Vaughn Doody Sets Super Senior Record

BURBANK—What turned out to be a record high scoring event for the WCST Qualifying and Finals at Pickwick Bowl, also resulted in a tie after the 10 games of finals between Joe Merrill (Las Vegas), and Kevin Gannon (Lakewood). Going into the position round. Kevin held a 65 pin lead over 2nd place, Joe Porcelli, and a 95 pin lead over 3rd place Joe Merrill.

Joe Porcelli won his match against Kevin 213-192, and his 30 pin bonus still left him short of Kevin by 14 pins. Joe Merrill bowling against Mike Rick, rolled a big 266 game, and his bonus pins of 30 points jumped over both Joe Porcelli, and ended up in a tie with Kevin. WCST one game roll-off when the finals ends in a tie for 1st place, resulted with Joe Merrill beating Kevin 263-203. Other close places between 4th and 7th on 22 pins.

There were many games of 250 or better. 300 Games in the qualifying on Saturday were rolled by Ray Cobb, Jeff Garrison and Joe Porcelli. Jim Thurmond a 299 game, Gary Markowitz rolled two 290 games, one in the qualifying and the other in the finals. Jeff Garrison a 299 game in the finals. The qualifying field of 62.

Bowlers over-all setting a new WCST record with a 216.8 average per game per bowler, even 6 bowlers in the minus. Kevin Gannon, plus 533 led the 10 game qualifying, with Jeff Garrison 2nd, plus 525. The Finals Field of 10 bowlers, set a new WCST record with an average of 235.3 per man, per game. TOP 4:

1st, Joe Merrill, \$1000.00, 2nd Kevin Gannon, \$710.00, 3rd, Joe Porcelli (Northridge), \$575.00, and 4th to Gary Markowitz (Northridge), \$460.00. Prize fund pay-off which included \$500.00 added by Pickwick Bowl was \$8,350.00, giving a total pay-off so far for 3 tournaments in 2007, \$23,025.00. Over-all for 249 Tournaments, a total of \$2,772,173.00 has been paid out. GM Bryan Alpert, besides being a great host. For this tournament put out Pizza, Guacamole, and Chips and tossed salad, and soft drinks and coffee, prior to the qualifying on Saturday, and bagels, Dough-nuts, and Coffee on Sunday before the finals.

Duke Does It Again

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind.—Norm Duke knows all too well the feeling of firing a 300 game in a national TV semifinal only to lose in the title match. That's why Duke showed no mercy in Sunday's 2007 Pepsi Championship title match.

After third-seeded Ryan Shafer fired the 18th nationally televised 300 game in Denny's PBA Tour history in the semifinals, the top-seeded Duke showed why he dominated the tournament from start to finish, defeating Shafer 235-219 to win his third title of the season and the 26th of his career.

Duke fired a 300 game in the semifinals of the 2003 GEICO Earl Anthony Classic against Walter Ray Williams Jr. only to lose to Mike DeVaney in the title match, who was also in this week's championship round.

Shafer could never get on track in the title match. After striking in the first two frames to run his string of strikes to 18 in a row, he failed to strike again until the 8th frame while Duke struck six consecutive times after an open in the 1st.

It was the fourth time in his career and the second time this season Duke defeated Shafer in a title match, and it pushed Duke's record overall against Shafer on TV to 6-1. Duke also defeated Shafer in the title match of the 2006 Columbia 300 Classic, his second of three titles this season.

The win capped a huge comeback for the 25-year veteran who withdrew from the first seven events of the second half after breaking a toe in January. He finished 11th in the Bayer Classic and fifth in the 64th U.S. Open in his first two events back before putting himself back in the PBA Player of the Year race with his third win.

“What was on my mind was that Tony (Reyes) was playing a line inside of me and it was creating a lot of havoc and I knew I would have to go in cold with something,” said Duke. “Then to see Ryan shoot 300 and to start with an open was just abysmal. I went with what I thought would work best and stayed with it. I caught a couple breaks. If I had used that ball for two or three games it would have caused me trouble but with just one game I caught some breaks and did it the hard way.”

After making seven TV appearances in 2005-06 but winning just one title, Duke has taken advantage of his opportunities this season, going 8-0 on television in becoming the first

bowler this season to win three times.

As for Shafer, he had a chance to move to the top of the PBA Tournament of Champions roster, but stayed on the bubble for a fourth week with Duke's win.

