

Fourth Time's the Charm for Belmonte & O'Neill in Roth-Holman PBA Doubles Championship Champions defeat San Francisco's Tang brothers to end streak of three straight fourth-place finishes

COLUMBUS, Ohio -After fourth-place finishes as partners in three previous Mark Roth-Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championships, Australia's Jason Belmonte and his "best mate," Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa., finally won in their fourth try.

With the tournament's namesake PBA Hall of Fame partners in the crowd for the finals of the event that was presented by BowlerX.com, Belmonte and O'Neill defeated brothers Darren and Michael Tang of San Francisco,

205-185, at Wayne Webb's Columbus Bowl. The finals of the fourth event of the 2018 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season aired Sunday on ESPN.

After a dominating performance in the preliminary qualifying rounds where they averaged a combined 238.31 for 76 games, earning the top berth in the finals by 327 pins, Belmonte and O'Neill finished in convincing style. The win was the 17th of Belmonte's career and the ninth for O'Neill.

Professional Bowling Returns to Broadcast TV in 2019 with 29 Shows Across FOX and FS1

LOS ANGELES and CHICAGO - The Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) and FOX Sports announced a multi-year, multi-platform agreement making FOX Sports the new television partner for the Go Bowling! PBA Tour starting in 2019.

The package will bring a substantial schedule of live PBA events to television, including prime time events and a new bracketstyle, multi-week PBA Playoffs tournament that concludes with a unique PBA championship finale. The announcement was made by PBA CEO and Commissioner Tom Clark and William Wanger, FOX Sports EVP of Programming, Live Operations and Research.

"The PBA has been searching for the best possible broadcast partner to serve our fans, players and the bowling industry, and we have determined that partner is FOX Sports," Clark said. "We are particularly excited that the PBA Tour returns to broadcast television, where it started 56 years ago, with shows on FOX next year."

In 2019, FOX Sports will televise four PBA Tour shows on FOX and 25 on FS1 in a series of two-hour telecasts. All programs will also be streamed on FOX Sports GO. Details pertaining to the FOX Sports-PBA package regarding PBA Tour locations, dates and times, and the television announcing team will be released at a later date.

"FOX Sports is thrilled to add the highly rated PBA Tour to our extensive lineup, joining other sport partners including the NFL, the FIFA World Cup, MLB, NASCAR, MLS, UFC, NHRA, Supercross, USGA, college football and basketball, and others," said Wanger. "We believe that adding a FOX Sports look and feel to bowling will help bring the sport to a whole new level."

The PBA was represented in the transaction by Ed Desser of Desser Sports Media (www.desser.tv).



PBA'S "60 MOST MEMORABLE MOMENTS" Unveiling continues: 46 Thru 50

The countdown to unveil the complete list of the PBA''s "60 most memorable moments" in its 60-year historycontinues, one a day, Monday through Friday, on all PBA Network outlets. Last week, "memorable moments" 46 through 50 were unveiled. Here are those five moments as the countdown continues:

- 46) In 1999, the PBA contested its first outdoor event, The New York City PBA Experience, on a two-lane installation in Manhattan's Bryant Park. Eric Forkel won. In another first, Milwaukee's Miller Park became the first major league stadium to host a PBA title event when Danny Wiseman won the 2004 USBC Masters. Madison Square Garden hosted several PBA events including three U.S. Opens and Joe Louis Arena in Detroit hosted the largest crowd in PBA History when 7,212 fans watched Dave Husted win the 1995 U.S. Open title.
- 47) After qualifying for the finals during the inaug1ural World Series of Bowling at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich., Tom Smallwood won the 2009 PBA World Championship in Wichita, Kan., defeating Wes Malott, 244-228. Smallwood's rags-to-riches story after being laid off from his job in the auto industry became a national news story during the nation's economic downturn.
- **48)** The PBA Regional Tour was launched in 1969 with its inaugural event the Regional Players Championship at Kingpin Lanes in Cincinnati. **Tom Hennessey** topped a field of 12 regional players representing the PBA's new six-region program. Since then, the PBA Regional program has awarded nearly 6,400 titles to more than 1,840 different bowlers.
- **49)** PBA Hall of Famer **Nelson "Bo" Burton Jr.** set a four-game TV record during the finals the 1984 Angle Open at Dick Weber Lanes in Florissant, Mo., rolling games of 278, 279, 257 & 236 for a 1,050 total to pick up his 17th title.
- **50)** In 1989, Venezuela's **Amleto Monacelli** became the first foreign-born player to win the PBA Player of the Year award after winning four titles. He won POY again in 1990 and became the first foreign player inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 1997.

paying him respect for making a strong run at a perfect game. It also alerted him to the fact that he was building something special.

