Kevin Gannon and Ross Packard Win The WCST Ebonite All-Star Doubles By A Big Margin Over 48 Team Squad

SANTA MARIA-Kevin Gannon (Lakewood) and Ross Packard (San Jose) were the big winners in the WCST Ebonite All Star Doubles at Rancho Bowl in Santa Maria, CA this past week-end. The team had qualified 5^{th} on Saturday, and was 81 pins from the leaders Kerry Painter and David Haynes. After Game #1 of the finals, Kevin and Ross jumped into 1st place and never looked back.

They won all 10 of their team matches and the tournament by 366 pins over a very surprising team in the finals, Ray Torres and Mark Dyer. In Game #4 of the finals, Mark and Ray was bowling against the team of Joe Barket, and Dede Davidson, and Joe and Ray each had a 189 game. Dede and Mark both had the first 9 strikes. In the $10^{\rm th}$ frame, Dede got her $10^{\rm th}$ strike, only to leave a solid 7 pin for a 289 game

Mark was luckier as he struck out for a perfect 300 game. Dede Davidson, one of the finest lady bowlers in the nation shot 2324 for her 10 games, which was the 3rd highest totals of the finals, behind Mark Dyer and Ross Packard. The conditions for the two days was not the regular house shot, and many bowlers bowled below scores. On Saturday, the qualifying for both sides was close to even, but on Sunday, the trend favored the left side, as the three highest totals for the tournament finals were bowled by 3 left handers

The bowling center's house team made up of GM, Pat Smart, and Pro Shop Operator, Rick Meneley finished a strong 3rd, by beating out Joe Barket and Dede by only 4 pins. The Qualifying leaders, Kerry and David, finished in 7th place. A big surprise to see that finished in 10th was the team of Warren Nelson and Ricky Corona. They led the qualifying after the first 5 games with plus 341, but rolled in the 2nd block, minus 92, and didn't make the finals, but they cashed for 12th place. One other 300 game rolled in the qualifying by

This Was No Day For **Ordinary Gentlemen Dead-Eye Wins #41!**

INDIANAPOLIS-In a match-up of two of the greatest bowlers in the history of the game, Walter Ray Williams Jr. defeated Pete Weber 236-213 in the title match of the Denny's World Championship on Sunday

The victory gave Williams his 41st career title on the Denny's PBA Tour, which ties him with Hall of Famer Earl Anthony for the most in history.


"To win a title is great, to win a Major is even better and to win 41 is unbelievable," said Williams, who was inducted into the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer last year. "I'm just ecstatic. When I first came on Tour I never thought this would happen. It's been a great career but I'm not done yet. I have at least four more years to break the record."

Williams' victory comes three years after he won the World Championship that was featured in the documentary "A League of Ordinary Gentlemen," which was released on DVD this week. On that show, Williams defeated Weber in the semifinals.

On Sunday, Williams was far from ordinary. He dispatched Ryan Shafer 224-201 in the semifinals while fellow Hall of Famer Weber knocked off Brad Angelo 227-214 to set up the battle of the sport's two biggest stars.

In addition to \$100,000, a four-year exemption and a trophy he could barely lift, Williams also claimed his seventh major title. That total moves him into second on that list, tying him with Weber and leaving him just one behind Anthony.

"Records are meant to be tied,



"It's all big, but I guess probably the four-year exemption is the biggest," Williams said. "It gives me four more years of making a living hopefully."

And now that the talk of winning 41 is over, Williams said he's ready to move forward.

"The talk is finished about 41, and now it will be about 42," Williams said. "It might be another year before I win again or it might be next week."

National Deaf Bowling News Abakumoff 276/906 • 3 Other 860+As **Deaf Travel Erupts At Del Rio Lanes**

DOWNEY-At the Del Rio Bowl's lanes right after watching TV's live ESPN of PBA World Championship finals showing Walter Ray Williams Jr. beat Pete Weber for his record tying 41 wins I, the bowlers of So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League had a show of their own. For the first time this season all 6 trios teams went over the 2000 barrier for the league's record of 178 plus average per bowler. There were one 900, three 800s and four 760 plus series on the honor roll.

Adding to the excitement, Ed Abakumoff, after losing his first game 181 to Bob Jones'200, started striking while Jones tried to keep up close. Abakumoff's string of nine strikes stopped as he ended with a 276. Jones' string ended earlier with two spares for a 259. The third game went to Jones with his 212 beating Abakumoff's 204 but Abakumoff came back with a 245 and 906 series against Jones' 226 and 897 total.