In the semifinal, Shafer defeated second-seeded Jeff Carter, 300-228. Shafer's perfect game was the second 300 on TV this season, marking the first time since 1999 two televised perfect games have taken place in the same season.

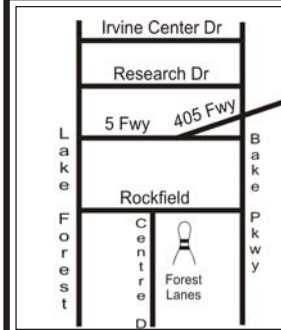
“Of course your legs are wobbling a little. I can't even throw a 300 game in league so it's just an unbelievable experience. I just tried to relax and concentrate on the game,” said Shafer of trying to recover in the title match. “I threw a pretty good game but threw one bad shot in the 3rd frame and lost my line just like I did in the World Championship here last year.”

Ironically, the other bowler to shoot 300 on TV this season was Tony Reyes, who Shafer defeated in the second stepladder match, 224-207. Shafer struck in his last four frames to force Reyes to strike twice in the 10th, but Reyes left a 10-pin with his first shot.

In the first match, Reyes defeated the fifth-seed DeVaney, 279-248, nearly becoming the first bowler to fire two perfect games on TV in their career. Reyes struck in 11 of 12 frames, the only blemish being a 10-pin in the 6th frame.

Duke (Clermont, Fla.) took home \$25,000 for the win, while Shafer (Horseheads, N.Y.) earned \$13,000 for second, plus a \$10,000 bonus for the 300 game. Carter (Springfield, Ill.) took home \$6,500 for third, Reyes (San Bruno, Calif.) earned \$5,500 for fourth while DeVaney (Temecula, Calif.) earned \$5,000 for fifth.

The Denny's PBA Tour heads to Wyoming, Mich., next week for the 2007 Denny's World Championship at Spectrum Lanes, March 18-25, the third of four Majors of the 2006-07 schedule. The live ESPN televised finals take place at DeVos Place in Grand Rapids, Mich., Sunday, March 25, at 11 a.m.

Tenpin Slants

The annual National Golden Ladies Classic keeps on getting better each year.

Founded—and nurtured—by USBC Hall of Famer Jeanette Robinson, the 17th edition of this very popular tournament for ladies 50 and up was staged recently (March 5-8) at the Orleans Hotel, Casino & Bowling Center...again.

The surprise winner was Joan Reilly, a petite brunette from Wilmington, N.C., who was competing in the Golden Ladies Classic (GLC) for the first time. If the Orleans sports book had put up odds on the event, Reilly would have been listed at 25-to-1, at least.

After the qualifying round, comprised of three 5-game blocks, Reilly, who has been bowling for 35 of her 53 years, was in 11th place when the field was cut to the top 16 for the match play segment.

After the first 8-games of head-to-head competition, Reilly moved up to eighth place. She then dropped one spot in the next block—and was 157 pins out of fifth place, the final spot for the stepladder finals. Reilly's chances of making the next cut looked slim.

Reilly, however, stepped up her game and qualified for the fifth, and final, spot with 57 pins to spare. The 5-4, 130-pound right-hander was ecstatic.

The top seed was no surprise. It was the local favorite and defending champion, Char Hammel, who averaged 222.12 for the 24 games of match play. The clear favorite to repeat as GLC champion, Hammel led runner-up Rose Smith, also of Las Vegas, by 154 pins. Debbie Christiansen, Wichita, Kan., was in third place, followed by Marci Williams, also of Wichita, and Reilly.

Williams and Reilly met in the first match, which was a thriller. Reilly, battling nerves, came through with a double in the 10th to edge Williams, 191-189. Reilly then won her next two matches rather easily, eliminating Christiansen, 244-223, and Smith, 224-151.

Smith, the 2001 GLC winner, had four wide-open splits. After the match, Smith asked for the microphone and announced to the

crowd, "I'm sorry I disappointed the Super Seniors." Being 64, Smith was eligible to compete in the Super Seniors Division (60 and up), but preferred to bowl in the Open Division (50-59).

USBC Hall of Famer Pam Buckner, 60, who also preferred the Open Division, quipped: "If you want to beat the youngsters, you have to bowl against them." Smith, evidently, felt the same way.

