Jeanne Naccarato Repeats Dominance at Golden Ladies

LAS VEGAS — It was 2009 again for Jeanne Naccarato in the 27th Golden Ladies Classic at the Orleans Bowling Center.

Naccarato, of Tacoma, Wash., reprised her dominating performance in the 19th Golden Ladies tournament by claiming the top prize in this year's four-day event.

Naccarato earned the top seed in the stepladder finals and captured her second Golden Ladies title Thursday morning by scoring a 231-179 victory over fourth-seeded Sharon Powers in the championship match. Eight years ago, Naccarato also was the top seed in the stepladder finals and she took home the first-place trophy with a 206-175 victory over Robin Romeo of Newhall.

Naccarato is a distinguished bowler who was inducted into the Women's Professional Bowling Hall of Fame in 2002. She set a record for highest sanctioned three-game series in the 1986 Women's Central States tournament, blasting an 864 with scores of 300, 300 and 264.

Powers opened the championship match with two strikes and led Naccarato by 11 pins. But the game turned when Powers got three straight splits and was unable to convert any of them. Naccarato ended the game with five consecutive strikes.

Powers rolled into the championship match with a 266-219 victory over second-seeded Lucy Sandelin. All together, Powers won three stepladder matches

before succumbing to Naccarato, who won \$2,300.

Powers opened with a 237-217 victory over fifth-seeded Laura Lee Daniel. In her second match, Powers eliminated third-seeded Tish Johnson, 227-216.

Johnson was the top seed in the previous four Golden Ladies stepladder finals, winning the title in 2013. Tish shot 300 this week in qualifying.

Naccarato was the second seed in last year's

Golden Ladies tournament but lost in her only stepladder match, 227-182, to eventual champion Michele Carter, who did not qualify for the stepladder finals this year.

Carter rebounded to win

the Golden Ladies Second Chance tournament title with scores of 207, 266, 236, 216 and 268.

Paula Vidar, of Sun City, Calif., won the 2016 Second Chance tournament continued on page 10

Josh Blanchard Wins PBA Xtra Frame Reality Check Classic For Third Career PBA Tour Title

TAMARAC, Fla. — Josh Blanchard of Mesa, Ariz., breezed through all three of his stepladder matches to win the PBA Xtra Frame Reality Check Classic Sunday at Sawgrass Lanes for his third career PBA Tour title.

Streamed live on PBA's online bowling channel Xtra Frame, Blanchard beat former McKendree University collegiate star and finals top seed AJ Johnson of Oswego, Ill., 232-204, in the title match for his first title of the season and first in two years. For Johnson, it was his third career runner-up finish.

"It feels unbelievable," said Blanchard, who won his last title in the 2015



PBA Xtra Frame Maine Shootout. "Sometimes you doubt yourself but I have a lot of support from my family, friends and fans so I think it was just a matter of time before I could bring home another win."

By winning, Blanchard also takes the early lead in

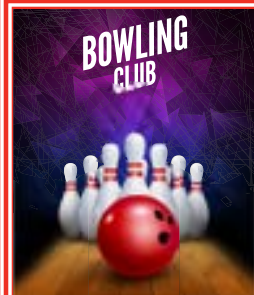
the Storm Cup points race which will award \$50,000 in bonus prize money at the end of the season. All eight Storm Cup events are streamed live on Xtra Frame.

Bowling and Its Bizarre Moments

WOODLAND HILLS – If you hang around bowling centers long enough, you learn that anything is possible. Especially the impossible.

A video is making the rounds of a right-handed bowler hurling what appears to be a perfect strike ball and he contentedly walks back to his seat after watching the pins splatter. Seconds later, he peeks behind him and a pin is still standing. What happened?

As the video shows, the head pin smacks solidly into the seven pin. But instead of falling, the seven pin just slides down the lane and remains upright.

Perhaps that isn’t an impossible result.

But what I witnessed four years ago might qualify.

Bowling in the “Guys and Dolls” league at AMF Woodlake Lanes in Woodland Hills, a player blasted through the pocket and every pin clearly departed the bowling stage. The bowler was exultant and so was his team because it was a key 10th-frame shot in a down-to-the-wire match.

On second look by the bowlers, the eight pin remained upright – motionless. Absolutely no one had seen what had happened after it appeared all the pins had left the lane.

But one pin definitely remained – to the shock of all.

It was such a stunning development that the unfortunate bowler’s team lodged a protest, asking that the shot be ruled a strike – even though the automatic scorer had posted a nine count.

The bowler’s team contended the remaining pin had left the bowling stage and likely had rebounded off the back wall and returned onto the lane. In that case, it was argued, the shot should be counted as a strike.

