## TROUP STEALING THE SHOW AT PBA ALL-STAR WEEKEND

Kyle Troup has taken over the inaugural PBA All-Star Weekend.

After leading Team Storm to the PBA All-Star Skills Showdown victory on Friday, Troup powered his team of Walter Ray Williams Jr. and reigning Rookie of the Year Cortez Schenck to winning Saturday's PBA Legacy Cup: Legends and Rising Stars.

Each team consisted of one PBA legend, one current star (who were

voted to compete by PBA fans) and one rising star. The event was taped March 7 in the Barn at Phoenix Raceway.

The four legends competing in the PBA Legacy Cup — Williams, Norm Duke, Pete Weber and Parker Bohn III — are the four winningest players alive.

Team WRW defeated Team PDW, featuring Pete Weber, EJ Tackett and Nate Purches, 208-165 in the opening

match.

In the other semifinal, Norm Duke made his triumphant return to competitive bowling. Duke, alongside fellow Dallas Striker Bill O'Neill and rising star Anthony Neuer, defeated the team of Parker Bohn III, Tom Daugherty and Deo Benard, 258-222.

After switching from the left lane to the right, the strikers weren't as easy to come by for Team Duke. Williams, the all-time leader with 47 PBA Tour titles, earned yet continued on page 4



## BOOMERSHINE, ALLMENDINGER SPOIL TROUP'S ALL-STAR SWEEP

PWBA Tour champion Lindsay Boomershine and NASCAR driver AJ Allmendinger capped off the inaugural PBA All-Star Weekend by winning the Go Bowling PBA NASCAR Invitational at Phoenix Raceway.

Four doubles teams featuring one professional bowler and one NASCAR driver took to a pair of lanes installed inside The Barn at Phoenix Raceway.

Competing in the baker doubles format, Boomershine and Allmendinger first defeated

Daria Pajak and Daniel Hemric, then defending champions Kyle Troup and Aric Almirola to win the event.

PBA Hall of Famer Mike Aulby, who ranks ninth all-time with 29 career PBA Tour titles, returned to the lanes in dramatic fashion. Aulby won the Checkered Flag Clash, a one-ball roll-off competition, against eight NASCAR drivers and FOX talent.

Aulby outlasted former Daytona 500 winner Trevor Bayne and FOX NASCAR analyst

Phil Parsons in the final rounds.

Boomershine and Allmendinger's victory spoiled a Troup sweep of All-Star Weekend.

Troup, who is the only player to have won multiple PBA Tour titles so far this season, also threw the winning strike in Saturday's Battle of the Ages match, which pitted five current all-stars against five PBA Hall of Famers.

Even though Sunday's event wasn't a PBA Tour title event, the continued on page 7

# Memories of Carol, Nick & The Hot Pot No-Tap

We received so many emails and other comments last week about Carol Mancini, Nick Mancini, and the Hot Pot No-Tap, that I thought it might be fun to condense some of them into an article of memories. What a wonderful time it was to be alive and living in California during those years of the Hot Pot!

I also found some old advertisements and clip-pings to confirm that The Hot Pot No-Tap was indeed on Saturday nights at 6:30 PM. Some of the emails mentioned that the Hot Pot was on Sunday nights. That's not to say that it could have changed to Sunday in later years, but in the summer of 1979, it was definitely every Saturday night.

As I was looking through the old tear sheets and articles from the California Bowling News, I noticed that there was a no-tap doubles on Sunday night at 6:00 PM, which began on August 19th, 1979, at Grand Central Bowl. It was called "Shoot the Mule." Perhaps that's where the confusion lies regarding the days and times.

The tear sheet that I have provided includes ads for both the Hot Pot No-Tap, Shoot the Mule No-Tap, and the results from the August 4th installment of the Hot Pot, in which a record 13 no-tap 300's were recorded. How times have changed, because in 2024 it's entirely possible for a league to have 13 REAL 300's — in one night!

Now, without further ado we present some fond memories from others:

**Dean Lopez, Editor of California Bowling News:** "Carol was a great boss and a close friend. I will miss our weekly talks and her touch with the paper."

