Junior Gold participation is at an all-time high. The same can be said for high school and collegiate bowling, which surpassed 200 member schools for the first time. More kids than ever are funding their education with bowling scholarships.

The Bowler's Ed program is also growing, delivering over 5,000 curriculums to schools across the country. USA Bowling expanded from 8 to 16 tournaments, with the largest tournament to date conducted in Birmingham, Alabama. Perhaps most importantly, our field staff of youth development specialists had individual visits to more than

> 2,000 centers, training and educating youth directors and proprietors on how to improve their youth programs.

> For 2016, Junior Gold is on track towards 5-8% growth. USA Bowling will crown a national champion for the first time and do so with the excitement of a national television broadcast. The youth development specialists will continue their outreach to more centers, providing training and education to new markets.

Competitive Bowling/Championship Tournaments

A new PWBA Tour re-launched with tremendous success. The tour surpassed entry projections by 73%! The public responded with over 330,000 views for our stepladder finals and the new tour generated over 26 million (that's not a typo ... 26 million!) media impressions for bowling during the 2015 season. Nearly every event sold out with bowling fans filling host centers as spectators.

We announced exciting enhancements for the USBC Open Championships for the 2017 event, including a new third division to broaden the appeal of the event to a new audience. Both the Women's and Men's U.S. Opens returned on national television in 2015 after a one-year hiatus. We also announced plans to bring back the United States Amateur Championship in 2016.

The word growth returns to the tournament area in 2016. The Open Championships in Reno and the Women's Championships in Las Vegas will both grow in participation from 2015. The PWBA tour expands from 11 to 14 events. We talked last year about the return of a familiar "team" tournament series and while we decided 2015 was not the right time to launch, you can look for this new ofcontinued on page 8

TOURNAMENT RULES

- ELIGIBILITY: Only members of the Southern Los Angeles County USBC are eligible to participate in this tournament. All bowlers
 must hold current National and Local membership prior to the start of competition. USBC memberships are available for purchase
 onsite for \$25.00. transfer cards are \$10.00.
- 2. <u>AVERAGES</u>: The entering average for this tournament shall be:
 - A. Highest published average of 21 games or more for the 2014-15 season, winter or summer.
 B. Highest published average of 21 games or more for the 2013-14 season, winter or summer.
 - Highest published average of 21 games or more for the 2013-14 season, winter or sur
 If no A or B, current certified league average of 21 games or more as of 12/31/15.
 - D. If none of the above, bowler shall be assigned the average of 220 and will bowl scratch.

This tournament follows standard USBC rules for averages, so please be familiar with rules 319a, b & c, as failure to comply with these rules may result in disqualification.

While we make our best efforts to verify averages prior to the start of competition, TEAM CAPTAINS and BOWLERS are ultimately responsible for providing the correct average. Any attempt to misrepresent the correct average will result in disqualification.

ALL SUBMITTED AVERAGES WILL BE VERIFIED PRIOR TO DISTRIBUTION OF PRIZE CHECKS. WE WILL VERIFY THE ACCURACY OF THE SUBMITTED AVERAGES USING ALL RESOURCES AT OUR DISPOSAL, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, BOWL.COM AND OTHER LOCAL ASSOCIATION AVERAGE BOOKS.

