SAINT MAXIMIN France - Mike Fagan of Dallas continued his career-year Sunday, winning his second Professional Bowlers Association Tour title of the 2011-12 season when he cruised past Finland's Joonas Jehkinen, 279213 , to win the Brunswick Euro Challenge at Plaza Bowl in suburban Paris.

The 31-year-old 10-year PBA Tour veteran started the title match with nine strikes before losing his bid for a perfect game when he left a 10 pin on his first shot in the 10th frame.

The title was the second of seven PBA Tour titles that will be awarded at international events under a new alliance with the World Tenpin Bowling Association. The Brunswick Euro Challenge included a field of 399 competitors -318 men and 81 women from 35 countries.
Fagan, who won the AlkaSeltzer Plus Liquid Gels United States Bowling Congress ed States Bowling Congress Masters in January and finished second in the U.S. Open in February, earned 15,000 Euros (US\$19,998) along with his fourth career PBA Tour title. Fagan also earned a European Bowling Tour title. He previously had qualified

for the PBA Tournament of 2011-12 season. There are four Champions Round of 36 based titles yet to be decided in the on his USBC Masters victory. 2011-12 PBA Player of the Fagan advanced to the title Year race, including the endmatch by eliminating Finnish of-season PBA Tournament of native Mika Koivuniemi of Champions.

CHICAGO-Ping pong anyone? This was a common question asked in my Chicago, Illinois home during the long winter months in the 1940's. As soon as the first snow fell dad would set up the ping pong table in the basement. Playing this game was our entertainment. It provided fun up the ping pong table in the basement. Playing this game was our enity an an opportunity to practice my skills. As a grade school tournament team player with our local Chicago -land playground we met strong competition from other grade schools. Our highly coveted awards included the colored medals of gold, silver, and bronze fashioned after the Olympian way of recognition. In following the Olympian way it was exciting to witness Olympic ping pong matches on T.V. in the late 1980's. By then my game skills were focused on bowling, my first love, after family. With the knowledge of skill levels required for winning at ping pong and the chance meeting of a master skilled player from China brings on "The Love Match" soon to be arranged..

It was mid afternoon, Labor Day in 2011as freeway travel took me to a local meeting place where a group of foreign students were waiting for their host families. This might be my supreme they be similar to the characters in one of my favorite movies The Lost City in Shangra-la?

My arrival as the first hosting person brought applause from the group of 35 elementary and high school teachers. All my concerns were put to rest when my two gents came forward to greet me. They were clean shaven, dressed in western attire - blue jeans, plaid shirt, and tennis shoes. A gentle bow, and a handshake followed by a good old American welcome hug brought on more applause, cheers, and lots of picture taking. My gents were the highly respected elders of this group here in the U.S.A. for the first time to attended a six week teachers seminar at a local university.

With my hosting duties in motion we were on the freeway homeward bound. When the front door of my home opened the aroma of a beef pot roast greeted us. My gents were very grateful to learn that I cook. They were tired, hungry, and thoroughly enjoyed their first American home cooked meal complete with oven roasted beef, potatoes, fresh veggies, hot rolls, salad, and chocolate cake. They spoke good English and chose the American names of Arnold and Harry which took care of my zero skills with speaking Chinese. They are family men, each married with one teenage child which made the settling into my home routine a comfortable adjustment. Arnold is a senior high school Chinese and English teacher.

He loves to cook and takes charge of his kitchen at home. His wife is a working mother and enjoys her freedom from kitchen duty. After sampling Arnold's cooking he had the freedom of my kitchen in preparing dinner several times a week. The gents enjoyed the new flavors in my American cooking but appreciated the chance to take care of their craving for Chinese home cooking. Harry teaches Chinese and English to the Middle School age group. He also loves to cook so took charge of all the KP duties including washing dishes.

Arnold and Harry were anxious to experience the American way. They had their lists of things to do but sports were not included. At home their teaching schedules also include boarding school duties so they have little time for personal sports activity. However, Harry remarked that the teachers and students play a game called Ping Pang every chance they get. A description of this game made me realize we know it as ping pong! The tables are always set up ready to use with a sign up list to challenge Arnold to a game. The students regard him as a master of the game since he is un defeated. Arnold confessed he loves this game! A phone call to the local Senior Center confirmed they have ping pong. We will get to play!