**Former California Bowling News Editor Bob Johnson:** "I often wondered if Carol and Nick talked about anything besides bowling. They ultimately got divorced... who knows why those things happen... but they both ate, drank, slept and probably bled bowling. Two highly creative minds."

**Former Pro Bowler and Owner of Baldwin Park Bowl, Bud Horn:** "I met Carol when I came off the tour and purchased Baldwin Park Bowl. She loved bowling. I had a great relationship with Carol and Nick. Bowling lost a good woman with the passing of Carol Mancini."

**Fred Eisenhammer, California Bowling News:** Fred recalled a humorous story that Carol told him regarding a brief encounter with pro golfer Arnold Palmer. The anecdote originally appeared in the March 14th, 2024, edition of California Bowling News. It is repeated here for the benefit of readers of this column in other states:

"I was standing on a small hill next to the sixth green at La Jolla," said Carol. "I looked to the right, catching Palmer addressing the ball for his first shot off the 6th tee. Whack — the ball headed right toward me. As it got closer, I raised my hand to ward off a hit. The ball hit my hand and rolled within four feet of the flag stick."

"Palmer came up and asked if I was okay," said Mancini. "I managed to say yes. His comeback was, 'Thanks for the save. It's the best shot I've had on number six all week!'"

**Juan Fonseca, Fill the Frames Bowling Services:** I noticed this comment from a mention on Facebook. Fonseca says that when he opened his first pro shop, Step Above Bowling Supplies, inside Grand Central Bowl, Carol was a fixture there, as was her husband, Nick.

"Nick was the GM at Grand Central Bowl. Both Carol and Nick had a love of the game that we don't see often enough. Thanks to both of you for creating an atmosphere where I met and am still in contact with many from those years."

Those of you familiar with the California Bowling News will remember one of Carol's favorite duties of delving into the past binders of newspapers in storage at Keystone Lanes in Norwalk, dating back to 1940. In honor of that favorite task, we take a look back at some old headlines from 1979:

- 48 year old GLENN ALLISON was inducted into the ABC Hall of Fame along with CARMEN SALVINO.
- GUPPY TROUP (Kyle's father) got his nickname for bowling in a "Guppy Junior League."
- DONNA ADAMEK (age 21) was named "Bowler of the Year" by Bowling Writers Association of America (now the IBMA).
- 36 lanes were added to the SHOWBOAT, making a total of 106 lanes.
- LEISURE TIME SPORTS purchased MIRA MESA LANES in the San Diego area.
- At last, a movie about bowling and a bowler.

## A Look Back - 1979

"Dreamer" is about the struggle to become a pro bowler, and features TIM MATHESON and DICK WEBER.

- The great BILLIE LEE of San Diego was inducted into the Hall of Fame.
- ART GODDARD rolled his first 300 at COLUMBIA BOWL. He found time to bowl league while managing KEYSTONE LANES and building VILLAGE LANES.

And that's just a portion of Part 1 of 1979, appearing in the February 8, 2018 issue of the California Bowling News. This is something that Carol loved to do. I can remember her giving me a call when she would run across my name. What memories!

Williams Leads 300 Onslaught

GLENDALÉ-Correy Groth, a Glendale youth just fresh out of the junior ranks, won the Hot Pot in the middle of a 300 game storm that established several Hot Pot records last Saturday night at Grand Central Bowl.

In an almost unbelievable onslaught on the Hot Pot Tie Insurance fund, bowlers piled one 300 game on top of another until it was difficult to tell whether this was a Hot Pot tournament or a hotcake bakeoff at the County Fair.

There were 13 of the costly muthas and they were all insured!

The 300 assault blasted off in the second game and set a couple of new Hot Pot records before it was all over. The previous high of eleven 300 games was beat by two and it was the first time in Hot Pot history that all 300 games were insured!

Another record: It was the first time any bowler ever shot three 300 games. Dave Williams, who owns a bunch of sanctioned naturals, strung his first Hot Pot 300 in the 2nd game then did a fancy back-to-back insurance collection in the 4th and 5th games totalling \$300.

A second back-to-back attack on the insurance fund came at the hands of Phil Altiree of Whittier. Phil filled his pockets in the second and third games.

The only game to go 300-less was the first when Rich Flores collected the highest amount on the low-est score for the night, \$100

another trophy with a 256-209 victory.

