Duke & Malott Win PBA Doubles Championship

Duke ties Pete Weber with 36th career title, Malott ends three-year title drought

LAS VEGAS – Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Norm Duke won his 36th career PBA Tour title and former PBA Player of the Year Wes Malott ended a three-year title drought when they combined to defeat top qualifiers Ronnie Russell and Sean Rash, 193-167, to capture the Mark Roth-Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship at South Point Casino.

The victory by the American players, televised on ESPN Sunday, ended a streak of five consecutive PBA World Series of Bowling titles won by international players.

For Duke, his second title of the 2011-12 season also tied him for third place on the all-time PBA Tour titles list with close friend and long-time rival Pete Weber who won a record fifth U.S. Open title in February for his 36th. Both are now one title ahead of Roth, the PBA legend who witnessed the finals along with Holman. Walter Ray Williams Jr. and the late Earl Anthony

are one-two on the PBA Tour titles list with 47 and 43 wins, respectively.

Duke and Malott got help in the title match when Russell and Rash opened in three of the first four frames, handing the challengers a 45-pin lead after five frames. Duke and Malott only committed one error – Malott's open in the eighth frame – on their way to victory.

"Talk about a dream day to have Marshall and Mark standing on the approach with you," Duke said after the trophy presentation. "Those two were my absolute idols. I was able to pass them in titles won, but that doesn't mean I'm better than they were. Mark Roth changed the world of bowling, much like (two-handed players) Jason (Belmonte) and Osku (Palermaa) may in the future. I'm a lucky man today, and I don't take it lightly."

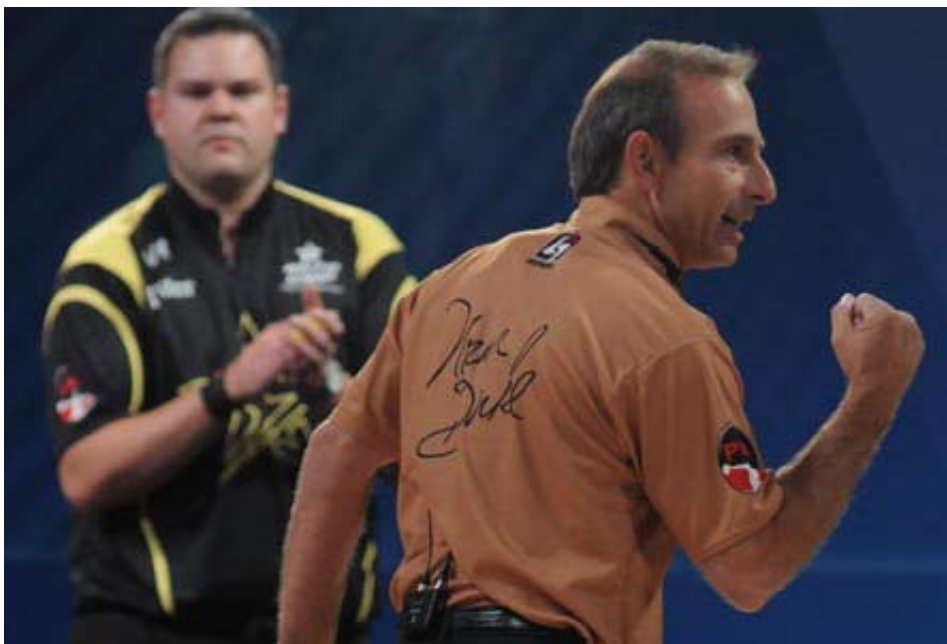
"I've had my ups and downs," Malott said after winning his seventh career title and first since the 2009 Etonic

Marathon Open capped his 2008-09 PBA Player of the Year performance. "I've been able to get to TV, but I haven't been able to win, so hopefully this is a new beginning. I've regrouped. I've re-set my goals. To put it all together against the level of talent that's out here is pretty substantial for me. It means a lot to me."

Duke shrugged off speculating on whether Weber or he would be the first to reach 37 titles.

"I'm sure as soon as I win another one, Pete will win again, too," said Duke, who bowled his first PBA Tour event in 1982 – three years after Weber got started. "That's something we both know. He's a great champion. I guess every tournament I've ever

Mike Fagan Nearly Perfect in Brunswick Euro Challenge

SAINT MAXIMIN France – Mike Fagan of Dallas continued his career-year Sunday, winning his second Professional Bowlers Association Tour title of the 2011-12 season when he cruised past Finland's Joonas Jekinen, 279-213, to win the Brunswick Euro Challenge at Plaza Bowl in suburban Paris.

