Eric Forkel Wins Senior WCST Title

Kevin Gannon Wins Super Senior Champion

LA HABRA—Eric Forkel (Henderson, NV), despite building up a big lead in the finals, lost that lead, and then the last 3 games bounced back with a 771 score, which included a big 289 game, and won those matches to win his 9th WCST Title.

Don Blatchford, took the lead from after game 5 and held a comfortable lead, up until game #9. Then disaster popped up for Don as he rolled a 167 game, and dropped to 3rd place going into the position match. Meanwhile, Mike Rick took the lead and bowled Eric for the championship.

Eric, down 40 pins, from Mike, won the match 278 to 224, and the tournament by 44 pins. Eric has won the 1st two WCST Tournaments this year with come from behind wins in the position matches. One fine note, new WCST mem-

ber, Alisha Hill, the only lady bowling this past weekend, made the finals, and finished in 6th place.

A 300 game, in the 10th game of qualifying put Craig Kisro in the finals. A big turn-of entries for this one, with 41 seniors entered, and 33 super seniors. 80 bowlers would have been the maximum field. We had cancellations due to sickness, work, and various other reasons.

A total of \$9,585.00 was paid out, and for two tournaments this year, a total of \$18,855.00 paid out.

For 283 tournaments, a grand total now of \$3,333,323 has been paid out. Top 3:, 1st place, Eric Forkel \$1000.00, 2nd Place, Mike Rick (Redlands), \$725.00, and 3rd place to Don Blatchford (Santa Monica), \$540.00. We like to

Carter Tops Weber for First PBA Title in GEICO Plastic Ball Championship

WHEAT RIDGE, CO.—Jeff Carter of Springfield, Ill., ended his 122-tournament quest for his first Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour title Sunday, defeating his idol, Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., 235-213, to win the GEICO Plastic Ball Championship at Brunswick Zone-Wheat Ridge.

Carter, 39, threw six strikes in a row after an opening-frame spare to build a 56-pin lead after five frames and he easily held off Weber to win the \$25,000 first prize, a one-year exemption to bowl on the Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour next season, and a berth in the 2010 PBA Tournament of Champions.

The tournament was contested with throw-back polyester bowling equipment that dominated the sport in the 1970s, providing a challenge similar to requiring professional golfers to play an entire tournament using persimmon woods, or tennis players to compete with wooden rackets and cat-gut strings.

With the entire field using identical low-tech bowling balls, the emphasis was on accuracy, speed control and hand action at the point of release. Carter — a contemporary power player — didn't expect to do well when he entered, but he found the equipment limitations actually worked in his favor.

"This tournament took some variables out of play that I've struggled with in the past," Carter said. "I just put my game into slow motion and went from there."

"Bowling against Pete was indescribable," Carter continued, adding with a grin: "Actually, bowling him for the title made it easier. He's my friend. He's also one of my heroes. I've dreamt about bowling him for my first title. Today that dream came true."

Carter also said that Weber had made a reference before the title match that seeing Carter vs. Weber on the scoreboard was special. Pete was referring to memories of his late

father Dick Weber's close relationship to fellow Budweiser teammate and hall of famer Don Carter. Jeff Carter is not related to Don, but the symbolism wasn't lost on him.

"Who would have thought it would come down to Carter vs. Weber for my first title," Carter said. "Who could ask for anything better?"

In the first semifinal round match, Weber followed an open frame and spare with eight consecutive strikes to defeat Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, 269-226. In the second semifinal match,