His first nine shots had all popped smartly into the pocket. But his next one found a vastly difference direction

"Jitters were part of it. The release was part of it. I didn't have my arm straight," Mike says.

The ball hugged the gutter from the outset – just like several of Mike's previous shots. But this time there was a problem. The shot wasn't hooking like the others.

"I was hoping it would hit a dry spot and snap back but it didn't snap back," he said.

Instead, the ball plopped into the gutter, a disappointing end to his bid for the magical 300.

But not all was lost. This was Mike's second game and he had carved out a powerful 222 in his first one. And he still was in the midst of a strong effort.

He was now facing a stiff test. Would he go to pieces and lament that bad shot or right the ship and move on?

"What else can you do but shake it off?" Mike says. "When it's done, it's done. I just wanted to pick up the spare and not gutter it."

Undaunted, Mike reset his mind and fired a shot like his first nine. He collapsed all 10 pins, giving him a bounceback spare in the 10th frame. He then got nine pins on his final shot to finish with a very formidable 269.

"This year, I vowed to keep my emotions in check," says Mike, a San Fernando Valley resident. "And that's allowed me to have a 203 average.

The 203 represents the highest of his 20-year-plus career for the extended winter season.


Mike went on to nail a 213 in his final game, allowing his team, which included Debbie Prince, John Kiladjian and Debra Hallett, to win all four points in the three-game series.

Mike, who won a no-tap doubles tournament title with Mario McKenzie two years ago, finished with a nifty 704 series, just four pins off his career best.

Mike held on to it that night and he still talks animatedly about reaching his primary goal: a perfect game.


A reporter told him that once he nailed that 300, he'll

- Two stars added to So. Calif. Hall of Fame: DUKE MCGREW and DICK STOEF-FLER.
- BELAIR LANES surprised everyone with their ad on March 6th. Men bowl free Monday 9-12pm. Women bowl free Tuesday 9-12pm. BEL AIR wasn't an easy bowl to get to! And it wasn't much once you did get there.
- Thirteen year old RICHIE PARRISH bowled 300 at SAN HI LANES using an old re-drilled Columbia ball. Mom LINDA PARRISH was a Pro shop operator and averaged 204! Good advertising, right?
- DOTTIE KERINS named to CWBA Hall of Fame. (Probably only women bowlers know her name.)
- League sheets were a product of RED MAC KENZIE and others. It was another new bowling business off-spring. He went bowl to bowl, collected re-caps, processed scores, printed sheets and delivered finished product back to the bowls. PAT HARRIS was the San Diego "scorekeeper".
- 23 year old ROBIN ROMEO won her first title beating GIANULIAS 206-201. \$3,000 and a four foot trophy was top prize.
- The Jim Beam Liquor Company produced a bowling pin shaped bottle and filled it with 86.6 proof bourbon. All proceeds from sales went to the National Hall of Fame and museum building fund.
- 6532 teams bowled the W.I.B.C tournament in Baltimore.
- The Brazil Sports Federation finally recognized bowling as a sport. Problem! To import equipment there was a 224 percent duty.
- BURT BACH rolled a 288 using his latest innovation- the custom-bored thumb hole which fit every contour of the thumb. He ran Bach's Bowling Supply in Bellflower from 1959 until his passing. Bowlers used to wait in line to have the inserts installed.
- Only 3 centers advertised any sort of St. Patrick's Day action. •
- BUTCH SOPER was tending bar at FOREST LANES.
- LARRY GRAY beat KYLE SHEDD for the Southeast District Masters title.
- MERRILL ALEXANDER, Dallas, rolled a 268 triplicate! Her doubles partner in the day time ladies league rolled a 675. They set new W.I.B.C. records.
- KEITH KENWORTHY (Rollin Donkee Bag inventor) won the NBA Tour in Vegas.
- 120 women bowled the WWPB Ebonite Classic at DEL RIO LANES. TONY BRANDER was manager at the time.

