

INDIANAPOLIS – A month shy of his 55th birthday, PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla., defeated top qualifier Jason Belmonte of Australia, 237-219, to win his 39th PBA Tour title in the Go Bowling! PBA Indianapolis Open Sunday at Woodland Bowl.

Duke, who is third on the all-time PBA Tour titles list behind Walter Ray Williams Jr.'s 47 and Earl Anthony's 43, never trailed after starting the title match with three strikes and then converting the 4-9 split. Belmonte, who entered the finals as the top qualifier for a record-tying third consecutive tournament, kept the match close throughout, but when the Australian two-handed player left the 3-10 split on his first shot of the 10th frame, all Duke needed to clinch was seven pins in his 10th frame.

Duke immediately turned to Belmonte, who led the stepladder qualifiers by nearly 400 pins, and said, "We've been watching you dominate us, and we know it hurts to lose. We've all been through it enough, but I'll never forget this as long as I live."

Duke, who hadn't won a singles title since the 2012 PBA Dick Weber Playoffs – also at Woodland Bowl – said he knew he'd win again. His doubles win with Malott in 2015 also was at Woodland, where he now has had more success than any other PBA player.

"I was in control," Duke said. "I've been there before. I knew what to do. It was hard, but the shot was there and the stepladder format gives you a chance to win, so I'm grateful for that chance".

"I always believed I'd win again," he said. "The first game I ever bowled on television was against Earl Anthony, and I won. In my mind, Jason's the best ever, in spades. I feel for him, because I've been there, but for me, I get to say I bowled Earl, and Walter, and Pete, and I beat 'em all."

Belmonte said, "Today I watched my idol (Duke) bowl the most impressive game against me. I tried my best to keep up, but a few stubborn corner pins...ended my chances. Norm's a treasure."

Duke earned his trip to the title match with a 214-195 victory over his two-time Mark Roth-Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship partner, Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, when Malott left a solid 10 pin on his first shot in the 10th frame. Duke's early turkey gave his an 18-pin lead in the fourth frame, but Malott then doubled and chipped away as Duke failed to carry key pocket hits. When Duke left a 10 pin on his last shot in the 10th frame, Malott had a chance to strike out to win by a pin, but failed to carry his first attempt in the 10th.

In the first match, after leaving a 2-8-10 split and failing to convert in the opening frame, Malott reeled off a string of seven strikes and cruised past Rhino Page of Orlando, Fla., 242-192. Malott then rallied to eliminate Tom Daugherty of Riverview, Fla., 174-170, by throwing four strikes in a row to end a match that saw Daugherty leave continued on page 4

However, if you've followed all the signs presented by the International Olympic Committee, this move should come as little surprise.

to appeal to younger people, especially as it relates to television audiences. Bowling simply doesn't yet deliver the younger demographic the Olympics and advertisers crave.

The PBA Tournament of Champions broadcast on FOX drew an overall audience of 1,131,000 viewers, according to ShowBuzz-Daily.com. Of those who watched, only about 21 percent were in the 18-49 age bracket.

That number pales in comparison to some other sports like, for example, the NBA, which often has closer to 50 percent of its audience in the coveted 18-49 age range.

If you need further proof

the Olympics is looking for an infusion of young viewers, simply look at the sports that were put forward by Paris 2024 as demonstration sports.

Breakdancing (aka "breaking"), surfing, sport climbing and skateboarding were all selected. The IOC will have the ultimate decision whether to approve those recommendations by the end of the year.

So, after being snubbed by Tokyo for 2020 and Paris for 2024, is all hope lost for the sport of bowling? Absolutely not.

The sport has made some big strides recently, including the PBA's new television deal with FOX that provides more prominent coverage for the sport. If the PBA can start to deliver a consistent, younger audience that advertisers crave, it will be incredibly positive for the sport's future.

One way to do that is to build up the sport's young stars and personalities and introduce them to new, younger audiences to get them engaged in the sport. The coverage by TMZ

and Barstool Sports recently of Kyle Troup and his unique style is a perfect example of this. We just need more of it more often. In the meantime, what can you, the everyday bowler do to help the cause? Engage your friends, neighbors and fellow bowlers to become more active on social media, sharing stories on the sport and watching the televised events.

The larger, and younger, the audience bowling can deliver, the more likely the Olympics will one day be interested.

And when they come calling, we'll be ready.

A Lifetime of Professionalism Thank You Note Reveals The Moral Quality of Leanne Hulsenberg At An Early Age

For most bowlers a thank you note to a tournament sponsor is an afterthought, and only thought about after said bowler has won the event. That's why when I received a thank you note from rookie sensation Leanne Barrette way back in 1987, I knew that greatness in bowling was etched upon her soul.