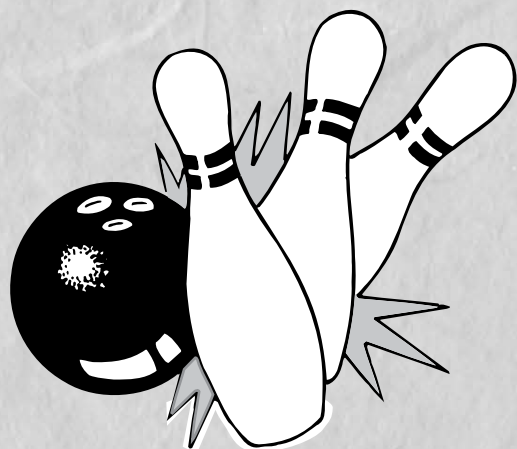

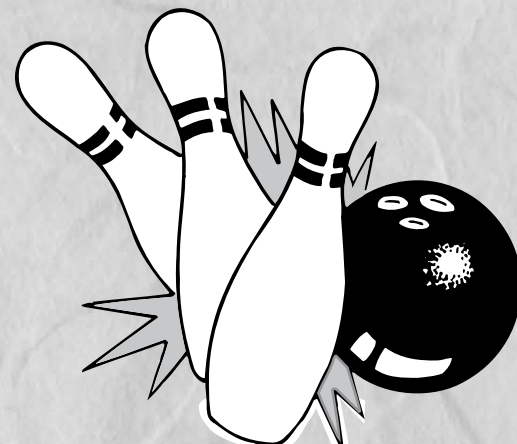

A Lifetime Thrill for 10 cents

It was dad’s bowling night – a Friday in March, 1938 – but he had to baby sit my sister Bertie and I due to a last minute notice that Mom had to work late. There was no time to get a baby sitter so dad packed us up with his bowling ball and shoes and off we went to the bowling alley. My sister and I had never been to such a place, it would be a new adventure, one that would keep us up long after our 7 PM bed time.

As dad opened the door to Chicago’s Kris Kadd’s Bowling Alley a long narrow stair case appeared before us with lots of noise at the top. We started climbing the stairs but half way up he had to pick up my sister and carry her. She had such little legs for a 7 year old. I was nine years old and tall for my age. I made it to the top of the stairs in time to see a man with a long stick climb up on a perch high above the alleys. Dad had fun with us by saying this man would smack us with the stick if we misbehaved. Truthfully, I learned that if the foot of a player touches the line where the gutters and alley begins the perch man will use the stick to tap the floor beneath him, point to the player and shout “foul”. My sister and I agreed that this game did not look like it would be much fun, not with that perch man watching.

The players were all there and the game started. My Dad stood tall at 6’3”. When it was his turn to play he seemed even taller in his bright red shirt. He swung his bowling ball high above his head and then forward down the bowling alley. I was frightened at first but then when the ball hit the pins they all fell down and dad was so pleased he shook hands with all his team players. After two games it had to be past our bed time. My sister was already fast asleep with her head in my lap. The wooden bench we were sitting on was so hard and cold. My dad finally said it’s time to go. Everyone had such a good time I asked my dad if I couldn’t play too – next time. He assured me my turn would come when I’m a little older.

Mom took up the game of bowling too. She was determined not to be a bowling widow. Once again, my sister and I went to the bowling alley, this time with mom. We went to Kris Kadd’s where she took some bowling lessons. I was 10 now and wanted to play too but Mom said my turn would come when I am a little older. She was a fast learner and soon became a team player.

I learned the rules of the bowling game, the courtesies, and how to keep score. I was 14 now and the desire to play grew stronger. Kris Kadd’s Bowling Alley was a short walk from home. After school one day I went to visit Mr. Kadd. He understood my determination to play and promised I could play one game after school for 10 cents but I had to bring a friend along who could set up the pins. I thanked him and ran home to share the news with mom and dad. They encouraged my quest to play the game and felt confident Mr. Kadd would look after me.

The following Sunday my sister and I walked to and from Sunday School so I could save the Street Car fare - 10 cents - for the bowling game. After school on Monday I rushed over to the bowling alley. I gave Mr. Kadd my 10 cents. Where is your pin setter?, he asked. It’s me, I replied. He gave me a long look, smiled, and said o.k. There I was – a big girl 5’8” with big hands and big feet. Good thing. So the special shoes and bowling ball fit well enough.. Mr. Kadd was kind and gave me an alley on the end to make it easier for me to run back and forth from the pit to the bowlers area. I had watched the pin setters on previous visits so I knew how to set pins. Mr.Kadd made certain I set the pins correctly.

It was my turn, finally! I knew I could do this. I had inherited the athletic ability of my dad, Chicago born of Swedish stock, eldest of nine and the determination of my Mom, eldest of four girls, Canadian born of English stock.

I was ready! The special shoes were on my feet, and a bowling ball waiting on the return rack.

After Mr.Kadd helped me set up ten pins I ran to the bowlers area. I was over whelmed with excitement. I had watched players many times so I knew exactly what to do. First, being right handed, I inserted my right thumb into the large ring of white chalk that was resting in a tray by the score table. I carefully rubbed the white chalk on my thumb several times, then withdrew my thumb and proceeded to wipe the chalked thumb on the slightly used towel that hung on a ring next to the chalk. Next I picked up the ball and slowly inserted my fingers and thumb into the holes. Then I lined my self up on the run way took aim, and started walking towards the alley-gutter line. I was swinging the ball like the pendulum on a clock and threw it forward. It landed with a thud, thought surely I broke the lane, but not so. The ball started rolling towards the pins, the ball hit some pins, the pins fell over. Oh what a thrill! I did it! My first ball knocked down some pins. I loved it! I will always remember that moment. This was a Thrill that will last me a lifetime and my cost was 10 cents.