- The \$2.25 charge for a Learn to Bowl class at **TROPICANA** included: Lesson, BARRY ASHER opened his Pro Shop inside **CENTURY BOWL** and he's still at it in 2018. Go BARRY!
 - **GRAND CENTRAL BOWL** had a 390 Scratch Doubles League. Both members of the championship team drove away in a new car.
 - PHYLLIS KNOLL was elected President of the Los Angeles W.B.A. NADINE OLSON was looonnnggg time secretary.
 - BOBBY KNIPPLE won his sixth P.C.B. Title at WELCOME LANES in Oceanside.
 - BIG question of the day (and still is) "Do high scores come from the bowler, • the ball, or the lanes?" High scores are always the envy of the bowlers who don't practice, don't know the game, can't read oil patterns or drink too much!
 - BILL TAYLOR wrote a book titled "Whatever Really Happened to Don Carter?" Anybody got a copy?
 - 600 Clubs were very popular. Each center had one and each association had • one. Any time a bowler rolled a 600 series they were given an invitation to join the club. Monthly and State tournaments were a must plus you felt privileged to join. Some areas also had a 700 club.
 - BUCK ROGERS was the manager at HIGHLAND BOWL in La Habra. Don't believe me? Check page 14, April 17, 1981 Bowling News.
 - Other interesting names in the news...DALE EVANS, MEMORY MORGAN, DICK JAMES, DENNIS LANE, BO BOWDEN, JESS DRANE, ERIC JOLLY, CHRIS CURLESS, KENNY MOE, WILLY WOLF, plus hundreds more. I like interesting names. How about you?
 - Just for fun- someone wrote to the news "To some people, a fishing rod is a pole with a worm on each end." Sender gave no name.
 - ABC approved legislation for local Associations to have either four or five man • team tournaments, lane condition rule not changed, 150 pins over average award to be awarded, 24 hour time limit on notifying local ABC when a 300 was rolled, and lanes must be inspected.
 - Congress was investigating the fact that military planes were used to fly 431 members of the Air National Guard to a bowling tournament in Nashville. The 12 planes made 18 round trips. Cost to the government? \$109,240.
 - The winners trophy for the Pennzoil Open at GABLE HOUSE was an actual small race car with a gas engine. The COGAN family was very much into Indy Car racing at the time. Son Kevin Cogan was on the racing circuit.

The championship came down to age-and-experience out-matching the youthful exuberance of third-year PBA member Darren Tang, 24, and his 22-year-old brother Michael, a PBA Tour rookie. O'Neill and Belmonte threw only four strikes in the title match – including one double – and converted six single-pin spares. It was enough to stave off the Tangs, who had won three consecutive matches to reach the title contest, but were unable to put together back-to-back strikes in the final match. And one missed 10 pin spare by Darren Tang in the eighth frame was a setback that proved costly.

"The lanes transitioned in a way I didn't see coming, but during the semifinal match you could see they weren't right," O'Neill said. "Marshall (Kent) isn't going to bowl a game like he did very often. We decided we'd be content to hit the pocket and if (the pins) fell, they fell. We were hoping we could get it done with a 2-oh game, and fortunately that's what we did."

"It wasn't playing defense; it was more that we were playing safe," Belmonte said of the team's conservative approach. "The adjustment either one of us could have made to be more aggressive was a risk, so if (the Tangs) couldn't show us they were going to put together a string of strikes, there was no reason to take that risk."

"We bowled amazing all week," Belmonte continued. "Winning was kind of getting the monkey off our back. We've been there three other times when we didn't perform amazingly and today we didn't have to perform amazingly, but we did exactly what we needed to do."

In the alternate-frame format, where each teammate bowled five frames on one lane, the Tang brothers came out of the gate on fire, putting together a string of six strikes early on their way to a 223-203 win over Texans Shawn Maldonado and DJ Archer in game one. Splits and open frames in the final two frames by the Tangs were the only flaws that kept the score close in the end.