She was not the winner of the Seagram's Coolers U.S. Open at AMF Major League Lanes in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, but the fact that she took the time to write a thank you note spoke volumes about the nineteen-yearold phenom from Fremont, California.

Wait, did I say Fremont, California? Most people associate the early years of Leanne Hulsenberg's (nee Barrette) career to Oklahoma City, but it turns out that she developed her craft at the famous Cloverleaf Family Bowl in Fremont. When the General Motors plant in Fremont closed down, her father chose to stay with the company and relocate the family to Oklahoma City.

Those early years of youth bowling at the Cloverleaf Family Bowl served Hulsenberg very well. She would continue a lifelong relationship with proprietor Mike Hillman, son of co-founder Allan Hillman, who along with Don Hillman opened the popular facility some 60 years ago. The bowling center has been in the news recently, as it fights for survival against a group of developer's intents on making the property yet another site for luxury condos.

There's an old adage in life that states "everything happens for a reason," or something to that effect. The move to Oklahoma City probably didn't make sense to young Hulsenberg in 1983, but it afforded her an opportunity to forge new friends like Carol Norman and Gary Dickinson in the Sooner State and advance her bowling prowess to the next level.

Leanne's legendary career on the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) tour began with three titles and a Rookie of the Year award in 1987. She went on to record thirteen wins in just the first 5 years of her professional career.

In 18 years on the professional circuit, Hulsenberg amassed 26 titles before the PWBA ceased operations in 2003. Along the way she also won a United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Queens event, five USBC national titles (singles, doubles, team and two all-events), the PWBA Bowler of the Year on three different occasions, and the coveted U.S. Open in 2011.

What could have happened to her career if the PWBA had continued operations? "I'd like to think that I had a few more titles in me," said the self-effacing Hulsenberg in a recent telephone interview.

When I talked with Leanne by telephone, I was reminded of the time that I spent with Dick Weber while working for AMF and utilizing him for grand openings, re-openings and exhibitions. Mr. Weber had that same quality of just making you feel at home when you were around him.

I mentioned that to Leanne as we talked and commented about her Facebook and Twitter pages, which say nothing about her unbelievable career, but instead focus on the accomplishments of others. She laughed, quietly of course.

Her relationship with Storm Bowling Products came not long after the birth of her son, Barrett. She and husband Gary were operating a pro shop at Steve Cook's Fireside Lanes in Citrus Heights, California, at the time. by Dave Williams

"With taxes and other expenses so high in California, we put together a 5-year plan to find an area of the country that was more beneficial to our needs of security and raising a family," said Leanne. "We like the slower pace in Utah."

Slower pace of living, perhaps, but not in terms of her duties with Storm Bowling Products. In her capacity as Marketing Coordinator, Leanne manages Storm's 85-plus sponsorships, tournaments and events, as well as coordinating Storm's trade shows, sales meetings and Storm University events.

One of the joys of her job is youth bowling. While we were talking Leanne mentioned that she was preparing for a trip to Las Vegas, and the latest rendition of the Storm Youth Championships, which encompasses 6 events throughout the nation. "This year we stop at Las Vegas, Rohnert Park, Calif., Nashville, Nebraska (site to be determined), Wichita, and Myrtle Beach," said Hulsenberg.

This comes on the heels of Leanne's partnering with Mike Hillman to form the California Youth Bowlers Tour many years ago. It would appear that Ms. Hulsenberg has learned the power of giving back to the community and offering the same opportunity that she had as a youth to thousands of others. I started this by commenting on the character and professionalism shown by Leanne at an early stage of her bowling career. Now it's my turn to return the favor, and write a thank you note to Leanne, one of the greatest bowlers the world has ever known.



2019 PBA League Draft Set for April 8 at Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine Seventh PBA League Elias Cup finals set for live coverage on FS1 July 16, 17 and 18

PORTLAND, Maine (Feb. 22, 2019) – For the past four years, tournament host Bayside Bowl in Portland has given the PBA League team bowling competition a jolt of electricity because of its exuberant fans and unique location. Now for the first time, Bayside fans will get a chance to see up close how the 2019 teams take shape when the PBA League Draft is held at Bayside Bowl on Monday, April 8.

The draft will be covered live on FloBowling, PBA's official online live-streaming outlet, beginning at 1 p.m.

Adding to the drama for the hometown fans, their own Portland Lumberjacks, managed by Tim Mack, will own the first pick by virtue of their last-place finish in the 2018 Elias Cup tournament.

