Bohn Wins PBA Players Championship in Overtime, Ties Roth with 34th Title

Strike on second sudden-death shot ends dramatic championship match

INDIANAPOLIS – Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J., struck on his second shot in sudden-death to win the Professional Bowlers Association Players Championship at Woodland Bowl, earning his 34th career title and moving into a tie for fifth place on the all-time PBA career titles list with legendary star Mark Roth. The finals aired Sunday on ESPN.

Bohn, a PBA Hall of Famer, rebounded from a pocket 7-10 split in the first frame of the championship match, throwing nine strikes on his next 11 shots to tie hometown favorite Ronnie Russell of nearby Marion, 237-237, at the end of 10 frames. The 51-year-old lefthander then threw two strikes in the one-ball sudden-death roll-off, defeating Russell when the Indiana native struck on his first attempt, but left a 10 pin on his second shot.

'I was only 16 when I met Mark Roth," Bohn said, "and I had no idea I'd be standing here tied with him with 34 titles. He obviously got there much faster than I did, but when you think about Roth, he single-handedly revolutionized the sport. Anyone who hooks the ball today does it because of what Mark did in the late 1960s and '70s. I couldn't be happier to share this distinction with him."

Roth, who was in Indianapolis for the anniversary TOC weekend, said, "It was just a matter of time before Parker caught up with me. We went about it in different ways, but guy to do it."

Walter Ray Williams Jr. is the all-time PBA Tour titles leader with 47, followed by the late Earl Anthony with 43, and Norm Duke and Pete Weber who are tied for third with 37 each. Among left-handed players, Bohn trails only Anthony in career titles.

Bohn, who qualified No. 1 for the Players Championship finals two weeks earlier in Milwaukee, said he had an issue with his grip in the first few frames, but "once I figured out how to keep my hand dry, I was in good shape."

Bohn also accomplished another personal goal with his

"I've been coming to Woodland Bowl for 34 years, and I don't have a championship banner hanging up here," Bohn said of the bowling center's tradition of recognizing its past champions. "I've been assured that after tonight, my banner will be hanging up

As rewarding as the victory was for Bohn, it was equally disappointing for Russell, who was trying for his third PBA Tour title. Leaving a 10 pin standing on his second shot in the 10th frame denied him an outright win against Bohn, and his seventh 10 pin in two games ended his dream of winning in front of his family and hometown fans.

"This is the second time I've finished second at Woodland," Russell said. "It's heart-

round with a 225-212 victory over PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla., and he then eliminated red-hot Australian two-handed star Jason Belmonte, 245-227 in the second match. In winning that match, Daugherty denied Belmonte a shot at a PBA recordtying third consecutive title (he had previously won the USBC Masters and 50th anniversary Barbasol PBA Tournament of Champions), and he ended Belmonte's streak of 13 consecutive match wins on television, three shy of the PBA record set by Jim Pencak between 1989 and 1991.

Russell ended Daugherty's bid for a second PBA Tour title, 216-214, with a clutch strike on his first shot in the 10th frame of the semifinal match.

The PBA Tour on ESPN continues next Sunday when the finals of the Mark Roth/ Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship airs at 1 p.m. ET. The Baker-format doubles finals - in which teammates will bowl alternate frames - will include top qualifiers and defending champions Duke and Wes Malott, Pflugerville, Texas; Dino Castillo, Carrollton, Texas, and Daugherty; Belmonte and continued on page 2

JUANITA BLOCKER

"A TRAILBLAZER" 07-15-1918-02-17-2015

Our dear friend Juanita Julia Blocker was born July 15, 1918 in Houston, Texas, Not. long after, Juanita's father James, gave up his career in show business, took a job with the railroad, and relocated in Los Angeles. Her mother Lenore and Juanita followed in 1921 and Juanita had called Los Angeles "home" ever since.

