Barnes Hits Big Time

N. BRUNSWICK—Looking to snap an eight-game losing streak on TV and win his first PBA major title, Chris Barnes converted the four pin with his final shot to defeat Patrick Allen, 213-212, and win the 62nd U.S. Open presented by Odor-Eaters by one pin Sunday at Brunswick Zone Carolier.

Barnes earned \$100,000 for the victory and a three-year Tour exemption.

In the 8th frame, Barnes left the 10 pin with his second shot letting Allen, Tarrytown, N.Y., back into the match. Both players struck in the 9th to make it a one-pin match heading into the final frame. Allen struck and converted a spare to put the pressure back on Barnes. Barnes then struck and converted the four pin to win.

“I didn’t throw a whole bunch of great shots and in the U.S. Open you have to throw great shots,” Barnes, who eclipsed the \$1,000,000 mark in a PBA Tour-record 220 events, said. “On the last shot, I came over the top of it. I needed help. You have to catch a break.”

In the semifinals of the step-ladder format, Allen edged Mika Koivuniemi who only needed to mark and knock down eight pins to advance to the title match. After converting the 10 pin, Koivuniemi left three standing, ending the game in a 194-194 tie and forcing a one ball, sudden-death roll-off. Both Allen and Koivuniemi had nine-counts with their first shots. In the sec-

ond roll-off, Allen left the three pin standing, giving Koivuniemi the opportunity to win the game with a strike. Koivuniemi, Hartland, Mich., left the two and pins pins, giving Allen the match.

In the first match, only six pins separated Koivuniemi and Walter Ray Williams Jr. in the 7th frame when Williams left the 4-9 split leaving the nine pin standing. Although Koivuniemi followed with two spares, Williams’ 4-6-7-9-10 split in the 10th sealed the 212-179 win for Koivuniemi.

Allen earned \$50,000 for his 2nd place finish, while Koivuniemi earned \$25,000 for 3rd and Williams, Ocala, Fla., took home \$15,000 for 4th.

The Tour will continue next week with the 2005 PBA Cambridge Credit Classic at AMF Babylon Lanes in West Babylon, N.Y. The PBA Tour Qualifying Round will begin Feb. 23 with the finals televised live on ESPN Sunday, Feb. 27 from 12:30-2:00 p.m. EST.

Williams Jr., Pluhowsky Named BWAA Bowlers of the Year

Pro earns his record eighth such honor, amateur collects her first

GREENDALE, WI—Professional bowler Walter Ray Williams Jr. and amateur Shannon Pluhowsky have been voted 2004 Bowlers of the Year by the Bowling Writers Association of America.

It was the record eighth time Williams has been honored by the BWAA voters and the third consecutive year that the California-born right-hander has been so honored. He also earned that title in 1986, 1993, 1996-98 and 2002-03.

The Ocala, Fla., resident won the American Bowling Congress Masters in January 2004, Earl Anthony Classic and Uniroyal Tire Classic, led the Professional Bowlers Association’s money earnings list with \$289,600 and cashed in all 21 PBA Tour events he entered. Williams will be inducted into the ABC Hall of Fame March 17 in Baton Rouge, La.

The voters gave Williams an overwhelming victory with 77 first-place votes and 426 points, far ahead of runner-up Mika Koivuniemi of Finland, who garnered 222 points with 19 first-place votes. Others receiving first-place votes were Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., and Steve Jaros of Yorkville, Ill.

Pluhowsky enjoyed an outstanding year by winning her third consecutive U.S. Amateur Championship and her second AMF Bowling World Cup. She was the NCAA Women’s Bowling Championships Most Valuable Player while helping her University of Nebraska team win the inaugural title. She also captured the first Collegiate Singles Championship.

The Phoenix left-hander received 35 first-place votes and 230 points. Runner-up was Carolyn Dorin-Ballard of North Richland Hills, Texas, with 20 first-place votes and 165 points. Also in the running was amateur Diandra Asbaty of Chicago with 18 first-place votes and 153 points. Others receiving first-place votes were Liz Johnson of

RIVERSIDE — The Citrus Belt Bowling Association hosted the 2004 Cal-State Championships, here at Arlington and Riverside Lanes. according to President Bud Pinchot, the coveted Scratch All-Events title was taken by Joe Roussin, Anaheim, with an actual nine-game 2256 series.

