JONESBORO, Ark. PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke, three weeks shy of his 55th birthday, defeated 22-year-old Anthony Simonsen of Little Elm, Texas, 212-164, to win the Go Bowling! PBA Jonesboro Open Sunday at Hijinx Family Entertainment Center.

With an error-free game including one string of three strikes against the splitprone Simonsen, Duke became the third player in PBA history to win 40 PBA Tour titles, joining Walter Ray Williams Jr. (47) and Earl Anthony (43). He also became the oldest player to win consecutive PBA Tour titles, and the first to win two titles during the 2019

## The Perfect Game A California Bowling News Exclusive

I recently had an idea that might help many bowlers who self-diagnose as having severe, "C.I. Syndrome;" a malady which causes " $\underline{C o n s i s t e n t ~} \underline{I n c o n s i s t e n c y . " ~ T y p i c a l l y, ~ s u c h ~ b o w l e r s ~ a r e ~ m u c h ~ b e t t e r ~ t h a n ~ t h e i r ~ l o w ~ a v e r a g e s ~ i n d i c a t e . ~ T h e r e ~}$ may finally be a cure for this affliction; I call it, "Diagramming Your Delivery."
It's a simple process which doesn't involve modifying your technique or learning new ones (let's face it, after all these years, your delivery is what it is). It also doesn't cost anything or involve endless hours of practice time, but could significantly improve your average

It's based on the concept that every veteran bowler has a consistent skill-set, but may not be consistent with how they prepare to use it. Diagramming allows you to do just that. If you're interested in trying something new and different here's all you need to do.

The next time you bowl, grab a scrap of paper and a pencil (both are readily available at most bowling centers).

- Near the top of that paper, draw seven dots in the shape of a V . These dots represent the tenpins you can plainly see (numbers 1, 2-3, 4-6, 7 and 10). (Note diagram on right.)

In the middle of the paper, draw seven more dots in the shape of an upside-down V . These represent the targetarrows that lie 12-15 feet beyond the foul line.

- Near the bottom of the paper, draw a line of seven dots as wide as the above mentioned Vs. These represent the dots on the approach.

You've just drawn a rough sketch of a lane and approach (scale is unimportant). You will create your diagram on this sketch. Begin by diagramming your first-ball delivery. It will consist of the four points-of-interest which define your strike-shot. These are:

1. Your starting position: You've been bowling for a long time so you already have an established starting point. Begin your diagram by drawing exactly where you place your feet in relation to the dots at the bottom of the paper; be precise. This is critical because success relies on identifying what works and what does not, then repeating only those elements of your delivery that produce the results you want. Note: There are three lines of dots on the approach; you only need to reference the one you use.
2. The direction you face: Once you have planted your

feet, look up and face straight ahead at the target-arrow area. Your shoulders will be "squared" to one of those targets. Draw an arrow that points directly at it. The direction you face determines the direction you walk. When you are being successful, the importance of walking along the exact same line over and over cannot be overstated. Aiming your stride is every bit as important as aiming the ball.
3. The board* your ball rolls over: Perform a normal delivery. When the ball rolls cleanly off your hand, pay close attention to the exact board the ball rolls over when it reaches the target-arrows. On your sketch, draw another arrow which points to that board. Hint: It's a waste of time to diagram any shot with a flawed release. This process works by charting only those deliveries you care to repeat.
4. Where the ball contacts the pins: Draw an arrow indicating exactly where, and from what direction, the ball entered the array of pins. Note: Ideally, a strike is produced by your ball entering the pocket at a slight angle and heading directly at the $\# 5 \mathrm{pin}$.

That's all there is to it. Now, look at your diagram. It's telling you, "On this lane, if I stand exactly here (1), face in this exact direction (2), and do what I always do, the ball will head in this direction (3) and strike the pins "HERE (4)."

That's a lot of important information. Here's how to use it: When you make a delivery, there are only three possible outcomes: the ball goes exactly where you want, it goes too far right or too far left.

