SPARTANBURG, S.C.—The roster of competitors for the inaugural Denny's All-American High School Championships is now complete with today's announcement by tournament sponsors of an elite group of 29 senior student-athletes chosen to compete in the March event. Denny's, the Professional Bowlers Association and the United States Bowling Congress made their final selections of the participants based on bowling accomplishments, academics and other criteria.

"The USBC is extremely pleased with the many talented candidates who submitted applications for the first Denny's All-American tournament," said Director of USBC High School and Collegiate, Jeanne Klescewski. "The decision making process wasn't easy, but we are confident the 29 student-athletes selected to compete represent the best in terms of bowling skill, academic achievement and citizenship. We look forward to an exceptional competition next month."

The elite field of 29 contains at least one representative from every varsity level state except New Mexico and Iowa. The 15 girls and 14 boys represent the best among student athletes, with a cumulative GPA of 3.67, and significant bowling experience. Twenty-three of the candidates have four years of competitive high school bowling; 21 have been team captain for at least one year; 14 are members of the National Honor Society and 10 have competed in the Junior Gold National Championship at least once. The full roster of participants is listed below.

"This is an exciting and rewarding project for Denny's," said Margaret Jenkins, Denny's Chief Marketing Officer. "We believe this tournament provides a wonderful opportunity to showcase the enormous talent that exists among high school bowlers."

"The high volume of applications we received and the impressive resumes of the 29 participants in the event prove the future of competitive bowling is very, very bright," said PBA Commissioner and CEO Fred Schreyer. "The PBA is thrilled to co-host this inaugural event and we look forward to watching the future stars of the Denny's PBA Tour compete on a national stage."

Lightning Strikes Twice

PARKERSBURG, W.V.— They say lightning never strikes twice in the same place, but on the Denny's PBA Tour, Emerson Lanes has been hit with a historic lightning bolt two years running.

Mike Mineman became just the second bowler in Tour history to win a title after advancing through the Denny's PBA Tour Qualifying Round, joining Sean Rash who became the first in last year's West Virginia Championship at Emerson Lanes.

Mineman, a 48-year-old journeyman who is a stark contrast to the 24-year-old Rash who won as a virtual unknown on Tour last year, defeated Mike Machuga, 223-202, Sunday to win the 2007 Bayer Classic for his first career title.

Emerson Lanes hosted a PBA Tour event in 1965 and then did not host another Tour stop until last season, when Rash came out of nowhere to win the title. Mineman was appearing in his 41st career Tour event and had never previously advanced past the Round of 16. He earned \$25,000 and an exemption for the 2007-08 season with the win.

"It's tough to go through that (Qualifying Round) on Wednesdays, but the gentlemen did it last year and paved the way and proved it could be done," said Mineman (Belleville, Ill.), who didn't even cash at Emerson Lanes last year. "It's just been a magical week. It's everything I ever thought it would be." The title match came down to the last frame despite Mineman leading throughout as Machuga had a chance to tie the match and send it to a one-ball sudden death roll-off.

Working on a four-bagger while Machuga was working on an open in the 7th, Mineman made a crucial mistake when he chopped the 4-pin off the 2-4-5 to let Machuga back in the match, and he responded with a double in the 8th and 9th.

After a nine-spare, Mineman struck out the 10th, forcing Machuga to strike out to tie. Machuga left the 10-pin with his first shot, however, to give Mineman the win.

Mineman advanced to the title match with a 217-178 win over Dale Traber. Traber led after four frames before splits in the 5th and 7th frames. Mineman took advantage with a double in the 6th and 7th to take the lead, then struck again in the 9th and 10th frames to move on to the title match.

In the first semifinal, Machuga defeated all-time Denny's PBA Tour title leader Walter Ray Williams Jr., 264-223. Machuga (Erie, Pa.) took home \$13,000 for second, while Traber (Cedarburg, Wis.) earned \$6,500 for third and Williams (Ocala, Fla.) earned \$5,500 for fourth.

Next week the Denny's PBA Tour heads to North Brunswick,

High School Championships is being held in conjunction with the Denny's PBA World Championship, March 24-25 in Grand Rapids, Mich. Immediately following the conclusion of the Denny's World Championship, the high school finalists will take to the lanes to compete for \$10,000 in scholarships on a PBA oil pattern and in an arena setting before more than 2,000 spectators.

They also will have a chance to team with professionals Kelly Kulick, the first female PBA exempt bowler, and Tony Reyes, a member of the Denny's PBA Sponsor Competition Team, for a one-game doubles match – girls against boys.

