Mika Is The Real Deal

INDIANAPOLIS—Mika Koivuniemi won his second title this season to jump back in the thick of the PBA Player of the Year race as he defeated Jim Pratt, 267-226, in the title match of the 2005 PBA Baby Ruth Real Deal Classic at Woodland Bowl.

Koivuniemi, the 2004 PBA Player of the Year, began the game with five strikes before leaving the 10 pin with his sixth shot. Back-to-back spares by Koivuniemi let Pratt, Glendale, Ariz., back into the match. Pratt had a turkey in frames 7-9 to put the pressure on Koivuniemi but he stepped up and struck in the 9th and doubled in the 10th for his sixth career title.

“I’m not there yet but if I do really well in the last two majors I have a chance,” Koivuniemi said regarding his Player of the Year chances. “I

knew I needed to strike on my first ball in the 10th to lock him out. You never like to give anyone a chance by leaving something there. I tried to focus on my routine and make a good shot.”

In the first semifinal, Koivuniemi defeated Tony Reyes, San Bruno, Calif., 194-154. Reyes began the game with three spares, two open frames and a strike giving Koivuniemi a 25-pin lead after six. With a 40-pin lead heading into the 10th frame, Koivuniemi needed to mark to advance to the championship round. The Hartland, Mich. resident threw a spare and strike to place himself in the title match for the third time this season.

Pratt advanced to the title match for the first time in his career via a 211-207 win over Danny Wiseman, Baltimore, in the second semifinal. Pratt left the six pin standing after throwing a 4-6-7 split in the 8th, letting Wiseman back in the match. Wiseman’s three marks to end the game forced Pratt to strike with his first shot in the 10th to clinch the win. Pratt struck and then converted the spare to advance into the title match.

Koivuniemi picked up \$40,000 with the win. Pratt won \$20,000 for his 2nd place finish while Reyes and Wiseman won \$10,000 a piece.

The PBA Tour will take a one-week break before heading to Grand Rapids, Mich. for the 2005 PBA Banquet Open. The 2005 PBA Banquet Open begins with the PBA Tour Qualifying Round on March 16 while the finals will be televised live on ESPN Sunday, March 20 from 12:30 -2:00 p.m. EST.

Last Call For TNBA Western Regional Entries

SACRAMENTO—Entries are now being accepted for the 30th Annual TNBA Western Regional Junior Championship Tournament. The tournament will be held, in Sacramento, California at AMF Alpine Valley Lanes on Saturday, April 2nd and Sunday, April 3rd.

This tournament is open to all YABA/TNBA youth bowlers in the 12 Western Region States, which include: Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming.

The tournament consists of four events: team, doubles, singles handicapped events, and a Masters & Misses scratch singles events. There are five divisions based on averages. The cost for each event is only \$12.00 per entry (plus \$5.00 membership into for TNBA if you are not already a member). The team, doubles and singles entries must be prepaid by the March 27th deadline. The Masters and Misses event may be paid as late as the date of the tournament. All participants must be members of both the YABA and TNBA before the tournament. No application for membership will be available during the tournament. As stated earlier the membership fee for TNBA is only \$5.00 and must be purchased with the prepaid tournament entry forms if you are not already a member. TNBA annual membership entitles youth bowlers additional, high score achievement awards, TNBA local, regional and national tournaments as well as scholarships based on either scho-

lastic or bowling achievements.

The tournament will be highlighted by the members of winning team in the Class 1 division receiving \$500 scholarships and earning an all expense-paid trip to the National Junior Championship Tournament and a chance to win additional scholarships. This years national tournament will be held in Detroit, Michigan near the end of May. That’s right for only a \$12.00 entry fee plus \$5.00 membership, four youth bowlers from the winning team will be on their way to Detroit, Michigan representing the Western Region states in the national championship roll off. This years Western Regional tournament will also award additional scholarships to the top places in both, the Masters and Misses competition.

The amount and the number of scholarships for the Masters and Misses will be announced soon.Housing arrangements have been established in Sacramento and you may contact the tournament officials.
