Sean Rash Wins Kuwait Open for First PBA International Tour Title

Reigning PBA Player of the Year denies Koivuniemi's bid for victory in 21st different country

KUWAIT CITY, Kuwait – Reigning Professional Bowlers Association Player of the Year Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., defeated Finnish-American Mika Koivuniemi of Hartland, Mich., 234-201, to win the Kuwait Open at Cozmo Bowling Center Sunday.

The victory was the sixth of Rash's career and his first in PBA International Tour competition. Rash earned \$25,000 and denied Koivuniemi's bid to add Kuwait to the list of countries where he has won titles. A week earlier, Koivuniemi won the Kingdom of Bahrain International Open a non-PBA International Tour event - for the 20th different country where he has won titles. Koivuniemi advanced to the title match with a 238-228 victory over fellow Finn and defending champion Osku Palermaa after Palermaa eliminated Sweden's Sandra Andersson in match two, 279-176. In the opening stepladder finals match, Anderson ended Ronnie Russell's bid to earn a berth in the upcoming Barbasol PBA Tournament of Champions, defeating the Indianapolis resident, 226-185.

The final PBA International Tour event prior to the Tournament of Champions is the Brunswick Euro Challenge, Tuesday-Sunday, at Dream Bowl Palace in Munich, Germany. Mike Fagan of Dallas is the defending champion. The Brunswick Euro Challenge will be covered live on the Internet by bowlingdigital.com.

Cup finals, featuring the top four teams based on PBA Detroit Winter Swing qualifying rounds, will be held at 6 p.m. on March 31 at Woodland Bowl for telecast on ESPN on Sunday, April 7, at 1 p.m. ET.

Second was Kelly Wynn and Bryan Moore with a 1354 for \$90 There was a total of \$790 paid out in doubles and 14 paid spots with low to cash of 1286. The Semifinalists took the floor and the leader after 3 games was Gentleman Jesse Boquio with a nice +116. He was on fire during the third game of semis shooting a 298 with handicap game. Finishing in very close second was Chris Kelly at a +115. She sat out the first round of the elims. Jesse had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$4,150. Jessie drew a 110 this week.