If it hit the pocket perfectly, you got a strike and that diagram becomes a reminder showing you how to repeat that success on that lane. It shows you where to stand and which direction to face for your unique delivery to be effective. If the ball went too far right, you need to change the diagram. There are 2 options; erase where you have drawn your starting position and move it a couple boards to the right or, keep the feet where they are, but erase the "directionfaced" arrow and draw another that points to the next target-arrow to the left. Whichever option you chose, do exactly what you have drawn on the diagram when you make your next delivery on that lane. Continue this process until the ball hits where you want.
If the ball went too far left, you have the same options; move where you stand to the left, or the direction you face to the right. Kapeesh?
That's all there is to it. Consistency, or a lack thereof, is a complicated issue; it's every bowlers nightmare. Hopefully, this simple idea may be the remedy that works for you. At the very least, the written records will have you looking at your game a bit differently than ever before. Good Bowling!!!
NOTES ABOUT DIAGRAMMING:
I recommend separate diagrams for each lane because no two lanes are identical. A strike-shot on one lane may produce a 10 -pin leave on the other
There are no bad diagrams. A first-ball diagram that goes too far left or right can be saved rather than altered because it indicates how to make spares in those directions. Diagrams that remind you how to make spares more consistently will raise your average quickly.
Don't expect to use a single diagram all night long. Lane conditions change constantly. Keeping track of your adjustments will teach you more about this subject than you can imagine.
Adjustments to your diagram should become smaller and smaller as you fine-tune your delivery to match the demands of the lane.
Adjusting foot-placement OR direction-faced will modify the balls impact point. Adjusting foot-placement AND direction-faced changes the "line" you are playing. Be careful here!
These written records can be saved as a reminder of what worked last week, last year, or for those of us who are becoming forgetful (like me), the previous frame.

in a "zone" and can't miss. The rhythm is there and everything is in sync.

Best of all, the pins are obliging. Those seven and 10 pins that wiggle actually fall. Messenger pins come from nowhere to make improbable knockdowns.

It happens.
And that's what makes bowling so special. That's because one doesn't have to be Pete Weber or Jason Belmonte or Kelly Kulick to do something extraordinary. For one game - or one series - one can bowl just as well as Weber, Belmonte and Kulick. Or even better.
It can be a mystery how it happens. But it's fun when it does

It's also nice when a reporter documents these feats so the stories can be passed around the social media loop and seen by dozens, sometimes hundreds, of friends and family.


Jim Novak of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, knows that feeling of exuberance.

On Feb. 25, Novak enjoyed the series of his life, ripping scores of 279,256 and 268 at May City Bowl in Cedar Rapids. That adds up to an 803 series.

At the time, Novak was 91 years, 2 months and 21 days old. That gave him a spot in the United States Bowling Congress record book as the oldest bowler to roll a sanctioned 800 series - pending formal approval.
He bettered the previous mark of 85 years, 9 days, set by William Lautenschlager of Stockton, California, in 2016.

Novak competes in three senior leagues each week and consistently averages over 200.
Previously, Novak had rolled 20 certified 800 series in his 65 -year bowling career. The last time he accomplished the feat was in March 2010.
"Honestly, I'd given up on having another day like that, because an 800 series really is hard to come by," Novak said. "A 300 is one thing but putting three games together is so tough."
And he added: "I just can't get over it. It feels so good to hold the record. I couldn't have asked for a better day." Perhaps my favorite special L.A. moment took place Oct. 13, 2014 at Winnetka Bowl.
A father and a son turned in a feat that sent a buzz racing through the entire Los Angeles area. Johnnie Englehart, a superstar bowler, and his up-and-coming son, Scott, both knocked out 300 games and an 800 series on the same night at the same bowling center - Winnetka Bowl. They were on different teams - bowling eight lanes away.
If this wasn't special enough, it was Scott's first 300 game and his first 800 series. And Scott put the exclamation mark on his night with a Brooklyn strike on his last shot to claim both the 300 and the 800 ( 802 : 245, 257, 300). It was pandemonium when Scott's last shot knocked down all the pins. Johnnie had already finished with an 805 series with games of 300,237 and 268.

USBC spokesman Terry Bigham said he could not find any similar situations. "Exceptional," is how he put it.
For Johnnie, it was a take-your-breath-away moment that literally took his breath away. Johnnie, seemingly never at a loss for words, was left somewhat speechless after it all happened. "This will stay with me a long time - only because of my son. Words can't describe it," he said.
For Johnnie, who has accrued dozens of good friends through the years because of his classy persona, it was his 63rd perfect game and 66th 800 series.

