

SIMONSEN PURSUES THREE-PEAT AND FOURTH CAREER MASTERS TITLE IN LAS VEGAS

2024 USBC Masters tournament preview

LAS VEGAS –The USBC Masters, the third major and seventh title event of the 2024 PBA Tour, is set to begin this week at Suncoast Bowling Center in Las Vegas.

Given the event’s unique format — over 450 entrants, just 15 games of qualifying and a 64-player, double-elimination match play bracket — every player can envision a path for themselves to hit the jackpot.

But in reality, at least in recent memory, the Masters is where the apex predators assert their dominance. Seven of the past 10 Masters have been won by two men: Jason Belmonte

and Anthony Simonsen.

As the two-time defending champion, Simonsen is already guaranteed a berth into the bracket. That security affords him the ability to use qualifying as his personal laboratory, testing various balls and lane-play strategies to give himself as many answers heading into match play as possible — a terrifying proposition for the rest of the field.

When match play came around a year ago, Simonsen already knew the answer to every conceivable question. He broke Norm Duke’s match play scoring record [by nearly five pins per game](#).

Simonsen struck on

71.8% of his shots during match play, according to [Lanetalk](#), and threw nearly twice as many six-baggers (nine) as open frames (five).

While it was Simonsen’s consistency that powered him to the win in 2022 — all six of his three-game sets were between 643 and 664 —

his unrelenting striking prowess created a sense of inevitability that made him unbeatable a year ago.

The then-26-year-old

secured his third career Masters title and became the youngest player to [win five majors](#).

While Simonsen, now continued on page 4

KAYLA STARR, ERNESTO REYNOSO WIN PBA JR. NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Maryland’s Kayla Starr and California’s Ernesto Reynoso became the latest youth players to win the PBA Jr. National Championships.

Two PBA Jr. boys and two girls advanced from each of five regional qualifiers held [last summer](#) to reach the PBA Jr. National Championships Finals. Ten games of round-robin match play at Bowlero Northrock in Wichita, Kan. determined the seeding for the five-player stepladder finals.

Illinois’ Gianna Bran-

dolino and Colorado’s Dmitri Richardson [each earned the top seed](#) and clinched a berth in the televised championship match, while Starr and Reynoso each emerged from the non-televvised stepladder to reach the finals.

Starr, who finished as the runner-up in this event two years ago, came out determined to finish on the other side. The Crofton, Md. native struck on her first four shots and never looked back.

Carol Mancini - Another Perspective

Another motivator is gone – Carol Mancini was living with her daughter Wendy in Oregon when she passed away on February 28, 2024 at the age of 89. She was born in Chanute, KS in 1935. She married Harold Woodruff in 1954 and they had three children, Bette (now deceased), Brian and Wendy. Bette, who lost her life to cancer spawned the only grandchild who lives in London.

It was at 17 that Carol went bowling and it was destined to change her life – she was hooked! In the early years children Wendy and Brian enjoyed the wonderful free nursery the bowling centers offered allowing Carol to promote and enjoy the game.

Following a divorce from Woodruff she later met and married Nick Mancini who was Manager of Parkway Bowl in Southern California. It seemed like a union that was meant to be and the two spent years creating excitement and good things for bowlers – on the lanes, at meetings and events locally, statewide and nationally. Always a smile on her face, Carol created fun wherever she went, a regular Pied Piper.

As President of the California WBA, following a state meeting in1991, a few of us were enjoying a cool respite outside and a reason to shed our heels in a warm summer day. We were facing a large cool looking green expanse of lawn – inviting to say the least. I shed my heels and sauntered out on the lovely freshly mowed green lawn. Enjoying the relief on my feet and all of a sudden the lawn sprinklers came on! There I was, uniform, no shoes – in the middle of the lawn and at this point – quite wet! I was horrified but Carol found this hysterical, and the rest is not fit to print however, at the following annual meeting, in 1992 in Modesto, Carol presented me with a genuine brass lawn sprinkler mounted on a lovely polished plaque! (Still have it.)

Carol was never intimidating she was a motivator. You knew if she was involved something would happen. She was beautiful, her smile was radiant, and she loved bowling while creating an atmosphere that made other people love it and want to be involved.

