## Scroggins Wins Eighth Title in Etonic Don Johnson Eliminator

COLUMBUS, Ohio — Mike Scroggins of Amarillo, Texas, won his eighth career title and second of the 2009-10 season in the Professional Bowlers Association's Etonic Don Johnson Eliminator finals at Sequoia Pro Bowl Sunday, surviving a 10th-frame error to edge home-state favorite Brian Kretzer of Dayton, Ohio, 206-195, in the championship match.

Scroggins, 45, put together three strikes in the middle of the final game to pull away from Kretzer, but when he left and missed a 7 pin in the 10th frame, he gave Kretzer a chance to strike out for a tie. Kretzer got a break when he kicked out the 6 pin for his

first strike in the 10th, but then he left the 2-4-5-8 on his second shot to end his hopes for his first title.

"I didn't miss a 7 pin all week," Scroggins said later. "I just got the ball a little left. I knew I missed it as soon as I let it go, and then I sat down and starting thinking about a roll-off."

"After finishing second in the U.S. Open last week, I wasn't expecting much," the 45-year-old Scroggins said. "But I got lined up after the first seven games and went from nowhere to somewhere."

With his second win of the year, Scroggins has become a candidate for PBA Player of the Year honors heading into

the final three events of the season.

"I'm just trying to follow in Walter Ray Williams Jr.'s footsteps," he grinned. "He's been setting an example for us older guys."

Williams, at age 50, also is a two-time winner this season. Bill O'Neill, Williams and Scroggins are one-two-three in the PBA Player of the Year point standings.

Scroggins and Kretzer eliminated Finland's Osku Palermaa, who had the high score in the first round, to reach the title match. In the second game, Palermaa lost his pocket just long enough for Scroggins and Kretzer to sail past him. Scroggins had a string of seven strikes on his way to a 254 game, Kretzer almost matched him with a six-bagger for a 245 and Palermaa put together a late string of four strikes for a 211.

Reigning PBA Player of the Year Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, was the first player eliminated after bowling a 195 in the opening Eliminator game. Palermaa led the first round with a 233, Kretzer posted a 211 and Scroggins a 203 game.

During Sunday's finals, Jimmy Johnson, son of the late PBA Hall of Famer after whom the tournament is named, and his wife Minda presented a check to Nationwide Children's Hospital of

Columbus and the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation for \$40,826. The 2010 contribution brings the total raised during the tournament for Nationwide Children's Hospital to more than \$100,000 over the past three years.

# Brothers Bowl Perfect Games On Same Night

IRVINE—On Wednesday night brothers Bryan and Brandon MacLeod did something that might have never been done before. Bryan MacLeod, 23, bowled a 300 game during league play at Irvine Lanes.

A 300 game is impressive in its own right. After around seven strikes in a row, crowds tend to form and leave the players alone for fear of jinxing them or breaking their concentration.

Bryan, who is right-handed, was on his 7th ball when his brother noticed that the pressure might be getting to him. “Hey, let’s go golfing right now,” 18-year-old Brandon MacLeod joked with his brother, trying to get his mind off the pressure. It worked. He made the strike. Then Bryan, who averages 188 and is not a professional, bowled five more strikes for his first-ever perfect game.

He knew he had it when it left his fingers, but he watched it just to make sure. The two amateurs bowled their first perfect game in the same league on the same team on the same pair of lanes on the same night.

As to the rarity of this occurrence, neither the Orange County chapter of the United States Bowling Congress nor the statewide organization remembered anything like this happening before in the state.

“Wow, I don’t know that I’ve heard of that before. I don’t know that that’s ever happened in California before,” said Al Hoffmann, president of the California USBC.

Hoffmann was in possession of a book – The Bowlers Encyclopedia – which confirmed that similar feats have been accomplished by bowlers before. The book, copyright 1997, lists three previous instances in the “statistics and oddities” section of 300 games being bowled by brothers in the same league game. Though it was their first, the MacLeod brothers didn’t do it in the same game.

First, there was Bob and Wayne Pinkalla who bowled their pair of 12-ball games on April 20, 1960, in Milwaukee. Then there was Mike and Dave Fleming, who knocked down 240 pins between the two of them to achieve the same rare milestone on September 26, 1991. Lastly, there was Joe and Albert Jimenez, who got their 600 points on January 20, 1994.

