## Royal High School of Simi Valley Wins Inaugural High School Open Bowling Championship; Josh Blanchard Shoots 300

VENTURA— February 26th and 27th 2005 will be remembered as one of the most competitive and loudest events ever staged at Buena Lanes in Ventura, CA.

Teams from Southern and Northern California spent two days bowling and yelling their hearts out with Royal High School of Simi Valley, CA being crowned “Tournament Champions”. The top eight teams advanced to the “Baker Style” match play format at the completion of 12 qualifying games bowled on Saturday and Sunday.

The team of Royal High School consisted of Daniel Watanabe, Devin Bidwell, Danielle Schilling and Josh Blanchard. This team shot a 955 first game and never trailed in three qualifying rounds. The finals, however, were much different in the first finals match. Royal bowled against a very spirited team from St. Bonaventure High School located in Ventura. The finals consisted of the best 3 out of 5 Baker Games. Royal never knew what hit them as they went down, 2-0 before they could catch their breathe. In the third game, Josh Blanchard had to strike out to win by a mere six pins. Josh was more than up to the task as he pounded the pocket for three strikes in the 10th frame.

Game 4 of the match saw St. Bonaventure start off with the first five strikes and it looked as if Royal would go down to defeat. Royal never gave up and responded by finishing the fourth game with six strikes of their own. St. Bonaventure needed a strike/spare to win. St. Bonaventure’s anchor man got the much needed strike but failed to pick up the 5 pin and the game resulted in a 246-246 tie. A ninth and 10th frame rolloff also ended in a tie. By now the house was “really rockin” and an additional ninth and 10th frame would be bowled again. This time Royal won 59-48 and would go on to defeat Bonaventure.

Royal was not done bowling like true champions in the re-

maining two matches. Royal would go down 1-0 to El Dorado High School and 2-1 to St. Vincent High School before claiming first place in the “High School Open”.

The top eight schools that qualified for the finals were Royal High School, Crescenta Valley High School, St. Vincent High School, Santa Paula High School, El Dorado High School, El Camino Real High School, Norco High School, and St. Bonaventure School. These schools shared in \$6,000 scholarship awards along with an additional \$658 awarded in brackets and sidepots.

We also awarded to schools with the team spirit awards, Thousand Oaks High School and St. Bonaventure with an overflow crowd of parents and spectators. This was without a doubt the loudest tournament held at Buena Lanes in it’s 28 year history.

## Tommy’s Trifecta

WEST BABYLON–Tommy Jones became the first player to win three title this season as he defeated Tony Reyes, San Bruno, Calif., 266-217, to win the 2005 PBA Cambridge Credit Classic Sunday at AMF Babylon Lanes.

Jones, who also won the 2004 Japan Cup and the 2004 PBA Denver Open, began the title match with eight straight strikes before leaving the 10 pin with his ninth shot. Jones picked up the spare and marked in the 10th for his third career title.

“I didn’t have the ball reaction today like I did on Friday night,” Jones, who averaged 281.75 and threw 43 of 47 strikes in the round of 8 on Friday night, said. “There are so many things to think about. I caught a couple breaks early. When you start striking on TV you get numb.”

Jones, Mauldin, S.C., advanced to the final by defeating last week’s 62nd U.S Open presented by Odor-Eaters champion Chris Barnes, Flower Mound, Texas, 258-212, in the first semifinal. Jones had a 13 pin lead after the 5th frame when Barnes failed to convert a 6-7-10 split in the 6th. Jones went on to strike in five of his next six frames to

Jones earns \$40,000 for the win while Reyes takes home \$20,000 for his 2nd place finish. Barnes and Girard won \$10,000 for 3rd and 4th place.

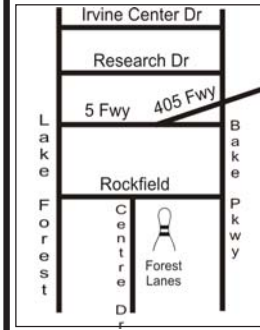



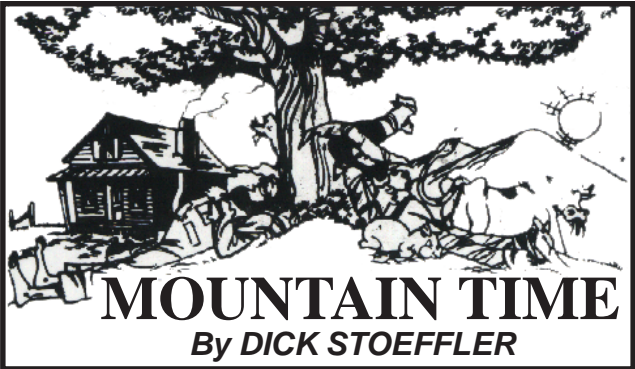

LAS VEGAS, NV—Finally!! REAL bowling on the PBA show! It was the Feb. 20 telecast of the U.S. Open from North Brunswick, N.J. THAT, folks, WAS THE GAME that built the sport. Challenge. Accuracy. Ability. Determination.

The PBA has various "conditions" ranging from the fairly easy (for the pro's) to the difficult. Each condition has a name to identify it. On Feb. 20, the "special" U.S.Open pattern likely earned a new name from many of the Pro's during the course of the event... "Bandini" would come to mind.

