Hall of Famers Reach Milestones at USBC Open Championships

CORPUS CHRISTI, TX—While so much attention is given to high scores and lead changes at the United States Bowling Congress Open Championships (formerly the American Bowling Congress Championships Tournament), it is the history, tradition and personal milestones that keep bowlers coming back.

This weekend, USBC Hall of Famers Glenn Allison of Anaheim, Calif., and Bob Hart of Suwanee, Ga., each reached tournament milestones at the American Bank Center Exhibit Hall.

On Saturday night, Hart made his 50th Open Championships appearance, while on Sunday morning, Allison became the ninth bowler in the tournament's 103-year history to eclipse 100,000 pins.

Allison, who was joined by his wife Marsha and granddaughter Laura, entered the 2006 event needing just 794 pins to join the elite club and posted 569 in team Saturday, leaving him 225 pins short. He didn't waste any time in doubles though, as he followed a spare in the first frame with five consecutive strikes. Needing a mark in the 10th frame, Allison left the difficult 3-6-9-10 combination, but converted the spare and struck on the fill ball for 241.

Allison, 75, finished with 673 in singles and 640 in doubles for 1,882, tying his highest all-events total since shooting 1,942 in Corpus Christi in 1992.

"It was a great relief to finally do it, and I nearly cried," said Allison, who owns four Open Championships titles and made his 55th tournament appearance. "I've joined many of my friends on the pinfall list, and it's nice to be in such good company."

Joining Allison in the 100,000-pin club are the late Joe Norris with 123,770, followed by Dick Weber (109,745), Bill Doehrman (109,566), Bill Lillard (108,296), Jim Schroeder (104,764), Frank Carr (102,651), Greg Griffio (102,483) and Sylvester Thiel (101,430).

Schroeder, who is second on the list of active bowlers, competed alongside Allison this weekend, shooting 607 in doubles, 549 in team and 541 in singles for 1,697 all-events.

Lillard, an eight-time champion from Houston, is the active pinfall leader and takes to the tournament lanes Monday and Tuesday, while Thiel, the only other active member of the club, bowls on Thursday and Friday. Don Ellis of Sugar Land, Texas, is expected

to add his name to the list when he bowls on April 2 and 3, needing just 432 pins.

"From the time I began bowling pretty well, I thought it would be fantastic to be one of the top bowlers around," Allison said. "I was fortunate to be a professional bowler and make a career of it. I am also lucky to have bowled in as many of these tournaments as I have, and 100,000 pins is just something that happened. I'll continue to come and chase the pinfall record and see if I can pass one or two of these guys."

Hart, who posted a career-high 2,087 all-events total on the way to the Regular Doubles, Regular All-Events and Team All-Events titles in 1974, bowled for the first time in Seattle in 1954. Although he missed the 1957 and 1958 events because he was in the Marines, Hart, 68, has been to every tournament since 1959.

"It just doesn't seem possible that I've been to 50 of these, and it really didn't dawn on me until now," Hart said. "The years piled up pretty quickly, and I know that I'm fortunate to be here and still in decent shape. I wish I could have had more family here, but my son couldn't get a flight and my wife is too busy working. But we spoke on the phone before I went out there, and because I have so many friends here already, it was still a truly special occasion."

This year Hart shot 608 in team, 594 in singles and 574 in doubles for 1,776 all-events, and says his next goal is to reach 100,000 pins.

"I'm going to stay active in this tournament for as long as I can," said Hart, who needs 12,335 pins to reach the milestone. "I still enjoy bowling and I started practicing a few weeks ago because it's important to me to come out here and bowl halfway decent. And I'm not going to quit before I get to 100,000."

Seventh Time's The Charm

TAYLOR, MI—If Norm Duke has learned anything in his 24 years on the Denny's PBA Tour, it's how to deal with setbacks.

In his seventh TV appearance of the season, Duke finally broke through with his first title of the season and the 23rd of his career, defeating Chris Loschetter, 275-221, in the title match of the 2006 Ace Hardware Championship at Taylor Lanes.

Duke had four 2nd-place finishes in seven TV appearances coming into this week since his last title in Feb. 2005.

"I don't want to say it's been a struggle, but it's definitely been a journey," said Duke (Clermont, Fla.). "I hate getting stuck on those numbers. I've got this one and now I'm on to bigger numbers."

Duke started the title match with four straight strikes before a spare in the 5th frame. Loschetter tried to make a run at Duke with four straight strikes in frames 5-8, but a spare in the 9th frame gave Duke some breathing room. Duke closed out Loschetter by striking on his next six shots. With the win, Duke also took over the top spot in the 2005-06 PBA World Point Rankings.

Duke advanced to the title match with a 205-198 win over Walter Ray Williams Jr., who was making his sixth attempt at tying Earl Anthony's all-time Tour titles record. Williams fell behind early when he left the 4-6-7-10 split and opened in the 3rd frame, and Duke responded with three strikes in frames 5-7.

Duke, however, left a 7-10 split in the 9th frame and opened, giving Williams a chance to strike out from the 9th frame on to force Duke to double in the 10th. Williams struck in the 9th and with his first ball in the 10th, but finished with a nine-spares. Duke's spare to start the 10th frame sealed his fourth berth in a title match this season.


Loschetter advanced to the title match with a 236-201 win over Mike Scroggins. Scroggins took the lead with four straight strikes in frames 5-8, but he opened after a 3-7 split in the 9th frame. Loschetter, who had doubled in the 8th and 9th, struck with his first ball in the 10th to advance to his second career title match.

Duke earned \$40,000 and an exemption for the 2006-07 season. Loschetter took home \$20,000 for 2nd, while Williams and Scroggins earned \$10,000 apiece for the 3rd and 4th place finishes, respectively.

