NORTH BRUNSWICK. NJ-Tommy Jones leaped to the front of the line in the race for the 2006 PBA Player of the Year award after winning his first career Major event, the 63rd U.S. Open Sunday at Brunswick Zone Carolier.

Jones, who leads the Tour with four victories this season. defeated top-seeded Ryan Shafer in the title match, 237-223, clinching the \$100,000 top prize and securing a spot on the Denny's PBA Tour through the 2008-09 season.

"You go out and do your best at every tournament. You want to have the chance to win. That's what you bowl for," said Jones, the No. 2 seed who converted a 4-pin in the 10th frame to capture his eighth Tour win over the last two seasons.

Shafer, who finished 2nd in a Major for the third time in his career, applied pressure late by striking in frames 7-9, but it wasn't enough.

Jones, who used an Ebonite "The One" strike ball, dispatched of Michael Fagan, the No. 4 seed searching for his first career title, in the semifinal, 231-226. Jones struck in frames 6-9 to help seal the win after opening on a 1-2-4-10 split in the 5th.

In the first stepladder match, Fagan defeated Robert Smith, looking for his second career U.S. Open title, 216-214. Fagan converted the 6-7-10 split to start the 10th then followed with an eight count. Smith, a six-time Tour title winner, needed to strike to start his 10th, but instead left the 3-6-10.

Shafer earned \$50,000 for his 2nd place finish while Fagan (Greenlawn, N.Y.) earned \$25,000 for 3rd. Smith (Thousand Oaks, Calif.) took home \$15,000 for 4th. The Denny's PBA Tour heads to Cheektowaga, N.Y., for the 2006 GEICO Classic, Feb. 22-26 at AMF Thruway Lanes. The live ESPN finals take place Sunday, Feb. 26 at 12:30 p.m. EST, with the winner taking home the \$40,000 top prize and a exemption for the 2006-07 Tour season.

by Frank Weiler RIVERSIDE—Citrus Belt great Paula Vidad bowled her third perfect game in our association on Tuesday, February 14. The association record for

women is four perfect games. Overall, this was Paula's tenth 300 game. She still holds the national record for the most perfect games bowled in a twenty-four game tournament three. She accomplished that feat in a 1994 Western Women's Professional Tour event in Palo Alto, California.

This latest perfecto was rolled at Arlington Lanes in Riverside, in the Tuesday Ladies League, using a Columbia Detour ball. It was the second game of her series, after struggling in her first game using a Storm Paradigm. Paula shot 699 for the night, but who knows how high her series might have been had she used the Columbia Detour that first game.

Paula may be the greatest female bowler ever produced in the

But, of course, there's always those special moments she enjoys sharing with others. She remembers when she was 15 years old, Joe was bowling competition at Palos Verdes Bowl and scored a 276 game to win a trip to Honolulu, Hawaii. The love of the game started with her father's influence and has remained her passion all these many years.

However, it has not always been easy. Bev worked for years as a bartender at South Bay Bowling Center, which was owned at that time by Active West. She was perfect for the job. She enjoyed the atmosphere and loved the interaction with the bowlers and... they liked her. And even though Bev made a pretty good life for her and the Citrus Belt. She is the product of a bowling family, rolling her first game at the age of ten. Her Mom (Elisa) and Dad (Juan) were very good keglers in their own right, with dad bowling two perfect games.Her sister Jeanne carries an average close to 200 in league play.

Vidad earned her scholarship at Cal State Los Angeles by leading the bowling team to a top ten national ranking. After graduation, Paula bowled professionally on the national ladies tour (Ladies Professional Bowlers Tour) for four seasons, 1984-1987. She was rookie of the year on the national tour in 1984. As a result. Paula was elected to the Southern California Bowling Writers Hall of Fame after being named to the groups all-star team twice in the mid 1980s.

Locally, Paula has led our association in average two times (1990 and 1991), in high series two times (1990: 778 and 2002: 802), and won our annual Queens Tourney in 1990.

Paula wants to thank her early coach Bobbe Norris for making her a better bowler, John and Linda Davis of Cal Bowling Supply for helping her with her equipment, and Corky DeMaio for drilling her bowling balls. It was the Davis's who recommended Paula use the Columbia Detour ball which was used by her to bowl this latest of her 300 games.

For as far back as I can remember, Bev has been a "high average" bowler and very, very, competitive in any group of bowlers. Conducted for the first time in 1916, the Women's Championships is the largest participatory sportin world for women. The 2 will mark the fifth time i Reno.

Alex and Michael were 4th and 5th and checks of \$145 with John and Marvin to meet for the right to bowl Esquivel for the title. This game was a great one also with Kim pulling it out at the end in a 248-233 game. Marvin who bowled so admirably was 3rd and \$240 with John off to the title game vs Luis Esquivel.

The title game was on and Luis elected to lead off. He did with a spare/strike. John then opened to take the big lead with a four bagger. After four frames led by 30 pins. Luis then magically found his shot. Ater a Brooklyn in frame five, zeroed in with three pocket hits and a four bagger and John left and missed a seven pin and when Luis opened in the ninth John had hopes but he couldn't double after a perfect shot and finished at 217/228. Luis would need a mark for the win. He got a strike and another one to win 223/250 and the title was his. Great bowling by Luis, a fine young gentleman and a title well deserved. The Esquivel family are great supporters of the ABTA. Dad Rogelio, and Mom Maria are also ABTA shooters. Luis and Rogelio bowl most all events. They are two of the Good Guys to be Sure!

Great bowling by another fine bowler John Kim who really was on at West Covina, eliminating four straight opponents before losing in the title game. I have known John for some time and he never ages, and also bowls as good as the old days. He is a great competitor and a fine guy also. Great performance John, and also Marvin Galsim could have been in the title match with a little more carry. Good bowling Marvin!