Every shot became dramatic. Spares were vital. It was bowling as it was intended, the sport we knew four or five decades ago. The big difference, the guys today each have a dozen bowling balls with them to supposedly "solve" any condition. They needed two-dozen. In the 50's and 50's, you brought ONE bowling ball with you. Period. A hard rubber gem. You used your personal ability to make the "moves" with your feet and the spots to try to find the range, then you would juggle your speed to get a better "carry." Hopefully.

I guarantee you, there were times you felt like you had to hit the crack between two boards to get to the pocket.

That's pretty much what the PBA stars apparently faced. What was the result? IT brought the cream to the top: Walter Ray Williams, Mika Koivuniemi, Patrick Allen and Chris Barnes. It was absolutely great. Mika beat Walter Ray 212-179, but the game was up for grabs until the last two-frames ... and in spite of Walter Ray bowling best. Allen then tied Mika at 194 in the stepladder finals and it took a pair of overtime frames for Allen to win with a nine-pin count in the strikeless roll-off in the title match, Chris Barnes won 213-212. I fell off the couch four-times!

In that championship game, Chris HAD to strike in the 10th, then get at least nine and a spare. THAT strike, on that condition may have been the greatest clutch shot ever, on the PBA show. He left a 4-pin in the 11th, but converting it for \$100,000 might be Chris' choice of his greatest shot ... nothing was a "gimme," and frankly, every shot in every match had you on the edge of your seat.

Put that condition down every week and the PBA excitement would double the viewers, or more, in no time.

But then, you couldn't expect the PBA powers that be to do something that clever. On 2/27 it was right back to "strike-o-rama" with five-board spot area for making strikes ... unless, of course, you fell down during your approach, which cut your chances of striking by ... maybe 10%.

Oh! On 2/27, the wonderfull geniuses got back to the gag-a-maggot trick shot segment, which is less exciting than watching a 5-year-old bumper bowl. That portion had been thankfully replaced on the U.S. Open show with a wonderful tribute to Dick Weber, exceptionally well done by John Petraglia and Carmen Salvino.

Amazing. with the exception of the "Open," the PBA offering each Sunday this season has been an utter disaster, with less bowling than prior years, more blather and stupid trick stuff. Yet they, in spite of themselves, came up with one of the greatest shows, ever, in the long history of TV tenpins on Feb 20. But then, even in the Open, they went way overtime, managing to squeeze three-games (instead of four) into an hour and 45-minutes. But this one was worth every second.

PS: I wonder if the PBA braintrust in Seattle comes up with the inane questions Randy Pedersen asks the bowlers in the weekly interview, or are they sent in by first-graders? Get rid of this mess ... get a 4th game back on the air. Geez! No wonder the PBA is losing their-er... rear ... monetarily every year!

Dick Weber was a friend of Ol' Steff...and so was just about everybody who ever picked up a bowling ball. Stories by the ton have been written about Weber since he passed. I would sum it up by saying: Dick Weber was the greatest thing to ever happen to bowling, in every respect, in every facet. He will never be replaced, he will forever be sorely missed. God bless, my friend. Please save me a good seat to watch your matches, up there!!!

A current WCST member must have bowled in at least 4 WCST Tournaments in 2005 to be eligible for the final singles tournament of the year, that will have \$2500.00 added from Ebonite Bowling Ball Sales at each tournament site.

Finals on Sunday, March 13, 2005, for both divisions will start at 8:30AM. Number of finalists and games bowled determined by WCST Chart on Saturday following the qualifying. (Note), if there are 11 to 15 super seniors entered, then a 4 man step-ladder finals on Saturday, following the qualifying.

NEWS passed on to me by Bill Cozad, Director of National Deaf Master Bowlers Association.

On Jan. 24 Steve Buford, Cleveland hit 244-300-279 for an 823 series. This writer knew an Ohioan Warren Buford and wondered if Steve is his son. Warren did bowl a 300 and this would be the first deaf father and son with 300 games.

On Jan. 25, deaf ex-PBA member Gerald Buckingham, Fogelsville, Pa began his three nights roll of three 700 series, the first one with a 300 in it. On Tuesday night he rolled 215-300-267 for a 782. That 300 is his 13th career perfecto. On Friday night Jan. 28 Bucky hit 258-289-220 for a 767 and again on Tuesday night Feb. 1 he bowled 278-278-193 for a 749. In that stretch, Bucky used his Storm Extreme ball.

That was not over because Bucky reported that last Friday Feb. 25 he rolled his 14th career 300 and 707 series. He is indeed on a roll.

This writer recalled meeting Gerald Buckingham back in 1974 when he came from Philadelphia to bowl in the memorable largest and most lavish deaf singles classic this writer conducted at the now gone Brunswick Wonderbowl in Downey. Bucky was a 19 years old 190 average bowler who aspired to be a PBA member when he gets another year of 190 average. He did joined PBA in late 1970's and cashed in several PBA Eastern regionals. He quit PBA when the deaf tournaments prohibit PBA members.

In his twenties and thirties Buckingham was a hot shot bowler in deaf national tournaments, winning the 1983 and 1994 Deaf Masters and most memorable in 1980 when he was runner-up in both Deaf Masters and World Deaf Championship. He was also the top qualifier in 1993 Masters but ended up as the runner-up.

Congratulations to Laura Lee Daniel for winning her first Western Women Professional Bowlers tournament at Camarillo. It is good to see her at the top after so many top 5 finishes.