- 3. HANDICAP: Basis for handicap shall be 100% of the difference between Entering Average and 220.
- 4. ENTRY FEES: Fees shall be \$30.00 per bowler per event. Optional All Events can be entered for \$10.00/person. All fees must accompany this form to guarantee squad dates/times. Make checks or money orders payable to: Southern LA County USBC. One check per entry is preferred. There will be a \$37.00 fee for any returned checks. There will be no refunds once your entry has been scheduled, unless SLACUSBC is notified within 5 days of the scheduled squad date/time. Refund requests received after the scheduled squad will be reviewed by tournament management. Prize fund will be returned one (1) place for every six (6) entries.
- 5. PARTICIPATION: Bowlers may enter Team event as many times as they wish, provided at least 2 team members are changed. Bowlers may only compete ONCE in Singles and Doubles. Bowlers entering Singles must also enter and pay for Doubles. For bowlers entering All-Events, the first team series bowled will count for your All-Events total. An entry form must be completed for each additional team being submitted.
- 6. PARENTAL CONSENT: Any unmarried participant under the age 18 must have parental consent on file prior to the start of competition. The official Parental Consent form can be obtained through the Southern LA County USBC by calling (562) 925-0417. Consent forms must be filed with the tournament office one week prior to the scheduled squad time. If the bowler is accompanied by a parent, the form can be completed onsite prior to the start of the squad.
- 7. <u>LINEUP & REPLACEMENTS:</u> Team and Doubles lineups listed on the entry form will determine the order the participants will bowl and no changes to lineup will be allowed at the tournament site. All replacements must be made by the team captain at least one hour prior to the start of the squad, and replacements will bowl in the position of the bowler he/she is replacing. Prizes will be paid to the replacement bowler unless prior arrangements are made.
- **8.** TARDY BOWLER: Late bowlers will start in the frame currently being bowled. Bowlers shall receive a ZERO (0) for each frame missed. No frames may be made up and no blind score will be used.
- 9. **PROTESTS:** An appeal or protest of a decision involving eligibility or playing rules must be filed in writing with the tournament director and the association before tournament prizes are paid. Any violation of tournament rules is cause for disqualification, loss of entry fee, forfeit of all prize monies and possible suspension from USBC membership. Protests must be made in writing within 72 hours of the time of bowling to Tournament Manager. USBC Rule 329 will apply.
- 10. <u>DRESS CODE:</u> All bowlers must wear suitable attire. No tank tops, halter tops, or clothing bearing obscene or offensive logos. No sleeveless shirts or blouses can be worn. Additionally, no short shorts, skirts or skorts will be permitted. Tournament management will make final decision on adherence to the dress code.

ABAKUMOFF DOES IT AGAIN WITH 268-852 IN DEAF TRAVEL AT CAL BOWL

LAKEWOOD — In the So-Cal Deaf Traveling League's position round day at Cal Bowl while first place S F Valley and second place Anaheim fought to 10 to 10 points tie, league president Ed Abakumoff led his 4th place Riverside team to a near sweep 15-5 win over 3rd place Eagle Rock, moving Riverside up to a tie for first place with S F Valley at 127 points apiece. Thus putting Anaheim down to third with 123 points and Eagle Rock to fourth with 117.5 points. In the other match 5th place Chino Hills beat 6th place Mid City 13 to 7 staying in their respective positions with 116 and 109.5 points.

Remembering Alan Logan: He Was a Big Man With a Big Heart

WOODLAND HILLS – It's now been two years since Alan Logan passed away at 52. It's still difficult to believe.

Losing a longtime friend in one's bowling league is always crushing. It's like losing a family member.

Alan Logan was more than a friend of mine, more than someone I interviewed countless times because he always had a story

He was a friend of everyone in his league. He was cool and yet he never acted the part. He befriended not only the elite but the bowlers who struggled to score 120. He was color-blind in his friendliness. If you were a bowler, he smiled at you, teased you, liked you and cavorted with you.

Alan Logan was special in so many ways.

It was always memorable to compete against his team in the "Guys and Dolls" league at AMF Woodlake Lanes in Woodland Hills.

He'd put a smile on your face without trying.

The tall right-hander with oodles of charisma would always wind up and send missiles down the lanes. He seemingly just heaved the ball as hard as he could at the head pin . . . and then it was so much fun to watch the pins scatter.

When he toed the line, it almost seemed as if the pins put on a pained look on their faces. They knew they were going to be in for a bruising.

The term "smashmouth bowling" was based on Alan's style of heaving bullets toward the pins. One of Alan's bowling colleagues said he had so much power that every pin became a "messenger" – often resulting in strikes after he completely missed the head pin.

Alan blasted a career-best 242 in May 2012 despite bowling with pain in his back. And he set his high in his very own style.

Alan, who had a sharp wit, explained his big game by saying: "I helped the granddaughter plant the garden and came down with a sore back. And my 15-pound ball was too heavy, so I used a nine-pound ball. There's no crying in bowling."