The 31-year-old 10-year PBA Tour veteran started the title match with nine strikes before losing his bid for a perfect game when he left a 10 pin on his first shot in the 10th frame.

The title was the second of seven PBA Tour titles that will be awarded at international events under a new alliance with the World Tenpin Bowling Association. The Brunswick Euro Challenge included a field of 399 competitors – 318 men and 81 women – from 35 countries.

Fagan, who won the Alka-Seltzer Plus Liquid Gels United States Bowling Congress Masters in January and finished second in the U.S. Open in February, earned 15,000 Euros (US\$19,998) along with his fourth career PBA Tour title. Fagan also earned a European Bowling Tour title. He previously had qualified



for the PBA Tournament of Champions Round of 36 based on his USBC Masters victory.

Fagan advanced to the title match by eliminating Finnish native Mika Koivuniemi of Hartland, Mich., 222-199, in the semifinal match.

With his victory, Fagan joins Australia's Jason Belmonte, Finland's Osku Palermaa and Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla., as the fourth PBA Tour two-time winners for the

2011-12 season. There are four titles yet to be decided in the 2011-12 PBA Player of the Year race, including the end-of-season PBA Tournament of Champions.

PBA Tour competition resumes in the United States Saturday and Sunday with the Xtra Frame Tour Dick Weber PBA Playoffs presented by Hammer at Woodland Bowl in Indianapolis. All qualifying

“The Love Match”

CHICAGO—Ping pong anyone? This was a common question asked in my Chicago, Illinois home during the long winter months in the 1940’s. As soon as the first snow fell dad would set up the ping pong table in the basement. Playing this game was our entertainment. It provided fun loving competition among family and friends as well as an opportunity to practice my skills. As a grade school tournament team player with our local Chicago -land playground we met strong competition from other grade schools. Our highly coveted awards included the colored medals of gold, silver, and bronze fashioned after the Olympian way of recognition. In following the Olympian way it was exciting to witness Olympic ping pong matches on T.V. in the late 1980’s. By then my game skills were focused on bowling, my first love, after family. With the knowledge of skill levels required for winning at ping pong and the chance meeting of a master skilled player from China brings on “The Love Match” soon to be arranged... .

It was mid afternoon, Labor Day in 2011as freeway travel took me to a local meeting place where a group of foreign students were waiting for their host families. This might be my supreme challenge of the year – hosting two 45 year old male teachers from Inner Mongolia, China. Would they be similar to the characters in one of my favorite movies The Lost City in Shangra-la?

My arrival as the first hosting person brought applause from the group of 35 elementary and high school teachers. All my concerns were put to rest when my two gents came forward to greet me. They were clean shaven, dressed in western attire – blue jeans, plaid shirt, and tennis shoes. A gentle bow, and a handshake followed by a good old American welcome hug brought on more applause, cheers, and lots of picture taking. My gents were the highly respected elders of this group here in the U.S.A. for the first time to attended a six week teachers seminar at a local university.

With my hosting duties in motion we were on the freeway homeward bound. When the front door of my home opened the aroma of a beef pot roast greeted us. My gents were very grateful to learn that I cook. They were tired, hungry, and thoroughly enjoyed their first American home cooked meal complete with oven roasted beef, potatoes, fresh veggies, hot rolls, salad, and chocolate cake. They spoke good English and chose the American names of Arnold and Harry which took care of my zero skills with speaking Chinese. They are family men, each married with one teenage child which made the settling into my home routine a comfortable adjustment. Arnold is a senior high school Chinese and English teacher.

He loves to cook and takes charge of his kitchen at home. His wife is a working mother and enjoys her freedom from kitchen duty. After sampling Arnold’s cooking he had the freedom of my kitchen in preparing dinner several times a week. The gents enjoyed the new flavors in my American cooking but appreciated the chance to take care of their craving for Chinese home cooking. Harry teaches Chinese and English to the Middle School age group. He also loves to cook so took charge of all the KP duties including washing dishes.

Arnold and Harry were anxious to experience the American way. They had their lists of things to do but sports were not included. At home their teaching schedules also include boarding school duties so they have little time for personal sports activity. However, Harry remarked that the teachers and students play a game called Ping Pang every chance they get. A description of this game made me realize we know it as ping pong! The tables are always set up ready to use with a sign up list to challenge Arnold to a game. The students regard him as a master of the game since he is undefeated. Arnold confessed he loves this game! A phone call to the local Senior Center confirmed they have ping pong. We will get to play!