But those personal achievements paled to what really meant something to him. It was watching his son put the finishing touches on an unbelievable night with a clutch, oh-so-memorable ending.

Said Johnnie: "As a parent, that's one of the things you live for. It was great to be part of it."
Yes, this was definitely a great take-your-breath-away moment in the world of bowling.

## This 122-Averaye Bowler Takes Her Best Shot at \$598

WINNETKA - Before last week, Cari Hanson had never entered the "Guys and Dolls" league's "Pin Count," a game in which one bowler can earn considerable money by throwing a strike on his or her designated turn.
But Cari felt quite a bit bolder last Tuesday at Winnetka Bowl.

After all, Cari had drilled her first 200 game a couple of weeks earlier - a 209 to be exact. So even though she was averaging a mere 122 , she plunked down five dollars for five tickets and a shot at the jackpot.

Lo and behold, Cari's name was pulled from the raffle - leaving all the league's highperformance bowlers to sit idly by and watch Cari take her turn at the line with a whopping $\$ 598$ jackpot awaiting her if she could strike. That payoff ranked among the most lucrative in the seven-year history of the game, said "Pin Count" coordinator Greg Kolski, citing a $\$ 749$ bonanza as the highest.
So Cari - feeling "very confident" - rolled her shot down the lane with dozens of the league's bowlers huddled behind her.
"It looked good from the beginning," teammate Roger Paskell II said.
Cari, a right-hander, snaked her shot seemingly on target, hitting the pocket perhaps a "little low," according to Roger.
The pins then collapsed and the 4 pin stubbornly stayed up . . . then wiggled $\ldots$ and remained up.
"So close," said Cari after converting her spare.
"I thought I had it," Cari added, "because after I released it, it was going to the head pin. But then the pin didn't go down!"

Cari, in her fourth year of league bowling, said her 209 ranked as her biggest thrill in the sport. If she had nailed the "Pin Count" strike, she said that would have supplanted her high score as the No. 1 thrill.
"I wasn't nervous," she said about her "Pin Count" shot. "You can't be nervous, or you won't make it."
Cari said if she had won the bonanza, it would have helped to pay the bills when she and Roger go on an imminent vacation to Jamaica. As it turned out, she received a consolation prize of $\$ 18$ for her near miss.

And how will she use the $\$ 18$ ?
"It will go for lunch tomorrow," she said, smiling.

## Thank You Note Reveals The Moral Qualify of Leanne Hulsennbery At An Early Age

For most bowlers a thank you note to a tournament sponsor is an afterthought, and only thought about after said bowler has won the event. That's why when I received a thank you note from rookie sensation Leanne Barrette way back in 1987, I knew that greatness in bowling was etched upon her soul.

She was not the winner of the Seagram's Coolers U.S. Open at AMF Major League Lanes in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, but the fact that she took the time to write a thank you note spoke volumes about the nineteen-yearold phenom from Fremont, California.

Wait, did I say Fremont, California? Most people associate the early years of Leanne Hulsenberg's (nee Barrette) career to Oklahoma City, but it turns out that she developed her craft at the famous Cloverleaf Family Bowl in Fremont. When the General Motors plant in Fremont closed down, her father chose to stay with the company and relocate the family to Oklahoma City

Those early years of youth bowling at the Cloverleaf Family Bowl served Hulsenberg very well. She would continue a lifelong relationship with proprietor Mike Hillman, son of co-founder Allan Hillman, who along with Don Hillman opened the popular facility some 60 years ago. The bowling center has been in the news recently, as it fights for survival against a group of developer's intents on making the property yet another site for luxury condos.

There's an old adage in life that states "everything happens for a reason," or something to that effect. The move to Oklahoma City probably didn't make sense to young Hulsenberg in 1983, but it afforded her an opportunity to forge new friends like Carol Norman and Gary Dickinson in the Sooner State and advance her bowling prowess to the next level.

Leanne's legendary career on the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) tour began with three titles and a Rookie of the Year award in 1987. She went on to record thirteen wins in just the first 5 years of her professional career.

In 18 years on the professional circuit, Hulsenberg amassed 26 titles before the PWBA ceased operations in 2003. Along the way she also won a United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Queens event, five USBC national titles (singles, doubles, team and two all-events), the PWBA Bowler of the Year on three different occasions, and the coveted U.S. Open in 2011.

