Former PWBA Star Fires 299, Takes All-Event's Lead at USBC Open

RENO, Nev.—Four years removed from a professional career that spanned nearly 20 years and many pages of the Professional Women's Bowling Association record book, Dede Davidson of Buellton, Calif., is back in the spotlight, this time breaking records at the United States Bowling Congress Open Championships.

Making her first USBC Open Championships appearance, the nine-time PWBA titlist posted nine games of 200 or better on the way to a 2,118 total and the top spot in Regular All-Events at the National Bowling Stadium on Friday. Former Professional Bowlers Association standout Mike Miller of Rio Rancho, N.M., previously held the lead with 2,114.

Only a stubborn 6-pin stood between Davidson and the fourth perfect game by a woman in tournament history, but the 299 capped off a 727 singles effort and helped her to the highest all-events total ever by a woman at the Open Championships. She added 705 in team and 686 in doubles to pass fellow PWBA alumna Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., who shot 2,117 last year in Corpus Christi, Texas.

If her all-events score holds up until the tournament concludes on July 1, Davidson would join former PWBA star Wendy Macpherson as the only women to claim Regular Division titles.

"This has been an amazing experience, and to bowl this well my first time out is even better," said Davidson, who bowled as a substitute in place of a friend who had back surgery. "I don't bowl much anymore, so to be leading right now is an incredible feeling. I still enjoy being able

to compete when I can, and this is better than I ever could've expected."

Since the PWBA closed its doors in 2003, the left-handed Davidson only bowls one night each week, plus the occasional tournament, but practiced a few times on this year's Open Championships lane condition at a local bowling center before making the trip to Reno.

"Those practice sessions really helped because I was able to get a feel for the pattern, and it helped me decide what balls to bring," said Davidson, who owns the PWBA records for 8, 16, 24, 32, 40, 48 and 56 games and earned the Triple Crown with wins at the USBC Queens, U.S. Open and Sam's Town Invitational. "I still love this sport and have a passion for it, but I have a job I love and bowling isn't the most important thing anymore. It was really difficult for me when the Tour ended, but things are good now. I definitely chose the right sport and enjoyed a lot of success, and those are memories that no one can take away."

Jowdy's Journal

JOHN JOWDY'S PBA CHANGE SUGGESTIONS:

The Professional Bowlers Association, from a publicity standpoint, is, without question, the most important segment of the bowling industry. Bowling fans throughout the country are certainly appreciative of the leadership of the present PBA regime.

It is nothing short of blasphemous to be critical of the manner in which they conduct business. Nevertheless, I feel that there is room for constructive suggestions and certainly express my opinions with positive intent.

I consider myself one of the PBA's most ardent supporters, beginning in 1958, when a young dynamic attorney, Eddie Elias, rounded up 33 Founding Members. That was almost 50 years ago.

In 1978, after twenty years, Eddie Elias retired as the PBA's leader. Following Elias, Joe Antenora, Mike Connor, and Mark Gerberich undertook duties as Commissioners of the organization. With all due respect, none of Eddie Elias' successors were able to fill his shoes. Elias, a salesman extraordinaire, could sell snow to Eskimos. Elias personally sold ALL the commercials on the show. He not only secured rights to televise the PBA on ABC-TV on Saturday afternoons; he made certain the PBA Tour would remain financially stable.

Following Joe Antenora's tenure as PBA Commissioner, the PBA began a downward trend. In 2000, the PBA was purchased and SAVED by former Microsoft executives, Chris Peters, Rob Glaser and Mike Slade. Needless to say, the PBA has been revitalized and again captivates bowling audiences all over America on the world's most famous sports station, ESPN. Furthermore, unlike former years, ESPN currently run PBA promos and include PBA results on its sports ticker. These are HUGE plusses for the current PBA ownership.

Nevertheless, I have a couple of suggestions I believe could make the PBA tour fairer and prove to be far more fan-friendly.

Although I previously favored the format featuring four out of seven match game eliminations, I have come to the conclusion that this format is detrimental in two ways.