Arnold explained that ping pang players need to be smart and have good nerves. Also that heightand strength are not necessary. Many world class champions are under 5 ft. in height. Game equipment, special shoes, and wearing apparel are available in different colors, shapes, sizes, material, weights, and coatings. There are ping pang camps for the serious players. Joining the conversation with Arnold and his passion for ping pang brought attention to my confession for the love of my game - bowling! Harry and Arnold have never bowled. There are no bowling centers in their city. They had seen information about the game in Beijing, China but considered it too expensive to play. With the assurance of affordable prices here, they agreed to bowl a game with me.

It was decided. We will go bowling and then play ping pong. We will be sharing the experience of the games we love. Harry suggested we call it “The Love Match “.

It began with a visit to the bowling center pro shop where owner Dale took the time and patience to do a show and tell for Arnold and Harry. The shoe rental was a bit difficult to explain. Why leave only one shoe with the control desk? Then find a ball to fit the fingers securely. The pink balls were the best choice. Our lane was ready to use. Two other lanes were in use nearby so my gents watched the bowlers for a short time. After giving them a few basic pointers they were ready. Harry was a natural – scored 150 his first game. Arnold had trouble keeping the ball on the lane. Determined to better his score with a second game he switched bowling balls to a green color. He pointed out another bowler who was scoring well with a green ball. He did score slightly over 100 his second game. Both gents enjoyed bowling and understand my love for the game. It has been written“When you bowl, you release your inner feelings.”

The Senior Center was a short drive from home. Four ping pong tables with equipment were set up and ready. The regular players were expecting my gents and extended a very warm welcome. Arnold gave a brief history of his ping pang with a demonstration of different strokes a player may use. Everyone was anxious to play him so we rotated him around to different tables after each game. My previous playing skills were not worth mentioning. Like a novice bowler I had trouble keeping the ball on the table. He is truly a master of the game he loves. The six week stay of my new friends Arnold and Harry from Inner Mongolia, China passed by too quickly. They enjoyed their American experiences taking home many happy stories and countless pictures to share with their families and friends. The heart felt hugs and echoing words of “thanks” and “we will never forget your kindness” help to fill the large void.

NAVARRO 818 & TEAM COVINA 655 LEADS DEAF TRAVEL AT AMF CERRITOS

CERRITOS—In So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League’s stop at AMF Cerritos Lanes Francisco Navarro and his powerful Covina team continues to dominate the league for another session. Navarro again for 2nd time in row led the bowlers honor roll with the lone 800 of the day with 818 from 207-237-182-192. Previously in the last session at Canoga Park Bowl he led with a 900.

With Covina 40 points ahead of Valley, only 5 points separates 2nd and 4th places, so it is a battle for 2nd place over the remaining 3 sessions..

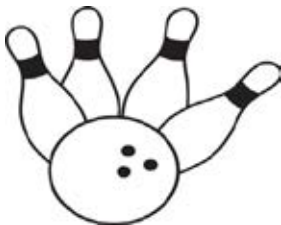

LAKEWOOD—We returned to Cal Bowl where we saw 186 entries come out on Saturday and bowl on a semi-tough shot. The cut scores were + 53 for the men and + 40 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Fidel Usi (+49), Rogelio Esquivel (+49), and for the women it was Sierrie Herradura (+4). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 43 bowlers making it to the semi-finals. By the way, Side Pots went for a Huge \$268 per game at 8:00PM for only a \$7.00 entry fee. Places paid \$115 2nd \$85 and 3rd place \$68.

Our top qualifier for the Men was Royce Angeles with a +149. For the women it was Jessica Alcayde with a +126. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed over-all draws the Match Series. This time it was worth \$1,354. Royce drew a 652. We had no bowlers that bowled this score. We will estimate the Match Series at \$1,800 at the Deer Creek event. The last bowler for the 3-6-9 roll off was “Iron Mike” Benavides. When he came up to shoot for the \$900 he missed on his second shot, so he will get \$50 as a consolation. The pot will be \$1,000 at Deer Creek.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Shaun Suase / Allan Calabio with a 1413 for \$100. Finishing second was Jhickie DeLuna and

Marife Catalasan with 1385 for \$80. There was a total of \$850 paid out in doubles and 18 paid spots with low to cash of 1318.