She bowled her first game in 1951 and ultimately bowled in13 different centers in Alhambra Valley over the years participating in 30 California WBA State tournaments; 28 National Tournaments; all local tournaments and in 2012 she was honored in the California WBA Hall of Fame. She was 100% dedicated to the sport and loved to go to work.

Carol Mancini helped many people along the way and in some ways she said she was “old school” - she hated the computer. She was truly one of those leaders that made bowling great and made California No.1 for many years. As a leader and as a person, Carol left a legacy and will remain in the hearts of many.

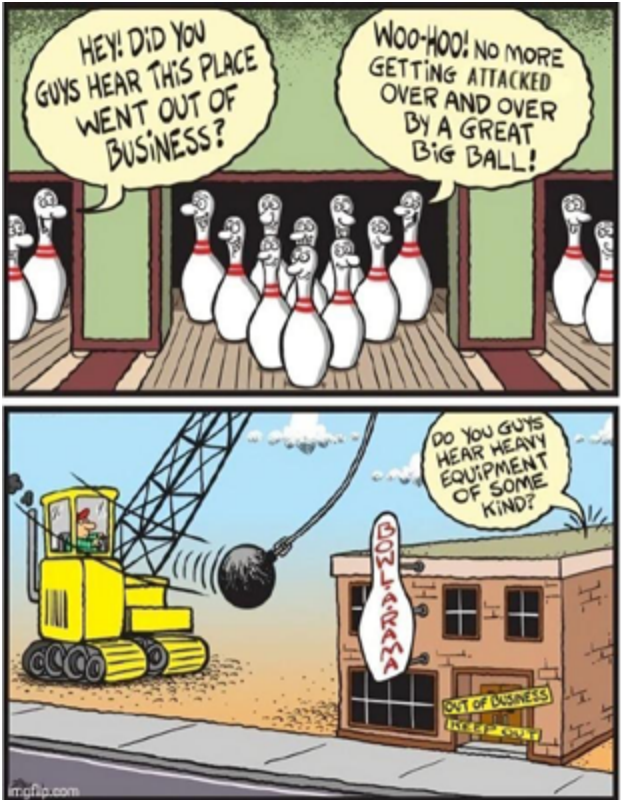

What an honor to be one of the inductees to the California USBC Hall of Fame! It's a tribute that I never expected because of my vagabond existence while working for AMF and two other large conglomerates in the bowling industry.

Bruce Pluckhahn, former curator of the International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame, used to joke with me every year at Christmas: "Dave, you will most likely never be a member of any Hall of Fame because of your frequent moves, *but your amazing collection of homemade cards at Christmas are already a part of the national museum!*"

So, again, I am so grateful for my election to the California USBC Hall of Fame in the meritorious category. Bob Johnson, another California native and former editor of the California Bowling News, who has also done his share of moves around the country, joins me in a love for California, which is beyond reproach.

Lynn Matsubara of the Cal USBC Newsletter has asked me to put together a brief profile for each of this year's inductees. I will be providing three this week, and another two next week (Bob Johnson will be providing my profile). So, without further ado, here are the first three inductees:

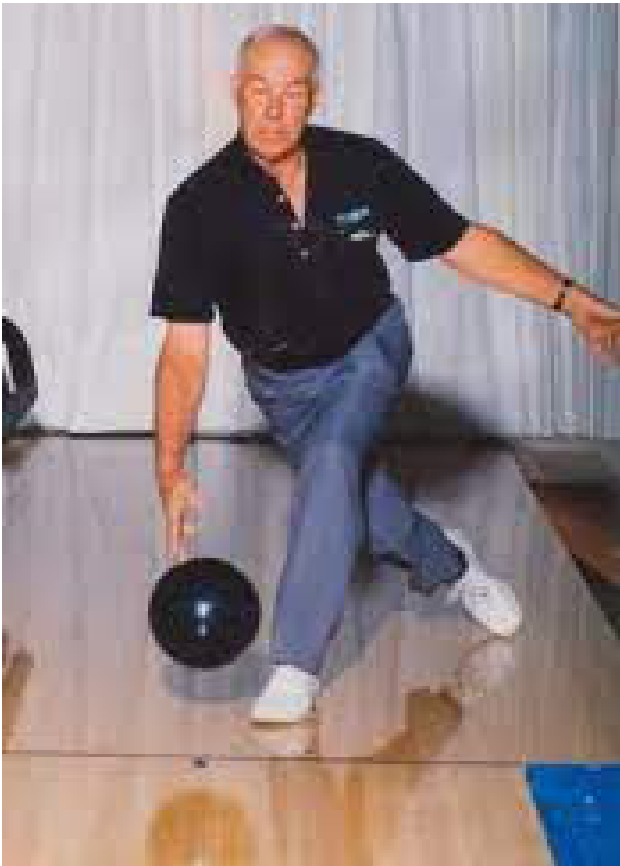
Donna Adamek — Donna Adamek grew up just a couple of minutes from Columbia Bowl in Duarte. "I would practice there for hours after my coaching sessions with Tosh Kinjo and Bobbe North," remembers Adamek. All that practice led to the Alberta E. Crowe Star of Tomorrow Award in 1975, and she soon embarked on a professional career that included 19 career titles in 16 years.