After two years of practice and lessons my skills had improved enough to join the adult ranks of bowlers. In 1947, at the age of 16, Mom signed the required release to let me join WIBC and my first league - a continuation of that Life Time Thrill.

As I step on to the approach to address the current set of ten pins, the reflections I see in the lane dressing remind me of my 56 years with WIBC and USBC. My affiliation with leagues, tournaments, and administrative levels in the bowling communities of Illinois and California are just another continuation of that Life Time Thrill I received for 10 cents.

National Deaf Bowling News

Goodloe Beats Collier in 25th SN-CDBA Elimination at Sunset Station

HENDERSON—The 25th anniversary So. Nevada-California Deaf Bowling Association Tournament held at Sunset Station Hotel Casino and Bowling Center in Las Vegas suburb of Henderson drew 26 teams, 51 doubles, 102 singles and 76 individual entries for its prestigious Handicap Deaf Eliminations. Because of the nation’s economic condition which affected some bowlers, the numbers were lower than previous years but some scoring records were broken in some events.

There was a 300 game rolled by Las Vegas’ Joey Harris in the team event, a 945 team record scratch game by So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers A four-some team, a record high handicap winning team score 2954 by a pick-up team Strong Heartz, a record doubles game 558, scratch doubles series 1474 and handicap doubles series 1591 by Darrell Stogryn and Ed Abakumoff of So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers and a record Deaf Eliminations handicap 4 games qualifying series 1128 by Bob Bergan of Whittier, CA.

All these will get their names printed in SN-CDBA records book for others in future to beat.

In the Saturday afternoon Deaf Eliminations qualifying round Bergan with 166 average rolled gamed of 189-226-244-213for 872 plus his 256 handicap for the record 1128 which surpassed the old record of 1077 made in 2007 by Raul Fuentez.

The eventual runner-up Ralph Collier, Hawaii, a two time (1995 & 2001) Deaf Eliminations champion placed 2nd with the high scratch series 927 (238-234-237-218) plus 180 handicap for 1087 which also broke the old record. Derek I. Gredinger III, Glendale, AZ placed 3rd with 204-174-252-246/876 plus 196/1072.

Joey Harris, LV was the only other bowler besides Collier with a 900, hitting 259-2149236-198/907 plus 124/1031and Hawaiian Nicholas Rivera shot the qualifying high game 287 in his 888 series and 1024 with handicap. The eventual winner Brian Goodloe, Moreno Valley qualified in 5th place with 1039.The cut off score for top 48 for the first round match play was 901.

After the Sunday afternoon 3 one game Match play Gredinger III grabbed the lead with a 706 scratch series winning two matches for a total of a new record 1985 including handicap (old record 1963 by Fuentez). A N. Las Vegas 145 average woman Jackie Talamantes who qualified in 15th place with 983, rolled a 602 series winning her all three matches to leap up to 2nd place with 1930 total.

High Qualifier Bergan dropped to 3rd place with 1923, Collier 4th with 1917 and Goodloe kept his 5th place with 1913. Daniel Vasquez has the round’s high 3 games series 730 with 1781 total in 17th place followed by Ed A bakumoff’s 728 and 1770 total in 18th as the low score for the cut-off 24thplace for

the next match plays which is for two games, was 1751.

At the end of two rounds of two games match plays, Gredinger III retained first place and seeded into the semi-finals while a dark horse Robert Scott, Jr. Rialto, CA sneaked up into 2nd place and 2nd seed into Semi-finals. Bowlers from 3rd place to 6th place had to battle in one game matches for positions in semi finals.

Bergan who finished in 3rd was matched against 6th place Collier and Collier won 207 plus 40/247 to Bergan’s 178 plus 64/242. Fourth place Goodloe was matched against 5th place Harris and defeated Harris 160 plus 66/226 to 181 plus 31/212. Collier moved into semi finals against Gredinger III and beat him 246 plus 40/286 to 196 plus 49/245 to move into his third title finals. Meanwhile Goodloe moved to face Scott, Jr. in other semi-finals and beat Scott, Jr. 232 plus 66/298 to 150 plus 66/216.

In the championship finals a hot Collier started off with 4 strikes while Goodloe had shaky start and regained his composure started striking out from 5th frame on for a 222. Collier was hurt by a split in 8th frame and finished with a 244. The final tally was Goodloe as champion with plus 66/288 and Collier as runner up with plus 40/284.

Next week will be with doubles, singles. all-events and team winners.

LAS VEGAS—The True Amateur Tournament February event did better than expected.