The title was worth a trip to the 2005 Baton Rouge, LA, ABC Masters but Joe opted for a chance at the just completed U.S. BPAA/PBA Oder-Eaters Open \$100,000 title (Chris Barnes), second \$50,000 (Patrick Allen), \$25,000 (Mika Koivuniem), \$15,000 (Walter Ray Williams) or \$10,000 (California’s Mike DeVaney) or down to the \$2,000 bottom qualifier prize.

Joe got \$185 and a championship wrist watch for the A-E title plus cashing in team doubles and singles (making up the nine games). Oh yes, he received \$75 for the 300 game in doubles 300/742, team 724 and

capped it with a singles 790 on games of 289-277-224.

According to his mother, Char, Joe is well qualified to compete in any bowling tournament. He started bowling when he was six at AMF Missile Bowl (Gardena), went through the So-Cal juniors with walls of trophies, put in nine years as a touring and part-time pro still carrying a paid-up card. Joe’s good to Mom. He rolled a 300 game on her 82nd birthday. And, taking after Mom who was a good bowler; she carried a 180 average way back at Linbrook Bowl. She put in about 16 years as an OCWBA director.

Harris’ 685 Gives Las Vegas First SN-CDBA Team Title In 20 Years

WINNETKA—For 20 years one of the founders of So, Nevada-California Deaf Bowling Association residing in Las Vegas Sammy Sain put together a team to participate in the tournament he helped start back in 1984 and did not win first place. Finally at Canoga Park Bowl this year he got the right team, Las Vegas Strikes and Spares to win with the tournament’s 2nd highest score 2925 over 29 other teams.

In this total Sain led off with 560, Barry Cossman 548, Marvin House 657 and Joey Harris 685, Las Vegas scored 751-907-793 for 2451 plus 474 handicap for the \$560.00 prize. The team won 131 pins ahead of 2nd place 2794 of So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers #1 which had two Deaf Team USA bowlers on it.

The two, Darrell Stogryn 678 and Ed Abakumoff 628 along with Bob Jones 618 and Jim Mohr 538 scored 781-825-856 for tournament high 2462 plus handicap of 332. Another Las Vegas team “Aces” placed 3rd with 2780.

The team prize list showed Calizona’s 2708 in 7th and last in the money. Team USA duo of Abakumoff and Stogryn, two times champion of this event (2002-2003) shot near record 527 in first game but could not hit 400 again. They both finished with same 644 series for the high scratch total 1288 plus 112 for 1400 good for 3rd place \$170.00.

Another So. Calif. husband and wife tandem, Emad (474) and Mirna (480)Aranki finished in tie for 4th with 1392 total. The last place 14th to cash in this event was 1353 scored by another married duo Ira and Glenna Krauss.

FIRST TIMER DIANA SCHETTINI SECURES SINGLES TITLE WITH RECORD HUGE 858

It is a rare feat for a woman bowling in her first tournament crashing into the tournament singles event record book with a huge handicap score. That was what the petite Diana Schettini, Sierra Madre did, rolling the first handicap 800 series total in SN-CDBA’s 21 years tournament history.

Ms. Schettini who had 146 book average and bowls in the Golden State Deaf League at Brunswick Matador Lanes, was excited in her first tournament but showed calm and poised when she rolled her first game a 192. Her next game was better, a 211 and other bowlers scoffed, “beginners luck and pressure will get her down”. No, Wrong! Diana put a string of strikes and ended up with a 241and a 644 series.

That with her 214 handicap gave her a gigantic 858 total to place first in the singles event good for \$150.00 prize. Diana will have her name in new record book for a long time. The old record was 798 made in 1996.

Placing 2nd was a former Southern Californian residing in Tampa, FL Howard Choy, Jr. who bowled in this tournament before moving to Florida. Choy rolled games of 212-204-214 for 630 plus 160 handicap for 790.

Third place went to the Team USA star Darrell Stogryn who won the silver medal in the Deaflympics bowling Masters in Australia. Stogryn hit 238-257-243 for tournament high 738 series plus 45 handicap for 781. The event’s high game 288 was made by Bert Enos, San Jose who followed it with 201-203 for 692 plus 62 handicap 754 total for 7th place.

Besides Stogryn’s 738, the other scratch 700, a 728 was rolled by the much heralded Ken DeGroff who moved to California from Pennsylvania where in 2003 he crashed in ABC records book as one of the only 5 men ever to hit back to back 300 games two times. In his 728, DeGroff had games of 224-248-258 but had zero handicap for his 235 average and placed 13th.

The last place in the money in this event was 29th 679 score by Stella Lopez.