Among those 19 professional titles were five majors - two USBC Queens titles, two U.S. Open titles, and the Sam's Town Invitational in Las Vegas. Donna also won four titles in the USBC National Championships - the Doubles in 1981 and 1982, and Team titles in 1981 and 1987. She was honored nationally as Bowler of the Year four times.

Nicknamed "Mighty Mite," Adamek no longer bowls, as woodworking and remodeling have become her passion. "The one thing that I do miss from bowling on tour is the travel," commented Adamek.

Glenn Allison — Glenn Allison was born in Whittier, Calif., in 1930. He bowled his first USBC Open Championship as a 16 year old, when the traveling event came to Los Angeles in 1947. This year Glenn participated in his 72nd national tournament, a record.

Allison is a four time champion at the USBC event, winning the Classic Doubles (with partner Dick Hoover) in 1962, the Classic Team Event (Falstaff Beer) in 1964, the Classic Team Event (Ace Mitchell Shur-Hooks) in 1966, and the Classic Singles in 1970. Glenn has five PBA Tour titles to his credit, as well as one title on the PBA50 circuit.

But Allison is most remembered for rolling a perfect 900 three game series on July 1, 1982, at La Habra 300 Bowl in Southern California. The score was never sanctioned because of the rules that existed regarding the application of oil upon a lane in those days.

Just six years later the rules were changed under the Limited Distance Dressing procedure. It's ironic that there are now 40 sanctioned 900 series (at last count), but one of the only perfect series that is still not included is Allison's score. His series was bowled on wooden lanes, using a plastic bowling ball and a conventional grip.

Bob Warning — Bob Warning began bowling as a 12 year old at Sun City Bowl in 1978. He remembers wanting to be a pro bowler since the age of 17. "It was all I ever wanted to do," said the 33 year USBC member from Menifee.

In 1991 he won the Cal State Masters, beating the likes of Jim Murtishaw, Alvin Lou and Marv Sargent. Nine years later he would join those men in capturing the Cal State Scratch Team Championship. The same team would repeat a year later. Bob also teamed with Marv Sargent in 2000 to win the PBA Regional Doubles in Dublin.

In between those impressive victories, Warning would capture the 1995 Cal State Scratch Singles with an 800 series. The 58 year old has 23-300 games to his credit and eleven 800's, with a personal best of 847. He was inducted into California's Citrus Belt Hall of Fame in 2012.

Bob was married to wife Laurie in 1993, and together they started Pins & Needles Embroidery and Pro Shop inside Hemet Bowl. In 2014 Bob became pastor of the Crossway Menifee Church. He enjoys his weekly Bible Study sessions which he happened to be conducting when word came regarding his induction to the California USBC Hall of Fame.

"When you bowl in league, it's like going to church once a week," said Warning. "You are with the same friends and develop relationships that last a lifetime."

27, prefers to focus solely on bowling — embodying the “one shot at a time” mentality — the history in front of him is undeniable.

With a win, Simonsen would become the second player to three-peat the Masters. He’d also become the second player to win the Masters four times.

Both feats were achieved by Belmonte, who seeks to win an unprecedented fifth Masters title, clinch a 16th career major title and insert himself into the crowded Player of the Year race.

The reigning PBA Player of the Year, EJ Tackett, has made the finals of every event since the U.S. Open. Tackett looks to make a sixth consecutive championship round appearance this week and bring home his first title of the season.

