### **PBA Hall of Famer Marshall** Holman To Be **Color Analyst for USBC** Queens **Telecast on ESPN2**

GREENDALE, Wis.-Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Marshall Holman will be the color analyst for the live ESPN2 telecast of the 2007

United States Bowling Congress Queens finals. He returns to the booth after serving as ESPN's commentator for PBA telecasts from 1996 to 2001.

Holman will share announcing duties with 1993 Queens champion Jan Schmidt, who will serve as the play-by-play announcer.

The sport's premier tournament for elite women bowlers begins April 28 at AMF Carolina Lanes in the Charlotte suburb of Matthews, N.C. ESPN2's coverage of the stepladder finals is set for May 2 at 7 p.m. Eastern.

"Listening to Marshall Holman is a treat for all fans," said USBC Chief Officer of Marketing and Communications Tom Clark. "His knowledge, experience and charisma will add to the broadcast."

The Queens telecast, which also will re-air on May 20 at 1 p.m. Eastern on ESPN, will feature a \$200,000 prize fund and \$30,000 first prize.

The televised finals will include the final five players left after four days of qualifying and double-elimination match play. The top four players remaining in the winners bracket will join the winner of the contenders bracket who will compete in a stepladder format.

Entries remain available for the Queens, which is presented by Eldorado, Silver Legacy and Circus Circus, and the USBC Senior Queens, which is sponsored by Storm Products. The entry fee for the Queens is \$300 (\$350 after April 7) while the Senior Queens entry fee is \$200 (\$235 after April 7). The Senior Queens, for those 50 years of age and older, will be conducted concurrently with the Queens from April 28-May 2 at Northcross Lanes in Huntersville, N.C. Chastain speech, major announcements, legislation, *Board/president elections set* 

NASHVILLE, Tenn.—Four days full of key decisions, major announcements and educational sessions focusing on both the business and sporting aspects of bowling are on the horizon when the second annual United States Bowling Congress Convention is held Wednesday through Saturday at the Gaylord Opryland Resort and Convention Center.

The events begin Wednesday highlighted by two-time Olympic soccer gold medalist Brandi Chastain giving the keynote address. She later will present one of more than 30 educational workshops to be held Wednesday and Thursday along with exhibits, coaching clinics and a lane inspection workshop.

Those people who have excelled in the sport on and off the lanes will be honored through events like the USBC Hall of Fame induction ceremony hosted by USBC and Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Nelson Burton Jr. on Friday. The day also will feature speeches on USBC's future direction including several major announcements directly relating to this focus.

On Saturday, delegates will vote on 17 overall proposed amendments - eight that deal with USBC's national bylaws, three with merged local bylaws, one with non-merged local bylaws, four with league rules and one with tournament rules. One proposed change to the bylaws would have USBC conducting national legislative sessions in

Kent jumped out to an early lead in the title match, striking in the first four frames, but Barnes clawed back with four consecutive strikes of his own in frames 5-8, while Kent had three spares in that span. With a chance to get within one pin of Kent, Barnes left the 4-pin in the 9th frame, however, and Kent struck with his first ball in the 10th frame for the ninth win of his career.

The Newark, N.Y., native advanced to the title match with a 235-219 win over Danny Wiseman. Kent had a chance to win by striking on his first ball in 10th, but a spare and a strike gave Wiseman a chance to tie with three strikes in the 10th. Wiseman struck with his first shot, but then left the 4-6-7-10 split to give Kent the match.

Barnes advanced to the title match with a 246-226 win over Tony Reyes.

Kent earned \$50,000 and a four-season Denny's PBA Tour exemption through the 2010-11 season with the win. Barnes (Double Oak, Texas) took home \$25,000 for second, Wiseman (Baltimore) earned \$13,000 for third and Reves (San Bruno. Calif.) earned \$10,000 for fourth. Next week the Denny's PBA Tour season wraps up with the 2007 PBA Tournament of Champions, March 29-April 1. The live ESPN-televised finals Sunday, April 1 at 10 a.m. Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn.





# 2007 USBC INTERCOLLEGIATE SINGLES CHAMPIONSHIPS

GREENDALE, Wis. - Fresno State's P.J. Haggerty, the two-time reigning collegiate player of the year, will have the opportunity to add a second national collegiate singles title to his resume as he qualified late Friday for the 2007 United States Bowling Congress Intercollegiate Singles Championships, which will be held May 21-22 at AMF Pin Palace Lanes in Huntsville, Ala.

The USBC Intercollegiate Singles Championships, which debuted in May 2004, features the top 16 male and top 16 female collegiate bowlers in the country competing for national titles.

Qualifying for the national finals was held Friday at four Sectional Qualifier sites: Allentown, Pa.; Chattanooga, Tenn.; Fairview Heights, Ill., and Las Vegas. All participants bowled six games with total pinfall determining final standings. The top four finishers in each division (male and female) at each Sectional Qualifier site advance to the 2007 USBC Intercollegiate Singles Championships

Haggerty, a current Team USA member who won the 2005 men's national collegiate single title, won the Las Vegas Sectional with 1,312. Other notables advancing from Las Vegas were Lindenwood's Daniel Farish, a Junior Team USA member in 2006, and West Texas A&M's William Haverland, who is currently on Junior Team USA.