Amid considerable confusion as to what exactly happened, league president Scott Tschappat was summoned. After listening to arguments, Tschappat ruled that the pin should be left standing.

The United States Bowling Congress was consulted a day later and it backed up Tschappat’s call. The USBC said that “pins that rebound and stay on the lane must be considered standing pins.”

This actually represented a change from a past rule. Formerly, pins that rebounded off a lane and returned would be considered as having been knocked down. But for this to happen, it would require verification – either from instant replay or witnesses.

The new rule, according to the USBC spokesman, “takes out the gray area.”

Don’t think these weird shots are isolated circumstances. Dustin Markowitz, the co-host of Bowling Evolved and a longtime bowler, says he once experienced an unreal situation during league play.

“Nine years ago, a bowler was going for a 300 game and he had the front 11 and buried his last shot,” Markowitz said.

“It was a picture-perfect ball. It looked like every pin left the deck. One pin shot straight up in the air and landed back on the deck. It was one of the most bizarre things that I had ever seen.”

Instead of a 300, that bowler was stuck with a 299 – and no doubt a story to tell for the rest of his life.

Yes, miracles do happen. Just go bowling and you’re likely to see one soon enough.



Voss is Boss

COLORADO SPRINGS — PBA Hall of Famer Brian Voss of Centennial, Colo., defeated 2016 U.S. Open champion and PBA Rookie of the Year Francois Lavoie of Canada, 263-210, to win the \$5,000 first prize in the third annual PBA Colorado Springs Southwest Super Regional, presented by Budweiser, at Harmony Lanes in Colorado Springs on Sunday.

Voss, the winner of 25 PBA Tour titles, grabbed an early lead when Lavoie failed to convert splits in two of the first three frames. Voss started with a two strikes, spared and then strung seven strikes to put away Lavoie.

After qualifying sixth, Voss earned a bye to the best-of-three-game Round of 12 where he defeated Dino Castillo of Highland Village, Texas, 2-1. He then disposed of local amateur John Cicero of Colorado Springs, 2-0, and eliminated Brad Miller of Maryland Heights, Mo., 225-202, in the semifinal round to advance to the title match.

As qualifying leader, Lavoie earned byes for the first two match play rounds. He then won his way to the title match by defeating Kris Koeltzow from Wheat Ridge, Colo., 2-0, in the Round of 8, and Team USA member Steve Badovinac of Parker, Colo., 223-190, in his semifinal match.

Voss, an infrequent PBA Regional competitor, won his fifth standard PBA Regional title and first in 31 years (not counting a PBA50 Regional title he won in 2015).

Competing in his second consecutive PBA Southwest Regional, Denver Broncos running back C.J. Anderson finished 37th in the field of 75, averaging 196.5 for his eight qualifying games.

WALTER RAY WILLIAMS JR. WINS 101ST PBA TITLE


PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla., defeated Lee Brosius of Ashburn, Va., 268-221, 211-206, in the best-of-three-game title match to win his 101st PBA title in the PBA50 Fayetteville Southern Open at La-Fayette Lanes in Fayetteville, N.C., on Sunday.

In a repeat of last year's title match, which Brosius won, 2-1, the PBA's all-time leading champion was dominant this time, winning a \$1,900 prize. Williams' overall PBA titles total includes victories in PBA Tour, PBA Regional, PBA50 Tour and PBA50 Regional events.

In the best-of-three semifinal round, Williams swept Steve Jones of Berlin Md., 232-214, 236-223, while Brosius rallied to edge Dave Sanders of Blythewood, S.C., 204-205, 212-176, 237-235. Williams also swept Joe Scarborough of Charlotte, N.C., 2-0, in the best-of-three Round of 8.

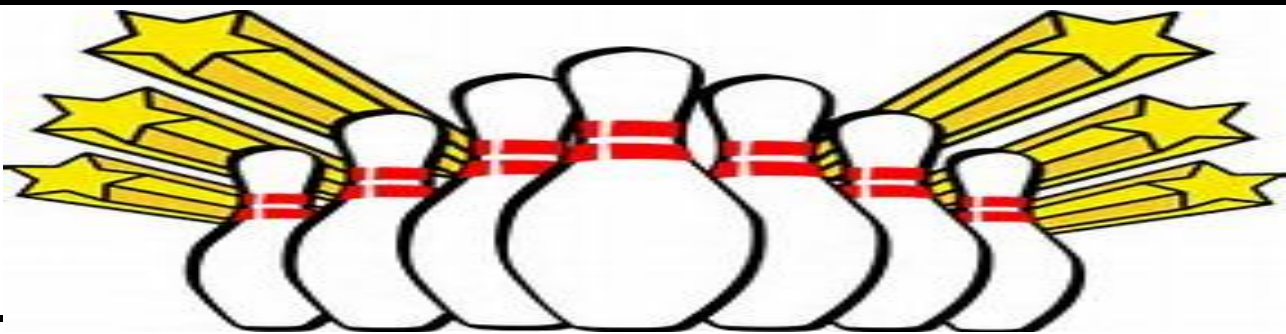

BURBANK — There is an elephant in the room that needs to be talked about...sandbagging bowlers. It's an age-old issue and the hardest offense to prove and enforce.