As for Costa Mesa residents Bryan and Brandon MacLeod, they won the match and bowled 787 and 781 for the series, respectively.



# 34 Years of Bowling is Enough

TUSTIN—For Tustin resident Jack Mann, 36 years of bowling is enough.

Raised on a small farm in Ohio, Mann started an orthodontistry practice in Tustin in 1964, and then in 1973 he started investing in real estate syndications, first golf courses then farms. In 1973 he and some partners bought land and built Fountain Valley Bowl. At 60 lanes, he said, it was the largest center west of the Mississippi.

From that time until the end of 2009, Jack Mann, with and without partners, with and without two of his sons, has owned bowling centers – “don’t call them alleys,” he insists – in Southern California. It has been a fun and lucrative career but now, he thinks, it needs someone with more energy. He sold his last remaining bowling property, Tustin Lanes, to his youngest son, Alex who also owns Arlington Lanes in Riverside.

But Mann is not a hobbyist turned entrepreneur, not the frustrated chef who opens a restaurant or the artist who opens a gallery.

“It wasn’t the love of bowling; it was a good opportunity,” he said recently, sitting in a second-floor conference room of Tustin Lanes with Alex. “In orthodontistry if something happened to me, I would lose my entire income. I wanted something where I would have money coming in even if I were incapacitated.”

He and partners built Regal Lanes in Orange in 1974 and bought Kona Lanes in Costa Mesa in 1980.

Jack Mann went to Japan, where the bowling industry suffered from overbuilding and bought two-year-old pin-setting equipment and other necessities for a bowling center for 10 cents on the dollar.

“I bought land so my rent couldn’t go through the roof. I never borrowed,” he explained his success. “I brought in partners to put up the capital. They got a nice return on their investment and I didn’t have the monthly pressure of a loan payment. Centers that fail over-borrow, the partners argue and they can’t adapt to changing conditions.”

The American bowling center industry has had its ups and downs, according to Hansell & Associates Inc., a Michigan broker and consultant to the industry. After booming in 1957 to 1963, it went through a period of failures because of overbuilding. It flourished in the 1970s and early 1980s before traditional bowling leagues started to decline.

As of 2009, the United States has 5,100 commercial bowling centers and more than 60 million Americans say they bowl at least once a year with 10 million bowling more than 12 times a year, Hansell & Associates said.

Many of the old centers in Orange County have disappeared because real estate prices, Alex Mann said.

Jack Mann sold Fountain Valley Bowl when Alex was a youngster. Regal Lanes made way for more parking at a Toyota dealership. He sold Kona Lanes to son Jack Jr., and it closed in 2003 when the landowner, CJ Segerstrom and Sons wanted to build a retail center.

But in 2000, Jack Sr. and Alex Mann bought a bowling center in San Dimas, which had filed for bankruptcy. Again, it was strictly business and when an investor came along “and made an offer we couldn’t refuse” they sold it in 2004, Jack Mann said.


Tustin Bowl was Jack Mann’s last center. Alex bought an Inland Empire center and changed its name to Arlington Lanes.

When Jack Mann was ready to step aside, “it was natural that Alex buy it,” he said. “The employees knew Alex from before so there was a comfort level. If I sold to outsiders, they might bring in their own staff.”

Alex Mann splits his time between his two centers. In Tustin, he has already updated the electronic scoring equipment, painted and put in new carpet and signage. He has surveyed customers about other possible improvements. But it will never convert to what are trends for some new centers where bowling is surrounded by an array of entertainment and games or a high-end cocktail lounge where bowlers pay \$50 an hour.

“Bowling is a very conservative business, no highs or lows. It’s predictable and as a business owner I like that,” he said.

My name is Kazimierz Chodak, and I am from Los Angeles, California. I currently am the Consultant for the 2009 Deaflympics with a concentration in Bowling. I hope to become a TD in the future.

I have had a vast experience with bowling. I was a dedicated bowler for about 20 years, and my first attempt at going to the Deaflympics occurred in 1996, but I unfortunately was one spot behind the cut. I kept bowling, regardless. 