### **Champions Crowned at Inaugural Denny's All-American High School Championships**

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich.—With bright lights, ESPN television cameras and the pressure of bowling for thousands of dollars in scholarships, two players emerged as champions Sunday of the inaugural Denny's All-American High School Championships.

Ellen Morrison of Winnebago, Ill., and Jonathan Buckert of Rochester, N.Y., each earned \$3,000 scholarships by defeating their opponents at DeVos Place. Morrison won her match 210-190 over Kayla Stamm of Shillington, Pa., while Buckert defeated Christopher David Ray of Granite City, Ill., 213-170.

The event, which was conducted in an arena-setting on the same lanes as the Denny's Professional Bowlers Association World Championship earlier in the day, is scheduled to be televised on ESPN on April 22 at 1 p.m.Eastern.

Buckert, the 2007 USBC Chuck Hall Star of Tomorrow, struck seven times in the boys' championship match to earn the title.

"It was really hot with the lights and I was a little nervous, but it was fun," Buckert said. "This proves that all my hard work and effort has really paid off."

In the girls' championship match, Morrison, who has two Illinois individual state high school titles to her credit, threw a strike on the first ball in the final frame to lock up the victory.

"This has been really cool and I think it's amazing that kids are being given the opportunity to experience an event like this," Morrison said.

"I thought I was going to be a lot more nervous than I really was, but once I got out there and started making shots I calmed down."

To wrap up Sunday's finals, Morrison and Buckert teamed up with a couple of PBA stars in a doubles showdown. Morrison and Kelly Kulick defeated Buckert and Tony Reyes 256-233.

The Denny's All-American High School Championships showcased 29 varsity high school athletes from 15 states. All players competed in eight games of qualifying Saturday morning before the field was cut to the top six boys and top six girls, who competed in match play to determine the four players on the TV finals.


For their second-place efforts, Ray and Stamm each received a \$2,000 scholarship, bringing the total awarded at the event to \$10,000

### CHEAP TRICKS MEDICATIONS FOR "SPLITS R US" AND OTHER VIRUSES PART 2 THE "CHOPS R US" CURE

Have you ever asked yourself why, in spite of having thrown accurately to your mark on a multi pin spare you chopped it anyway? Well, in case you are one of those mid or high average bowlers who suffer from that cherry-picking disease too often, I suggest a rather simple solution which allows use of a one board foot adjustment instead of the three we used for splits (covered last month). As simple as it is, I've been consistently surprised by how many bowlers weren't using it, so we'll describe it here.

This rule applies to all multiple pin spares <u>except</u> splits! It basically says that to pick up a multiple pin spare, shoot for the <u>side</u> of the key (front) pin which will cause the <u>ball</u> (not the pin) to deflect into the remaining pins. To do this, merely adjust your feet <u>one</u> board right (or left) of the normal board you would stand on for that key pin and shoot for the same mark. A single board foot adjustment will cause the ball to hit the key pin on the side opposite to the direction of that adjustment (a one board foot adjustment equals 2 inches at the pins).

Some examples: For a 3-6-10, stand one board left of your normal 3 pin position. The ball hits the right side of the key pin (the 3) and deflects into the 6, also taking out the 10. For a 3-5 (or a rare 3-5-8) however, you would stand one board <u>right</u>, because now you want the ball to deflect off the <u>left</u> side of the 3 and into the 5 and the 8. For a 2-4-5-7, stand one board right of your normal 2 pin foot position, thus making the ball hit the left side of the 2 pin which deflects into the 5, while the ball takes out the 4-7. (Left handers reverse this for the 3-5-6-10 There are many others, of course. The obvious purpose of this tactic is to always make the <u>ball</u> deflect off the key pin into the greatest possible number of accompanying pins. The vast majority of such attempts should be straight ball shots, because lane condition variances on various parts of the lane surface will have no effect on a truly straight ball, thus increasing your conversion rate.

One of the rare exceptions to this straight ball rule would be the 2-8 spare, where a Brooklyn strike ball is best for right handers; but for the 3-9 the usual straight ball nose shot to the 3 is best (left handers reverse this; throw a Brooklyn hook shot to the 3-9, but a straight shot to the 2 to convert the 2-8).

For bucket spares, it's a mistake throw Brooklyn strike shots. Why? Because Brooklyn shots are supposed to miss the 5. So here I also suggest a straight shot to the nose of the front (key) pin. Even on the pro tour I see right handers sometimes miss a simple 4 pin, because even a slight hook ball hits middle oil and slides by on the inside of the pin. So for most off center spare shots the straight ball has been proven more successful. After all, a <u>really</u> straight ball will go straight no matter what the lane condition! Remember, the only reason you have to live with the constantly changing variables of throwing a hook on a strike shot is to gain entry angle, which isn't needed on simple spares. Obviously, the more variables you can eliminate on spare shots, the less open frames!