After bowling all 3 games for the semi-finals, finishing in first was Andy Huynh with a +113. Finishing in 2nd during the semi-finals was Freddy Zamora at a +111 to sit out the first round. Our top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$2,000. Andy Huynh drew a 140. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had two bowlers who shot that score, they were Freddie Catamisan and John Armenia. They will each get \$1000. We will estimate the pot at \$1,400 for Deer Creek.

This would bring us to our exciting top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Julie Nguyen, Marife Catalasan, Art Windsor, Charles Weeks, Aishasade Abdur-Raheem, Shaun Suase, and Teresa Maloles. They received checks of \$100 each. In the second round, losing out were Ben Hurtado, Sun Sundara, William Garrett, and Freddy Zamora. They received checks of \$107.50 each. This would get us down to the final four bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$47 (Jhickie De Luna) to a high of \$103 (Ricardo Baca) depending on who would win. In this round we saw Joey Nepomuceno (3rd seed) bowling Kmel Cunanan (15th seed). We would see an exciting

match where it was Kmel who would prevail in this match with a 249 to 219 match to advance. In the other match we saw Ricardo Baca (6th seed) bowling Jhickie De Luna (7th seed). This would be a match where it went to the last two frames and it was Jhickie who would prevail with a 212 to 205 finish. Both Ricardo and Joey finished in 4th and 5th getting checks for \$115 each, and they bowed very well.

Our semi-final match was all set now, and would pit the 7th and 15th seeds from the semis against each other. In the weekly “horses” we would see Kmel paying \$51 and Jhickie paying \$47 if they would win their match. In this match we saw another good match that went down to the 10th frame. It was Jhickie who would open in the 1st frame, and then a quick double by Kmel brought the match close. It would stay this way all the way to the end, with only 10 pins separating the two bowlers going into the 10th frame. In the 10th frame, it was Jhickie who would finish first and when he came up in the 10th frame he left a solid 10 pin. He missed left that set it all up for Kmel who needed to double to win the match. He got his first strike and came up to get #2 and #3 to finish with a 205/231 to 168/219 to advance to the title match. Finishing in 3rd place was Jhickie DeLuna this week for \$200. entered, he’s been in. We’re great friends. We’ve been on this (PBA) journey together and we’ll stay on it until we both croak. It’ll be a fight to the finish.”

The Roth-Holman PBA Doubles Championship involved eight teams put together from the field of 16 players who led the PBA Elite Players Championship qualifying. A special draft was conducted with the qualifying leaders, in order, selecting partners from among the group of 16. Russell was the qualifying leader and picked Rash, who had advanced to a record five consecutive World Series of Bowling ESPN finals. Malott was next and picked Duke.

“To have the option to pick Norm was a no-brainer,” Malott said. “There was obviously a lot of talent available but (Norm) was my smartest decision. The thing is, no matter what the ball reaction was, Norm was going to give you his all and nothing was going to bother him. He has that unique ability, no matter what, to calm himself down, re-group and make quality shots, and that’s exactly what he did, proving once again why he’s one of the greatest.”

The doubles finals got underway with three non-televised matches. Newly-elected PBA Hall of Famer Jason Couch and partner Mike DeVaney cruised to a 268-205 victory over Dick Allen and Mike Scroggins in the first match. Australian two-handed star Jason Belmonte and five-time U.S. Open champion Pete Weber then eliminated Couch and DeVaney, 242-224, and Canadian Dan MacLelland and Ryan Ciminelli, 245-219, to claim the fifth spot in the ESPN stepladder finals.

Belmonte and Weber met their match in the first ESPN contest, losing a sudden-death roll-off against Bill O’Neill and Mike Fagan after the teams tied at 185-185. O’Neil threw a strike in the one-ball roll-off and Belmonte left the 3-10 to end his team’s title bid. O’Neill and Fagan then made sure an American team would end the international domination in the World Series, eliminating Colombia’s Andres Gomez and Sweden’s Martin Larsen, 194-173. In the semifinal match, Duke and Malott were almost perfect in a 260-245 victory over O’Neill and Fagan.

PBA World Series of Bowling competition continues on ESPN on Sunday, April 1, at 1 p.m. ET with the Carmen Salvino Classic finals. Finalists are Gomez, Malott, Russell and Belmonte.