What could have happened to her career if the PWBA had continued operations? "I'd like to think that I had a few more titles in me," said the self-effacing Hulsenberg in a recent telephone interview.

When I talked with Leanne by telephone, I was reminded of the time that I spent with Dick Weber while working for AMF and utilizing him for grand openings, re-openings and exhibitions. Mr. Weber had that same quality of just making you feel at home when you were around him.

I mentioned that to Leanne as we talked and commented about her Facebook and Twitter pages, which say nothing about her unbelievable career, but instead focus on the accomplishments of others. She laughed, quietly of course.

Her relationship with Storm Bowling Products came not long after the birth of her son, Barrett. She and husband Gary were operating a pro shop at Steve Cook's Fireside Lanes in Citrus Heights, California, at the time.

"With taxes and other expenses so high in California, we put together a 5 -year plan to find an area of the country that was more beneficial to our needs of security and raising a family," said Leanne. "We like the slower pace in Utah."

Slower pace of living, perhaps, but not in terms of her duties with Storm Bowling Products. In her capacity as Marketing Coordinator, Leanne manages Storm's 85-plus sponsorships, tournaments and events, as well as coordinating Storm's trade shows, sales meetings and Storm University events.
One of the joys of her job is youth bowling. While we were talking Leanne mentioned that she was preparing for a trip to Las Vegas, and the latest rendition of the Storm Youth Championships, which encompasses 6 events throughout the nation. "This year we stop at Las Vegas,

Rohnert Park, Calif., Nashville, Lincoln, Nebraska, Wichita, and Myrtle Beach," said Hulsenberg.
This comes on the heels of Leanne's partnering with Mike Hillman to form the California Youth Bowlers Tour many years ago. It would appear that Ms. Hulsenberg has learned the power of giving back to the community and offering the same opportunity that she had as a youth to thousands of others. I started this by commenting on the character and professionalism shown by Leanne at an early stage of her bowling career. Now it's my turn to return the favor, and write a thank you note to Leanne, one of the greatest bowlers the world has ever known.

of what the scoring environment allows, rather than trying to overpower the lanes and pins.
"You never know what's good enough until it's over, but I love the fact that I didn't have any open frames," he added. "Spares win titles."

Simonsen, a 22-year-old two-handed player, advanced to the title match against Duke - who had been bowling on Tour for 25 years by the year Simonsen was born - with a 214-199 victory over 26-year-old EJ Tackett of Bluffton, Ind. The semifinal match was a battle between two of the PBA's most powerful high-revolution players. Simonsen started the match with four strikes to establish a solid lead that held up because Tackett was unable to throw consecutive strikes on the dual lane conditions until the 10th frame.

In the final match, however, Simonsen completely lost the right lane, leaving unmakeable splits on his first three attempts to give Duke the room he needed to open a big lead.
"Uncomfortable is the word for it," the frustrated Si monsen said.
In the opening match, Kris Prather of Plainfield, Ill., started with four strikes, converted a 10 pin and threw three more strikes to build a lead Japanese star Shota Kawazoe couldn't overcome despite a late string of four strikes. Kawazoe, a 17-time Japan PBA title winner, didn't miss the pocket but three single-pin spares kept him from closing the gap and Prather won, 246-236.

In the second match, Simonsen jumped into an early 44-pin lead by starting the match with five strikes while Prather lost the pocket after a first-frame strike. Simonsen hit a speed bump when he left the $4-9$ split in the eighth frame and failed to convert, but he then threw four more strikes to eliminate Prather, 247-203.

Sunday's live FS1 finals were contested on the same dual lane conditioning environment that was used throughout the tournament, with the 45 -foot Wolf oiling pattern applied to the left lane and the 36 -foot Viper pattern applied to the right lane.

Next up on the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour schedule is the 10th anniversary PBA World Series of Bowling at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich., March 11-21. WSOB X will award four PBA Tour titles, including the PBA World Championship, the year's second major, and will include five consecutive nights of prime-time telecasts on FS1, March 18-22.

Leading into the World Series will be the World Bowling Tour Men's and Women's Finals, presented by the PBA, on FS1 next Sunday at 10 p.m. EST.