BERT ENOS ENDS UP WITH 2089/2275 FOR ALL-EVENTS TITLE

San Jose’s Bert Enos came down from Northern California to bowl in this tournament and ended up with the All-events title and \$100.00. Enos struck out steady series of 700 in team event, 697 in doubles and 692 in singles for the tournament high 2089 scratch total plus 186 handicap for the winning 2275 score.

The surprise 2nd place winner was petite Diana Schettini with 2230 total. Marvin House, Lass Vegas placed 3rd with 2215. Darrell Stogryn with 678 in team, 644 in doubles and 738 in singles had the 2nd high scratch 2060 plus 129 handicap 2189 for 4th. His Team USA teammate Ed Abakumoff had 1941 total from 628-644-669 and plus 207 handicap for 2148 to place 7th.

The last place in the money in this event is tied for 10th by Richard Apple, Union City and Pete Morreale, Las Vegas with same 2123 score. The notable third scratch 2000 total was a 2027 made by Ken DeGroff with 665 in team, 634 in doubles and 728 in singles. Of course with his zero handicap he placed out of money in 30th.

Short Cuts To Problem Solving - Part I The Most Important Of All Short Cuts To Better Bowling

Past knowledge is the soil in which the future can grow.

No single individual, no matter how knowledgeable, knows everything there is to know about bowling (or anything else, for that matter). This explains why experts are often recognized for their specialty areas. Mo Pinel is a highly recognized ball designer and layout expert, Dr. Dean Hinitz a clinical sports psychologist specializing in the mental game and Hall of Fame coach of the pros, John Jowdy, specializes in shot execution.

These are only a few examples, but serve to point out what some of the available specialist functions are all about.

Of course, the knowledge of such bowling gurus usually spills over into other related areas as well. Most of the above are also fine bowlers, tournament winners, excellent coaches, etc. But they are mainly known for their specialties. Like the heart surgeon who is known for that specialty, but had to first go through years of schooling in many other areas of medical knowledge as well. And so it is in bowling...most specialists gained knowledge of many areas of the sport first...then chose their specialties out of that knowledge.

There is, however, a different breed of cat; the individual known as a *generalist*. That's the person who decided to increase his or her general knowledge to become a better overall player or teacher/coach. As a serious student of not just one, but all areas of the game, this individual can parlay that greater breadth of knowledge into becoming a tournament winner...and often even a successful teacher/coach, capable of training others to become winners.

Prime examples of such 'generalist' coaching successes include": Former Team USA head coach and PBA champion Palmer Fallgren, Dick Ritger, Gold level coach Susie Minshew and John Fantini (former head coach of Saudi Arabia's national team), Bill Hall and many others too numerous to mention. At the pinnacle of such examples, of course, is Hall of Fame coach of the pros John Jowdy, arguably the most successful and sought after teacher/coach of winning touring pros ever spawned by our beloved sport.

Every city in which these articles appear boasts at least a few such coaches. They represent the army of both specialists and generalists in bowling's coaching world, without whom it would be extremely difficult for many of today's winning bowlers to have achieved their success. High level competitive bowling is a demanding game in which talent alone, without good coaching, can virtually never make it. If there is a multi-tournament champion who has never had coaching, I'm not aware of it.

SO WHERE'S THE SHORT CUT?

Well, the most productive short cut a sincere, ambitious bowler can use is to *employ a qualified coach!* "Oh, yeah?" you say, "Working with a coach takes time; how can you call that a short cut?" Simple! The *hiring* of a coach, once it's been decided, is one short cut. The other is the fact that without the training of a good teacher/coach, much time can be wasted without achieving your goals. So while the training itself may take some time, it usually saves months, even years of wasted effort.

Once it's been decided to get coaching help, the next step is to decide whether to hire a generalist or a specialist. That depends on which aspects of your game need improvement. A generalist coach is best for most areas of execution and the parts of strategy dealing with adjustments and options. A specialist would be for assistance in whatever specialty help is needed. For ball choices to fit various conditions, an experienced pro shop operator like Jerry Frankomano or, if available, someone like Denny Torgerson (who also publishes Bowling Equipment Concepts, an informative monthly newsletter on the subject) would be the answer.

Then there's the most often disregarded part of bowling...the mental game... which many winning touring pros constantly work on, but to which not nearly enough of today's non pro bowlers pay much attention. Dean Hinitz is a great example of such a specialist. The mental game becomes increasingly important as your average goes up, as Dr. Hinitz explains in his new outstanding book, **FOCUSSED FOR BOWLING**.