In her early years, Juanita showed evidence of a born athlete. By the time she graduated from Jefferson High School in 1936, Juanita had been a member of the Track, Basketball, Softball, Volleyball and the Tennis teams. Besides being an athlete Juanita showed her talent as a student leader and subsequently, was the first black student to be elected to the Jefferson High School Student Government. Juanita attended (LACC)Los Angeles City College played and coached Basketball and graduated in 1942 with a degree in Physical Education and Recreation and was immediately hired by the Los Angeles County Department of Parks & Recreation as one of their Leaders. Volleyball was one of the sports Juanita played and coached at the parks and, continued on page 8

Defending Champions Duke and Malott are Top Qualifiers for Sunday's Roth/Holman PBA Doubles Championship on ESPN

Telecast to feature three of the Tour's 'two-handed' players

INDIANAPOLIS -- The PBA Tour brings back its traditional doubles format when the Mark Roth/Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship finals air Sunday (March 1) at 1 p.m. ET on ESPN.

Named in honor of PBA legends Mark Roth and Marshall Holman who won three doubles titles together during their Hall of Famer careers, the Doubles Championship returns to the PBA Tour for the first time since 2011 with defending champions Norm Duke, a PBA Hall of Famer and owner of 37 PBA Tour titles, and nine-time Tour winner Wes Malott trying to repeat from their position as top qualifiers. The finals take place at Woodland Bowl in Indianapolis.

Four other doubles pairs, including three of the Tour's twohanded players, will battle it out in the alternate frame stepladder final beginning with international standouts Dom Barrett of England and two-hander Osku Palermaa of Finland meeting Texans DJ Archer and two-hander Shawn Maldonado in the opening

Both Barrett and Palermaa will be trying for their fifth Tour titles while Archer will be trying for his second Tour title and Maldonado his first in his television debut.

The winner of the opening match will take on the powerful doubles team of Bill O'Neill and two-hander and two-time reigning PBA Player of the Year Jason Belmonte. Belmonte, who re-

cently won a record third consecutive USBC Masters and then became the first player to win both the Masters and Tournament of Champions in back-to-back seasons, will be making his fourth consecutive television appearance.

The Australian two-handed star will be trying to win his third title of the young 2015 season and 13th of his career. Belmonte kept his TV streak going with a fourth-place finish in last Sunday's PBA Players Championship. O'Neill, whose last title came in the 2014 Badger Open, will be trying for his sixth Tour title.

The second match winner will take on the team of Tom Daugherty of Tampa, Fla. and Dino Castillo of Carrollton, Texas in the semifinal. Daugherty is making his second consecutive TV appearance after finishing third in the Players Championship. He will be trying for his second career title. Castillo will try for his first PBA Tour title.

The semifinal winner will then take on Duke and Malott who won the doubles championship in 2011 by defeating the doubles team of Ronnie Russell and Sean Rash in the championship match, 193-167. Currently tied with Pete Weber on the PBA's all-time titles list.

Duke will be trying to move into third alone if he gets his 38th win. Malott will be trying for his 10th career title which would make him eligible for PBA Hall of Fame consideration in the future.

After some practice and a few tips from Williams, Brauckman beat the PBA's all-time titles leader (47) in a one-game match, 213-206.

"He's the best ever in my opinion," said Brauckman, who carries a 176 average. "I've always admired his game and how he throws the ball. Just to be able to bowl with him was great, but to beat him was something I didn't expect."

Prior to the match, Brauckman had a brand new Brunswick ball drilled with some help from Williams and then it was off to the lanes to try it out.

"When he said he was a 176 average, I didn't believe it," Williams said. "He's got everything you want at his age – great fundamentals, ball control, timing. Like all of us, he probably needs to make sure not to forget to work on the spares, but I was pretty surprised at how well he threw the ball."

The spare advice was well-taken as Matt missed a 10 pin in the 10th frame, even though he still won the match.

Brauckman bowls in a youth league and is an avid tournament bowler in Iowa. Last year he finished ninth in his division in the Iowa State Youth BA singles. Brauckman was accompanied to Indianapolis by his mother Karen, father Douglas and teammate Tyler Mohr.



of course, in those days the nets were held by portable Volley Ball Standards. After suffering an injury from a fallen standard, Juanita invented a safety device to secure the standards, for which she received a monetary award. Those devices were then installed in all Los Angeles County playgrounds and centers. Besides coaching sports, Juanita possessed a talent in art projects and writing. Under her close eye and tutoring her students would many times, come away with First Place Blue Ribbons from the Los Angeles County Fair in Pomona for their artwork and poetic writings.

