Storm National Mixed Championships Tournament To Be Held At Newly Renovated Stadium

RENO,NV–The National Bowling Stadium is proud to be the host of the 2005 Storm National Mixed Championships and the Festival of Bowling. This tournament will one of the first to use the Stadium’s new lanes and scoring system. The \$1.3 million renovation is scheduled to be completed in July and includes a whole new look for the Stadium. New carpeting and other upgrades will give the Stadium a fresher look and the new lanes, gutters and state-of-the-art scoring system keep the Stadium as the “premier” bowling facility in the world.

The tournament will be held on selected dates from August 11 through November 13, 2005. The National Mixed Championships provides league and tournament bowlers a chance to bowl in a 4-person mixed team event (2 men and 2 women), mixed doubles (1 man and 1 woman) and singles in a USBC Sanctioned National Tournament.

The Festival of Bowling is a companion tournament to the National Mixed Tournament and features several different events for bowlers of all ages and abilities. The events included in the

Festival are Open Trios, three bowlers of any combination of men and women, Open Doubles, two bowlers of any combination, Senior Doubles and Senior Singles, separate events for bowlers 50 and over, and the Adult-Youth Doubles, one youth and one adult bowler, which gives the youth bowlers a chance to compete and win scholarship money.

This year, the tournaments have been divided into separate handicap and scratch events, giving bowlers a chance to compete against other bowlers of equal abilities.

Some tournament dates are already sold out, but spots are available on the following dates: August 11-12, 18-21, 25-28, September 29-October 3, October 13-16, 20-21, October 31-November 6 and November 10-13.

Back To Back WCST Singles Tournament Victories For Kevin Gannon Regular Divisioin & Jim Thurmond Super Senior Division

LA HABRA–All Time WCST Leading Money Leader, Kevin Gannon (Lakewood), won his 18th WCST Championship at La Habra “300” Bowl last week-end and has now the 2nd most WCST Titles won, passing Barry Asher, and now only 5 Titles in back of Ross Packard who has 23 WCST Titles.

For this tournament, Kevin never had the lead at any time of the finals, and was in 4th place prior to game #11, then rolled a 299 game to go into 3rd, and into the position round, 36 pins from 2nd, and 45 pins from 1st. 1st and 2nd belonged to Gip Lentine, and Ron Winger. Gip beat Ron 215-198, but needed a double in the 9th frame to shut out Kevin. He got a baby split, and went 9 out, losing ground to Kevin who was finishing strong with a 267 game, against Marlow Dinger who rolled a big 257 game against Kevin and lost.

With the 30 pin bonus, and the win, Kevin ended up winning the tournament by 16 pins, and the big \$1000,00 first place prize. Kevin bowled 566 his last two games, and plus 464 for the finals. He started the finals in 6th place. This was his 2nd victory in a row, after winning Forest Lanes three weeks ago. **continued page 2**

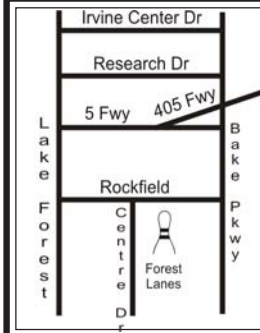
Team No-Tap Santa Clarita Lanes

The finals had nine WCST Champions of the 12 bowlers who bowled and the scores were very high. Leading qualifier, Ken Racette dropped back after game #3, and never did make a strong recovery, and finished 7th. Gip Lentine and Ron Winger were the main two leaders for most of the finals.. Gip ended up in 2nd, and Ron in 3rd place.

Local resident, Marlow Dinger finished a very strong 4th place, after beginning the finals in 11th place. Big games for the qualifying, Dave Frame, 300, Four 297, games, Vaughn Doody, John Cocchi, Marlow Dinger and Larry Gray, and a 290 game by Don Blatchford. The tournament, it's biggest singles turn-out in over a year with the return of the two divisional finals format, had 71 entries, 52 regular seniors, and 19 super seniors for a pay-off of \$9,260.00 for both divisions, and a total of 26 cash places paid.