Showing he had learned his bowling lessons, he added, "You just have to adjust, adjust, adjust."

That he did. And when he did rattle the pins for a strike, everyone in the bowling center knew it.

He celebrated his strikes with an ear-piercing clap and a huge smile. He wasn't showing off. It was just Alan being Alan.

"It's my personal excitement," he said of his clapping. "I wear my excitement on my sleeve."

His fellow bowlers all liked him and knew he was one of a kind. One such bowler was Carol Tucker, who said, "To me, he had the most loving and kindest spirit of any man I've ever known. He was sincerely nice to every person he came in contact with. You don't meet people like him often. I was lucky to have known him."

That goes for all of us – both bowlers and non-bowlers alike.

Alan was a Canoga Park resident who worked as a head locksmith at Huntington Memorial Hospital in Pasadena. He was receiving treatment there for his cancer.

All the while, he kept going to the bowling center without saying a word about his

Alan just wanted to throw his bullets down the lane and shatter the pins. He recognized that he might be better off throwing a hook instead of his fastball, but he was having too much fun to change.

"I'm not sure if it's the right coaching method," said Alan of his gun-slinging, "but it's my personal technique."

That was Alan Logan. He was his own wonderful person and he is certainly missed – two years later.

PBA HEADQUARTERS — The PBA has announced PBA Hall of Famer and veteran ESPN color analyst **Randy Pedersen** will join ESPN/Xtra Frame lead announcer **Mike Jakubowski** in the broadcast booth for a series of exclusive PBA Xtra Frame tournaments, beginning with the PBA Xtra Frame Maine Shootout April 4-6 at Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine. PBA's 2016 Xtra Frame tournament series will include tournaments across the United States. Each Xtra Frame event is an expanded weekend tournament that will award PBA Tour titles and will be covered exclusively, live by PBA's online bowling channel, Xtra Frame.

The Xtra Frame tour will include two stops in the suburban Chicago area; Jonesboro, Ark.; Lubbock, Texas; Houston, Texas; Middletown, Del.; Detroit, Tamarac, Fla.; Memphis, Tenn., and Las Vegas. Details will be announced soon. Also, the PBA reported that as of March 1, Xtra Frame had surpassed the 8,000 paid subscriber milestone for the first time. The previous high for paid monthly and annual subscribers was 7,448 on Jan. 2, 2015. The current subscriber total – 8,045 – is 1,122 ahead of the same date a year earlier. The paid subscriber base doesn't include three-day passes.

'He'd Be a Great Story Even If He Wasn't 77'

WINNETKA – This is the mark of a very good bowler. Four years ago, Ed Chow was bowling in leagues twice a week at now-defunct Mission Hills Bowl. When other teams at that bowling house needed to fill openings through the season, they turned to Ed.

Ed accepted invitations from three new teams to bowl with them for the rest of the season. He finished bowling that year five times a week – twice in his own leagues and three times as a permanent sub.

One of the nicest and most affable guys around, Ed had another quality that bowling teams liked: He was a darn good bowler with an average over 200. And it didn't matter a bit that he was over 70 years old.

Now 77, Ed hasn't slowed down at all. He's still in demand as a substitute but now he's moved to Winnetka Bowl for his home bowling center. And he's still averaging over 200.

Ace bowler Russell Booth often practices with Ed and Booth says this about his practice partner:

"A million players can average 205, but Ed's averaging 205 and he's 77 years old," Booth said. "He still can come down to the lanes and bowl 10-12 games for practice in the afternoon.

Ed Chow is a 200-average bowler and self-described "sucker for the game." He's in demand whenever teams need a substitute.

"He's in great shape and he's not a kid anymore. He'd be a great story even if he wasn't 77."

Ed listens to the playback of Booth's praise and laughs heartily.

"Russell's a very nice guy with the compliments, but he's a great friend. He's very competitive and that's what I enjoy about going down to the lanes – the competition.

"Competing against yourself is no good. If you saw me by myself, I wouldn't be there. I like competition," said Ed, a resident of Granada Hills for the past 43 years.