Arnold explained that ping pang players need to be smart and have good nerves. Also that heightand strength are not necessary. Many world class champions are under 5 ft . in height. Game equipment, special shoes, and wearing apparel are available in different colors, shapes, sizes, material, weights, and coatings. There are ping pang camps for the serious players. Joining the conversation with Arnold and his passion for ping pang brought attention to my confession for the love of my game - bowling! Harry and Arnold have never bowled. There are no bowling centers in their city. They had seen information about the game in Beijing, China but considered it too expensive to play. With the assurance of affordable prices here, they agreed to bowl a game with me.

It was decided. We will go bowling and then play ping pong. We will be sharing the experience of the games we love. Harry suggested we call it "The Love Match

It began with a visit to the bowling center pro shop where owner Dale took the time and patience to do a show and tell for Arnold and Harry. The shoe rental was a bit difficult to explain. Why leave only one shoe with the control desk? Then find a ball to fit the fingers securely. The pink balls were the best choice. Our lane was ready to use. Two other lanes were in use nearby so my gents watched the bowlers for a short time. After giving them a few basic pointers they were ready, Harry was a natural - scored 150 his first game. Arnold had trouble keeping the ball on the lane Determined to better his score with a second game he switched bowling balls to a green color. He pointed out another bowler who was scoring well with a green ball. He did score slightly over 100 his second game. Both gents enjoyed bowling and understand my love for the game. It has been written"When you bowl, you release your inner feelings."

The Senior Center was a short drive from home. Four ping pong tables with equipment were set up and ready. The regular players were expecting my gents and extended a very warm welcome Arnold gave a brief history of his ping pang with a demonstration of different strokes a player may use. Everyone was anxious to play him so we rotated him around to different tables after each game My previous playing skills were not worth mentioning. Like a novice bowler I had trouble keeping the ball on the table. He is truly a master of the game he loves. The six week stay of my new friends Arnold and Harry from Inner Mongolia, China passed by too quickly. They enjoyed their American experiences taking home many happy stories and countless pictures to share with their families and friends. The heart felt hugs and echoing words of "thanks" and "we will never forget your kindness" help to fill the large void.

BEEP! BEEP! BEEP! It's 6 a.m., and it's the end of a short, restless night and the start of an important, long day. You need a shower to feel awake after four hours of sleep. You fumble through your bags of clothes in the faint light for your team uniform and nice slacks, and then drag yourself to the hotel lobby, where you will meet up with the rest of your team. The walk to the rental cars is short but cold. There's not much time before competition begins, but a McDonald's is on the way to the bowling alley, so the team stops there briefly to scarf down breakfast.

Suddenly, you are in the company of 20 of the best collegiate bowling teams in the United States. This is it. Each one of these teams has put in many hours, both on and off the lanes, to earn a spot at The Intercollegiate Sectional Tournament, held March 10-11, 2012 at AMF Showplace Lanes in Euless, TX. Bowlers not only had to practice upwards of 10 hours every week, both as a team and individually, but they had to fund raise money to pay for all of the tournaments and travel, and set aside time to grow as a team and forge a close, brotherly bond. But now it is do or die. If they don't win, their season's over.

With high hopes and steady concentration, bowlers navigate through a maze of bowling balls, spectators, and tables littered with energy drinks and pastries, to their starting lane. Before practice ven starts, each team has developed a game plan to follow; hopeful it will give them an area advantage on the lanes as the day progresses.

After the final, poetic words of the "Star Spangled Banner" ring through the building, the applause signals the start of the competition. These 20 teams of six to eight talented athletes are about to be put through a grueling test of endurance, patience and wit. Over two days, the players bowl 64 games on oil conditions that demand strategy and near perfect execution, each and every shot. Those teams that have the sharpest physical games and communicate the best will rise to the top.