The sport of bowling came into the picture in the 1940's when while attending LACC, Juanita would often go into what was then, Vogue Bowl at 49th & Central, and spectate the bowlers. It wasn't long before she was convinced "I can do that" and thus the beginning of Juanita's bowling career, and, first encounter with a sports headliner. During one of her practice sessions, a huge black gentleman stepped up and offered to coach her. Lo and behold, it was none other than Joe "The Brown Bomber" Lewis, the heavy-weight boxer. Lewis who owned an east coast bowling alley (as they were called then), hung out at Vogue Bowl with a close friend Ernest Whitman, a professional singer and movie actor. Juanita loved "this game" and proved to be one of the few black women to average 185 and better. The Parent Senate of the (TNBA) The National Bowling Association was formed in 1939 and Juanita joined the organization in hopes to use her bowling talents to open some doors for the TNBA. Unfortunately, until well into the 1950's the black bowling athlete received little recognition and no opportunity to take their sport to a professional level.

Although Juanita pursued her game of bowling, she remained involved in other sports, because if you were good, you made the team. She was recruited to a women's professional basketball team sponsored by the popular "Dad's Rootbeer". Their team traveled up and down the coast of California and as far away as Phoenix, Arizona, competing against women military teams. As far as Juanita knew, they were the only black female team in this travel league. Juanita recalled the excitement when with the influence of singer Nat King Cole and Charlotte Bass, owner of the California Eagle Newspaper, (later known as the Los Angeles Sentinel), their team received an invitation to play the pre-game show to the famous Harlem Globe Trotters at the Los Angeles Olympic Stadium.

When basketball season was over, Juanita spent more time on her bowling game but was also playing shortstop and second base for the California Eaglettes, a Los Angeles Parks & Recreation Women's Softball Team. They were sponsored by the California Eagle Newspaper and Nat King Cole. Juanita held a batting average of 275-285 and was largely feared by her opponents for her "steal-and-slide" techniques. Juanita utilized her talent for the game and coached other players. One particular player she coached was non other than Richard Williams, father of the well-known professional Tennis Stars, Venus and Selena Williams, of Compton, California. Unfortunately, all that vigorous activity took its toll and she was later in life reminded every day by the pain she endured in both her ankles. Juanita played Tennis as well. She was third-seated to the then well known, Pauline (Bobbie) Betz, a Wimbleton Champion. In fact, Juanita held the honor of being the only player who then could beat Betz. Ironically, Juanita was coached by none other than.... Pauline's mother, Stella Betz!

Prior to 1950, (ABC), the American Bowling Congress, and the (WIBC) Women's International Bowling Congress Rules banned non-caucasians from bowling in their events, but that did not discourage Juanita from becoming a bowler of note. She knew the game well and wanted to become a Certified Bowling Instructor. While working as the Manager for Studio Bowling Academy, Los Angeles, (since closed) owner Victor Bernath sent her to Instructor's School where she was tutored by the best; National Hall of Famer Buddy Bomar, Bill Bunetta and California's own, Helen Duval. It wasn't long after that Georgia Veach, Founder and President of the (PWBA) Professional Women's Bowling Association accepted Juanita's application for membership. She had the honor of being the first black woman member of the PWBA on the west coast during the 1950's and 1970's. Juanita applied for sponsorship from AMF, but they were not sending black bowlers on tour, so armed with a 189 average and the sponsorship of PWBA members, Donna Zimmerman and Merle Matthew (since deceased), Juanita put her busy schedule on hold and hit the "pro trail" as a member of the Greater Los Angeles Women's Traveling League. The schedule required visiting 28 different centers per season, which at that time, was no easy task. Bill Stennis, owner of the well-known Golden Bird Restaurant chain, sponsored their team and Juanita proudly recalled bowling with teammate Georgia Veach and crossing lanes with the famous bowling pro Marion Ladewig. While traveling to tournaments across the United States Juanita endured anxieties and indignities most of us cannot even imagine. Times when she could not practice bowling until after midnight until all "other" bowlers were through. She was unable to eat at the bowling alley café counter where the "other" bowlers were seated. Juanita was blessed with an innate understanding of the times and the importance of which it took to break barriers. And, she did. Juanita set numerous records. Over300-400 trophies, medals, plaques, certificates, ribbons, and more. The first 720 series she shot at Hollywood Legion Lanes, (since closed) held top honors with WIBC for some time.

