Jason Belmonte Wins PBA World Championship for Record 11th Major

Australian two-hander beats Jakob Butturff 236-227 in title match for 21st career tour win



ALLEN PARK, MI -Australia's Jason Belmonte successfully defended his PBA World Championship title Thursday for a record 11th PBA major crown, continuing to set new benchmarks of performance for the PBA Tour's most prestigious and challenging tournaments.

The 35-year-old twohander defeated Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., 236-227, in the title match of the stepladder finals televised live by FS1. The World Championship, the Go Bowling! PBA Tour

season's third major, was the pinnacle event of the multi-event PBA World Series of Bowling X at Thunderbowl Lanes.

In his 11th season on tour, Belmonte broke a tie with PBA Hall of Famers Earl Anthony and Pete Weber for most major titles. after winning his 10th major in the PBA Tournament of Champions in February. He had a chance to win his 11th major in the Players Championship a week after the Tournament of Champions but was defeated by fellow two-hander Anthony Simonsen in the title match of that tournament.

Having been top qualifier for the finals of the Tournament of Champions, Players Championship and the World Championship, Belmonte also set a new mark for earning the top qualifier position for the finals in three consecutive major tournaments in a sea-

"I'm so overwhelmed right now that if I could express how I feel I don't know if anyone could understand me." said Belmonte, who also won his

21st career tour title. "To break a record held by two of the greatest players of all time is just something I never thought was possible when I first started on tour more than 10 years ago. I'm proof that you can achieve your dreams."

Belmonte got off to a fast start in the title match with strikes in the first three frames, while Butturff, trying for his first major and sixth career tour title, struggled until striking in the third frame. Butturff ran into trouble again in the continued on page 6

ALLEN PARK, MI -The five leading International scorers from PBA World Series of Bowling X qualifying beat the five highest U.S. scorers to win the USA vs. The World team competition, 2-0, in a best-of-three Baker team format finals to conclude a historic week of PBA competition on FS1 at Thunderbowl Lanes in Suburban Detroit.

The World team, made up of Pontus Andersson (Sweden), Andres Gomez (Colombia), Dom Barrett (England) and Australians

Sam Cooley and Jason Belmonte defeated the U.S. team of Bill O'Neill. Kyle Sherman, Tom Daugherty, Anthony Simonsen and EJ Tackett, to end the U.S.'s two-year reign as champion of the non-title WSOB "allstar" event.

The U.S. team, captained by PBA Hall of Famer Marshall Holman, jumped out to the lead in the first game of the second match 184-176 but The World team, captained by Hall of Famer Amleto Monacelli, came back to continued on page 8



qualifier Andres Gomez of Colombia 236-194 in the second event of PBA World Series of Bowling X at Thunderbowl Lanes which was televised live by FS1.

Belmonte threw seven strikes in the match and didn't throw a shot worse than nine on the first ball to maintain a comfortable lead over Gomez throughout the match.

"What you find is that making a good shot to get to the pocket really isn't the issue, it's how the ball goes through the pins once it gets there," said Belmonte, who won his 18th career title in the 2018 PBA Tour Finals at Thunderbowl Lanes. "When you leave a single pin, it puts you in an odd position of deciding how much of a change you should make to carry those single pins because you're basically making good shots. But, on the other hand, you don't want to leave those single pins all day."

By winning the Chameleon Championship Belmonte joined PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke and Dick Allen as two-time winners this season. He also joined Hall of Famers Amleto Monacelli, Dick Ritger and Wayne Webb in the 20 career win club.

Belmonte won the PBA Tournament of Champions in February for his 19th career title and to tie Hall of Famers Pete Weber and Earl Anthony for most major titles with 10.

"It's a crazy big number I never thought I would reach," Belmonte said. "I'm just enjoying the moment and then moving forward to the next tournament. I'll celebrate a little tonight and then focus on what I need to do tomorrow. "You don't want to live in the past or the future because it will distract you from what you need to do now."

Bowling on the PBA 39-foot Chameleon lane condition, the finals opened with a seeding round that determined the qualifying order for three stepladder matches. Gomez earned the top seed for the finals with a 235 game followed by Belmonte, 227; No. 3 qualifier AJ Chapman, Manchester, Iowa, 205, and four-time tour winner Ronnie Russell, Marion, Ind., 179.

In the opening stepladder match, Chapman, making his second tour telecast and trying for his first tour win beat Russell 244-233 to advance to the semifinal match against Belmonte. Belmonte beat Chapman 200-197 in the semifinal to advance to the title match against Gomez.

Joe Curry Has a Grand Ol' Time

WINNETKA - It was the shot heard around the world - or at least around Winnetka Bowl.

Ace bowler Joe Curry claimed the \$996 prize this month in the "Guys and Dolls" league's Pin Count, a game in which one bowler can earn big money by throwing a strike on his or her designated turn.

It was the top payoff in the seven-year history of Pin Count, which is organized by Greg Kolski, who said the previous high was \$749 when the league was bowling at AMF

Woodlake Lanes in Woodland Hills. Curry actually collected an even \$1,000.

Before Curry threw his no-doubt-aboutit strike, colleague Jamie Beeler delivered a message to Curry. "If you make it, I'll throw in an extra four dollars to make it a grand,"

Said Curry: "It was the most money I've won apart from Vegas. "I said, 'Whoa! I can't believe I won it.' I've been on Cloud

It may have been a shock to Curry to walk off with 1,000 bucks, but not to the rest of the league's players. Curry, one of the most popular and gracious players in the league, averages 212 and has blasted two perfect games.

"Once his name was pulled [from the raffle], we knew it was over," league member Jeff Stitz said. "He's one of those bowlers guaranteed to make that shot."