With the economy in a downward spiral, the TAT had almost 4000 entries (3984). Shawn Ryan from New Port Rickey, Florida was our big \$25,000 main event winner. 2nd place winner of \$15,000 went to Mike Colby, Agawan, Maine, 3rd place Jim Wolcott (\$10,000), from Henderson TN, 4th place \$5000 was Nick O'Malley from Clondaldin, Dublin, Ireland.

Amateur Bowlers from all over the world once again ascended on Las Vegas to participate in the TAT Amateur Tournament. They received as always, real value for their entry fee. Tat had more International bowlers than ever with the biggest group from Ireland 16 bowlers.

All Bowlers received FREE Ebonite's performance bowling ball, NVD from Ebonite with their first entry. (TAT gave away hundreds of high performance Ebonite balls to bowlers). The single entry fee also paid for the - \$20,000+ Chance Tournaments, the sweepers, the \$30,000 Ebonite Challenge, and the main Tournament prize fund with \$55,000 being paid to the Top 4.

TAT had Guaranteed minimum's of \$500 for making the finals. If you entered with Big Bucks, all finalists received an additional \$500 for making the finals. (\$1000 for making the finals daily leaders received \$1250.) 232 bowlers paid the \$100 to get the \$500 added money and 83 bowlers @ \$500 each who had the Big Bucks made the finals. Bowlers paid \$23,200 and received back \$41,500, another TAT First.

The Chance tournaments had 144 winners, the sweepers had 88 plus 6 bonuses in 3 separate division payoffs, the Ebonite Challenge had 17 cash winners and the main event had 134 checks of \$500 to \$25,000. TAT gave out 389 prizes (mostly cash) to 484 bowlers which is a 4 out of 5 cash ratio with many checks over \$1000. This doesn't include side pots or brackets.

134 bowlers made it to the finals and even with the marathon entries counting as .5 an entry, one in 11 by squads (mostly daily cuts) made the finals. Partly because the marathon bowlers keep bowling after they make the finals and add more bowlers. Cash prizes increased in each round of the finals with two thirds of the checks well over \$1000. 1 out of 4 bowlers made it to the main event finals and almost 50% made it to either the Ebonite Challenge or the main event finals.

It was an exciting week as 3 different tournament players bowled perfect games. Bowlers who used an Ebonite ball when rolling 300 like Joel Reynoso received an extra \$1000 bonus.

The new Buddies Mystery Score paid out over \$15,000 to over a two dozen different bowlers. All money left over was drawn and given away in the finals (over \$5000).

The Ebonite Challenge paid 17 cash spots with last cash of \$100. (all participants received a second Ebonite Performance ball -The Pin Slasher). The winner was Mike Wilk from California for \$5000. The other top four were paid \$1,000 each and were, (2) Omar Arnett from Texas, (3) Art Nutley from Illinois (4) Tim Bonneville from Arizona (5) and Vaughn Doody from Nevada. This event has a \$10 entry fee and all Qualifiers received a second Performance Ball by Ebonite (Pin Slasher). Where else can you bowl for \$5,000 for a \$10 entry fee?

The 4 Chance Tournaments had 144 winners. The 4 free events paid out \$21,000 with last cash of \$100. Winners were, #1 Chris Klerk from Arizona , winner #2 Evan Castillo from Nevada, #3 Larry Hoffman from Arizona, and #4 was Alan Gibbons from Ireland. The 3 sweepers paid out over \$20,000 with most bowlers receiving 2 ½ price sweeper entries with any multiple entries. The sweepers had \$6,000 added money from the sponsors and paid out great by the 3 divisions.

The Ebonite Demo Days ran from the 1st through the 7th of Feb. and many bowlers who did well used the Demo Days and the Ebonite staff to help them get the right ball reaction. Ed Gallagher, Mike Calderon, Shawn Morris and Todd Zenner and all their staff deserve special thanks from all of us at TAT and from the hundreds of bowlers who utilized their services.

TAT would also like to thank Etonic. Etonic gave away 32 high performance pairs of shoes to the bowlers in the 4 Chance Tournaments. They increased our prize fund by adding 32 spots for the shoe giveaway.

We at TAT would like to thank the bowlers who participated and our sponsors, especially Ebonite, Buddies Pro Shop.com, Etonic, Verve, K & K Bowling Supply, Enterprise rent-a-car and The Orleans whom without their support, we could not have these multiple prize funds with so many ways to cash. 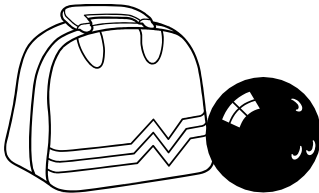

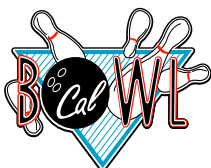
