Australia's Belmonte First Two-Handed Player to Win a PBA Title

West Babylon, N.Y.— Australia's Jason Belmonte became the first two-handed player in Professional Bowlers Association history to win a PBA Tour title when he upset top qualifier Michael Fagan of Patchoque, N.Y., 215-201, to win The Bowling Foundation Long Island Classic at AMF Babylon Lanes Sunday.

Belmonte, making his PBA Tour singles television debut, won \$25,000 and an exemption to bowl on the Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour during the 2009-10 season. He also joined Sweden's Mats Karlsson, Venezuela's Amleto Monacelli and Finland's Mika Koivuniemi as the fourth international player to win a PBA Tour title.

"The PBA Tour is the ultimate bowling competition in the world," said Belmonte. "With all the media attention I have received, it's now time for us to put the foot down on the gas and go mainstream; this is not just about me. There are many great stories and great athletes out here. It's time all of us knock on all the doors of we can, the next one could be the 'golden key' door we are all looking for."

The 25-year-old Australian has been a terror in international competition over the past few years, but had not experienced PBA competition until this season. In limited PBA Tour participation, he had finished in the top 15 four times with a best finish of 10th place in the season-opening PBA World Championship in Wichita, Kan.





The Board of Directors met on January 25, 2009 at the Marriott Hotel in Riverside. All but five members were present. One position had been vacated and three had been excused.

President Hoffmann introduced guests, John Vogler and Dennis Reynolds who were in California to promote a mixed league championship tournament on a national level, proceeds in part which would be donated to the BVL Fund. The national prize fund was anticipated at \$150,000. For further information, the board was referred to their Website "4BOWLLC" or the mailing address of #4 Bowl LLC, POB 62, La Mirada, California 90537-0062

Association Manager, Larry Peppers reported that the office in Antioch was being closed and Open Tournament Official Gina Moura was being released of that responsibility but would remain on the Board of Directors as a Director. From the Tournament Committee Report, the board approved the motions: (1) To reinstate plaques for the Youth State Tournament and pay the scholarships down further than last year. (2) To take action to get proposals from two Professional Photographers for the Open and Women's Tournaments. had another game, he would have shot 240." In the opening match, Ritchie Allen of Columbia, S.C., finished with

eight strikes in a row to eliminate Robert Smith of Columbus, Ohio, 258-244. Bill O'Neill of Southampton, Pa., overcame an open in the first frame with six strikes on his next seven shots to defeat Allen, 237-218. Belmonte then slipped past O'Neill in the semifinal match, overcom-




