tier and probably the TOP LEAGUE in the entire Association. No Question, Period!

The league has been around for decades starting at Brunswick Cal Oaks In Murrieta then moving to Trevi Lanes in Lake Elsinore until this season. The league moved to Temecula



Lanes this season and grew to 18 teams.

Over the past five seasons Jeff Lewen has led his teams to at least two league titles and a

ANTHONY SIMONSEN CLIMBS LADDER TO WIN PBA PETE WEBER MISSOURI CLASSIC

Simonsen wins four consecutive matches to claim 14th career PBA Tour title

Fifth-seeded Anthony Simonsen climbed Sunday afternoon's stepladder finals, defeating AJ Johnson, Matt Russo, EJ Tackett and top-seeded Bill O'Neill to win the PBA Pete Weber Missouri Classic.

With the win, Simonsen earned his 14th career PBA Tour title and the \$25,000 top prize.

On Friday, Simonsen threw the front-nine in the final game to punch his ticket to the finals. Following a pivotal strike, he tapped his wrist and said "too much time."

"I really had nothing to lose that last game, and that was the motto today," Simonsen said. "I barely made the show. I was on house money. Sometimes all it takes is just sneaking through until you get that opportunity."



Though he felt he had nothing to lose, Simonsen concocted a gameplan to conquer the 45-foot Dragon oil pattern. His command over lanes 29-30 at Enterprise Park Lanes in Springfield, Mo. proved to be the difference.

"On TV shows, I like using balls that I'm comfortable with," Simonsen said. "I decided I was going to shuffle through

a couple of those until hopefully we made the lanes dry enough to the right to throw that Attention Star. I think my gameplan today was really solid and I executed it to a tee."

In the opening match, Simonsen distanced himself from Johnson with a three-bagger in the middle of the match. Meanwhile, Johnson split three times on the

right lane — the same blunder that cost him in last week's PBA Illinois Classic title match.

Johnson advanced to face the lone lefty in Russo, who now lives in the St. Louis area and bowls regularly with Weber during the off-season.

After a strong start, Russo left a pocket 7-10 in the fifth frame

Pete Weber Retires — For The Second Time

I first met Pete Weber during AMF's negotiations to purchase Dick Weber Lanes from his father in Florissant, Mo., still home to most of the Weber clan. Pete was already a PBA champion at the time with a couple of titles under his belt. He was an intense young man that had heard of my 300 and 800 exploits on the east and west coasts and was ready to duke it out on the lanes when we first met that day.

But once he learned that my personality was

slightly above that of a delegate to a pacifists convention, and that I had no interest in defending my "valor" against one of the greatest bowlers in the history of bowling, we became fast friends in a mutual admiration that has continued to this day.

In an article that I penned in May of 2021 ("Pete Weber — Still Doing It His Way"), I remarked about the hospitality extended to me by all of the Weber house-

Why Bowl in Leagues? Here's Why!

WINNETKA – So you've never bowled in a league? Or you've taken a break from a bowling league and want to get back in?

This is a good time to start considering joining a league for the popular three-month summer season. Bowling coordinators will start mapping plans within the next couple of months to patch together the requisite number of teams for their leagues.

And space is tight!

With many bowling centers closing or abandoning leagues, bowlers need to inquire early or they may find themselves squeezed out of a spot. Some leagues are saturated with would-be entrants and there's no guarantee that latecomers will have an opening available.

So why bowl in leagues?

Here is a list of 10 reasons to join a bowling league, courtesy of About.com, along with my comments:

1 – The Characters

About.com: League bowling brings out some of the most colorful, interesting, baffling personalities in the world. You have no idea these people are in your community until you join a bowling league. From unbelievably talented bowlers to inexplicably strange humans, you get a cross-section of society you didn't realize existed.

Fred Eisenhammer: *Because there are so many characters, there is absolutely no shortage of individuals to write about. You never know when you encounter a bowling league icon like Ken Borshell among the mix of players. Borshell is someone who for 30 years traveled round-trip more than 200 miles every week just so he could bowl in Los Angeles on the same league team as his good friends. Borshell hit the road from Bakersfield to L.A. for seven years and then drove from Palm Desert to L.A. for 23 years.*

2 – Camaraderie

About.com: Bowling leagues, especially with your friends (or strangers who will become your friends), are great ways to spend a few hours a week.

Fred Eisenhammer: *It's a great way to make friends, especially for widows and widowers.*

3 – Fun

About.com: Whether league bowling or not, it's fun to bowl.