Following her pro tours, Juanita devoted herself to all other facets of the bowling game. She was the resident Certified Instructor from 1971 to 1981 at Southwest Bowl at Western and Imperial, (which has since closed). Many of her students were from Southwest College across the street, several who were of foreign cultures and had little athletic ability. Although there was a language barrier, Juanita made her actions speak for her and helped pave the way for those youth to be able to enjoy the game anywhere. Juanita was instrumental in convincing the Los Angeles Board of Education to give grade credits to high school and college students who attended her classes.

In 1961 Juanita joined the Los Angeles "600" Bowling Club and was eventually elected to their Board of Directors. In 1962 she was elected to the Board of Directors of the Los Angeles Women's Bowling Association (LAWBA). Although Juanita was a "natural" in any sport she engaged in, she also possessed a wonderful talent for writing about sports. She was handsomely rewarded in many areas. In 1963 she was given her own sports column which appeared weekly in the Los Angeles Sentinel Newspaper for over 35 years. In all that time, she remained the devoted publicist to her Los Angeles organizations and the TNBA. It was during this same era that Los Angeles Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, (since deceased), presented Juanita with a "Writ of Commendation" for the poems and odes she composed about the newly dedicated Olympic Style Swimming Stadium at Will Rogers Park. It was this same year, while still managing Studio Bowling Academy that the Annual Press Conference and the Los Angeles Sentinel voted Juanita as the "Woman of the Year in Sports". In 1987, when she retired from the Parks and Recreation, she received "Special Recognition from Los Angeles Mayor Tom Bradley and Councilman Gilbert Lindsay, for all the dedication she had shown to bringing out the talents of the children she had coached in sports and tutored in art projects. In 1988, she was the first black member inducted into the LAWBA Hall of Fame and was made a Member Emeritus. In 1999, Juanita was elected to the Southern California Bowling Writers Hall of Fame. In 2004, she received the "Distinguished Service Award" from the United States Bowling Congress (USBC), California Association.

Bowling was still Juanita's life as she entered the "golden years". I can remember that when she celebrated her 86th birthday in 2004, she was still bowling

in 2004, she was still bowling two leagues a week, and with her 140 average, continued to be extremely competitive and you could bet on her to win a side pot now and again.

Even though the past five or six years, Juanita was looked after in an Assisted Living Facility, she never failed to keep up on all the news in the bowling arena. She was dearly grateful to Carol Mancini, Editor/Publisher of the California Bowling News for sending the weekly issue to her by USPS. And, when I called her, on an average of every other day, she was watching one of the Williams girls in a Tennis match. Or, if I couldn't reach her, she later informed me she was in the Recreation Room playing Dominos and more than often would add," I won a couple of matches today". And, more importantly, Juanita never ended our conversations without sending her regards to my husband..... "Give Phil a Hug For Me"

Juanita left us peacefully in her sleep and on her terms.... working gallantly her entire life to prove to all of us that she truly was a "trailblazer" and that we could be proud of the legend she left us with. She was put to rest beside her mother Lenore, Tuesday, February 24th at Angelus Rosedale Cemetary, Los Angeles. Goodbye Dear, Dear Friend...

Glass, Peters, Wilt Inducted into PBA Hall of Fame

INDIANAPOLIS - PBA Senior standout Bob Glass, former PBA owner Chris Peters and longtime PBA staff member Barb Wilt were inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame Class of 2015 Tuesday evening at the Marriott Indianapolis North in conjunction with the 50th anniversary Barbasol PBA Tournament of Champions.