First, is unjust to the leaders of the qualifying rounds who post the highest scores are then subject to elimination in the first round by bowlers who qualified anywhere from 150 to 400 pins less. But, equally important, it is unfair to paying spectators who are seated in one area and compelled to watch only two bowlers for at least an hour and a half to over two hours. They have no choice or opportunity to watch their favorite player/players. Furthermore, fans unable to attend the tournament in daytime competition will not have the opportunity of

watching one of their favorites if he/she is eliminated early. In the 24-man finals format, fans are able to see ALL the finalists. In a seven-game match format, this is not guaranteed. Consequently, It is not in the best interests of the PBA organization who strive to present a fan-friendly atmosphere.

My second criticism of some of the PBA decisions on critical matters was originally expressed about a year ago. I wrote a column suggesting the expansion of exempt players from 64 to 80. In order to keep the financial aspect in perspective, I recommended reducing the top prize from \$40,000 to \$30,000, with subsequent reductions down the line to a minimum prize of \$1000. The 80 -man field is intended to increase interest in the PBA from the ground roots level, whereas, the extra available spots for exemption status would increase participation in rabbit squads and tour trials, not to mention the added interest it would generate for aspiring bowlers who would be willing to test their skills in regional events. From a financial standpoint, it seems like a logical move. It would undoubtedly increase membership.

In addition to the aforementioned justification for an expanded exemption field, it would certainly benefit some very worthy players who may have had an "off" year but were still very capable of competing on a high level. A prime example would be Mike Edwards. Several years ago, the likeable Oklahoma native experienced a slight slump and lost his exemption. He was forced to enter the tour trials at Merrillville, Ind. and ran away from the field, thereby again gaining exemption. Since then, he has had little or no trouble maintaining his status.

Today, with only three more tournaments remaining on the PBA schedule, (provided they fail to capture a title in the remaining events), players like David Traber, (four titles); Tim Criss,(five titles); Dave D'Entremont, (six titles); Randy Pedersen (13 TITLES;) Amleto Monacelli (19 TITLES); and Brian Voss (TWENTY-FOUR TITLES)' have not accumulated enough to points to qualify for exemption next season.

Monacelli has bowled well in tournaments he has competed this year. However, due to business matters in Venezuela, he was forced to miss six or seven events and was unable to accumulate enough points for exemption. Would Amleto attempt to regain exemption through the tour trials? I doubt he would even entertain the thought. For all intents and purposes, we may have seen the last of one of the most popular bowlers in PBA history.

And, what about Brian Voss? TWENTY FOUR TITLES to his credit and he may be forced to throw in the towel. Brian Voss at the tour trials? Perish the thought. It would be a downright insult. Can any bowling fan imagine a tour without Brian Voss? a model professional and one of the most fundamentally sound bowlers in the history of the game.

Randy Pedersen participated in last year's tour trials but failed to make the top ten. He also engaged in a number of rabbit events. After failing to qualify for exemption, Pedersen has opted to continue his

bowling career as an analyst on the Pro Bowlers Tour and maintain his position as sales representative for Storm Products. Nonetheless, does it seem logical that a bowler with 13 TITLES be forced to prove himself all over again?

Del Ballard, a 12- time PBA champion, succeeded in regaining exempt status through last year's tour trials. Presently, he is not among the exempt players for next season. Should a bowler with Ballard's credentials be required to qualify for exemption? Ballard owns 12 titles that include one ABC Masters.

Through some quirk in PBA rules, is not recognized as a PBA title; otherwise, he would be credited with 13 titles. In addition to that, he is possessor of FOUR MAJOR TITLES...the ABC Masters, the US Open (twice) and the Firestone Tournament of Champions. It may be noted that Ballard has recorded the same number of "majors" as the immortal Dick Weber had in his brilliant career.