Fred Eisenhammer: *Not only is it fun, but it's exciting. One day, anchorman Greg Kolski prepared to bowl in the 10th frame of a league game knowing that the match was on the line. Greg needed a mark to seal the victory for his team. Considering Greg's average was near 200, Greg's teammates were feeling pretty confident. Then Greg drilled a pocket shot that inexplicably left the imposing 6-7 split and it was apparent that the bowling gods had intervened to upset the norm. There were no groans from Greg's team. It was more like shock. Then Greg threw his big hook for his second shot, and again it was another huge surprise. He clipped the 6 pin gently on the right side and the pin slid over and barreled into the 7 – an improbable shot that snatched victory from the jaws of defeat.*

4 – Gambling

About.com: Small-time gambling is acceptable in most bowling leagues. Often, half your league fees go toward your bowling and the other half goes toward the prize fund. At the end of the season, you and your team will receive prize money based on where you finish. Individual prizes are usually up for grabs, too. Other ways to win a

pittance during league bowling involve card games and strike pots.

Fred Eisenhammer: *It's not usually a tremendous sum of money that is up for grabs, but bowlers are a competitive group – and even a little money means a lot.*

5 – Fitness

About.com: Repeatedly hurling a heavy sphere requires strength and endurance, and you can burn a significant number of calories bowling.

Fred Eisenhammer: *Bowling may not be the exercise program prescribed by your doctor, but even a little exercise is better than none.*

6 – Pizza

About.com: Never mind you're counteracting the exercise portion while cutting into your prize fund – it's delicious.

Fred Eisenhammer: *Don't forget beer for those with an appreciation of that beverage.*

7 – Television

About.com: If bowling isn't enough for you, many bowling centers have TVs playing whatever most of you want to watch (typically sports). Depending on the time of your league, you can watch entire hockey and baseball games while bowling.

Fred Eisenhammer: *Hockey? No thanks. Thumbs-up on football, baseball and basketball – and particularly any game involving the Dodgers, Angels, Clippers, Lakers, Kansas City Chiefs or San Francisco 49ers.*

8 – United States Bowling Congress Membership

About.com: You'll be a part of the USBC, which costs about \$20 a year (and is often hidden in your league fees, so you don't even have to think about it if you don't want to). Membership qualifies you for awards and gives you discounts with various merchants, including hotels and rental cars.

Fred Eisenhammer: *As a USBC member, a bowler is eligible to participate in many tournaments.*

9 – Relaxation

About.com: Except on the nights during which you're bowling so poorly you find yourself doing anything but relaxing, the sport can give you a nice respite from the workday or workweek. Show up, relax, throw a few frames and have fun.

Fred Eisenhammer: *Relaxation is nice in theory. Fact is, even a small pot of money at the end of the rainbow creates a competitive environment. And many bowlers feel the tension during the ninth and 10th frames. But competitiveness is a good thing. It's fun to show that one can come through when the chips are down. A bad thing is when some bowlers resort to gamesmanship – deliberately distracting the other team's bowlers or "disappearing" so the other team's players bowl ahead of them in the 10th frame.*

10 – Status

About.com: You'll be amazed by how many people are impressed when they find out you bowl in a league.

Fred Eisenhammer: *Perhaps more importantly, bowling in a league could provide a boost to your self-esteem. Your first 200 game, your first 500 or 600 series – it shows that you can accomplish things in your 30s, 40s, 50s, 60s, 70s, 80s and older. It's no coincidence that some of the most successful people are avid bowlers.*

Missouri Classic continued from page 1 and washed out in the sixth. That was all Simonsen needed to prevail with a 247-202 victory.

The semifinals pitted Simonsen against reigning Player of the Year EJ Tackett. The 2023's season's top two players grinded through the transition as neither player struck for five consecutive frames.

Tackett tossed aside any struggles as he aced three strikes in the 10th, forcing Simonsen to double.

Just as he did on Friday evening, Simonsen dialed in when he needed it most.

O'Neill, seeking his second title of the season, awaited Simonsen in the title match.

The current front-runner for Player of the Year elected to finish on the left lane, a decision he soon came to regret. O'Neill left a variation of the 2-10 split in the fourth, sixth and eighth frames.

Simonsen, who displayed the savviness of a fifth year senior point guard, cruised to a 225-156 win.

When Pete Weber threw his final shots on the PBA Tour last Thursday, Simonsen was the first player to congratulate the Hall of Famer. Sunday, Weber returned the favor to present him the championship trophy.

"The sport of bowling wouldn't be where it is today without him," Simonsen said. "It's emotional for me because we're getting to the point where Father Time

has kind of taken over a lot of the guys who I watched at a younger age. This is going to be the first time in 66 years without a Weber associated with the PBA Tour."

"I think me and Pete are alike at times," Simonsen said. "Sometimes it seems like we need to bowl angry to bowl better. Sometimes it comes out the way it should; sometimes it's a little unprofessional."

"I jokingly told Pete, 'I don't know if there's anybody better to win the inaugural Pete Weber event than me.'"

No days off in 2024: The PBA Tour keeps rolling as the Just Bare PBA Indiana Classic, the fifth title event of the season, begins Monday in Anderson, Ind.