The championship match between Hammel and Reilly was a pip. Trading strikes and spares, the two were dead even at 178 apiece in the seventh frame. In the eighth, Hammel, uncharacteristically, missed a routine 10-pin. That proved to be the turning point of the match as Reilly completed a five-bagger to upset Hammel, 246-225.

Hammel took the disappointing loss calmly. She was the first to congratulate Reilly, giving her a big hug. "Joan deserved to win," Hammel said. "When I missed the 10-pin, it was the turning point. The ball didn't come off my hand right."

Reilly, who collected a check for \$2,000 and a handsome trophy, said, "The bowling gods were with me today. I was very nervous, but having butterflies is a good thing as it puts you in a position with a chance to win."

Reilly, who bowls in three leagues back home, says, "I own 11 bowling balls but I brought only five with me to Vegas."

Her husband of 22 years, Steve, made the trip with her to Sin City but had to return home early because of his job. Several friends, however, were on hand to cheer for the new champion.

Reilly promised to be back next year to defend her title. "I love it here (at The Orleans)," Reilly said. "The way it's set up...and people are so wonderful. Yes, I like to gamble, especially at the dice table." She said that she heard about the Golden Ladies Classic last year in Reno, where she finished second in the USBC Senior Queens tournament at the National Bowling Stadium.

A big sports fan, Reilly said her favorite bowlers were Norm Duke and Carolyn Dorin-Ballard. "And Michael Jordan is my favorite sports personality," she added.

Asked how she was going to celebrate her victory, Reilly replied, "First, I'm going to have a good meal as I'm tired of eating hot dogs and hamburgers. Then, my girlfriend and I are going to see The Strip."

Reilly wanted to put in a good word about Char Hammel. "She's an awesome bowler," Reilly said. "She rolls the ball so well. I was lucky to beat her."

As the runner-up, Hammel received \$1,100. Rose Smith earned

\$800 for third place; Dee Christiansen \$600 for fourth; and Marci Williams \$500 for fifth. The total Open Division prize payoff was \$9,550.

In the Super Seniors Division, the winner was Utah's Karen Pullman. She won by 56 pins over USBC Hall of Famer Fran Deken, the former tournament director for the PWBA (Professional Women's Bowling Assn.) and a past Super Seniors champion.

Pullman received \$1,000 and a trophy, presented to her by Barbara Chrisman of Storm Products, the tournament cosponsor. Deken collected \$700 for finishing second.

* * *

The National Ladies Classic is going to be a lot tougher to win next year. At least three of the PWBA's biggest winners are ready to turn 50 this year, thus qualifying to enter the 2008 GLC.

They are Robin Romeo, who won 17 PWBA titles; Cindy Coburn-Carroll, 15 titles; and Jeanne Naccarato, 10. Dana Miller-Mackie, who has 15 titles, became eligible last year, but chose not to compete in the GLC in 2006 or 2007. Perhaps she will change her mind and enter the '08 Classic; after all, it's a woman's prerogative.

Besides, the GLC is one of the biggest bargains in bowling. Every cent of the \$150 entry fee goes into the prize fund, plus an additional total of \$6,000 is added by The Orleans, Storm Products and two new sponsors, Jack Oetjen and J.R.

TOURNAMENT NOTES: The '07 GLC attracted 71 entrants,

which included three ladies from England and one from Wales...In reality, there was another entrant, Jeanette Robinson, who was delighted to be bowling again in the GLC after missing the tournament last year because of injuries sustained in an auto accident. That was the only time she ever failed to cavort on the lanes with all her friends...Jeanette revealed that "there would have been about 80 entries except for the fact that eight ladies had to withdraw for various personal reasons. They included Florida's Shirley Levens, a three-time GLC champion, who missed the tournament last year because of knee surgery. Levens was looking forward to bowling in the GLC this year, but she was still undergoing therapy for her aching joint...Another bowler who had to withdraw was Southern California's Kathy Solowitz when her back went out on her, a problem she has had to contend with for many years...

Four USBC Hall of Fame bowling writers were on hand for the GLC—Pearl Keller, Hazel McLeary, Dick Evans and John Jowdy. Keller, Evans and Jowdy are all past presidents of the BWAA (Bowling Writers Assn. of America), and McLeary is the BWAA's incoming president who will be wielding the gavel at the writers' annual convention, to be held in conjunction with Bowl Expo in June at (where else?) Las Vegas...Speaking of Hall of Famers, Al Thompson, the former PBA Midwestern Tournament Director, who retired and moved to Sin City, was among the GLC spectators. Also spotted on the concourse were past PWBA champions Wendy Macpherson, Jeanne Naccarato (with husband Stan) and Rene Fleming...