Glass was elected in the PBA50 Performance category while Peters and Wilt were recognized in the Meritorious Service category for their extraordinary contributions behind the scenes to advance

Glass, one of the first true power players on the PBA50 Tour, competed as a senior between 1997 and 2007 when he won nine titles and finished in the top five 38 times in 78 tournaments, earning just shy of a half-million dollars. He won a pair of majors - the 2000 Brunswick PBA Senior Championship and 2001 United States Bowling Congress Seniors Masters - and earned PBA50 Player of the Year honors in 2000, 2001 and 2004.

'The Senior Tour was an opportunity to do something I always wanted to do," Glass said. "It has provided a lot of guys like me an opportunity to combine their career with the tremendous experience of bowling competitively at a high level and meeting a lot of wonderful people. I miss bowling and the people.

"I'm a very analytical person, but through bowling on the Senior Tour I learned the importance of intuition," he continued during his acceptance speech. "I also learned that there were similarities between bowling on the Senior Tour and my regular job. Success is gained not only through experience but also from the knowledge and what I could learn from young people.'

Glass, 67, who holds a PhD in economics and has a law degree, lives in Lawrence, Kansas, and currently is Chief of Economics and Rates with the Kansas Corporation Commission in nearby Topeka.

Peters, an early employee of Microsoft who later became an executive with the company, led the effort to purchase the PBA with partners and fellow Microsoft executives Mike Slade and Rob

Peters and his partners provided an infusion of capital to ensure a solid foundation for the organization while at the same time providing vision and innovative ideas to enhance the fan experience especially in the areas of event presentation and online coverage. The introduction of a professionally-designed "arena" style set for TV finals, including professional presentation of signage and an overall enhanced image, helped the PBA generate more new non-bowling corporate sponsorships than the PBA had seen in several years.

Peters also introduced Strike Pass, the forerunner of PBA's online bowling channel Xtra Frame, and the PBA Exempt Tour creating an "elite" tour to better showcase PBA Tour players and provide the Tour's most successful players with guaranteed opportunities to make a living by including increased prize money for standard events.

'First, I share this honor with Mike and Rob and couldn't have done it without them," Peters said. "When the opportunity presented itself (to purchase the PBA) all I could think of was how wasteful it would have been for this prestigious 40-year-old sports organization to just go away. My motivation was to prevent something so valuable from being just tossed away."

Wilt, who joined the PBA staff in 1970, retired to North Carolina in 2014 after 44 years of service to the organization. Her duties ranged from processing all PBA Tour entries to managing all of the PBA's statistical records, and virtually every other hands-on office chore over her extensive

When the PBA was sold in 2000, the new owners asked Wilt to assist with the transition to the new headquarters in Seattle, so she moved to Seattle and continued to work to make improvements in membership, entries and statistical processes.


When a 20-year-old walks into the PBA for the first time it's just a job, but it would become much more than that," Wilt said. "More than 40 years later this is the last place I imagined I would

Twice during her tenure with PBA, Wilt had left the organization but was asked to return when her replacements didn't work out.

"I did a job I loved to do, and worked with great people and terrific athletes," she added. "I'm especially grateful to have had the opportunity to work with (PBA founder) Eddie Elias and all the commissioners who followed him."

She was the face of the PBA among most of its thousands of members over four-plus decades, providing a familiar and friendly voice to help them with their needs, and she was conduit between PBA's national and regional tournament directors in bridging the gap between the office and the road. She also became the organization's unofficial historian and served as a guardian of old records, photographs and historical information.

Also during the ceremony, emcee Nelson Burton Jr., paid tribute to his fellow Hall of Famer Chuck Pezzano who died Jan. 23 at the age of 86. Pezzano, a PBA charter member and bowling historian was widely recognized as the dean of bowling journalists among many other accomplishments in the sport.

Previously I have addressed the complaints about handicaps, one team vs another, as being outrageously high even though the same handicap percentage applies to everyone. Also, the misunderstanding of team maximums in scratch leagues and the concept of 'bringing in a ringer'.

Bowlers are concerning themselves with the idea that teams have been put together to gang up on the rest of the league not realizing bowlers may be rerated after an absence to the sport or are simply improving their skills.

In order to do that, we would have to pay extremely high fees every week and not many are willing.

I have always maintained that if I had to bowl for a living I would starve. What is your opinion? You may want to share it with your league officers or center manager. Just sayin'!