Abakumoff's Riverside with aid of Robert Audette's (204)762 scored the day's high 2261 and 16 pts while Jones' S. F. Valley with absentees scores had 2057 and just 4 pts.

Ed's 276, Audette's 197 and Émad Åranki's 176, Riverside made the season high team game 649 replacing South Bay's 645 made two weeks ago. El Camino Village has a higher team game 661 in its season high team series of 2348 made last January. John Segafredo who came as a pacer for Valley, had a 201.

Overlooked at the wall end pair of lanes, another exciting duel between Darrell Stogryn and Andy Lorenzo which ended with one pin win by Lorenzo. With all the buzz about Ed's 276 against Jones's 259, Stogryn in the third game quietly tossed the day's high game 277. Stogryn had lost first two games 199 and 196 to Lorenzo's 221-214 before recovering with a barrage of strikes which Lorenzo could not cope with his 186. But Lorenzo recovered with his best game 246 and 867 total. Stogryn ended with a 194 and 866.

Lorenzo's 866 along with Gardy Rodgers' (209-202)774 gave their Los Angeles its highest score 2201 for a 13.5 to 6.5 win over Stogryn's El Camino Village. Village with Stogryn's 866 and Paul Taffolla's 702 had 2147.

In other match, league leader South Bay with Don Millwee's 236/773 and Pablo Yoma's 214-202/760 scored 2134 to win 12 to 8 over Hollywood. For Hollywood which scored 2054, Rick Pennington had a 200 in his 728 and Dan Flores 202/716. South Bay is running away with nearly 40 points over 2nd place S F Valley.

The league thanks Del Rio manager Mike Cammarata and his staff for hosting and making an excellent scoring condition for the bowlers which 12 out of 16 made the league's honor roll list. With a week off, the league travels to Brunswick West Covina Lanes on April 9.

Anderson's 870 series is the highest all-time handicap singles score in the twenty-two year history of the tournament. There have only been five other 800 series in singles play in the history of the tourney. The previous record was an 815 bowled by Aurelia Casem Jr., in the B Division, in 2002.

Bill Logan's B Division handicap all-events title was his seventh senior handicap title (four doubles and three all-events). It moves him into a third place tie on the list of all-time senior tourney

titlists. He trails Hall of Famer Corky DeMaio (ten senior titles, four handicap and six scratch) and Hall of Famer Curt Snyder (eight senior titles, seven handicap and one scratch).

Logan is now tied with seven time senior titlist Ron Sandusky (five handicap and two scratch). The top ten all-time Citrus Belt senior titlists list also includes: Dave Gulley (six senior titles), Neil Ankrim and Don Crandall (five senior titles), Chuck Dawson, Gene Kozloff and Jim Gregson (four senior titles). WEST COVINA-Lots of excitement was in store at West Covina Lanes last Saturday as we saw John Austin win his first ABTA Title in a stellar performance finally downing upstart Brian Reyes to take a nice top prize of \$1,200 to his home in Aliso Viejo.

John wasn't the only bowler performing well at West Covina as we saw Ernie Juarez take a nice \$3,000 3-6-9 pot. Irene Kang and Marc Lester Anthony split a \$2,380 Match Game at Premier as ABTA regular Jason topped another nice turnout of 238 bowlers at West Covina which produced high "this week" cut scores of +113 (men) and +57 Ladies. Added Super Seniors at Premiere were Rico Cavton, Simon Rojas, and Esther Tambio making a total of 54 semifinalists in the cash line at Premiere

John Austin blew up in the semis, as he was tops in the Semifinals with a fine +137 to be able to sit out and bowl for the title, besting Bret Rose at +123. He would receive a first round bye in the single elims and enter in round two. It took a +76 Men, to make the sweet 16 single elims and a +51 for the three

guaranteed women.

The Bowlers took to the lanes. In the first round single elims, losing their matches were Guy Clear, Gina Velarde, Francisco Trejo, Anthony Flores, BennyMach, Michael Villarreal, and Daneille Carter. They got checks of \$107.50 in 10-16th places.

In round two being eliminated were Irene Kang, Rico Cayton, Bret Rose and Robert Mercado. They cashed in 6-9th places and \$115 each.

Round three saw Brian Reyes bring his strike ball downing Patrick Ambrose 248-168. Anthony Nicholson did the same. Patrick and David were 4th and 5th and checks of \$130 with Anthony and Brian to meet for the right to bowl Austin for the title.