Medications For "Splits R Us" And Other Viruses - Part I

In the December and January issues (which I hope you cut out and saved as I suggested) we discussed the "Triax" Spare System. I published this because it has become extremely successful for those who use it. Since then, however, I've had further questions about picking up splits, so we'll answer those here.

First however, is a subject most bowlers need help with...namely, how best to avoid leaving splits in the first place.

Briefly, the answer is simple and it is this: When adjusting your feet and/or mark for drying lanes, always follow these three rules. 1-Always adjust earlier than necessary. 2-Adjust more often. 3-Always over-adjust slightly on purpose!

Why? Because it's better to hit the pocket slightly light than too high! High hits cause splits, as you know.

OK – Now to answer those who had questions. By now it is well known to most league and tournament bowlers that statistically, the touring pros who most often make the TV show are the ones who convert the most spares during the week. This fact is so for two primary reasons. First, all top professionals are great strike shooters or they wouldn't be where they are. Second, even one open frame on the TV show can often mean disaster, so spare conversion becomes increasingly important. So the difference between converting or missing a split or difficult spare often determines success or failure. **CRITICAL MEASUREMENTS** Some time ago we discussed some possible "fine tuning" adjustments for pocket hits based on pin spacing. Let's briefly borrow from that, just to re-familiarize ourselves. There's a 6" lateral spacing from center to center of the front V of pins. Let's add some

additional information needed for this technique: The diameter of a bowling ball averages very slightly above 8½ inches.

The diameter of a pin, at its practical widest point is approximately 4 ³/₄". (See the last couple of issues, describing the "Triax" spare system to verify this.

Although there's no rule requiring any specific number of boards across the width of a lane, 39 is what all current manufacturers are making.

41 to 42 inch width is regulation for all lanes. What all this means to us is that one board will usually be very slightly more than one inch wide. Given the lane and approach geometry based on these figures and assuming you always hit the mark at the arrows target area, the ball's impact point at the pins will change according to your foot adjustments as follows:

- A 1 board foot adjustment = 2 inches at the pins
- A 2 board foot adjustment = 4 inches at the pins
- A 3 board foot adjustment = 6 inches at the pins
 - THE RADICAL SPLIT ADJUSTMENT

Now we'll begin to see the reasons for all the statistics above. A bowling pin, if divided into five parts <u>laterally</u>, across the widest part of the pin, would have; left <u>edge</u>, left <u>side</u>, center, right <u>side</u>, right <u>edge</u>. Now, split shooting is a bit like billiards or pool...a round object hitting a round object. Success depends upon the ability to hit the correct part of the target object with the correct part of the propelled object. (That's one reason why champion pool players can run more perfect games than champion bowlers; the cue ball doesn't have to travel 60 plus feet.)

Let's take wide splits first (<u>not</u> including "unmakeable" splits such as the 7-10, 4-6, etc.). The majority of 200 plus bowlers tell me they adjust their feet one or two boards off their key pin (front pin) foot position for splits like the 4-10, 6-7, 2-10, 3-7, etc. They do this in an effort to hit that key pin off center on the <u>away side</u>, thus hoping to drive it into the far pin of the split.

The trouble is, that won't work and here's why:

It is the very <u>EDGE</u> of the key pin which must be hit, not just the side of it (with the edge of the ball of course). Just hitting the side won't work, because that would drive key pin <u>behind</u> the far pin, instead of into it.

The 'how' is simple. In such splits, simply shoot for the pin (standing or not) closest to and outside of the key pin (outside, in this context, means away from center of pin rack). Do this by adjusting the feet three boards instead of one or two, off the position you would use for the key pin itself. Example: for a 4-10 (or 4-7-10, 4-9, 4-7-9 or even 4-7-9-10) forget about adjusting to hit the left side of the 4 pin...your ball deflection angle won't be sufficient to get that 9 or 10 pin! So...simply adjust your feet to shoot the 7, just as if the split didn't exist. Sure, accuracy must be pretty deadly to convert such splits, but dead accuracy is needed for splits anyway. For splits such as this, it's almost impossible to hit the key pin thin enough to convert the far pin, unless you take this bold approach by shooting for that "phantom" pin (the 7 pin, in this case). The beauty of this tactic is that even if you're using a different spare system, it doesn't matter, as long as you know which board you ordinarily stand on to shoot for a given pin. This system has proved to consistently outperform the other method mentioned above.