Break point bowling is another specialty, obviously for the better bowler. I've taught break point targeting for years and there must be any number of coaches who know and use it today, so it shouldn't be hard to find one who can help with it. Most top professionals definitely use it. It's a worthwhile short cut to learn about, especially for changing lane conditions.

WIDENING YOUR OWN KNOWLEDGE

It is my experience that reading instructional books and magazines, as well as watching instructional tapes, is an important adjunct to the coaching you get. The wider your overall knowledge becomes, the more multidimensional a bowler you'll become. I have always suggested, "Read everything you can lay your hands on."

Another outstanding book is **BOWLING EXECUTION**, by no less an author than John Jowdy himself. This book is already among the top sellers. Jowdy can show and prove more successful results of his instructional work with both professionals and amateurs than anyone I know of. In constant demand by other countries also, Jowdy helps train national teams all over the world. Here at home, his seminars are legendary, which make him available to all serious bowlers.

SOME 'HELPING YOUR COACH' SHORT CUTS

Bowlers generally hate to write things down. Somehow, taking notes seems to be a thing that less than one bowler in 10 will take the time to do. There's a human tendency to think, "Well, I'll remember what I just learned this lesson, so there's no point in slowing myself down to take reminder notes." *WRONG!* For example, let's say you're taking a lesson a week. Any good coach wants, if possible, to see you improve during the week so that something new can be worked on next week. You may *think* you can remember everything just covered, but during the week you may just find yourself scratching your head and saying, "What did the coach say?" Then the next lesson will just be a repeat of the previ-

ous one. There's an old saying, "*If you couldn't find the time to do it right, how will you ever find the time to do it over?*"

Taking short notes (short is OK) takes only a little time, but *saves hours, even weeks of wasted time!* Even after achieving many of your goals, short notes on progress, on open frames, splits, practice reminders, etc., keep you working on your game more intelligently and progressing more quickly. If you could see Parker Bohn, III's spread sheet of notes and self hints, you'd quickly realize that writing things down is one important short cut to success. Bohn is hot on note taking. He considers it one of the short cuts to winning, of which he's done plenty. During his appearances around the country to visit with bowlers, he'll take out his notes and show how he uses them. So...rather than thinking of it as time consuming, consider note taking an important, time saving short cut!

MAKING IT EASY

Those little 3 x 5 inch spiral notebooks from the stationary store cost very little and can be carried around in your bowling bag for easy access during lessons or practice. My personal system is to give every bowler I work with one of these books. In that book I'll write down everything worked on that day. My only rule, "Don't lose that book!" After some pages get filled up with notes, these little books become a sort of bible. The bowler can now refresh his or her memory during practice, before a league or tournament, or whenever needing a reminder.

So my suggestion is: *Take the little time needed to take simple notes. It really is a helpful short cut!*

HELPING YOURSELF VIA YOUR COACH

All better bowlers know that practice is critical for improvement. Also, that during the early stages of lessons, scores may temporarily fall a bit before improving. Good coaches are aware of this and warn their students about it. One outstanding way to help both yourself and your coach create earlier and faster improvement is to accept the fact that extra practice sessions may be needed. Yet often, with continuous job and business pressures, it's hard to dedicate that extra practice time. I often suggest joining a social league (or a flex league) while taking lessons and use that league for practice purposes. Such leagues are always available and seldom demand that you maintain a high average...perfect for practice purposes.

Again, while practice does take time, it really does come under the heading of short cut...a short cut to better bowling and winning, sooner rather than later. By finding the time for this you're helping both your coach and yourself...the coach by making yourself more teachable...and yourself by improving more rapidly.