Personally, it is difficult to grasp how a bowler could or would practice 'bagging'. IMHO, if you are good enough to sandbag, why would you want to under play your ability?

Wouldn't you want to compete against bowlers of your own ilk?

The expression 'taking candy from a baby' comes to mind. I regard it as cowardly, insincere and thievery. Harsh words?

Yes. It actually takes skill and work to sandbag. Put that energy into becoming the best of the best and leave the innocents alone.

Even the USBC has taken action to try and prevent sandbagging by creating the composite average to use for tournaments.

Granted, it may be in the hands of the tournament directors to employ the composite average into the rules of the tournament to make it actually work but still, unscrupulous bowlers can make it work for them.

Frankly, it embarrasses me that it has gone far enough for the USBC to get involved and yet it encourages me to know that bowling, in general, is important enough to do so. It might surprise you to know the core of bagging could be happening in your own fun league.

Baggers will often sub in a league just enough to establish a 21 game average. An average that is far below their true ability and then use it to enter tournaments.

This should be a red flag for all secretaries. Some leagues have suffered this action in their sweepers.

All in all, I encourage bowlers to be aware of the actions of others and themselves. Is a victory born out of duplicity really a victory?

Sysco narrowly misses opportunity to clinch 4th round

They took all five games, winning the final two by a combined 16 pins in very close fashion, to stay alive. Cal Bowl will go into next week four behind, needing a sweep for the round. Leonard Ruiz Jr. led the way against J.A.T. with a 248-211/628 series.

Western Pacific, already a round winner, added to five wins to their season total by sweeping past Smirnoff. Chris Hefner was the top shooter on the pair, leading Western Pacific with 201-223/623. Gary Duran added a couple 200 games to help with 581.

Bowlum added four wins to their season total by defeating Keystone Lanes. Bowlum took two out of three games, plus totals. They dropped the second game by only 10 pins. Ramiro Garcia led the team with a 213-234/612 set.

Threadworks met up with Crown Royal on the next pair. Some big individual efforts on the Threadworks team led them to a 4-1 victory in the match. Eric Snow had a 234-211/636 night, and even that didn't lead the team as Paul Varela topped him with 266-208/667.

Unfortunately for Matt, it was only good for one win, as Century 21—My Real Estate was able to shoot some steady scores and win the match. Joe Jimenez was the top shooter for Century 21 with 255/628. Bobby Campagnale added a 257 game.

Another match that ended in a 4-1 win was between Erickson's Food Supply and Herzog Insurance, with Erickson's being the team getting four. The match was incredibly close, with Erickson's winning the first game by only 10 pins, and Herzog getting the last one by only 4. Mikey Villarreal was the top bowler on the pair, with 200-201/571.

Los Altos Trophy and Forest Lanes squared off in the next match. The final game for this series ended in a tie, at 703. And that tie was the only bright spot for Forest, as Los Altos took the other two games and totals in relatively easy fashion. Matt Mosley led Los Altos Trophy with a nice 215-201/612 set.

Linder's Insurance got back in the win column, taking four out of five from Parkin's Bowling Supply. Both of these teams were near the top of the leader board when the round began, but are looking forward to it ending next week. Jello Gray led the pair in this match, pacing Linder's with a 208/575 series.

The final pair of lanes saw GJC Janitorial take four out of five from Gym W.R.A.T.T. Fitness. Dan Gartin started with 190 and 209 before dropping off but still led the pair.

The first sidepot for the night went to Michael Lindsey and his 226 game. The super pot in game #2 was won by Paul Varela for his 266 effort and paid him \$207. Ramiro Garcia took the third game pot with 234.

The Financial Advisor's Pot was won by Ramiro Garcia. He earned an additional \$200 for his 234. Chris Hefner and Herbert Jones tied for 2nd place with 223 and split \$100.

The round will end next Monday night with Sysco needing one win to clinch. For added excitement we'll have a sweeper to end the round, just like in the past three. Plenty of excitement to go around. Come down and watch the action at Del Rio Lanes, beginning at 8:30 every Monday night.