Ed got acquainted with the game when he set pins as a teenager in Kansas City. He moved to California after he graduated high school and got serious about the game in the 1980s.

With the game coming naturally to him, Ed considered competing on the professional level but decided against it. "A lot of people were very serious about the game, but I wasn't that way," said Ed, who walks more than five miles a day at Northridge Mall. "I was busy working and wasn't in position where I could be away from my job."

Ed was involved in the high-tech field at the time and later closed out his career in 1995 as the vice president, chief information officer of Sherman Oaks-based House of Fabrics ("a great company," he says).

"My new job after I retired was bowling," says Ed with a laugh.

Interestingly, Ed has been bowling better than ever. He has bowled five sanctioned 300 games and two 800 series in his career. Ed scorched his last 800 in 2009 at Mission Hills Bowl by rolling 243, 299, 267 for an 809.

"I'm like fine wine," he says with a laugh.

Ed's first 800 also was at Mission Hills Bowl. He went 289, 245 and 279 for an 813 in 2006.

"On my first 800, I didn't even know I had it," he said. "I didn't keep track of it. All of a sudden, I realized I got an eight: 'Oh, my God.' And that was a tough league – the Mission Majors. These are all serious bowlers. I was proud of that."

Ed sometimes hears that he bowls so well because he has a distinct advantage that most others don't.

He's a left-hander. He just laughs about that supposed edge.

"I don't really care," he said. "I know there are more right-handers than left-handers, but to me you have to do with what you got out there. Do your best and you'll feel rewarded. It's a game and just keep it a game.

"You may not perform well one day, but the next day you might. And if you don't, that's fine. That's why I've been in the game for so long."

Ed also gives credit for his longevity to his rotator cuff surgery that he underwent on his left shoulder three years ago.

"After the operation, I haven't felt any pain," he says. "I'm bowling more than I ever have in my life. I'm not feeling

tired. I don't have to soak my arm when I get home."

His most memorable moment in bowling? Ed answers the question only indirectly by saying "being able to be the

person I am today. My wife [Charlene] and I will be married 52 years this year."

Now here's where the bowling part comes in. Ed happened to first spy his wife-to-be at a Kansas City bowling center,

but he didn't say anything. "My first impression was that she looked great," he recalled.

Five or six years later, the two were fixed up on a blind date in 1963. "In 1964 we came out [to California] and got

Ed says Charlene used to bowl on his team but she's given up the game. "She was a good bowler, but she didn't have the fever as much as I had," Ed says. "She wasn't a sucker for the game like I was. She wanted to do other things than bowling."





Michele Carter's Golden Ladies Victory Was One for the Books

LAS VEGAS — There was something very special that happened at the 26th National Golden Ladies Classic earlier this month in Las Vegas.

And it hasn't been properly emphasized enough.

It wasn't so much that a relative unknown won a bowling tournament title in the person of 50-year-old Michele Carter of San Diego.

That happens. It happens from time to time.

It wasn't so much that Michele Carter "ran the table" in the single-elimination stepladder finals, meaning she won all four of her matches as the No. 5 seed.

That happens too. Not often, but it does happen.

It wasn't so much that Carter, a tournament-inexperienced player, rose up and prevailed in the championship game against a tournament-hardened player like Tish Johnson, who earned the top seed in the past four Golden Ladies tournaments.

Those things happen too. Upsets happen – though not that often.

Rather, it was the fact that Michele Carter did an unbelievable job of being immune to pressure during a mesmerizing 300-256 victory in the championship match.

She bowled her best, not in her first game of the stepladder finals (239-190 over Rene Fleming) – not in her second game (249-223 over Sharon Powers) and not in her third game (227-182 over Jeanne Naccarato). She saved the best for the pressure-packed finals

She was perfect in all 12 of her shots. In the champion-ship match. Now THAT'S rare.

How rare?

Records are sketchy about the frequency of such occurrences.

But here's a glimpse of how special Michele's effort was.


There have been 25 documented cases of Professional Bowlers Assn. players rolling a perfect game during tournament play on nationally televised shows. Jack Biondolillo (300-216 over Les Schissler) was the first, recording the effort April 1, 1967 in the PBA Tournament of Champions in Akron, Ohio.

