Like Father, Like Son

Pete Weber tied Earl Anthony's all-time Denny's PBA Tour record of eight Major titles Sunday.

NORTH BRUNSWICK—There are few things Pete Weber has yet to accomplish in his PBA Hall of Fame career, but surprisingly he has never been named PBA Player of the Year.

With a win in the most grueling tournament of the season Sunday, he's one step closer to that elusive award.

Weber defeated Wes Malott, 210-204, Sunday to win the 64th U.S. Open at Brunswick Zone Carolier, his fourth career U.S. Open crown and record-tying eighth career Major title. The win also put Weber, who has two titles this season, in a tie with Mark Roth for third on the all-time titles list with his 34th career Denny's PBA Tour title.

Brunswick Zone Carolier was where Weber found out two years ago that his legendary father, Dick, passed away on February 14, 2005. With his win Sunday, Pete joined his father and Don Carter as the only bowlers to win the U.S. Open or BPAA All-Star – the U.S. Open's predecessor – four times.

“This was one of my dreams, to be one of the guys to win four U.S. Opens. I might not be done, I might have six or seven before my career is over,” Weber said. “My dad and Don Carter are the only two to win this event four times so I am joining an elite group. Even though the All-Star was not an official title, to me it is, and it is in dad's book and Don's book. So to me, we have 12 U.S. Open titles among us.”

Weber struck in his first five frames in the title match after starting with the first eight in his semifinal win, leaving the 10-pin both times. Malott had a couple chances to get back in the match, particularly after Weber opened in the 8th, but Malott struck and

Stogryn rolled 261-266-227-201 for his 955 to replace his former high 922 while Abakumoff hit 257-228-196-227 in his 908.

Oddly since the beginning of this year in this league, Stogryn started his first game with a 267 and had rolled at least one game over 260 each time, once with a close call at Pickwick Bowl. At that Burbank center he had a 131 game but recovered to find his line to finish with a 268. In the recent one he started with two over 260.

In the league's position round match Abakumoff's Riverside beat the league leader South Bay 13 to 7 to move up within 8 points as he, himself swept 5 points from South Bay's anchor man Pablo Yoma. Riverside team also swept 5 points.

With Bob Jones absent due to surgery on his knee, S. F. Valley fell prey to Stogryn's El Camino Village 16.5 to 3.5. Stogryn's 955 and Don Millwee's 701 helped in the win.

Los Angeles finally got the teamwork with Francisco Navarro's 717 and Jim Mohr's 225 to win 4 games and 12.5 points from Hollywood 7.5 whose Dan Flores had 201.

The honor roll had only 6 bowlers. Not so tough lanes to two bowlers but tough to the rest of the league. Thanks to the management of AMF Bowling Square Lanes for hosting us. Next date is March 11 at Del Rio Lanes one of the league's favorite centers.

were tied with same score 860 for the 44th cut off position and a one game roll-off was held. Salazar had the lowest score 201 and lost, Parker placed 43rd with 221 and Brown 44th with 209.

In the Sunday afternoon first round 3 one-game match play against different bowlers with 30 bonus points for each win, the leader Fuentez still averaged close to 2003 with 595 for his 3 games plus 201 handicap for 796 and won all three games for 90 bonus points. After losing to Fuentez, Porter won one and lost again to drop to 6th place. Fisser and Stogryn both lost one game but held on to their 3rd and 4th place respectively.

Two bowlers from the bottom half made the jump up to the top 5, Malucci and 143 ave. Perry Hansen. Hansen had qualified with 898 in 23rd place and scored 533 plus 207 for 740 winning all 3 games to move up to 5th place. Malucci made a bigger jump from 25th to 2nd with his 779 (223-279-277) winning 3 matches.

With the field cut to top 22 bowlers for 2nd round of 3 one game match play, Fuentez faltered to his real average bowling winning once scoring 432 and fell to 2nd place.

Malucci made a big move up to first gaining more than 200 pins with his 775 (279-267-229) and 90 points (3 match wins). Fuentez's handicap was so huge as his way over average bowling that Malucci finally caught up with him by only 7 pins in grand total points to get the top seed position for the stepladder finals.

With a 719 and 3 match wins Fisser retained his 3rd place position and Hansen with his 519 (726 with handicap) and 3 wins moved into 4th. Stogryn with 2 wins dropped to 5th and Porter with 2 wins held on to 6th.

The one game stepladder match play began with a thrilling match between Porter and Stogryn with Stogryn winning 259-233 over Porter. Stogryn moved up to against Hansen and Hansen bowled way over his average 204 to beat Stogryn's 201 without handicap. Hansen moved up to against Fisser and Fisser rolled a 222 against Hansen's 180. But Hansen wins with 69 handicap for 273 while Fisser had 8 for 230. So Hansen again moved up to against Fuentez and Fuentez could not bowl like he did at the beginning and Hansen's 198 (267) beat Fuentez's 144 (211).

For the Deaf Eliminations championship finals Hansen moved up against a rested Malucci and the match was close, Hansen with 69 handicap for his 143 average and Malucci only 1 handicap for his 227 average. Hansen made some opens and Malucci could not get a long string of strikes to help him. At the end Hansen had 167 plus 69 for 236 and Malucci 237 plus 1 for 238, a 2 pin win for Malucci.

This is Malucci's third Deaf Eliminations title. He won his first one back in 1990 and his 2nd one came in 1996.

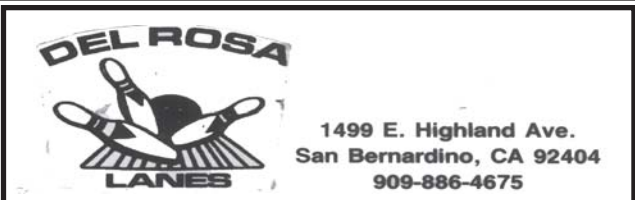
