Remembering Park Bowl in Baldwin Park, California

It's amazing what you can find on the internet. A couple of my internet buddies the past few years — Tom Knapp from Minnesota, and Bud Horn from Las Vegas — were both involved with Park Bowl in Baldwin Park, California. Tom worked in the pro shop, while Bud was the owner of the location from 1972 to 1976.

An interesting article that's posted by the Baldwin Park Historical Society & Museum states that the location originally opened as Baldwin Park Bowl in the mid-1950's. No one seems to know the exact date of the opening, which remains in dispute, but the allmaple lanes would signify that it probably opened in the mid-1950's, if not before that time.

The article, called *Ghosts of Baldwin Park: Baldwin Park Bowling Alley*, mentions that the bowling center occupied the east end of a shopping center at the corner of Ramona and Baldwin Park Boulevard. The other anchor store at the west end was a Lucky Supermarket. "There were other little shops in between," states Mr. Horn. "But one of my favorite spots was across the street, at one of the two original In-N-Out Burgers that started in Baldwin Park."

Bud said that he remembers In-N-Out founder Herb Snyder from the Chamber of Commerce meetings held in a banquet room inside Park Bowl (Horn renamed the center Park Bowl when he acquired it in 1972). "We had 32 lanes with a coffee shop, lounge, banquet rooms, pro shop and 6 billiard tables," remembers Bud. In addition to the Chamber of Commerce, the Lions Club also met at the center on a regular basis.

"Our league base was strong, with over 2,000 bowlers," said Horn, a member of the USBC Bowling Hall of Fame. "We had a lot of women's daytime leagues that unfortunately went away when the economy crashed, because all of the housewives had to go back to work in order to keep the family afloat." This writer remembers those days very well when the price of gas doubled overnight. Gas lines became the norm, and it was my job while still in college to get up at 4 a.m. three times per week and wait in line to be sure that all of our cars had a full tank of gas.

Tom Knapp, now a resident of Minnesota, worked in the pro shop during the years that Horn owned Park Bowl. When I asked Tom if he might have any photos of the bowling center, he replied, "The only one that I can remember is of my future wife walking back from the foul line to the ball return, and after 46 years she still takes my breath away."

"The scoring conditions were on the tougher side compared with some other houses in the area," said Knapp. "It was probably because of the all-maple lanes which resulted in many single pin spares. The

lane condition was fair on both sides. The flat gutters may also have been slightly lower than the other centers." Tom said that when the economy was hurting and Bud was losing his daytime leagues, he began to provide a softer bowling condition to attract scratch bowlers. "My average went from 195 to about 210 after the change."

The article that appears on the historical society website mentions that Baldwin Park Bowl had actually closed for a period of time and reopened on July 10, 1972, under a new name — Park Bowl. I asked Bud about this, and he replied that was when he purchased the center. "The previous owners had run it into the ground. It was an opportunity for me, and I was successful in recovering the business quickly."

Horn grew up in Los Angeles and bowled in junior leagues with longtime friend and fellow pro bowler Norm Meyers at Santa Monica Bowl. Bud was a regular on the PBA tour from 1963 to 1970, winning two titles and finishing in the televised top 5 finals a total of 19 times. "After all those years on the road, I was ready to settle down, and Park Bowl looked like a good opportunity," said Bud.

After only 5 years, Horn decided to sell Park Bowl due to some personal problems in his life. It wasn't long after that he was approached about managing a new bowling center in Temecula, California, called Rancho Lanes. Bud was there until another opportunity became available with the opening of the beautiful Santa Fe Lanes in Las Vegas, in 1992.

"Santa Fe Lanes had it all," said Bud. "We had 60 lanes, a bar & grill with fresh handmade pizzas, a pro shop and private rooms for birthday parties, meetings, or other hosted events. Within a year, we had a total of 5,000 league bowlers." Thirty years later the bowling center is still known for league bowling. Their slogan at santafestation.com is "League Play That Raises The Bar."

Horn still lives in Las Vegas, where he has retired, like so many other professional bowlers. He has a couple of USBC records that may never be beaten, even with all of the "softer" lane conditions, double voided pins, and bowling ball enhancements: eleven consecutive years of rolling an all events total of more than 1800 (1966-1976); and two perfect 300 games (tied with Tom Jordan), one in 1961 during the Masters, and another in the 1976 Classic Singles event.

two squads, and doubles competition was March 2.

Teams and doubles pairings competed for medals based on their division. Allen has been part of every National Unified Tournament dating back to its first year alongside the Open Championships in Toledo, Ohio, in 1991. In describing this year's event at the National Bowling Stadium, Allen said, "It's unlike any arena our athletes will compete in. It's majestic."

The athletes and partners who participated this year got to experience bowling on its biggest stage, from the championship atmosphere and high ceilings at the NBS to making their way down the famed Center Aisle to start each squad.

"When they marched on the lanes listening to the processional music, it's truly an Olympic experience for our athletes," Allen said.

The National Unified Tournament could not happen without the unified partners competing with the Special Olympians or the support they receive on the local level.

"They are so important on the local level," Allen said. "They are needed to raise the funds that we cannot provide for our athletes, like their travel. Without them, none of this happens."

Another key need on the local level is receiving proper instruction, which Allen stated makes the relationship with USBC even stronger.

"Everything the USBC does to promote coaching and learning is a perfect fit with our organization," Allen said. "Our athletes are a big part of the sport on the local level and are USBC members as well."

The tournament historically is held each year just prior to the start of the Open Championships, and it's an important relationship for Allen and the Special Olympics.

"The USBC staff, tournament director and everyone involved are just tremendous to us," Allen said. "They can't do enough for us and our athletes."