Sean Rash (300-213 over Ryan Ciminelli) has been the last person to do it and he accomplished the feat on Feb. 15, 2015 in the PBA Tournament of Champions in Indianapolis.

But only two of the 25 perfect games came in the championship match. Bob Benoit (300-255 over Mark Roth) was the first to turn the trick – this happened Jan. 23, 1988 in the Quaker State Open in Grand Prairie, Texas. It then happened one more time when left-hander Mike Aulby (300-279 over David Ozio) accomplished the feat July 31, 1993 in the Wichita Open in Wichita, Kan.

That was the last time a PBA player rolled a nationally televised perfect game in a championship match.

Now, Carter's perfecto wasn't televised and it wasn't a PBA event (the event was sanctioned by the United States Bowling Congress) but it, nevertheless, ranks as a monumental achievement.

Marketing

The success of our youth and PWBA programs opened the door to an amazing television partnership. CBS Sports Network and ESPN televised 12 USBC managed events equaling more than 30 hours of bowling on national television in 2015. The USBC Bowling Academy has expanded its reach to over 100,000 people. A new structure and focus within the marketing team has worked hard to deliver growth for the USBC Open and Women's Championships for the first time in several years. Content programs for our members such as the Bowler's Source and Welcome 2 Bowling continue to grow as

In 2016, our marketing team will continue to support the needs of the association by telling the USBC story through all of our channels. The story spans many products, benefits and services with one common theme ... Bowling!

Technology

USBC now has a mobile app for members to access their card, look up averages and see news on their phones. Perhaps most importantly, work is nearing completion to deliver USBC associations a modern version of WinLABS software. This investment of more than a million dollars will provide associations a current tool to manage association

For 2016, the new version of WinLABS will be available for USBC associations and a new mobile-friendly redesign of BOWL.com is on the way!

Membership Value

Our membership services teams supported our members by answering 67,000 phone calls in 2015. Our regional managers visited 649 associations, servicing bowling at the highest levels. We also listened to our members concerns about membership cards. USBC made a larger investment on cards this year and dramatically improved the quality of the cards with a new ink process. Whether it is rules experts just a phone call away, regional managers visiting local associations, a great tournament experience, videos on BowlTV or answering a question on Facebook, your dues allow for a quality staff with a customer service focus.

2016 will see us continue the work to serve the needs of our state and local associations and their leaders in a quality way. This includes quality customer service for the association, the member, leagues and tournaments. Of course, all tied together with a certified average for all bowling members. Additionally, rules support, bonding, and settling membership disputes continues to be a critical USBC service to bowling. Ensuring the future success for the local and state associations is critical so bowling can best serve the customer at the local level with meaningful local awards, tournaments and recognition programs.

Before I close, I'd like to talk about the 2016 USBC Convention

The past couple of years, the USBC staff, our board, along with association delegates changed the convention experience. We talked about the importance of working together to create a USBC we can all be proud of. We also celebrated our shared successes. USBC association leaders then took home the message of A Future for the Sport back to their community.

The 2016 USBC Convention will mark an important crossroads. A proposal came from an association leader in the field that would allow USBC National to increase dues in the future, if needed. If approved, it would be the first dues increase in the history of

USBC. Many people don't realize that USBC national dues have been \$10 since 2005. The proposers correctly realize that without additional financial support, USBC and our associations will soon face some uncomfortable changes.

Today's Vision/Tomorrow's Future

The theme for this year's convention is so fitting. Sharing a vision that becomes tomorrow's future is something we must do together. A look at the past gives us some perspective on tomorrow.

Comparing financial reports in 2006 to 2014, USBC has seen a 33% decline in membership revenue. The primary reason for this is very simple – there are fewer lanes in the United States. Meanwhile, inflation has driven prices up about 20% in the past 10 years. This combination of revenue declining with inflation rising led USBC to make big cuts.

Some of the cuts were products such as the member magazine and awards. In addition, staff has set out to become more efficient in all areas. In 2006, USBC had over 200 employees. Today we have less than 90. We are striving to be a lean and efficient organization without reducing services to our associations and members. However, continuing to simply cut will soon become unsustainable and has already in some areas.