This is a "cheap trick" with an excellent scoring payoff.

### THE EYES HAVE IT

Talking about cheap tricks, this next one can answer two questions for bowlers concerning the "dominant eye" situation, which is a part of every human being's legacy, yet often creates accuracy problems. There is much excellent material available on this subject in scientific journals and we've covered it before, so we won't do it again.

But here's what's important to you right now: A) Is there an easier way to determine *your* dominant eye and, b) How can any effects it may have on your bowling be quickly identified? These items are important because the <u>degree</u> of eye dominance can vary from person to person. This often causes an optical illusion, which prevents many bowlers from being able to accurately hit the mark they're looking at. Worse, they may not even know which board they actually hit after the shot.

Right or left eye dominance has no relation whatever to being right or left handed. A vast majority of the population is right eye predominant, *including most left handers*.

shown that even a bowler who can't identify his/her own shots accurately, seems to have no problem spotting it correctly when watching another bowler.

#### **FURTHER EXPERIMENTS**

Another thing I've never heard mentioned is the fact that the same bowlers who "see" the fourth arrow as being off center by 3 or more boards, can look at the pins and easily see that the head pin (or the 5 pin) is indeed in the center of the lane. It seems that somehow, at a lesser or greater distance from the eyes than the arrows, sight lines seem more accurate. This is more than just an idle observation, and here's what was done to check it out

Several high average bowlers who consistently see their marks 3 to 5 boards off, due to exaggerated left or right eye dominance, were tested. They were asked to throw strike shots, <u>not</u> to their mark, *but to their break point target*...then to say whether the ball hit or missed that break point after each shot and if it missed, by how much and in which direction. This was done on lane 40 of a 40 lane house, with a spotter down lane to check the accuracy of the bowlers' calls. So far, the bowlers tested *were all able to accurately see and call their balls' hits and misses at the break point after nearly every shot, even though unable to do it even once at the arrows!*

# Reilly Wins Orleans-Storm Golden Ladies Classic

LAS VEGAS—First timer she was looking for, striking out Joan Reilly of Wilmington, NC from the 5th thru 9th with a spare

and strike in the 10th. Reilly is no newcomer when it comes to tournament competition finishing 2nd to Sandy Postma in last years USBC Senior Queens. Karen Pullman of Salt Lake City, UT won top honors and \$1000.00 in the Super Senior Championship. Runner-up was Fran Deken of Coweta, OK and 3rd place honors went to Shirley Cockerell of Temple, TX. New top of the line Storm bowling balls went to Andi Whitlock, Middletown, DE for most pins over average (29) after 15 games of qualifying and Nona Cook of Yakima, WA who took 1st place money in the 2nd chance tournament.

#### THE LANES

As far as I know, the following "cheap trick" has never been mentioned, so you're reading it here first (though I've taught it for years):

1- Stand in the center of the approach, center dot between your feet. 2- Look at the fourth (center) arrow.

3- Note that arrow *appears* to be off center.

4- If the arrow appears to be *left* of center, you are *right* eye predominant; if it appears to be *right* of center, you are *left* eye predominant. This is because the dominant eye seems to "push" that arrow toward the opposite side, creating that off center illusion. Eye doctors have different tests by which you can determine which eye is dominant, but if you're in a bowling center, why bother? Once you know which eye is dominant, vision experts agree it virtually never changes. So for those of you who don't yet know which eye is dominant, this is the "cheap trick" that'll instantly tell you. (If you already know your dominant eye, read on anyway...there's more.)

5-Next, to determine the *degree* of dominance of that eye, try to judge approximately *how many boards* off center that arrow appears to be. Some report as little as a board or two, while to others it looks to be as many as five boards away from center. This variance is one possible reason why some bowlers consistently miss shots on the same side. There are, as you know, numbers of other possible reasons for missing the mark. But if you consistently *see* your ball hitting your mark, while your coach or other onlookers disagree, that difference in "spotting" can nearly always be attributed to dominant eye causes. The person watching the bowler can virtually always correctly see which board has been hit. Tests have

One of these bowlers, for example, is a former PWBA champion who has won several pro tournaments. Her sight to the arrow targets has always been off by about 4 boards, forcing her to look 3 to 4 boards right of her intended target board to be able to hit it. Yet her sight line to her break point tested "dead on".

#### **THE BOTTOM LINE**

Incidentally, CATS machine analysis shows that over half the bowlers tested can neither hit a mark at the arrows consistently, nor accurately identify which board they have hit after the shot. If such bowlers can be more accurate to a selected break point, that obviously provides an additional reason for break point techniques to become an important goal for all serious bowlers.

When I started reaching Sam Baca's break point techniques nearly 30 years ago, nobody wanted to hear it. Today, virtually *every professional shoots for the break point!* Baca has made the concept user friendly, not only to you league and tournament bowlers, but to us the teachers and coaches as well. Certainly, if inaccuracies caused by eye dominance can be overcome by break point targeting, averages must go up. I wonder...is that *really* a cheap trick?