\$1.9 million in new SMART deposited unassigned funds for Providers to allocate toward future scholarships.

This is in addition to the new \$3.2 million SMART deposited unassigned funds Providers received for allocation in December from expired Recipient accounts.

\$2.55 million is set aside for the SMART Pell Grant Match program for the 2024-2025 academic year.

"The SMART program continues to develop into one of the most impactful programs in our sport," USBC President Melissa McDaniel said. "We are proud to announce another meaningful earnings allocation, which will benefit our youth bowlers and SMART Providers."

The federal Pell Grant is a national program that helps students and families with the greatest financial need pay for college. The SMART Pell Grant Match maximizes the power of this federal program for bowlers by matching it dollar for dollar. The SMART Pell Grant Match will be available to any student with at least one season of USBC Youth participation and two seasons of overall USBC membership.

"We are seeing interest in the SMART Pell Grant Match program grow and clearly meeting a need within our bowling community," said Frank Wilkinson, chair of the USBC SMART Committee. "We want the awareness to continue to spread and encourage more kids to learn about SMART and take advantage of the resources available to them."

In 2021, the USBC Board of Directors approved a series of policy changes for SMART, designed to increase scholarship benefits for SMART Recipients. The new policy allocates a portion of investment gains to be awarded as new scholarships in SMART Recipient accounts.

Top 5 finish in every of the five seasons. There is every reason to believe he will lead this season's team to another league championship.

TEAM LEWEN won this season's first eight week Block with 159.5 points by a whopping 27 points over second place "VISITING TEAM" led by William Conrad. TEAM LEWEN won the second Block with 145 points a mere seven points more than TEAM 1 led by Alan Mojado and Jerry DeYager.

Jeff Lewen is averaging 225, third best in the league, and just half a pin behind John Cooper's league leading 226 average. Over the past five seasons Jeff has recorded the league high average three times and has recorded one of the Top 3 league averages in the seasons he hasn't led the league.

hold, refusing to let me return to my hotel room, and instead enjoying home cooked meals and visits to the famous trophy room that housed all of the Weber's memorabilia. Whenever I would see Pete, usually during the U.S. Open at Carolier Lanes in New Jersey, he would always comment about how much his parents thought of me and enjoyed my company. The feeling was mutual.

Pete first announced his retirement from the regular PBA Tour in 2021. But Weber also said that he would continue to bowl the majors, or special invitations, as well as the PBA50 circuit for members over the age of 50. Ironically, Walter Ray Williams Jr., Pete's nemesis for all those years, would make virtually the same announcement a couple of days later.

In Pete's most recent announcement, he told the crowd at the PBA Pete Weber Missouri Classic, "After 44 years, it's very humbling for me to be with you today. It's been an honor and a privilege. I will continue to bowl on the senior tour, but you will never see me throw another ball on the kid's tour, the Tournament of Champions, the U.S. Open or the Masters. I love you all so much. Thank you."

In his final frame, he rolled a strike on the first ball. "Most importantly — 200," he exclaimed, pointing to the overhead scoreboard. On the next shot he left a solid 9 pin. "How appropriate, to leave a solid 9 on my last shot," said Weber. You could almost sense the sarcasm in his voice, referring to the many taps that he's had to live with the past few years. As I continued watching the telecast on Bowl-TV from Enterprise Park Lanes in Springfield, Mo., I could see the frustration that must have weighed heavily upon the 61 year old Weber.

While Pete was leaving solid 9 pins, or 4 pins, or even the proverbial 10 pin, other bowlers around him, mostly two-handers, were striking at will, with only an intermittent 4 or 5 count split preventing them from a perfect score. There were so many 279's and 280's being rolled that it was reminiscent of playing pinball on a no-tilt machine! Only those crazy 3-4-6-7-9-10, or similar splits, were all that was preventing the players from averaging 250, or even higher. It's a wonder that Weber and Walter Ray have remained as long as they have on the regular tour. The game is just not the same.

Pete Weber won his first title at the 1982 Greater Hartford Open in Connecticut. But he didn't stop there, racking up a total of 10 titles by the tender age of 24, which is still a record. He's the only PBA player to win the Triple Crown (U.S. Open, Tournament of Champions, World Championship) twice, and he has won the U.S. Open an amazing 5 times.

PBA staff writer Nolan Hughes comments that since Weber's first retirement in 2021, he has bowled an occasional event each season, in addition to the majors. He has become a fixture at the PBA50 events, and last season earned PBA60 Player of the Year honors. The Pete Weber Missouri Classic will continue through Saturday, with the finals airing Sunday, February 19th at 1 p.m. Eastern, on Fox Sports 1.

"I can't wait to give the best bowler the trophy on Sunday," said Weber.




ANOTHER WEBER SAYS FAREWELL — John Weber spent a good deal of his life overseeing PBA Regional and PBA50 Tour operations.
