Dick Allen Wins PBA Cheetah Championship

Allen also notches seventh career title in first event of PBA World Series of Bowling X on FS1

ALLEN PARK, MI -Dick Allen of Lexington, S.C., defeated Kyle Sherman of O'Fallon, Mo., 234-195, in the title match Monday to win the PBA Cheetah Championship for his second tour title of the season and seventh of his career

As the first event of PBA World Series of Bowling X, the Cheetah Championship finals telecast was the first of four consecutive live PBA Tour telecasts on FS1 this week from Thunderbowl Lanes.

The 40-year-old Allen. in his 20th year on the Go

Bowling! PBA Tour, had things in hand from the start striking on the first five shots and opening up a lead that Sherman could not challenge.

"I just focused on keeping it together and not falling apart," Allen said. "When you have a good lead you don't want to let the bad thoughts creep in, or the good thoughts either. Just focus on making the best possible shot every frame and fortunately I was able to do that."

Allen, who won the PBA Lubbock Sports Open in January, ran his career



singles title match record to 5-1 and joined PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke as the only two-time winners this

"When I get to TV I'm hard to beat," Allen said.

"It's a matter of getting here. I wish I could be as effective in the qualifying and match play rounds of tournaments and I then would be here (in the finals) more often."

Bowling on the PBA advance to the telecast. 33-foot Cheetah lane condition, the telecast opened with a seeding round that determined the qualifying order for three stepladder matches. Allen earned the top seed for the finals with a 230 game followed by No. 2 qualifier Rhino Page, Orlando, 173; No. 3 qualifier Sherman, 172, and No. 4 qualifier Matt McNiel, Minneapolis, 163.

The four finalists survived Round-of-16 and Round-of-8 best-of-five elimination rounds earlier Monday after qualifying rounds bowled last week to

The 25-year-old Sherman burst out of the gate with a 290-152 win over McNiel and then went on to beat Page 229-204 in the semifinal match to advance to the title match against Allen.

Sherman's second-place finish was his career best in a tour singles event in three seasons as a pro. He finished second with partner Brad Miller in the Mark Roth-Marshall Holman Doubles Championship earlier this season.


Veterans Take To The Lanes For 72nd Annual BVL Veterans **Bowling Tournament**

ALLEN PARK, MI - As top qualifier for the 2019 World Series of Bowling X PBA World Championship stepladder finals, Australian two-hander Jason Belmonte finds himself once again one more match win away from a record 11th career PBA major title.

The stepladder finals of the fourth event of WSOB X, and the third major of the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season, will air live Thursday (March 21) at 5 p.m. on FS1 from Thunderbowl Lanes in suburban Detroit.

The four-time PBA Player of the Year and World Championship defending champion earned top-qualifier honors for the finals by posting an 8-8 match play record and 12,953 56-

game pinfall total (including match win bonus pins) after Saturday's match play rounds.

"I'm feeling confident as I usually do when I get to this point - maybe a little more relaxed because we have a few days before the (World Championship)

finals," said Belmonte, a 19-time tour winner. "It's a little more rewarding when you come back from a slow start. First, you just chip away, and then if you get the lead stretch it out if you can."

The title match of the World Championship will

offer a \$1 million bonus if Belmonte or his opponent can bowl a 300 game.

Belmonte won the PBA Tournament of Champions in February for his 10th PBA major title to tie PBA Hall of Famers Earl Anthony and Pete Weber for continued on page 8

ity for recovering veterans as the sport is adaptable to most skill levels and physical abilities.

President Truman hosted the first BVL/VA Bowling Tournament in 1947 on the White House lanes for hospitalized veterans returning from battlefields in Europe and Asia

Teams of five veterans bowl a total of 40 games then submit scores to BVL. Bowlers compete in seven divisions, including two for electronic bowling – Inpatient, Outpatient, Seniors (60+), Wheelchair, Vision Impaired, Electronic Bowling, and Electronic Bowling Seniors (60+). All competitors receive a certificate of participation, and the top three teams in each division receive medals. The tournament concludes on April 15, and team coordinators can submit scores online at BVL.org through May 1, 2019. Winners will be announced in June.

"Bowling is a sport for everyone, and this tournament has proven to be a valuable program for veterans as they look for fun, competitive ways to challenge themselves during their recuperation and ongoing recreation therapy," said BVL Executive Director Mary Harrar. "BVL is committed to supporting our veterans through therapy programs and services that give them access to positive challenges and long-term recovery."

BVL is bowling's own and oldest charity, raising more than \$50 million dollars since 1942 to provide recreation therapy grants at VA hospitals and clinics for America's veterans and active duty service members. Fundraising events in bowling and entertainment centers occur throughout the year, with many efforts centralized around National BVL Month each November. Beasley threw first and struck. Auerbach followed, leaving a ringing 10 pin. In the other match, Bellinger disposed of non-PBA member Jerry Horn of Lexington, S.C., 233-223.



first on the all-time list. The following week, also as top qualifier, he was denied an 11th major title losing to fellow two-hander Anthony Simonsen of Little Elm, Texas, in the title match of the PBA Players Championship.

Qualifying second for the World Championship finals was part-time tour player Matt McNiel of Minneapolis, who put together a 12-4 match play record and a 12,630 pinfall total, 323 pins behind Belmonte after 40 qualifying and 16 match play games.

McNiel, making his first tour singles television appearance, has finished 11th in the last three World Championships. He has a best tour finish of fifth, which came in the 2015 Roth-Holman Doubles Championship with Anthony Pepe.

Qualifying third for the finals was 10-time tour winner Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa., with a 10-6 match play record and 12,603 pinfall. O'Neill, trying for his second major title, won his 10th career title in the season-opening PBA Hall of Fame Classic in January.

Five-time tour winner Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., compiled a 12-4 record in match play and finished with a 12,597 pinfall to qualify fourth for the finals. Butturff, trying for his first major win, won the PBA Oklahoma Open in January for his fifth career tour title.


Qualifying fifth for the finals was BJ Moore of Greensburg, Pa., with a 7-9 record and 12,518 pinfall. Moore, who has a best tour finish of second in the 2016 Scorpion Championship, will be making his second major telecast after a fifth-place finish in the 2018 Tournament of Champions.

Live WSOB X telecasts on FS1 will begin when FOX Sports airs the championship finals of the PBA Cheetah, Chameleon and Scorpion Championships live on FS1 on consecutive nights Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at 5

After the World Championship telecast on Thursday, WSOB will wrap up with the telecast of the tape-delayed USA vs. The World team competition Friday, also at 5 p.m.