I feel certain the PBA brass will conclude that every PBA player has the same opportunity and no one should be privileged on the basis of past performances. This is where I am in total discord with this particular PBA policy. The aforementioned players are not average journeyman players. They are stars. They made the PBA. The PBA needs their stars. These players will NEVER embarrass themselves on the lanes. They are still capable and, above all, remain drawing cards for many bowling fans all over America.

So, how can the PBA include these players without forcing them to regain exemption through the rigorous tour trials? The answer is very simple. Insert a rule that grants exemption to any player with at least 10 titles who participates in at least two-thirds of PBA regular tour events. This gesture would affect NO MORE than five bowlers and would certainly outweigh any disapproval from players who might object to this proposed plan. Additionally, this will provide extra spots available on the point list for PBA members who barely failed to qualify for exemption.

I suggest the proposed 80-field be made up as follows:

Regular Tour Point Leaders	50
Regional Point Leaders	5
Tour Trial Qualifiers	7
PTQ (weekly rabbit squads)	10
Players with 10 or more titles	8
Total	5
	80

Provided the PBA high brass consider this plan, I am confident of four things:

- 1.It would unquestionably enhance the image of the PBA
- 2.It would undoubtedly increase membership.
- 3.It would certainly delight bowling fans all over the country.
- 4.In regard to the growth and popularity of the PBA tour, it would display appreciation for the contributions made by great players with 10 or more championships. In all probability, the PBA hierarchy will

turn a deaf ear to my proposal. Kind of reminds me of a Tonight Show during the 70's. On this particular evening, Johnny Carson invited Amarillo Slim as a guest on his show. The rangy Texan had just captured the World Series Poker Championship at the Horseshoe Casino in Las Vegas. (This was long before the current rage of televised poker.) Carson posed the question, "Do you guys play by any set of rules?" Without hesitation, Amarillo Slim answered, "We play by the Golden Rule... them that put up the gold, make the rules"! The bowling world knows who put up the gold to keep the PBA afloat.

Mike Tucker Wins Forest Lanes 6-Gamer \$300 Title

LAKE FOREST — If you don't win the first time, try again, again and again. That's what Mike Tucker did to win Forest Lanes' 6-Gamer last Saturday afternoon. Yes, he won the \$300 plus \$67 in sidepot money with a 1426 series.

Tucker was fourth the first three-game block with a 248/697. He kept pace with games of 225 and 257 going into the sixth game with a 31 pin lead over the four runnersup. They didn't make it.

Tucker's sixth game (247) earned him a block winning 729 series, high for the afternoon.

Here are the top four cashers including sidepots: Ken DiIorio 1378 \$213, Bruce Williams 1367 \$163, Daniel Campbell \$100 and Tim Harkness 1351 \$100.

High games were worth \$25 each, \$13 for ties. First game tie, 268, DiIorio and Williams. Second game tie, 248s, Tucker and Harkness. Third game 269 and first block (724) Greg Neuer; fourth game, 257, Jim Starks; fifth game 276, Harkness and the sixth, Matt Avantis 258.

Prize Fund: 26 players paying out a total of \$1,080. No 300s or honor scores, 7-10 or -4-6-7-10 conversions.

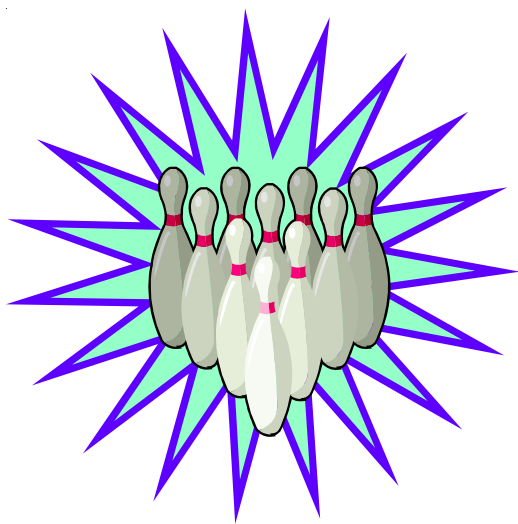


