JASON BELMONTE WINS THE STORM CUP: DAVID SMALL'S KOKOMO CHAMPIONSHIP

His 27th PBA Tour title is his second of the season

KOKOMO, Ind.—Jason Belmonte won his second Guaranteed Rate PBA Tour title of the season and 27th of his career, leading every round of THE STORM CUP: David Small's Kokomo Championship and ultimately defeating Nick Pate in the championship match at Heritage Lanes.

After Belmonte failed to double in the 10th frame, leaving a 10 pin on his second shot, Pate had a chance to win, needing two strikes and count in the final frame to win. Like Belmonte, Pate got the first strike but left a 10 pin on his second shot.

"I was really nervous," Belmonte said of watching Pate. "All you can do is throw the ball where you're looking and we both did that. We both left a 10 pin, but he could've easily struck on that shot. If it were to be, he would be fully deserving."

Pate qualified third for the stepladder finals and advanced to the title match with wins over Anthony Simonsen and EJ Tackett. Pate put up the front seven against Belmonte's front six in the championship match, but a split in the eighth frame and the stubborn 10 pin cost Pate the

chance at his first career title.

Belmonte, who is the all-time record holder with 14 major championships, is now ninth all-time in total PBA Tour titles, passing "Kokomo Kid" Don Johnson, who won 26 times in his career. Belmonte has competed in all four events so far this season, winning two and finishing third in the U.S. Open.

The win also moved Belmonte into first place in THE STORM CUP standings, giving him a 110-point lead over second place Pate, who is the only player to have qualified for the stepladder finals in both THE STORM CUP events this season. Belmonte also increased his lead in the PBA Playoffs race, now holding a nearly 5,000-point advantage over Anthony Simonsen.

USBC HALL OF FAMER ELVIRA TOEPFER DIES AT AGE 99

ARLINGTON, Texas - United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer Elvira Toepfer of Bradenton, Florida, died Feb. 5 at the age of 99.

Toepfer first made a name for herself as a Detroit-area standout and was selected as the Motor City's Queen of Bowling eight times, to go along with multiple appearances on the all-city team and a Woman of the Year Award from the Bowling Proprietors Association of Greater Detroit.

Her passion for the sport began while she was working at a local bowling center, and her career kicked



off in 1940, when she was 18 years old.

In the decades that followed, Toepfer was part of the Brunswick Advisory Staff of Bowling Champions and was able to find success at the national lev-

Her first noteworthy victory came with fellow USBC Hall of Famer Anita Cantaline at the 1956 Bowling Proprietors' Association of America Women's National Doubles, and Toepfer found the national continued on page 5





centers based out of California, with locations primarily in California, Texas and Wisconsin, and smaller clusters in Oklahoma, Kentucky and Missouri. Each year we would host the professional bowlers at one of our locations, and each year I would think about utilizing the pros for a series of commercials that we could air in-house during league and casual bowling hours.

Finally in 1992, and with the permission of the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA), I used the KSCH-TV 58 studios and crew in Sacramento, Calif., to develop a number of 30 and 60 second commercials directed at just about everything in the bowling center - league and casual bowling, food and drinks, video games, lottery cards, tournaments, short season clubs, etc. The pro bowlers, most notably Parker Bohn III and Marc McDowell. were anxious to be a part of our efforts. I remember Parker telling me, "I want to do as many spots as possible, because this will be good experience for me in the future."

Parker and Marc probably had the most difficulty

with the scripts, while others like Dave Husted and Steve Cook were naturals, and required only one take. Looking back on my experiences at AMF, I recalled marketing guru Al Spanjer telling me to always have the participants sign a release, and pay them something, even if it's just one dollar. It seemed to add credibility to the moment, and I remember all of the bowlers taking it seriously once they signed their agreement.

Some of the most humorous moments were captured on a video we called "ARC Bloopers." It was so funny that I remember sending a VHS copy to Mark Gerberich at the PBA corporate offices, and they shared it at their annual Tournament of Champions Dinner. I still have at least one copy of "ARC Bloopers," and it will someday be a part of the Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum.

The article in February's BCM Magazine reports, "Strike Ten Entertainment (STE), the Bowling Proprietors Association of America (BPAA) and the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) are rolling out Bowling Center TV — or BCTV for short." The article goes on to say that BCTV will provide participating locations the opportunity to enhance the customer experience and generate additional revenue through advertising.

It all sounds wonderful, but looking back on my personal experience, prior to what appears to be a fully integrated system with live transmission, I can only remember the reluctance by the bowling center staff to activate the 1992 version. After viewing the tapes a couple of times, the crew were irritated by the videos and did not turn up the sound, or in many cases did not even turn on the 2 hour loop tapes. One can only hope that the additional revenue that will be provided by BCTV will encourage the management to have the system running, and with sound! The BCM article states that BCTV will include interactive games, photo uploading and other elements designed to get customers engaging with the screens. But what about the bowling? Do we really want the customers so occupied with the screens? Won't this lead to (extremely) slow bowling?

I wish BCTV well, but in the interest of everyone involved, it would seem that "The Bowling Channel" on cable TV makes more sense...

spotlight again in 1957 and 1959 with team titles at the USBC Women's Championships.

In all, she participated in the Women's Championships 56 times from 1942-2001. She also collected topfive finishes at the World's Invitational Tournament and the BPAA All-Star and enjoyed a stint on the Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour in the organization's early years. The first PWBA Tour event was held in 1960.

Continued success earned Toepfer entrance into a trio of halls of fame for superior performance - Metro Detroit USBC (during the 1966-1967 season), USBC (1976) and Michigan State (1977).

Toepfer and her late husband, Meyrl, moved to Homosassa, Florida, in 1999, and she relocated to nearby Bradenton following his death in 2001. She had lived in an assisted living facility since 2016.

Information about funeral services for Toepfer is not yet available.