Replied Curry: "I heard that, and I told them, 'I'm glad you were confident because I wasn't.' I was just hoping to make a good shot. Once you throw the ball, it's out of your hands. You have to be lucky – and you may not get the carry you need."

This actually was the third time the right-handed Curry has had his name picked for Pin Count . . . and he's nailed a strike all three times.

The Pin Count pot had gone up at a swift pace as bowlers kept failing to strike. "There were nine misses and I was one of them – when I left a 10 pin on a perfectly good hit," said Kolski with a smile.

Cari Hanson, averaging 122, had nearly won the pot two weeks earlier when she delivered a strong shot that left a quivering but defiant 4 pin. She was shooting for \$598 so the pot skyrocketed about \$400 in two weeks.

Curry said he bought 10 tickets for \$10. His winning shot came in the fifth frame of the middle game of his 603 series (186, 223, 194). He had struck in his previous frame, so he was riding some momentum. Still, Curry admitted that "I was nervous. It felt like I was throwing my last shot of a 300 game. It was definitely nerve-wracking."

His reaction after the strike?

"I was exuberant – like my [first] 300. Same happiness. Same joy. Same shock," Curry said.





sixth frame when he missed a seven pin but recovered to throw the last six strikes of the match to eventually force Belmonte to strike on the first ball in the 10th and then finish the frame with a spare. Belmonte doubled in the 10th to seal the win. "Jakob is a great player and I knew what he was capable of so for him to come back from that missed spare really didn't surprise me," Belmonte said. "He put together a clutch performance to the very end.

"Going into the 10th I knew my ball had to be perfect going through the pins and those were two of the best shots of my life," Belmonte added. "I can't think of a better way to win this tournament." Belmonte also became the season's first three-time winner having also won the Chameleon Championship on Tuesday. He also extended his record of career tour wins in WSOB competition to six.

The stepladder finals started with Butturff, who qualified fourth, beating No. 5 qualifier BJ Moore of Greensburg, Pa., 236-183. Moore, who was trying for his first PBA Tour title, finished fifth which tied his best finish in a major when he also finished fifth in the 2018 Tournament

The 24-year-old Butturff then beat 10-time tour winner No. 3 qualifier Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa, 235-226, to advance to the semifinal match where he beat part-time tour player and No. 2 qualifier Matt McNiel of Minneapolis, 184-179, to advance to the title match against Belmonte. The next stop for the Go Bowling! PBA Tour will be the USBC Masters March 26-April 1 at the Gold Coast Bowling Center in Las Vegas where Belmonte will try for his 12th major win. After the season's fourth major has concluded, the top 24 players in points will earn berths in the PBA Playoffs which begin April 8 with the Round of 24 eliminations at Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine.

in the title match of the third tournament of PBA World Series of Bowling X at Thunderbowl Lanes.

After five frames in the title match, Prather held a 10pin lead over Moore, who was also trying for his first tour win, when he left the 4-10 split in the sixth frame on a seemingly good hit.

"I didn't have a clue what happened there because it was a pretty good shot as far as I was concerned," said Prather. "It could have been a turning point in the match but there was still time to get back on track. I decided after that shot the best thing to do was move a little further left and create a little more angle to the pocket and that turned out to be a good adjustment."

Prather's previous best tour finish was third which he had achieved four times.

"Even though I wasn't winning, I was fortunate to achieve small breakthroughs in my game over the past 18 months," Prather said. "That was a good thing because I didn't want to go backwards. I could still find something positive to take away from those (top five) finishes even though I didn't win."

Moore, whose best previous finish was second in the 2016 Scorpion Championship, earned the top seed for the finals with a 224 game in a seeding round to open the live FS1 telecast. Ten-time tour winner Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa., earned the No. 2 spot with 215, followed by Prather, 212, and three-time tour winner Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, N.C., 194.

In the first stepladder match, Prather beat Troup 222-208 to advance to the semifinal match against O'Neill. Prather doubled in the 10th frame to beat O'Neill 198-190 to advance to the title match against Moore.



win the second game 204-156 to force a sudden death one-ball roll-off. Belmonte, who was coming off a historic PBA World Championship win Thursday, won the roll-off against Tackett with a nine-count to seven for Tackett, who left the 2-8-10 split, for the title.

In the first match, the U.S. team also took the early lead, winning the first game 234-227 but then lost to The World team in the second game 213-202 to force another one-ball roll-off. Belmonte and Tackett tied with strikes in the first roll-off frame with a strike, forcing a second rolloff where Barrett struck to beat Simonsen's eight-count (2-10 split) to give The World team a 1-0 lead heading into the second match.

The Baker format requires each player to bowl two frames in one game to combine for one score. The leadoff bowler bowls frame one and six, the second bowler frames two and seven and so on until the anchor bowler bowls frame five and 10.

"It's another great example of showcasing the international scope of the sport and the talent that exists all over the world," Belmonte said. "I felt good about this team because we bowl against each other all over the world so I knew we could develop a good chemistry right away.

"Like all team competitions, the key is communication between the players," Belmonte added. "We share what we experience on every shot, then it's up to each player

Monacelli, a 20-time PBA Tour and eight-time PBA50 Tour winner, who is also coach for the Dominican Republic national team, echoed Belmonte's comments as a coach for the highly talented World team.

"They know what to do as far as their physical game is concerned," Monacelli said. "What's important is putting together a good order (lineup). I try to help with the mental side and give them another pair of eyes to see what is happening with the lanes and their games. What the eyes can't see, the body feels so I try to get them to connect with that feel so they can trust in the decisions they make."

The players earned berths on their respective teams based on their finishing positions after 30 qualifying games from the 10-game qualifying rounds of the WSOB X Cheetah, Chameleon and Scorpion events.