THE REALLY STRAIGHT BALL

This leads us to another rather important point; namely, that a lot of intended "straight" balls thrown at spares, splits included, aren't really straight! Those that are, like Walter Ray Williams', are straight not just because of extra speed or reduced revs, but because they actually run end over end, so lane conditions are taken out of the picture. A "straight" ball which hooks half a board or so may make no difference in a single pin spare, it can definitely ruin a split conversion attempt. I mention this because in addition to splits, in most other off center spares (with very few exceptions) a <u>really</u> straight ball is of definite advantage. For those whose straight balls still hook slightly, developing the end over end straight ball may well be worth practicing!

Having said that, let's mention an exception, the 5-7 split (right handers only). According to the above technique, the 5-7 would require a straight 3 pin shot. However, standing 2 boards left of your strike position and throwing your strike ball to your strike mark will bring uncanny results. For the 5-10, however, the straight 2 pin shot is your best bet.

For left handers it's just the opposite...for the 5-10, stand 2 boards right of your strike position, throwing your strike ball to your strike mark. For you, the 5-7 is best converted with a straight 3 pin shot as the above system describes.

WASH-OUTS

Here most bowlers will throw a Brooklyn strike shot, which is acceptable, especially if additional pins are standing

BABY, BABY!

Baby splits haven't been covered here for obvious reasons. We all know that these are converted by shooting for the missing middle pin, (such as the 2 for a 4-5 split or the 3 for a 5-6 split, for example). But this brings up the very common 3-10 and 2-7 splits, because they are considered baby splits even though it's possible to fit the ball between them. Although many right handers will throw a straight ball at the 3-10. but a hook at the 2-7 (vice versa for left handers), I recommend straight shots for both sides.

Why? Because today's rampant center-of- the-lane oil variations display a huge lack of respect for hook shots across the middle. So it's almost impossible to get a hook ball to hold its line. making virtual guesswork out of what should be one of the easiest splits. Taking the above information into consideration, then, the obvious conclusion is, that with the possible exception of the 1-10 and 1-7 wash-outs, 5-7 and 5-10 splits (as described above) all splits become more makeable using straight shots. No matter how good an overall spare shooter you may be, keeping track of your split conversion rate can be a big eye opener. The phantom pin split conversion system has never, in my experience, failed to increase the success rate. Putting it on paper as you bowl may take a few seconds extra, but is well worth it. Key pin: The front pin in a multiple pin spare (the closest pin to the bowler in a spare). Phantom pin: The pin to shoot for to convert a wide split when using the above system; called "phantom" because it may be standing or not.

The lanes were buzzing with activity as the bowlers knew there were many added back in from high losing scores in the 4 separate divisions. When is was over, the 1st place winner was Larry Cooper from Reno, NV bowled a 223 to win the top prize of \$25,000. 2nd place was Ken Wyatt, Sterling Hts, Mich. score of 217 for \$15,000, 3rd pl. Chris Pitts, Clovis Calif score of 216 \$10,000, 4th place David place Hallwared Et accers of 202 for \$7500 and 5th r use Pavilack, Hollywood, FL score of 203 for \$7500 and 5th pl was Stephen Dale, Newton, NH score of 188 for \$5000. All finalist received a minimum of \$649 in cash and prizes for making the finals. Prizes also increased as the bowlers advanced to the next round. Al-most **1000** Ebonite balls were given away.Everyone who participated received Ebonite's Angular One bowling ball with their first entry. All advertised guarantees were paid in full and the **second round** of the finals was **increased by \$50**.



As a quality assurance engineer and statistical data analysis expert for the past 12 years at Ford in Dearborn, Mich., Sterbenz has tested vehicle concepts and solved quality issues on Ford vehicles at foreign and domestic assembly plants. Sterbenz holds master black belt status in Six Sigma, a disciplined process issued by the American Society for Quality and used by companies to recommend product improvements based on statistical analysis. He teaches Ford engineers advanced statistical methods and data analysis techniques.


Sterbenz will put that expertise to use with USBC, where he is expected to use his statistical analysis skills on the Equipment Specifications Committee to assist the Specifications and Certification team as it analyzes research data relating to the System of Bowling. The System of Bowling includes components of the sport that affect scoring, such as bowling ball motion studies, bowling ball dynamics, bowling pin testing, lane surface analysis and oil evaluations.

Sterbenz is a USBC member and resident of Brownstown Township, Mich. The righthanded bowler averaged 228 last season in a Detroit USBC league and has one certified 300 game and a 776 high series to his credit.

"We look forward to working with Scott and taking advantage of his expertise in data analysis to help USBC review, organize and plan research to help improve credibility issues in bowling," said USBC Technical Director Neil Stremmel.

