LAS VEGAS - England's Dom Barrett, in his American television debut, defeated Sean Rash of Montgomery, III., 247-204, to win the Professional Bowlers A ssociation Scorpion Open at South Point Casino and Hotel. The finals aired Sunday on ESPN
The Scorpion Open was the third of four PBA "animal pattern" championships contested during the third annual PBA World Series of Bowling and the fourth straight World Series title - including the PBA World Championship - won by international players. Barrett joined countryman Stuart Williams, winner of the Stuart Williams, winner of the


SEATTLE - Sixteen-time Professional B owlers A ssociation Tour titlist Jason Couch and 11-time PBA Senior Tour winner Gene Stus have been wnner Gene Stus have been ected to the PBA Hall of Fame.
The 42 -year-old Couch is the only player in Tour history to win three consecutive PBA Tournament of Champions titles, an event many players consider one of the most demanding to win because a player must win a PBA title to be eligible to compete.
In addition to his Tournament of Champions titles, which came in 1999, 2000 and 2002, Couch won a fourth major in the 1993 PBA Touring Players Championship.
Couch, who makes his home in Clermont, Fla., bean his Tour career in 1992 and earned Rookie of the Year honors that season.
"I'm a firm believer in setting goals along the way in your career, working hard at achieving those milestones and hopefully you'll be rewarded with a great honor like being elected to the PBA Hall of F ame," Couch said. "I went out and did my best and when I achieved one milestone, continued to work hard and went on to the next one."


## Couch's career path was

 probably a foregone conclusion as the son of parents who owned a Florida bowling center."B owling on Tour has been a dream of mine since I was four years old watching PBA Tour telecasts on ABC on Saturday afternoons," said Couch "Growing up in a bowling cen ter certainly hel ped but it took the right combination of hard work and desire."

Throughout his 20-yea Tour career, Couch had a string of winning at least one title in six straight seasons (1998 2004) and won multiple titles in five seasons. Still active on Tour, he has more than $\$ 1.6$ million in career earnings and was ranked 24th among PBA's 50 greatest players in history as part of the organization's 50th anniversary in 2009. He
has also won 25 PBA regiona titles.
As a competitive bowler for most of his adult life, the 71 -year-old Stus had always wondered how he might have done on the PBA Tour. But the opportunity to compete in Tour competition didn't present itself until he was able to retire from General Motors after 32 years at the age of 50 and became a regular on the Senior Tour.

Stus' 11 Senior Tour titles rank fourth on the all-time list behind fellow Hall of Famers John H andegard with 14 titles, and Gary Dickinson and Dale Eagle each with 12

In 1992, Stus, who currently resides in Taylor, M ich., earned Senior Player of the Year honors thanks in part to winning two titles. In July of continued on page 4

have to make a good shot yourself．＂
For Rash and the United States professionals，the loss was another bitter disappointment．In four straight World Series of Bowling finals appearances，Rash has finished third in the PBA World Championship and Bayer Viper Open，and second in the Chameleon and Scorpion Opens．He also finished second to Mika Koivuniemi in the WTBA World Bowling Tour Finals to kick off he World Series．And the U．S．has yet to win a World Series title．Following Koivuniemi＇s win in the WBT Finals for Finland， fellow Finn Osku Palermaa won the PBA World Championship， England＇s Williams won the Bayer Viper Open，and Australia＇s Jason Belmonte won the Chameleon Open．
＂If you were to roll the calendar back 10 years，this wouldn＇t be happening，＂Barrett said of the surprising international domi－ nance．＂But we have so many international tournaments now， and the PBA Tour has opened events like the World Series to international players，that the experience we＇ve been able to get on the European and Asian tours has really meant a lot．
＂The tournaments we have in Europe have televised finals， but nothing quite like this，＂he added．＂The arena setting here reminds me of the Weber Cup back home，so when I walked in and saw how close this setting was to the Weber Cup，it made me feel right at home．＂