Las Vegas is still one of the country's few bowling bright spots, and Mike Monyak, Director of Bowling Operations for the Coast Casinos chain (The Orleans, Gold Coast and Suncoast), thinks "the bowling boom in Vegas will continue for a long time." He says the bowling outlook is so good because "from 4,000 to 5,000 people are moving to Vegas every month." Monyak added that the three Coast Casino centers are averaging 41 lines per alley bed daily... According to Monyak, he loves hosting the Golden Ladies Classic at The Orleans. Why? "Because it's such a fun tournament," Monyak said. "There's so much camaraderie among the players." He then said something rather strange: "I don't want to see the tournament get much bigger than a hundred entries.

Because if it does, we'd have to have additional squads—and that's too much like work," he laughed. "We want to keep it a fun tournament"...

The Star of Tomorrow Committee is pleased to announce the winners of our 2007 Star of Tomorrow \$1,000 Scholarship Award. The presentation ceremonies will take place during our Annual Convention June 3rd at the Town & Country Hotel and Convention Center, San Diego.



ROSE LYNN BROWN of Modesto, is a senior at Grace M Davis High School, Modesto, where she maintains a Cumulative Grade Point Average of 4.0, ranking 7th in her class of 603 students. She has been a member of the California Scholarship Federation for four years.

Not only is Rose an outstanding student, she was described by one of her teachers as “always consistently prepared and completes her student duties in a timely and efficient manner. She is always prompt and absences are a rarity. In class she acts as a role model for others and is often found helping those in need”. And, in their testimonials written in Rose’s behalf other teachers wrote how impressed they were by her level of maturity and professionalism she displays. She is a quick learner, a self-motivator and never makes excuses when presented with challenging tasks. Rose’s outstanding efforts were rewarded with the Spartan Award for two consecutive years, which is given to only 100 students out of 3,200 who show exemplary qualities inside the classroom.

Rose has been a member of the Public Safety Academy for four years from which she received a recommendation for a position of California Highway Patrol Explorer, where she has served for two years. She has been Vice President of the Challenger Club for two years and is an active PAL (Peer Assistant Learning, which involves helping to tutor both physically and mentally disabled students.

Outside the classroom, Rose has lettered in Varsity Track and Field and Volleyball. She has been a youth bowler for thirteen years, ten of which she has been a member of the “Nor-Cal All Stars”. She has recorded two certified 300 games and a high series of 791. In March 2006 Rose was awarded a berth on the USBC Junior Team USA, one of the most prestigious honors for youth bowlers in the nation. She would be representing the United States in international competition and act as an ambassador for youth bowling worldwide. After attending the Olympic Training Camp in Colorado Springs in May, Rose competed in the American Zone Youth Championships in Pueblo, Mexico in June, bringing home the Bronze Medal for taking Third Place in the Girls Event. Then in 2007, this young lady earned her way through the competition to earn a spot on Team USA.

Rose’s other bowling achievements are numerous. She captured a First Place in the NorCal YABA State Girls Scratch Singles; NorCal BPA/YABA Youth Doubles Championships, South Division.; NorCal BPA/YABA Jr. Adult Championships-Scratch Girls/Women, South Division; NorCal Youth Doubles Championships-Major Mixed Division, South Division; and the NCJBT Girls Scratch Division.

Although Rose had applied hard work and determination, she attributes her mother June for all she has taught her in bowling, and probably the most important: “Always remember to have fun and, practice with a purpose.”

Rose has carried her leadership abilities forward into the bowling arena both on the local and state levels. She has served as a CSYABA District Youth Director to the for two years; Vice President for the California Youth Leadership Association three years and one year on the Cali-

fornia Youth Council. In 2006, Rose was elected to the California USBC Board of Directors.

Following her high school graduation, Rose will be attending Modesto Junior College to complete her general education, after which she will transfer to Fresno State University to major in Criminal Justice and will try out for a spot on the FSU bowling team. Rose intends to pursue a career in Law Enforcement, preferring to work with the Juvenile Probation Department.

It’s not “all work and no play”, however, for Rose says that when she isn’t studying or working, she loves to go to movies, hiking at Yosemite or, of course,... go bowling.