For 3 tournaments in 2005, a total of \$24,310.00 paid out, and for 218 tournaments , a total of \$2,395,333.00 paid out. Top 4: 1st, Kevin Gannon, \$1000.00, 2nd, Gip Lentine (Chino), \$725.00, 3rd, Ron Winger, \$600.00, and 4th to Marlow Dinger (La Habra, \$500.00. Our thanks to our hosts. The scores, very high. Our thanks also to our coverage sponsor, Ebonite International. We sold two more Ebonite Bowling Balls and now have a total of over \$1000.00 in the end of the year money kitty, that will be added to the final tournament for 2005, also to be held at La Habra "300" Bowl, on the week-end of December 17-18. Ed Saleh, our former Bracket and Side-Pot worker, was able to work this one, and as always a great job done. Our thanks to all of the bowlers entered, especially the 8 travelers from Las Vegas.

Jim Thurmond (Hemet, won his 6th WCST Title, and the 2nd one in a row, with his last victory prior to this one at Lake Forest three weeks ago. Jim, started out in 2nd, and got the lead early in the finals only one time, and entered the position round even after bowling a 286 in game 5, was in 3rd place. Barry Gurney had rolled a 289 game earlier to hold a lead of 74 pins over Jim, and 72 pins over 2nd place, Don Jackson.

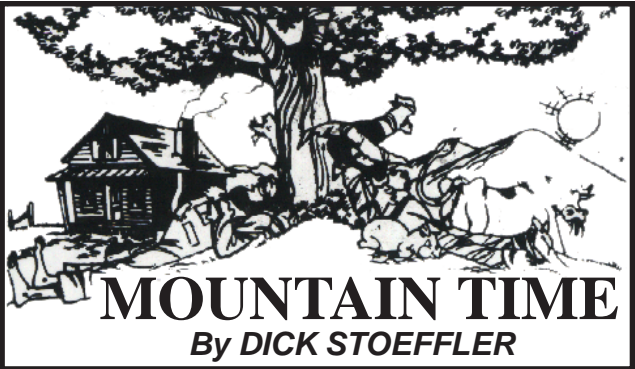

LAS VEGAS, NV—On the walls of my office, 14-plaques remain from the group accumulated over time. One standing trophy; the Helms Hall Athlete of the Month for January, 1968, adorns a front room shelf.

The office walls also reveal three pictures or posters: Johnny (No-Hit Vander Meer and Larry Doby, both autographed, thanks to the famed Chuck Pezzano, and, Dick Weber, joined by Sandra Wong, also signed. Albeit by Sandra. Add to this, a framed copy of my favorite column, accompanied by a cartoon of the event by Walt Steinseick, which would be the “Monster Mash” episode when Bowlers Journal Editor Jim Dressel floundered and flopped from the stands at the U.S. Open at Fountain Howl a couple years back, only to be saved by a miracle catch by Marge Miyoda and a pair of other courageous women.

The rest of that madcap room is a clutter of papers, magazines, notes and a TV that doesn’t function and a fax machine that does, plus file cabinets.

After the recent passing of Dick Weber, I was looking (my filing system needs a full-bore-search for any item ... people could be lost in that room,) for 61 “stuff” that might relate to Weber. I came across a copy of the list of those presented the “Sam, Levine FLOWERS FOR THE LIVING Award.” Since 1961, the award has been given by the Bowling Writers Association’s special committee 44-times. Sometimes bowlers are the recipients, sometimes it goes to writers, publishers, proprietors, broadcasters or even sports editors who may have never bowled a 150-game in their life, but whose coverage and involvement in bowling has been profound enough for them to receive the honor.

Eddie Elias, who founded the PBA is on the “*Flowers*” list. *Chris Schenkel* the TV broadcaster is, too. So’s Marion Ladewig, the greatest woman bowler in her time, maybe all-time. Writers like Fritz Howell, Billy Sixty, Byron Schoeman, John Jowdy, Joe Lyou and Chuck Pezzano are there.

So are bowlers like Joe Norris, Hank Marino, Don Carter, Earl Anthony, Millie Ignizio and Glenn Allison. Plus ... naturally, Dick Weber, named in 1979. Weber was only about 50-years-old at the time he got the lifetime achievement award, and was barely “warmed-up.” He could have been named several more times! Add Jeanette Robinson and Helen Duval and Helen Baker and Fred Lufy and Mort Luby, Jr., plus Sam Levine, to mention a few-people who have devoted a lifetime to the sport, from coaches to proprietors ... in other words, it covers the entire spectrum of the great game of bowling.