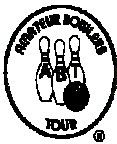

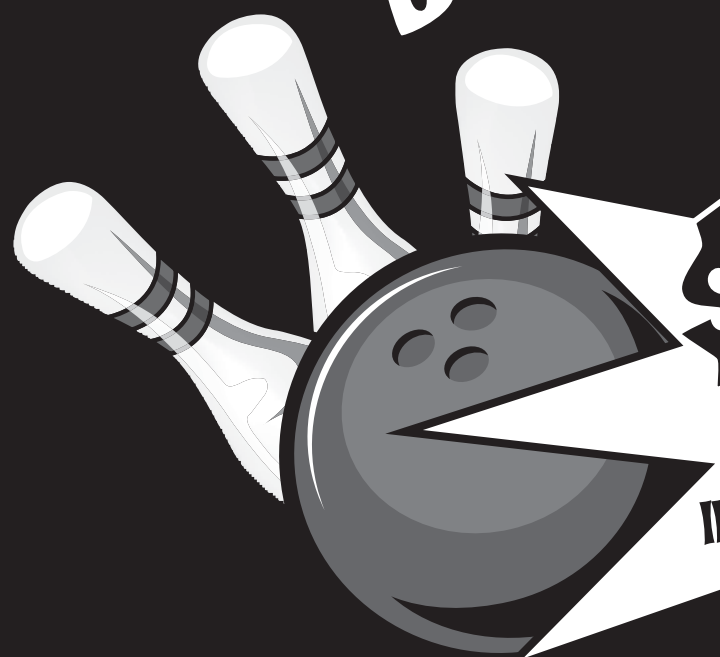

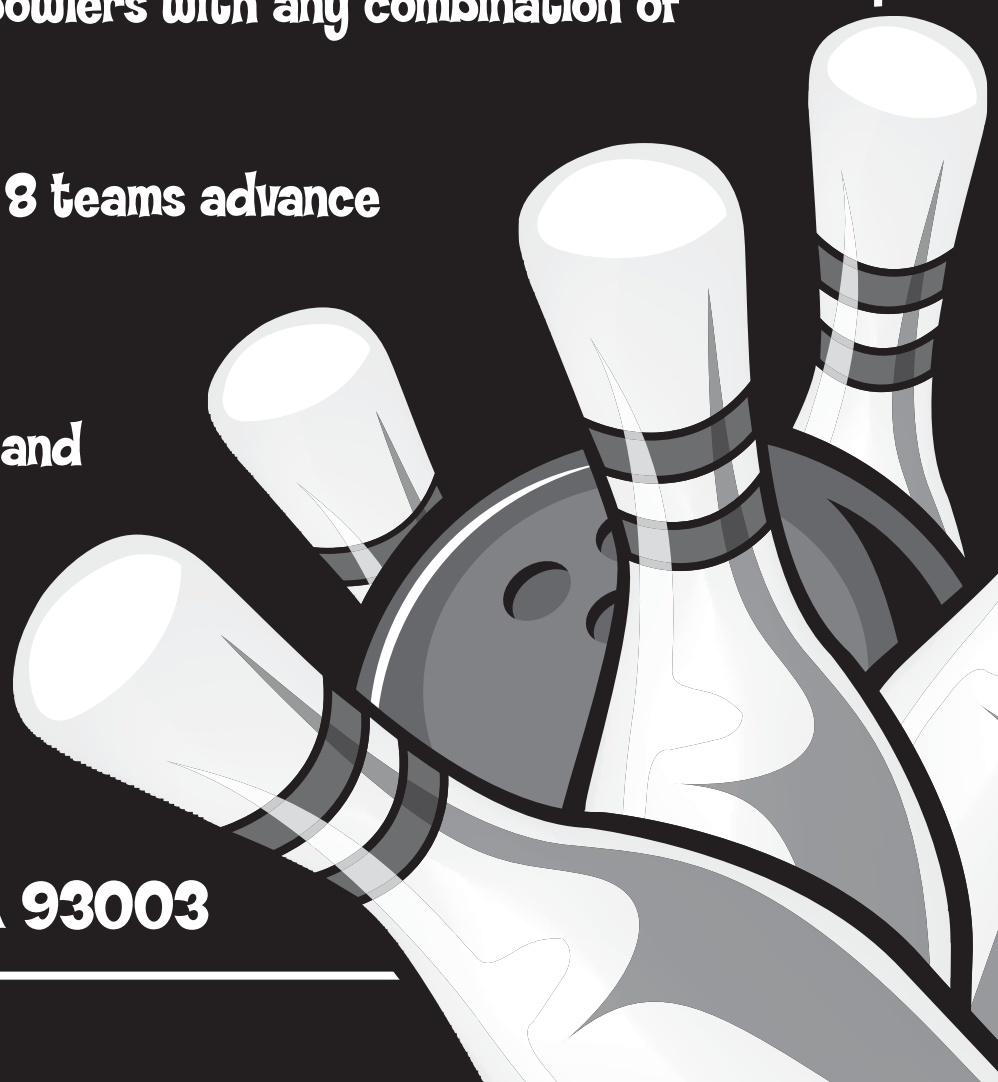