DOUGLAS JAMES LAUER of 29 Palms, California graduated, from Twenty-nine Palms High School in 2006. He was first in his class of 181 students with a Cumulative Grade Point Average of 4.37. He was the Class Valedictorian and awarded High Honors receiving a Golden State Seal Merit Diploma. His Academic Awards included: Math, History, English, and Physical Health earning an Academic Letter with (2) Lamps. Doug proudly earned membership in: The National Honor Society.; The National Society of High School Scholars; The President’s Education Awards Program for Outstanding Academic State Achievement; and the Who’s Who Among American High School Students for 2005 and 2006.

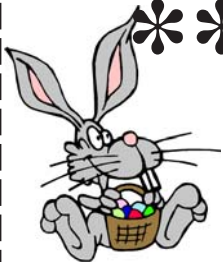

National Deaf Bowling News

ORANGE—Former tournament director Mark Fisser and his long time friend Carl Malucci formed a new organization, Deaf National Bowlers Tour (DNBT) and invited hand picked staff members to its first dinner meeting at Lucky Strike Lanes on the Block in Orange. The purpose was to understand the DNBT rules they made up. The staff members are Ed Abakumoff, Darrell Stogryn, Robert Ellison, Connie Marchione, Daniel Vasquez, Natalie Fisser and Heather Ellison.

Fisser had excessive tournament directing experience as he used to run his West Coast Deaf Bowlers Association monthly tournaments back in late 1990’s. He ran it as a first class operation from membership cards to championship plaques. Malucci knows a lot about tournaments as a bowler and a writer too.

Both are co-founders of DNBT and will take turns as tournament directors. Also Both will take care of finances and financial reports. They want the tournament to be open to ALL deaf and hard of hearing bowlers with no average limit.

DNBT will be a handicap tournament with deaf PBA and PWBA members allowed to bowl in it. It will use 85% of 210. The entry fee will be about \$160.00 one time only. DNBT is a two-day tournament with two 5 games blocks qualifying on Saturday and top 16 goes in 2 blocks of 8 games match plays on Sunday with top 4 in finals.

DNBT has not determined where its first tournament will be in. It may be in Las Vegas in October or Detroit in September.

Stay tuned for further information from DNBT when available.

USBC ASKED TO SUSPEND COZAD, THE FATE OF NDMBA DOOMED.
SAN BERNARDINO—The staff of National Deaf Master Bowlers Association, after discovering that Bill Cozad had not paid out the last October NDMBA Las Vegas Tournament prize money, held a meeting with him at the Anaheim Concourse Bowl. There, Cozad admitted he did not have the money to pay them and was waiting for his business partner to get him the money.

The staff told him while it way past the 45 days he was supposed to pay out the money and he got a deadline to pay them off. Also the staff told him that they volunteered to work for him and NDMBA in good faith and made it clear that they did not handle a single cent of the entry fees monies and were not responsible for the prize money. He was not to use the money for his business ventures.

A couple of weeks after the deadline former NDMBA Tournament Director Ed Abakumoff checked with the prize winners to find out if they get ant money and the response was none. Abakumoff tried to contact Cozad but could not reach him. The staff had no choice except to have USBC “force” Cozad to pay. For that, Abakumoff went to his Citrus Belt USBC Bowling Association office in San Bernardino to set up a hearing trail for Cozad who was notified to come. When the day of hearing came on a Saturday, Abakumoff and some members of the NDMBA staff were there but Cozad did not show up.

At this hearing, Citrus Belt USBC BA recommend to USBC suspend Cozad unless he pay all the prizes and what expenses he owes. The last thing we knew was that USBC had asked Cozad that he had 15 days to appeal the suspension.

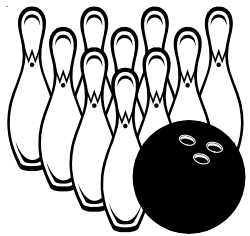

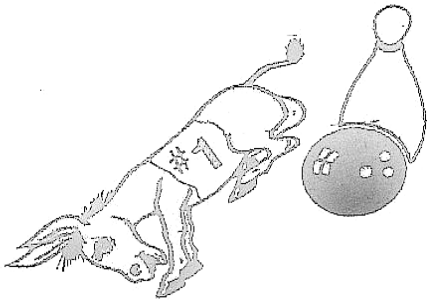