"How often in life do you get a chance to be involved with the governing body of a sport to help maintain and improve integrity in a sport?" said Sterbenz, who earned a B.A. and Masters degree in Mechanical Engineering at Wayne State University in Detroit. "You don't get opportunities like that often so I jumped on it. I look forward to working with Neil and his team."





2007 Meritorious Service Recipient

History will be made on June 3, 2007 at the Town & Country Resort in San Diego as the California USBC hosts its first Annual Meeting and Convention. While we celebrate our new beginning we will honor those members of our bowling family who, by their bowling performance or their service to the sport we all love, will be inducted into our Hall of Fame. They will be the 1st inductees for the new State organization. It is with pride that I announce Ross Packard as our inductee for Superior Performance and Stephanie Steiner for Meritorious Service.

ROSS PACKARD shines with his outstanding bowling achievements. He holds 27 PBA West Coast Regional Titles, 6 PBA Regional Senior Titles, 24 West Coast and 24 North Coast Senior Tour Titles. In addition, Ross is a 3-time champion in the California State Masters Tournament and in the California State BA Championship tournament he has 4 All Events titles and 1 Singles title. Ross has bowled over 50 certified 300 games and over 25 certified 800 series. Clearly, Ross is an outstanding bowler and it is our pleasure to induct him to our Hall of Fame.

STEPHANIE STEINER has dedicated most of her adult life to bowling. In the 60's Stephanie became a certified AJBC Coach where she taught all divisions of youth bowlers. She has been a member of the 600 club, at both the State and National level, for more than 30 years. She has been Secretary/Treasurer of the California State 600 Club for over 20 years and has been All Cities 600 Club President for 14 years. She served as CWBA Teller for 1 year and WIBC Teller for 5 years. Stephanie is currently serving on the California USBC's Nominating Committee. Stephanie initiated many 600-club tournaments such as the long-standing doubles tournament held yearly in Las Vegas. The trio's tournament held in Reno and in 1991 she started the California State Women's 500/600 doubles tournament. These and many local accomplishments, makes Stephanie an excellent choice for our Hall of Fame.

Rule 400 Revised For Youth Bowling Awards

The United States Bowling Congress Board of Directors has approved the modification of Youth Membership Eligibility Rule 400, effective immediately, to expand the awards deemed acceptable under the terms of USBC Youth membership. In addition to previously allowed symbolic awards, USBC Youth members are now eligible to be awarded bowling equipment, gift certificates, apparel and other merchandise prizes with a total value not greater than \$500 in any one event, excluding scholarships.

The modifications also allow for USBC Youth members to compete in singles competition where cash and/or bonds are awarded, as well as merchandise prizes exceeding \$500 in total in any one event, but must waive rights to these awards by signing and completing the USBC Prize Waiver form prior to their participation in that competition.

Acceptance of awards of cash or bonds of any amount or any merchandise prizes with a total value higher than \$500 per event remain prohibited for youth members under USBC's revised Rule 400. Violations of the terms of Rule 400 could result in the loss or suspension of youth membership.

There also remains no limit on the value of scholarships that can be awarded in youth competition. The scholarship funds from USBC certified events and leagues will continue to be required to be deposited with USBC's SMART program. USBC Youth members may be awarded scholarships from singles competition in which cash and/ or bonds are awarded.

"The USBC Board determined that the former Rule 400 placed unnecessary restrictions on everyone associated with USBC Youth membership and concluded the best course of action to alleviate this issue was to modify Rule 400 effective immediately," USBC President Michael Carroll said.

The previous version of Rule 400 intended to protect the current and future interscholastic sports eligibility of USBC Youth members through the most restrictive interpretations and limitations. The USBC Board concluded that placing these restrictions on all USBC Youth members was unnecessary due to the lack of uniform eligibility standards for interscholastic sports nationally. The new structure of USBC allows for addressing of significant issues to be handled in an expedited manner," said USBC Chief Executive Officer Roger Dalkin. "The previous version of Rule 400 placed undue and unintended restrictions on USBC Youth members, league and association coordinators and proprietors. The USBC Board modified Rule 400 to address these restrictions and expand acceptable awards that promote and enhance the participation in vouth bowling." The USBC Board concluded that compliance with local/state interscholastic eligibility rules and policies is the responsibility of the individual member and his/her legal guardian. However, USBC will continue to educate USBC Youth members and their legal guardians that competing in USBC certified competitions and acceptance of some awards now acceptable under Rule 400 could jeopardize individual member's interscholastic sports amateur eligibility.