Choosing second will be L.A. X, followed by the Brooklyn Styles, New York City Kingpins, Motown Muscle, Dallas Strikers, Philadelphia Hitmen and defending champion Silver Lake Atom Splitters. The serpentine draft will then find the Atom Splitters making the first selection of the second round.

In order to be eligible for the draft pool, PBA members must be ranked in the top 40 in the 2019 PBA competition points standings at the conclusion of the 2019 USBC Masters on April 1.

Leading up to the draft, each team manager will be allowed to protect and retain up to three members from current rosters regardless of their PBA Points standing, with those decisions made by March 25.

April 8 will be a big day for Portland's enthusiastic PBA fans who are invited to attend the PBAL Draft and stick around for the inaugural round of PBA Playoffs matches that will air later in the evening, live on FS1 at 7 p.m. Eastern. The PBA Playoffs is a new PBA Tour singles competition that will feature the season's top 24 players in competition points in a single-elimination match play series that will result in eight FS1 telecasts in April and May, leading up to the live FOX telecasts of the semifinal and final rounds on June 1 and 2. Bayside Bowl will host the entire PBA Playoffs series.

PBA League players will then return to Bayside Bowl where all rounds of the 2019 PBA League Elias Cup competition will take place July 16, 17 and 18, airing live for the first time on FOX Sports' FS1 in prime time.





Here's Another Reminder About Bowling Etiquette

by Fred Eisenhamme

When will bowlers learn?

One can never remind players enough about bowling etiquette. This may be an appropriate time for that reminder because many new bowlers are midway through their lengthy nine-month fall seasons and might still need a brush-up on manners.

As for those veteran bowlers who should know better . . . well, it doesn't hurt to hear this lecture again.

Remember, you're not bowling in a vacuum. There are bowlers all around you. If you forget everything else, just remember this: Be considerate.

Do you have a pet peeve about etiquette and courtesy when you bowl?

I have one.

When I release the ball at the foul line, oftentimes a bowler on an adjoining lane will thunder to my side and rifle his or her ball while I'm still tracking my shot and anticipating my upcoming pin action (or lack thereof).

It's easy to get startled by such an ill-mannered bowler . . . and annoyed. Why can't that bowler just wait a few seconds and allow me to watch my electrifying shot (thinking positively) before I triumphantly return to my seat?

The fact is that rudeness often prevails in a bowling house. It's rarely intentional, but it can produce a heart-stopping – and irritating – moment or two.

On the same topic, *perfectbowling.com*, a nifty website that provides bowling tips, advice and other interesting data, came up with its list of nine bowling rules for etiquette and courtesy.

So here goes – the etiquette rules from *perfectbowling.com*:

1 - The first rule in bowling is to never bother another bowler while they are in the process of bowling.

2-Bowlers on the right-hand lane have the right-of-way to bowl first.

3 - Never pick up your ball from the return rack while another bowler is preparing to bowl and is in his/her starting position.

Fred Eisenhammer: Also, don't start cleaning your ball while climbing onto a lane next to another bowler who is getting ready to bowl. It can be extremely distracting. In other words, don't be so eager to take your shot. The pins will still be standing!

- 4 Refrain from using obscenities or vulgar gestures.
- 5 After your shot, let others bowl.

Fred Eisenhammer: In other words, don't linger on the lane after your shot.

- **6** Wear proper shoes.
- 7 Keep food and other refreshments off the approach.
- 8 Remember, there are others waiting to bowl.

Fred Eisenhammer: In other words, don't wander off aimlessly . . . or socialize too long when your turn is about to arrive.

- 9 Above all else, have fun.
- I'll add Rule No. 10 to the list:

 $10-\mbox{Let}$ the bowler next to you complete his or her turn and walk back to his or her seat before you start your approach.

Of course, it's inevitable that some bowlers will slip up from time to time, so it's important not to get flustered if someone violates one of these rules.

No slamming your bowling ball on the lane in disgust. Distractions happen – even when pros are bowling.

Remember, it's just a game. So, enjoy it. And be a good citizen and let others enjoy it

- JEWEL CITY BOWL shut down the rumors that they were closing. Built in 1958 they are still in business, thanks to the Sands family.
- Robin Romeo opened a Pro Shop inside CANOGA PARK BOWL. Did she drill? Pictures say "yes".
- Herb "The Judge" Roth passed away after suffering a heart attack. What a guy!

In game two, 3 Olives Vodka more than made up the difference, and their momentum continued in the third game on their way to winning the match. Eric Snow led 3 Olives Vodka with 574. Ryan Cunningham was only four pins behind him with 570
