CHICO, CA - Vincent "Mickey" Colletti, bowling pioneer and the founder of the JANCO and Junior Amateur Tour junior bowling organizations passed away on February 14, 2009 at his home in Chico, CA. He was 84 years old and just 10 days shy of his 85th birthday. His family told us that he left us peacefullyhe was watching TV and fell asleep and never woke up.

"Mickey" as he was known to generations of junior bowlers started the first scratch youth bowling tournament club in the United States back in 1973. JANCO started with a single event at Hollywood Star Lanes and eventually became the Junior Amateur Tour.

Mickey's JAT is still in existence today and through its 36 year history has produced more nationally-recognized bowlers than any single youth organization in the nation. The alumni list from the JAT is a virtual who's-who of Southern California bowling with numerous professional bowlers, TeamUSA members and even hall of famers.

He was also a pioneer in the sport- many don't know but he discovered "skin patch" by realizing how an existing prod-


Wes Malott Wins PBA **Etonic Marathon Open**

INDIANAPOLIS-After conquering one of the most challenging tournament formats in Lumber Liquidators Professional Bowlers Association Tour history, Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, earned his sixth career title by winning the PBA Etonic Marathon Open Sunday at Woodland Bowl.

Malott defeated hometown favorite Ronnie Russell of Indianapolis, 248-195, in the championship match to win his third title of the year and take a commanding lead in the race for Player of the Year honors. He won a \$35,000 first prize.

"That's the goal right now," Malott said of his run for Player of the Year. "This puts me in good position but I can't slack off-there's Norm Duke, Patrick Allen and some others behind me so I've got to stay sharp."

The unique tournament format consisted of 54 gamestotal pinfall with no match play-over four days contested on six different PBA Tour lane condition patterns leading up to the stepladder finals. The long format and the use of PBA's Cheetah, Viper, Chameleon, Scorpion, Earl Anthony and Shark oil patterns was designed to test the competitors'



As the tournament leader, Malott earned the privilege of choosing the Scorpion oil pattern for the ESPN telecast. The Scorpion pattern incorporates a larger volume of oil on the lanes applied to a distance of 42 feet which often demands a more direct line.

"I consider myself to be one of the most versatile players out here and I don't want to be a one hit wonder," said the 32year-old Malott. "I picked the Scorpion pattern because I've bowled well on it and I felt it would hold up the best during the course of the finals.'

Earlier this season Malott won the Tour's Versatility Swing, which consisted of six

ent PBA lane conditioning patterns.

For the 29-year-old Russell it was his first television appearance and best finish in an individual Tour event. He also finished second in last season's PBA Exempt Doubles Classic with Joe Ciccone.

Prior to losing to Malott, Russell defeated Bill O'Neill, 27, of Southampton, Pa., 245-190. and in the semi-final match beat Hall of Famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., 248-216. Weber, who finished third and has yet to win this season, was making his second consecutive television appearance and third in the last four weeks. O'Neill, finishing fourth and still looking for his first Tour victory, was bowling on his sixth telecast of the season.

"For all three matches I felt exactly the same, but I probably needed to go to another ball, I'm not sure," Russell said. "I can't complain, I had a great week bowling in front of my family and all the hometown fans." In the opening match, O'Neill defeated reigning PBA Player of the Year and 10-time Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour titlist Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, 239-220. Barnes was also making his second consecutive television appearance and fifth overall this season, but also has yet to win this season.

Results of 25th So. Nev-Calif **Deaf Tournament at Sunset Station Bob Jones Wins Singles Event w/745**

HENDERSON-The 25th anniversary So. Nev-Calif. Deaf Bowling Association tournament began on Saturday morning February 14 with 102 bowlers taking part in the singles event at Sunset Station Hotel, Casino and Bowling Center. At the end Robert G. Jones, Simi Valley rolled stepped up games of 235-245-265 for the lone 700 of this event, 745 but needed his handicap of 90 for a 835 total to win this event.

Only 8 pins behind in 2nd place was 171 ave. bowler from Castro valley, CA Philip Smith, Jr. who went way over his average with steady games of 214-222-214 for 650 plus 177 handicap for 827. A son of deaf mother, Derek Gredinger III, Glendale, AZ rolled 217-207-226 for 650 plus 147 handicap 797 total for 3rd. A woman, Delores McCarty, Lucerne Valley, CA shot 484 plus 307 handicap 793 for fourth.

The much heralded Carl Malucci now of Las Vegas started with the event's high 278 game but finished with 224-191 for zero handicap 793 to place out of money. The 26th last place in the money was a tie between Becca Gleicher, Moreno Valley, Ca and Natalia Quintero, Boulder City, NV with same handicap total 725.

STOGRYN & ABAKUMOFF DUO WINS **3RD DOUBLES TITLE WITH RECORD 1474**

The 25th anniversary tournament doubles event started right after the singles event and a pair of Deaf Team USA members Darrell Stogryn, El Camino Village, CA and Ed Abakumoff, Riverside closed with a 279 each for the new record 558 doubles game after games of 502-414 for a new record high scratch 1474 total plus their lowest handicap of 117 for another record total of 1591. Besides their 279 games, Stogryn had games of 265-199 for 742 and Abakumoff 238-215 for 732 as they won for the third time (previously 2002-03).

The mother and son duo of Araceli Martinez and Derek Gredinger III placed 2nd with Derek rolling 253-214-207 for 674 and mother 533 for 1207 plus 354 handicap for 1561. Third place went to Las Vegas tandem of Vernon Jones (624) and Ronald Loader (626) with 1250 plus 297/1547 total.