The question a delegate needs to ask themselves is, "Do I want a smaller USBC with less services in the future or do I want to ensure tomorrow for the organization which includes a healthy local, state and national together?" It's not a question about staff members. It's about the services association and members need and then corresponding staff needed to provide it. Delegates will have to ask themselves, "Where does it end? Can we afford not to ensure tomorrow and have the services we need go away?

The answer to these questions will come in the form of a vote on amendment B3, which gives USBC the option of raising dues up to \$5 if needed. Option is a key word here. It's a cap increase as opposed to a dues increase. USBC doesn't necessarily need a dues increase for the 2016-2017 season, possibly even 2017-2018, but soon after that we risk consistent deficit budgets and eroding our financial reserves. Without a dues increase, at that point, additional service cuts would need to be looked at. As a responsible business, USBC plans with a multi-year budget which is why knowing funding will be there down the road is so vital.

Where would the additional money go?

The funding will go directly towards ensuring tomorrow for USBC. This includes support for all our associations that are protected by USBC's singular non-profit designation. Many people don't realize that the majority of USBC's membership dollars fund resources used to benefit state and local associations. In fact, almost all the membership revenue goes directly or indirectly to that support. Here is a simple list of examples:

•Continue investment in the field for USBC Association Services and membership support. Expanded training and education could be funded in the future.

•Continued investment in dedicated, knowledgeable staff members a phone call or email away to help with rules, association services, tournament support and more

•Improving key technology such as WinLABS, BOWL.com, the mobile app and

•Keep the USBC Convention as a free event to benefit our delegates and members

•Continue USBC investment in IBC Youth, where we have seen growth and all-time highs in Junior Gold, high school, and collegiate program

•Competitive bowling events including the Masters, Queens, U.S. Opens, PWBA Tour, and Open and Women's Championships that provide amazing experiences for our members, help retain bowlers and showcase our sport

•Televise our outstanding events to keep bowling top of mind and relevant for the next generation of consumers

> •Evolve, as the science related to equipment certifications and specifications currently is changing and requires support with modern tools and a trained staff

> •Have the strongest Team USA program so we can compete with the best on the world stage

> Over the next several months, our association services team will be traveling the country attending as many as 90 local meetings. We will be there to listen and answer questions about how you want USBC to look like in the future. During a conversation recently, a member was asked the question, "What do you expect from USBC as a member?" The answer, "I expect USBC to be there when we need it." That answer really resonated with me.

> So much of what we do here (as well as the answer to where the money goes) at USBC is being there with services and solutions when our associations, leagues, members or the bowling industry needs it. More information will be shared at convention, but for now just remember an approval to raise the dues cap of any kind is an approval towards ensuring tomorrow. It's an approval of continuing the effort towards building a better USBC we can all be proud of and a brighter Future for the sport.

> We hope you will look back at the past couple of years and see the vision for USBC's future taking shape. Together we are building more opportunities across all of bowling. From little kids, to college players, professionals to seniors, USBC provides service every step of the way. We are celebrating our successes more than ever before while investing in new tools for tomorrow.

> Certainly, USBC is not perfect. We make plenty of mistakes, but you may have noticed our staff's commitment to being available and responsive when something does go wrong. Whether it is tournament formats, host city preference or membership cards, we are making improvements by listening to our bowlers.

> We hope you see the progress and the value provided by having USBC serve bowling as a quality National Governing Body. Bowling has a lot to be excited about in 2016. Thank you for being a part

To close, I'd like to again remind you of our mission and promise. Everything we have talked about circles back to it.

USBC is the National Governing Body for the sport.

Our mission is to provide benefits and services, resources and standards for the sport. Our promise is to celebrate the past, be mindful of the present and ensure bowling's future through thoughtful research, planning and delivery. We will protect and nurture the sport with a mutual admiration and respect for all who enjoy bowling.