Near the bottom of the list, for 2003, the name “Dick Stoeffler” appears. It was an unbelievable honor at the time. Like... holy crap! But it wasn’t until a couple of weeks ago that it REALLY hit me! I had received the same honor as Dick Weber! Can you IMAGINE the feeling of BEING ON THE SAME LIST AS DICK WEBER? For anything? Or Carter or Anthony or Allison, or any of the luminaries who have been honored? Hey! Even *though* it was something that took place two-years ago, I had to take a “change of shorts” time out. It truly sent a shiver up and down my spine.

You see, you don’t apply for this award. There’s no entry blank. It is one of the best kept secrets in sports. When the committee makes their pick, the writers find some event they know the honored individual will be in attendance, then the secret is made public. No advance announcements, ala the Academy Awards or some such. The presenter talks for several minutes without giving a major clue... then, someone in the audience is in for a helluva surprise. Mine came at BowlExpo in Vegas, just prior to Terry Bradshaw’s uproarious speech.

I like to say I “was Bradshaw’s opening act,” in front of a couple thousand or so bowling proprietors and their spouses.

I was there for the 8 am shinding because of the skulduggery of Bob Johnson, Jim Dressel, Sandra Wong, Jim Goodwin, and, unbelievably, my wonderful child bride, Susie. They convinced me Dressel was getting an award and he hoped we’d be on hand as close friends: Due to LV traffic, it meant leaving the house prior to 6 am. It was a “con” job, deluxe. I had no intention of being anywhere but in bed at 8 am ... causing me to ask Susie if I was becoming senile, as we drove to the Manadalay.

I was stunned at the time, but it took the unfortunate passing of Dick Weber for shock and reality to set in nearly two years later.

Dick Weber was the benchmark for anything great in *bowling*. I don’t know how I even got on the outskirts of this honor. Maybe it was ‘cause I kept “showin’ up” for those 60-years. Maybe I’m the reason they keep the award such a secret? Whatever-it is really cool. Thank you Dick, belatedly and sadly, (and I’m sure I am saying this for the other 42-recipients) for providing one of the biggest thrills of a lifetime in bowling ... being on a list that includes the name “Dick Weber !” Wow!

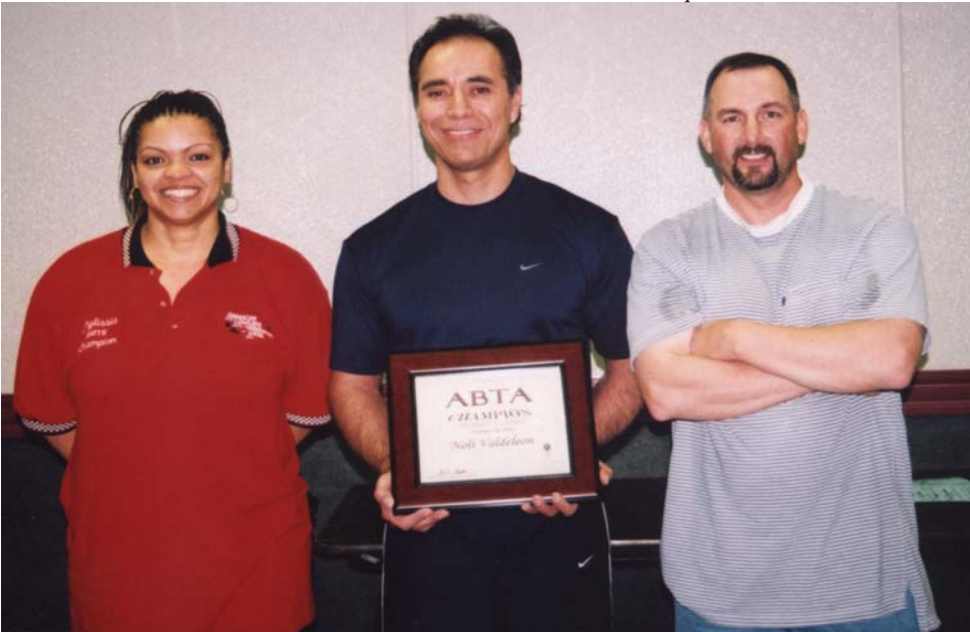

Nearly 40,000 Women Expected To Descend On Tulsa For The WIBC Championship Tournament

600 participants will arrive daily from April through June
GREENDALE, Wis. - Tulsa, Okla., should brace for an invasion of nearly 40,000 Women's International Bowling Congress members during the 2005 WIBC Championship Tournament, a USBC Event, April 9-June 24.