The Denny's PBA Tour heads to Indianapolis, Ind., for the third of four Majors on the Tour schedule, the 2006 Denny's World Championship March 20-26 at Woodland Bowl. The live ESPN finals take place Sunday, March 26 at 2 p.m. EST, with the winner taking home the \$100,000 top prize and a four-season Tour exemption.

Weiler averaged 232 on his way to victory, with a high game of 266. During qualifying he used the Thunder Storm and Brunswick HPH balls. The fi- nals saw him look for more power, switching to the Lane #1

Dirty Bomb. This last ball was a gift from Japan's greatest bowler, forty-five time Japan Tour champion Yajima.

Weiler said he felt pressure during every match, but none- theless was mentally in a "zone," taking his time and con- centrating on every shot. He continued, saying he never felt more focused. He only had two open frames in eight games.

John Jowdy, Famous "Coach of the Pros" Chosen For WBW 2006 Outstanding International Coach Award

In its Mid-March issue, The Worldletter-Plus bowling publica- tion announced that Coach John Jowdy of California, will become only the fifth coach in history to receive this prestigious World Bowling Writers award. The other four are Fred Borden, Tom Kourros, Magnus Johnson and Sid Allen. WBW president Hazel McLeary will do the honors at the UCBC convention in Orlando.

Jowdy, who has not only taught well over a hundred PBA and PWBA pros in the US, also travels the world to train bowlers, as well as national teams from several countries. With his trademark, the huge 10 inch cigar between his lips at all events, he has been consistently active in coaching since the early 1960s. He also stays busy teaching seminars and clinics to amateur bowlers.

Well known for his policy of training touring pros at no charge, Jowdy, now in his 80s, remains active on the PBA Tour, continu- ing to work with several of the top players, who praise him for the help he provides. His highly successful book, "bowling eXecution", hasn't kept him from being one of the "nicest guys" in the sport. Jowdy also writes columns for about twenty-five publications, including "Bowling This Month" magazine. He has been invited to go to Austria again this year to coach at the Vienna Open.

Jowdy is recognized by most of the top integers of bowling for his many achievements, just some of which, include:

- Texas Hall of Fame
- ABC Hall of Fame
- PBA Hall of Fame (Only per- son to be voted in as a coach by the PBA players)
- Still attends the majority of PBA tournaments, having started in 1961 as Columbia representa- tive, which is when he began his illustrious pro teaching career.
- In addition to the US, has taught clinics in Austria, Japan, the UAE, Canada and has been asked to teach in Saudi Arabia, Venezuela and other countries.
- Several PBA pros, including the great Pete Weber and others, have thanked Jowdy publicly for his help.

The tournament pays one place for every three entries in both the regular and super senior divisions.

If 16 to 22 super seniors enter the tourna- ment. Then 6 bowlers to their own finals on Sunday, NO matter how many super seniors cross over into the regular division finals. Less then 16 super seniors entered, then a step-ladder of three or 4 bowlers depending on the number of entries under 16, and how many make the regular division finals, will bowl a step-ladder finals following the qualifying on Saturday.







National Deaf News

Bowler Lindy Decker Received 2005 Jerald M. Jordan Award

Edward Abakumoff, chair of USA Deaf Sports Federation’s Ad Hoc Committee on Bowling reported to me that the star Dover, PA deaf bowler, Lindy Decker received the USADSF’s prestigious Jerald M. Jordan Award. That is wonderful news to know that this award went to a bowler and also a more deserving woman.

The award was named after Jerald M. Jordan, Washington, DC a long time supporter of then American Athletic Association of Deaf, now USADSF and former President of Commite Internationale des Sports des Sourds (CISS) which conducts the World Games for Deaf, now Deaflympics. USADSF established this award that during a Deaflympic year, for the deserving American athlete who has accomplished outstanding Deaflympics achievement and during a non-Deaflympic year, for the deserving and outstanding individual who demonstrated leadership and continuous participation towards the goals of the Deaflympics.

During the 2005 Deaflympics at Melbourne, Australia, Decker led the deaf women’s Team USA with two gold and two silver medals. At the start she was ailing with a cold but managed to win her first gold in singles with a sub-par score under her average. Still battling her cold she still bowled under her average in helping her team win silver medals in Trios and 5 players team. She led in 24 games all-events but no medals were given for that competition.

When she finally got better, she showed her true self in winning the gold in the 16 game women’s Masters with an amazing new Deaflympics record 211.8 average.

In addition, Decker who in 1992 received both AAAD and USOC Deaf Athlete of Year awards, proved that she has the best deaf woman bowler record in the world with 3 perfect games and two 800 series. In the 2001 National Deaf Master Bowler Tournament she beat two best deaf PBA bowlers in the finals for the title and \$3,000 prize.

This writer told Abakumoff that he could not understand why Decker was not nominated for CISS’s 2005 Deaf International Sports-woman of the Year, which was awarded to a 20 years old deaf Chinese Table Tennis player. Also added that the Taiwan deaf star bowler Li-Hsiao Chang whom Taiwan considered as the best deaf male bowler in the world, placed 2nd in the Deaf International Sportsman of the Year.

Again reminded Abakumoff why wasn’t USA’s Cary Vymazal nominated for CISS’s 2001 Deaf International Sportsman of Year when he won 5 medals (3 gold, 1 silver and 1 bronze) and scored the record 2nd highest 24 games all events total (5540) in world competition category in 2001 Deaflympics at Rome, Italy. FIQ records shows a Dutch man hit 5496 in FIQ World competition as the record for 24 games.

Aside from honoring Decker with the Jordan Award, that shows USADSF does not know much about bowling. Lets hope that Abakumoff will make an improvement there.