18. All entrants who have qualified for a cash and/or merchandise prize of \$600 or more in the position standings prize list in any event in a tournament, including All-Events, special features, special prizes and donated prizes within 12 months prior to entry, must give tournament management the following information at the time of entry for possible re-rating: the name of each tournament in which the bowler has been paid such a prize, or if not yet paid, in which the bowler has qualified for the prize; the amount of the prize; the actual score bowled to qualify for the prize; and the prize position. Failure to comply with these provisions is cause for disqualification and loss of entry fee.

LINE-UPS. REPLACEMENTS

- 19. Bowlers must check-in at least one hour prior to their scheduled squad with their current USBC membership card.

- 23. An All-Events entry may be transferred if the transfer is made before either of the bowlers involved have participated in any event of the tournament. The all-events fee must be paid before the closing date

- 24. Bowlers arriving late shall begin play and the score shall count ginning with the frame then being bowled. Missed frames sha be credited with a zero. Frames may not be made-up. Bowlers not present to bowl when it's their turn will be credited with a zero fo
- 25. If equipment failure on a pair of lanes would delay the progress of the series, a tournament official can authorize the completion of a game and series on another pair of certified lanes. The interrupted game and series must be resumed from the point of interruption. No practice will be allowed after being moved. USBC Rule 321 will be
- 26. A game or frame(s) within a game that is irretrievably lost in the scoring process may be re-bowled with the approval of tournament

EQUIPMENT, CONDUCT, DRESS

- 27. $\underline{\textbf{Practice}}$ is $\underline{\textbf{prohibited}}$ in the hosting center during the weekend of competition
- 28. Bowling balls may be checked for hardness, weight, and balance at the discretion of a tournament official. Any bowling ball that does not meet USBC specifications will subject the bowler to disqualification
- 29. Any use of abrasives, chemical, solvents or other methods to alter the surface of a bowling ball is prohibited after competition has begun. Any ball so altered must be removed from the competition

- and if it is determined the bowler had prior knowledge that the actions were in violation of USBC Rule 18, the game(s) in which the violation occurred is subject to forfeiture and the bowler is subject to disqualification, loss of entry fee, and possible suspension from USBC membership. The use of approved cleaning agents such as isopropyl (rubbing) alcohol and polishing machines is permissible.
- 30. Action on the lanes which is considered unsportsmanlike or disruptive will not be tolerated. Improper conduct as determined by the tournament management may result in disqualification.

WOMEN'S DIVISION: Cash prizes and awards shall be awarded to the Champions in each division. In cases of a tie for first place. duplicate awards will be made. Prize fund will be returned 100%.

Designated prize funds will be paid accordingly to each division within 30 days upon completion of the tournament, except when USBC nationals has authorized delay in payment, pending settlement of any claim or protest which effects position standings. APPEAL, PROTEST and VIOLATIONS

- 37 The Tournament Director shall be the authority to interpret USBC rules and state tournament rules, policies and procedures in deciding disputes. If deemed necessary, the Tournament Director shall consult with the Board of Directors of the California USBC.
- 38. An appeal or protest of a decision involving eligibility or playing rules must be filed in writing with the tournament director and the USBC before tournament prizes are paid. The decision of USBC is final and binding on all involved parties. Any violation of tournament rules is cause for disqualification, loss of entry fee, forfeit of all prize monies and possible suspension from USBC membership.

Failure to return the verification form within the designated time shall result in the disqualification of the bowler's scores.
- Minors under the age of 18 must have written consent from a parent or guardian in order to participate. Such consent must be on file with the tournament director before participation.
- PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED: Handicapped bowlers requiring aids such as crutches, canes, wheelchairs, etc., or who are blind must report this in writing when entry is submitted so that special schedule consideration can be arranged. Similar additional notice must be given if such a handicapped bowler is to be used as a
- Any person who bowls under an assumed name, under the name of another person scheduled to bowl in the tournament, or who is under suspension from USBC membership shall be disqualified. The individual shall forfeit their entry fee, all prize monies and be subject to suspension from USBC membership.

PARTICIPATION

- The team captain is responsible for the lineup and conduct of the team in tournament play. Team captain must report changes in their mailing address. Prize checks will be mailed to the captain's address listed on the entry.