Following the PBA Legacy Cup title match, the four legends teamed up with fellow PBA Hall of Famer Mike Aulby in an exhibition match against five current PBA All-Stars: Troup, O'Neill, Sean Rash, Tackett and Tommy Jones.

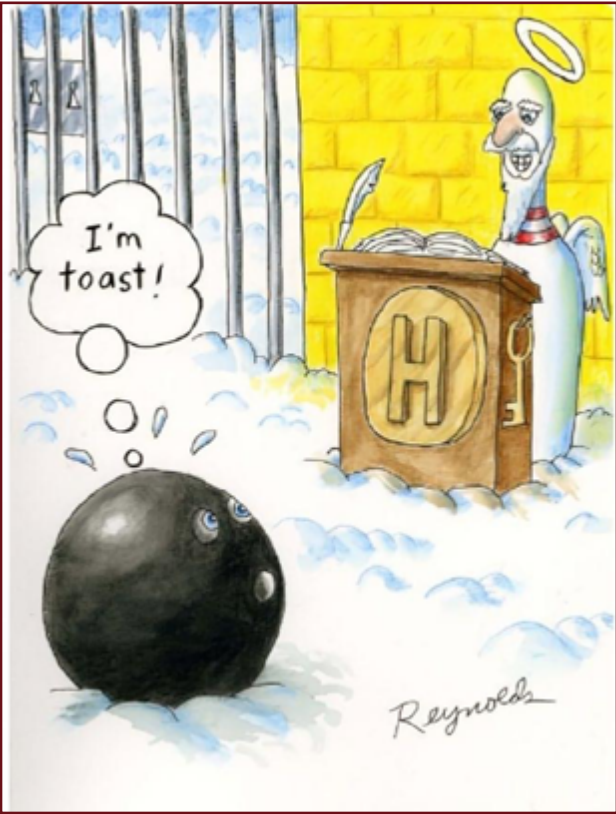
Each team attempted 10 shots, two by each player. Neither team was able to take advantage of the Endless 10th Frame rule — in which the 10th frame would continue until a team did not strike — which sent the Battle of the Ages match into extended play.

Yet again, Troup delivered a game-winning strike in the roll-off.

all three events to win the PBA All-Star Skills Showdown.

- Storm's Kyle Troup out-struck Motiv's EJ Tackett and Brunswick's Packy Hanrahan to win the Strike Contest.
- Storm's Darren Tang prevailed in the Make That Spare competition over Brunswick's Bill O'Neill and Motiv's Tom Smallwood.
- Storm's Sean Rash converted the Flying Eagle in a roll-off to win the Trick Shot Contest over Brunswick's Tommy Jones and Motiv's Sam Cooley.

In the Strike Contest, Hanrahan had a goal to strike more than once in his five attempts. He failed, awarding Team Brunswick just 10 points and sending Troup and Tackett to the finals.

For the third time this season alone, Troup got the best of Tackett. Troup threw a modified hambone in the five-shot finals to defeat Tackett four strikes to three and earn 25 points for Team Storm.

Players paid tribute to a 1960s Make That Spare contest in the second event. Players attempted five increasingly difficult spare attempts and earned points for each conversion.

Tang converted the bucket (25 points), 4-5 split (50 points) and washout (50 points) to best O'Neill and Smallwood.

A panel of five PBA Hall of Famers, including the four winningest players alive, served as the judges for the Trick Shot Contest: Mike Aulby, Parker Bohn III, Norm Duke, Pete Weber and Walter Ray Williams Jr.

Sam Cooley converted just one trick shot during his allotted five minutes, but wowed the crowd with his thumb-less rev rate. The judges gave Cooley a total score of 33 for his efforts.

Tommy Jones immediately while pushing the ball down the lane with a pool cue, then picking up the 10-pin throwing the ball backwards and between his legs. The judges awarded him a score of 39.

Rash appeared to have won the event after converting a plethora of different trick shots, but the judges had a trick of their own in mind by giving Rash a 39 as well and sending the competition into overtime.

The iconic Flying Eagle, made famous by Chris Barnes, served as the roll-off trick shot between Rash and Jones. Rash converted the spare on his first attempt, while Jones barely missed.