A Masters win for Tackett, as well as Dom Barrett or Chris Barnes, would complete the career Grand Slam. Only Belmonte, Duke and Mike Aulby have won each of the PBA World Championship, Tournament of Champions, U.S. Open and USBC Masters.

Any 2024 Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year conversation starts with Bill O’Neill and Kyle Troup, who each brought home one of the season’s first two majors. O’Neill leads the tour in [points and earnings](#), but Troup ranks second in both stats and is the only player with multiple titles so far this season.

Simonsen, Marshall Kent and David “Boog” Krol have each won a title and rank third, fifth and sixth, respectively, in points. The titleless-in-2024 Tackett ranks fourth in points and hasn’t missed a show in two months, while the always-looming Belmonte ranks seventh in points.

After the final squad on Wednesday night, the 64-player bracket will be set. Match play begins on Thursday and continues through Friday evening.

All rounds of qualifying and match play will be livestreamed on [BowTV](#).

The five players left standing will advance to Sunday’s championship round, airing at 10:30 a.m. local (1:30 p.m. ET) on FOX.

Starr defeated Brandolino in the girls championship, 259-209.

“It’s good to know that all the hard work paid off,” Starr said.

The lone blemishes on Starr’s scorecard were a pair of 10-pin conversions; meanwhile Brandolino tallied just two strikes through seven frames, then left a pocket 7-10 in the eighth frame and stifle any comeback attempt.

Starr will begin her college bowling career at the University of Nebraska next fall, where she will join a two-time PBA Jr. Girls National Champion — the same girl who defeated Starr two years ago, in fact — Jillian Martin.

Roles were reversed in the boys title match as top-seeded Dmitri Richardson of Denver came out striking while Reynoso struggled to carry the corner pins in the first half.

But everything flipped in the sixth frame.

Richardson left a pocket 7-10, then Reynoso struck to start a four-bagger after switching to reactive. That ball change proved to be the difference maker for Reynoso as a pair of 10-pin leaves from Richardson in the ninth and 10th frames all-but sealed the win for Reynoso.

Reynoso collected his second national youth title in the past year after winning the U15 Boys division of the Junior Gold Championships last summer.

After the singles matches, the PBA Jr. players teamed up with PBA and PWBA stars — but it was Starr and Reynoso who looked like the pros.

Starr and 2019 PWBA Rookie of the Year Valerie Bercier defeated Brandolino and Lindsay Boomershine, who won the 2023 USBC Queens and this month’s **Go Bowling PBA NASCAR Invitational at Phoenix Raceway**, in a five-frame baker doubles match, 107-74.

Reynoso and EJ Tackett took down Richardson and AJ Johnson in a strike-filled, 147-129 match.

In the doubles finals, a full 10-frame game, the PBA Jr. stars each struck on their first four shots while their professional counterparts tallied three strikes and two non-strikes each.

Reynoso then fired all three strikes in the 10th frame to shut out Starr and Bercier by a single pin.

Reynoso struck on 11 of his 12 shots in the doubles competition and 18 of his 23 shots throughout the entire show. Only one of his non-strikes knocked down less than nine pins.

“[This means] everything,” Reynoso said. “I’m so happy all my hard work paid off, countless hours I’ve spent in the bowling alley. This means the world to me. I’m so excited right now.”

For their wins, Reynoso and Starr each collected \$7,500 in SMART scholarship earnings. Richardson and Brandolino, who committed to Jacksonville State University for the 2025 season, each added \$3,750 to their college funds.

The show was taped Jan. 14 at Bowlero Northrock in Wichita, Kan.

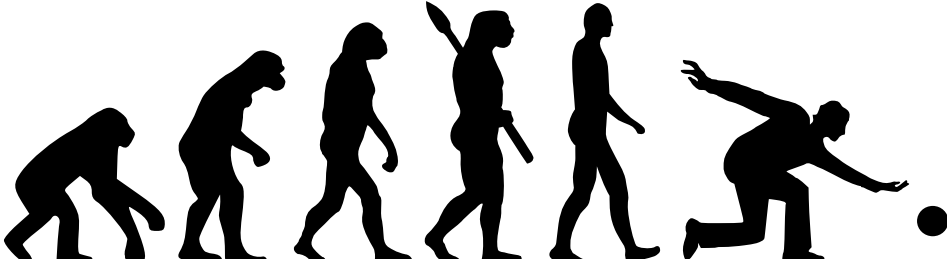