Final numbers for the 86th annual WIBC Tournament, a USBC Event, show that 7,962 five-player teams will compete at Riverlanes. The tournament will feature 19,989 sets of doubles, 39,978 singles entries and 37,812 all-events entries. The prize fund for the tournament has reached an estimated \$1.6 million.

Tulsa should expect an economic impact of approximately \$40 million, based on previous WIBC events with similar participation levels. Each person is expected to spend an average of four days in Tulsa and more than 50,000 room nights will be booked at area hotels. Approximately 600 participants will arrive daily from April through June.

The WIBC Championship Tournament, a USBC Event, features the following divisions: Classic for bowlers with averages of 190 and above; Division 1 for averages of 170-189; Division 2 for averages of 150-169; Division 3 for averages of 131-149; and Division 4 for averages of 130 and below. Division 4, created in 2003, gives lower average bowlers an opportunity to compete with other bowlers of similar abilities for prize money and international championships.

The tournament attracts bowlers from every U.S. state and Canada, as well as international participants from Australia, Bermuda, Japan and elsewhere. It is the world's largest participatory sporting event for women.

Future tournaments, to be called USBC Women's Championships, will be held in Reno, Nev., in 2006, 2009, 2012, 2015, 2018; Charlotte, N.C., in 2007; and Detroit in 2008.

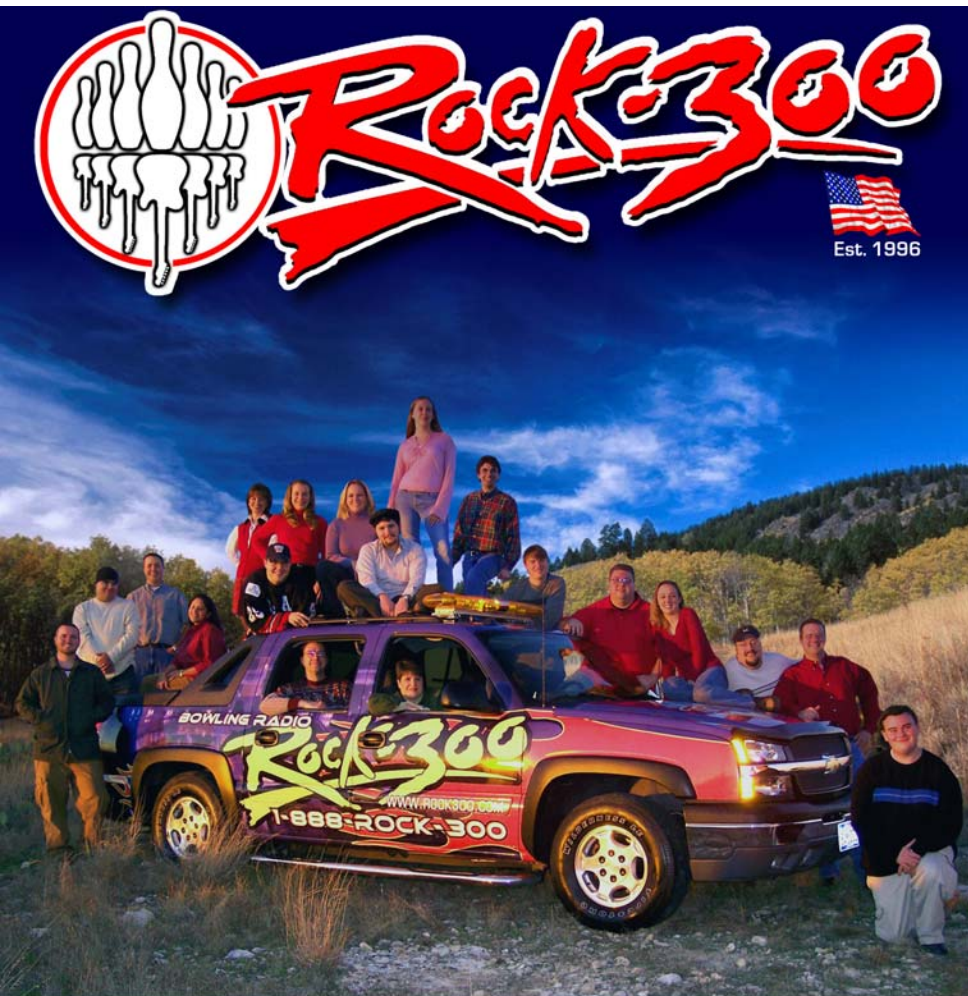