Barrett didn＇t want to rate himself against Williams as to who the best British bowler might be，but he said，＂Stu was the best after the Viper Open，and I put myself into the running today．But the fact is，we＇re the only two Englishmen to win a PBA Tour title，so that＇s what is really cool．＂

The final＂animal pattern＂championship，the GEICO Shark Open，will be contested on Sunday，March 4，at 3 p．m．ET on ESPN．Rash will appear in his fifth straight elimination final along with top qualifier Chris Barnes of Double Oak，Texas；Ja－ son Belmonte of Australia，and reigning PBA Player of the Year Mika Koivuniemi of Hartland，Mich．

Barrett was looking for his second PBA Tour title after win－ ning the PBA Scorpion Open which，ironically，was aired on an ESPN taped－delayed telecast earlier in the day．

＂The Bowler＂：Uh，not really．I just threw the ball harder when I got angry．
Me：Did you try adjusting your mark on the lane？
＂The Bowler＂：I just threw it harder to make it go straighter．

## Me：I see．So basically you didn＇t adjust at all to what was out there？

＂The Bowler＂：Well I don＇t really know how and if they would stop messing with the lanes I wouldn＇t worry about it．They really need to do something because I should be shooting much higher．

Me：Right．
Sound familiar？Although this transcript isn＇t verbatim，this is very close to a conversation that I have with bowlers on a near daily basis．Many that I talk to are quick to blame everything else but hemselves when they have a bad night．B eit the bowling center，the oil patterns，the ball or something else，no one wants to accept that they should have the ability to adjust to the lanes．Conditions are never going to be EXACTLY the same week in and week out and I believe it is time for bowlers to ake the initiative to improve themselves rather than find scapegoats for their problems．There are several concepts bowlers can use and although all of them are important I would like to dedicate this article to the two that I find to be the most important in＂Attitude and Practice＂
A bowler＇s attitude on the lanes and is the cornerstone to becoming a better bowler．Every week ou＇ll find bowlers losing their cool and completely falling to pieces after they make a bad shot or something gees wrong．M ore often than not these bowlers will begin to pipe the ball down the lan something goes wrong．M ore often than not these bowlers will begin to pipe the ball down the lane trying to hem．It is a lose／lose situation for everyone involved and only goes to hurt your game further． A positive o find something to learn about after every shot．Even in your most frustrating times you can calm yourself by analyzing what has happened and finding ways to improve it next time．Questions I ask after someone misses a spare，for example，could include did you go too fast？Did you miss your mark？Where was your arm swing？How much speed was on the ball？What are you going to do to make it next time？All these questions can be answered thoroughly and can only lead to making yourself a better bowler．
This attitude isn＇t just linked to spare shooting either．You can take the time to look at different conditions，balls，individual shots or just about anything involved with bowling．I＇Il even admit to aking a short walk after throwing a bad shot to relax myself，figure out what went wrong and get back into a groove．The best bowlers are the ones who can constantly get into that＂zone＂where it is automatic and they are left with no further questions to have to answer．The best way to get yourself into this zone and understand what you are doing better is to simply practice．
Practice，without a shadow of doubt，is an essential part of anybody＇s bowling career．W hether on your own，or preferably with a coach who knows what they are doing，practice can lead to you breaking bad habits and learning the answers to the questions that can arise during even the roughest of league nights．Practice also leads to the development of muscle memory which by definition is consolidating a specific motor task into memory through repetition．

The more you repeat the correct movements and adjustments means the easier it becomes to do it automatically and without thinking．The ultimate goal for any bowler is to go into league or tournament knowing exactly what they need to do and to do it over and over again．When you can achieve this muscle memory and combine it with a positive mental attitude you find yourself at the pinnacle of bowling ability．This is the zone and this is what separates the good bowlers from the great．
While I will stress again that attitude and practice are not the only things to work on I do stil incerely believe they are the most important．I wish you all great luck on the lanes and I welcome anyone to contact me with an opinion on this part of bowling．