In game two, Brandon Novak of Chillicothe, Ohio, and Kris Prather of Plainfield, Ill., looked like they were going to eliminate the brother team when they put together a string of five early strikes. But the Tangs started with three strikes, converted two single-pin spares and combined for three strikes to take the see-saw battle into the 10th frame where Michael Tang doubled and Prather, after a strike on his first ball, left a 10 pin on his second. The Tangs escaped with a 243-235 decision.

The semifinal contest against two of the PBA's top high-rev power players, Marshall Kent of Yakima, Wash., and EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind., was a struggle for both teams as they quickly degraded an oil pattern that had already undergone the wear-and-tear of two earlier matches. Kent was especially vulnerable, throwing three consecutive splits he was unable to convert. Michael Tang also failed to convert a split, but otherwise the brothers left single pins they were able to spare in posting a 172-151 win to advance to the title match.

PBA players now head to Syracuse, N.Y., where the 2018 Go Bowling! PBA Tour continues with the United States Bowling Congress Masters. As defending champion, Belmonte is automatically seeded into the 64-player three-game total pinfall double-elimination match play finals field and will try for an unprecedented fifth Masters title. If successful, he'll also tie for the PBA record for major championships won with 10, joining the late Earl Anthony and PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber in that elite group.

All qualifying and match play rounds of the USBC Masters in the Oncenter Convention Center in Syracuse, Tuesday, April 10 through Saturday, April 14, will be live streamed on PBA's online bowling channel, Xtra Frame. To sign up, visit <u>xtraframe.tv</u>. The stepladder finals will air live on ESPN on Sunday, April 15, at 10 a.m.

• Matt O'Grady of Rahway, N.J. defeated 2017 PBA Rookie of the Year Matt Sanders of Indianapolis, 244-216, to claim his third consecutive PBA Trumbull County Tourism Bureau Central/East Open title presented by Radical at Bell-Wick Bowl in Hubbard, Ohio, Sunday.

O'Grady, who won his first PBA Tour title in the PBA Tournament of Champions in Fairlawn, Ohio, in February, picked up his sixth PBA Regional title of his career and the \$2,600 first prize.

Frank Snodgrass of Center Line, Mich., defeated **John Furey** of Howell, N.J., 236-185, and Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y., 256-237, before losing to O'Grady in the semifinal match stepladder, 269-166.

• Anthony Lavery-Spahr of Pasadena, Texas, opened the seventh annual PBA Odessa Southwest Open, presented by Brunswick, with games of 279, 300 and 279 – an 858 series – to build a huge lead over twin brother Sean as he coasted to his fifth PBA Regional title and second in a row at Astro Bowl in Odessa, Texas, Sunday.

Anthony Lavery-Spahr held a 200-pin lead after qualifying and won five of his eight matches, tying another, to finish with 5,078 total pins, including bonus pins, to finish 240 pins ahead of his twin brother who also resides in Pasadena.

Sean Lavery-Spahr finished second after a 223-202 win over **Joe Findling** of Mesquite, Texas, in their position round match, edging **Adam Pogge** of Austin, Texas, who finished third.

Also of note, 71-year-old amateur **Phil Bailey** from San Angelo, Texas, not only bowled in the event, but finished sixth against a field comprised mostly of players young enough to be his grandchildren.

In the first stepladder match, Polizzi defeated four-time PBA Tour champion **Dick Allen** of Columbia, S.C., 243-184, and he then eliminated Curtis, 198-180, in the semifinal match.

• Tom Adcock of Decatur, Ill., defeated **Dean Mueller** of Vernon Hills, Ill., 192-177, to win the PBA50 Showtime Lanes Midwest/Central Open at Showtime Lanes in Virden, Ill., Sunday.

Adcock, an amateur, won his third PBA50 Regional in the last three years at Showtime Lanes and earned \$1,500, but doesn't receive credit for a PBA title because he isn't a member.

Adcock defeated **Steve Jaros** of Yorkville, Ill., 2-0, and Mueller edged **Jeff Johnson** of Freeport, Ill., 2-1, in the best-of-three-game semifinal round.