Roger Lewis, Phoenix closed with a 280 for the event's high game and 704 series but with his partner scored 1444 total for out of money. Also Carl Malucci scored the event's high series 771 (270-244-2570 but with his partner scored out of money 1412. In the last place 13th in the money was 1470 total by Jeff Stansell, South Gate and Bob Bergan, Whittier.

JOEY HARRIS ROLLS 300 TEAM EVENT BUT PICK-UP TEAM STRONG HEARTZ WINS WITH RECORD 2954

Bowlers and fans were prepared for an exciting show with Carl Malucci's Team Nation entered but were disappointed when Malucci himself was scratched out with a flu sickness and was replaced. Team Nation was not doing good until the 3rd game, Joey Harris lighted things up when he struck all the way for his 2nd career 300. It is the first ever perfecto in the team event and it helped Team Nation to a 2907 total to place 7th last in the money.

Rarely does a pick up team with all bowlers bowling over their average winning the team title as did Strong Heartz foursome of Bob Kerker, Bakersfield, Bobby Thompson, Chris Groves, Hawthorne and Philip Smith, Jr. Castro Valley. With Kerker's 548, Thompson's 490, Groves' 498 and Smith 's closing 234 for 575 the team scored 2111 plus 843 handicap for 2954 beating the 2003 record by two pins.

A team with odd name, Obey the Beer with Brett DeLoss' 654 and Daniel Vasquez's 640 placed 2nd with 2375 plus 561 handicap 2936 total. Third place went to Angel West #5 whose Phil Hawkins starred with a 290 - 644 as the team hit 2933 total..

Another strong team So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers A with Doubles champion Stogryn and Abakumoff and Singles champion Bob Jones, hit a new record scratch team game 945 in 2nd game and the event's scratch team series 2563 but their low handicap 336 gave them 2899 to finish 8th and out of money. In addition to his 300, Harris had the event's lone 700 series 737.

GREDINGER III GRABS ALL-EVENTS WITH 2380

Young Derek Gredinger III unknowingly until he tallied his all-event scores that he came within two pins of the record. Gredinger III with 181 average, scored 650 in team, 674 in doubles and 615 in singles for 1939 plus 441 handicap 2380 total with win the all-events title. Not bad for his first tournament.

Just 4 pins back was Brett DeLoss with 2376 total for 2nd and Philip Smith, Jr. 2342 for 3rd. Joey Harris edged out Bob Jones by two pins for the high scratch all-events total 2050 to 2048 and both finished in 4th and 5th places respectively. Becca Gleicher gathered another last in the money 11th place with 2226. Others out of money with respectable 2000 totals, were Darrell Stogryn 2034, Barry Cossman 2023 and Daniel Vasquez 2019.

addition to remodeling the centers, he has included youth learn-to-bowl classes at each location and focused on enthusiasm, hospitality, cleanliness and helpfulness.

The former California Bowling Proprietors Association president and Orange County Council member belongs to the Southern California Bowling Writers Hall of Fame and has been named Southern California proprietor of the year.

"It was a pleasant surprise," Kinstler said. "It's a pretty big honor. I'm very excited.

"I enjoy the diversity of people that bowling touches. It's not just one market segment. You have bowlers from 3 to 103, grandparents to great grandchildren. It's amazing.

You don't have to be good to have fun but if you are good you can still have fun. It's like doing a business where you can't lose."

Clark was selected as winner of the Joyce Deitch Trailblazer Award, Tondola-Smith the Helen Baker Outstanding Association Service Award and Kinstler the Proprietor of the Year Award. All will be formally honored during the USBC Convention April 29-May 2 in Reno, Nev.

The Joyce Deitch Trailblazer Award is named for the seventh president of the former Women's International Bowling Congress. It recognizes organizations and individuals who have made important contributions to bowling by being motivators, visionaries, leaders and innovators.

A former USA Today editor and USBC vice president of marketing and communications, Clark was largely responsible for the return of women's professional bowling after a four-year absence. His creation and execution of the USBC Women's Challenge, U.S. Women's Open and the PBA Women's Series has provided opportunities for the next generation of women's pro bowling.

"It's a great honor to be given this award, named after Joyce Deitch, who was so dedicated to bowling's growth," Clark said. "This recognition is really a testament to the direction and commitment to keeping bowling in the public eye that the USBC board, leadership and staff accepted and supported. Together we did some special things. Now that I am with the PBA, I hope to continue to work with the USBC across many platforms to give the sport of bowling the attention and respect it deserves."

The Helen Baker Outstanding Association Service Award is named for WIBC's fifth president. It annually recognizes an outstanding bowling leader who has made invaluable contributions to local and state associations as an innovator, creator and mentor of adult programs. Tondola-Smith has been active in all aspects of bowling on the local and state levels. As Massillon USBC Women's Bowling Association and Massillon WBA president for the past 17 years, she helped develop bowling instructional clinics and conducting membership surveys. She devel-oped a "Welcome to the New Season" letter distributed the first night of bowling each season. She also created numerous association fund-raisers, personally promotes the local association championships and conducts yearly workshops for league officers. She also has

spent many years on Massillon's youth bowling associations' boards and working with the West Stark USBC Bowling Association/Massillon BA on numerous projects.

She is in her seventh year as Ohio USBC WBA president. She was instrumental in starting bowling certification clinics in her state and developing Ohio's all-star team and bowler of the year award. She does all this while working a full-time job with the United Way.

"I probably busted the poor lady's ear off," Tondola-Smith said of when Awards Committee Chair Valerie Pittser notified her of winning the award. "The car beside me probably heard me. I could not believe it. I was so ecstatic.

"This is probably the greatest honor I've received in my life. I never thought I would even qualify for something like this. I just try to do the best I can to promote bowling.'