## Once the first shot of competition is underway, the test begins.

The distractions slowly creep in. Maybe you were left out of the starting lineup and are bitter you aren't bowling, as you feel you have a better look than somebody else. Your body language and side remarks beckon negative thoughts to cloud over the entire team, pulling the unit into a funk. Maybe an opponent gets a lucky strike, and now you are angry at their good fortune and distracted from focusing on what you need to do to throw a good shot. Maybe you throw a bad shot. Now, you eel the tension in the air, emanating from your team's disappointment. You know if your next shot is not a good one, you likely will be taken out and put on the bench. Amidst all of this stress, the oil starts to change. Distracted bowlers and teams don't adjust as quickly, and soon find themselves slipping farther down the all-important leader board.

After one or two bad games, teams huddle together and start to right the ship. Members calm down, make quality shots, and string some strikes together. Briefly, the situation looks brighter. But then, you throw a good shot and leave a split, and suddenly it feels like the air is leaking out of you and it's difficult to stay afloat. A team that was the loudest in the bowling center just a few minutes ago is now downcast and silent. But things can reverse themselves in a heartbeat

That was San José State's struggle early Sunday morning. The team got off to a lackluster start at a time when they were in desperate need of making up ground. By the fourth game, the team

fifth frame when their anchor, and most consistent, bowler, Darren Tang, threw a great shot only to be left with the dreaded $7-10$ split. A team that had all of the momentum the frame before was suddenly stalled. But then something amazing happened. Tang threw his ball at the 10 pin. The 10 pin bounced out of the back of the lane, rolled across the lane and knocked out the 7 pin! It felt like a shot of pure adrenaline, pumping the entire team up. San José was the happiest team in the center, and they went on to throw three more strikes in a row after that miraculous conversion, on their way to a 224 game.
"I felt despair when I left it," Tang said. "I was already thinking about a ball change, but that leave confirmed it. I just thought it was another spare, but it boosted the team's morale. It really got momentum going.

Another team that found a quick spark was the Campbellsville Tigers, who had put together the first 11 strikes in a game near the midway point on Saturday afternoon. Their anchor bowler delivered a good looking final shot, only to leave a nine pin for a 299 game. The Tigers were in strong contention for the first part of the tournament, but could not sustain that level of play throughout the weekend, and finished in the middle of the field.

Trust is essential to succeed in tournaments. Do you trust your teammates will try their best to win? Do you trust your teammates when they tell you their observations and give their opinions? Do you trust in your own ability to execute the shot you want to make? If you aren't fully trusting, in all respects, then your team will never be able to win this tournament. It takes an entire team scheming, working with and supporting each other, to stand on top.

By the end of the day, you are dead tired, both physically and mentally. Poor sleeping and eating take their toll. Your attention wanders easily, and it becomes a taxing endeavor to give your all on every shot, including spare attempts. The only thing on your mind is getting some rest and nourishment, but you must fight to remind yourself you want to be at the bowling alley, throwing strikes to be one of the four top qualifiers.

At the conclusion of the tournament, Wichita State led the event by nearly 1,000 pins over Midland College. When a team dominates an event as challenging as Sectionals, it is obvious it isn't due to luck. In fact, Wichita's men and women's teams have won the national championship a combined 19 times. But what exactly does the team attribute to their success?
"The main thing was communication and we stayed focused on good lane play," said Geoffrey Young, who is bowling in his ourth year on the Wichita team. "We practice four days a week and we practice staying really focused."

On the men's side, the top four finishers were Wichita, Midland Fresno, and Kansas. For the women, Wichita, Midland, Wes Texas A\&M, and Stephen F. Austin State nabbed the coveted top four positions. These eight teams will be competing in the team championships in Lincoln, NE, to be held on April 18-21, 2012 Finally, the tournament is over

The top eight teams rejoice together on the lanes and share in the festivities while everyone else says good bye to their friends, packs up, and heads out the doors to the airport, left to reflect on the highs and lows of the weekend and what could have been.

But you aren't leaving empty handed. Everyone who participated in the tournament gained a better understanding of the preparation and attitude necessary to go far in Sectionals. It is now your job to do whatever it takes to be ready for that 6:00 alarm call Saturday morning, one year from now.
