Professional Bowlers "Carry On" Despite Coronavirus Fears

On March 12, 2020, most of the sports world came to a grinding halt when both the National Basketball Association (NBA) and Major League Baseball (MLB) announced cancellation of their games "until further notice." Then on March 15, 2020, the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) not only elected to move forward with the televised finals of the PBA World Championship from Las Vegas, but they added a cool \$100,000 to the televised finals purse, making the first place prize \$150,000!

LAS VEGAS - Jason Belmonte, the bowling phenom from Australia, was the victor over fellow two-handed kegler Anthony Simonsen of Little Elm. Texas, by the final score of 213-190. Simonsen received \$70,000 for his second-place finish. In the battle for the best of the "regular" one handed bowlers, E.J. Tackett of Bluffton, Ind., placed third for a generous prize of \$40,000, followed by François Lavoie of Canada (\$30,000) and Chris Via of Springfield, Ohio (\$20,000).

While bowling has sometimes been ridiculed for their lack of sports stadiums, or even facilities with arena style seating, such as Thunderbowl in suburban Detroit; the lack of those confining areas has suddenly become desirable in the world of sports, following the announcement of the Coronavirus pandemic in the United States.

Colie Edison, CEO of the PBA, has since placed all tournament activities on hiatus until early April, following a plea by President Trump and many state and local municipalities, in an effort to avoid the spread of COVID-19 (COrona VIrus Disease - 2019). However. in the process of going forward with the World Championship last weekend, the question of a bowling facility as a venue for future television events has once again surfaced.

There was no live crowd at the Las Vegas event only family, friends and tournament officials were permitted into the event at the South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas. Frank Esposito, long time TV Coordinator for the PBA and ABC-TV, once told me that, "Bowling is the perfect sport for television, because it is in a controlled space and requires

two cameras!" The years that Esposito spent as proprietor of the famous Paramus Bowl in New Jersey made him an expert on the very little set up, and only subject, as he hosted many "made for television" programs, including "Make

Could this be the beginning of the possible remakes of "Jackpot Bowling," or the previously mentioned "Make That Spare," or even the popular "Pin Point Bowling" of the 1970's and 80's? One of my favorites when I was growing up in the San Francisco Bay Area, was a spinoff

first televised PBA event.

of Championship Bowling called "Top Star Bowling," shown every Sunday at Noon, with one of the most famous of all the bowling announcers, Jack Buck, who went on to star in both football and baseball broadcasting.

It was Jack Buck, father of popular play-by-play announcer Joe Buck, that was behind the microphone when Kirk Gibson of the Los Angeles Dodgers hit the famous home run in the 1988 World Series that caused the elder Buck to spontaneously exclaim, "I don't believe what I just saw!" But in bowling's heyday, it was Jack Buck

that was atop the bowling world of announcers. In fact, you can still watch him on the very first telecasts of the Professional Bowlers Association on You Tube, when he served a dual role with the man that went on to become the most famous of all bowling broadcasters, Chris Schenkel of ABC Sports.

The possibilities of a packaged bowling broadcast are endless. It could not only spawn the likes of a "Jackpot Bowling" or "Make That Spare" on network television once again, but also provide several local ties in promotions with all of the various Bowlero

signature bowling chains. One of my favorite promotions from my formative years, the Youth Pick-Your-Pro, comes to mind... but the prospects are innumer-

Add to that the relatively inexpensive costs associated with coordinating such a program, which could be filmed in a weekend and then spread out over an entire season, and you can begin to see why Frank Esposito called bowling a perfect environment for television. Who needs a crowd and worries about social distancing when you have bowling, the quintessential sport? Carry on!

Clark finished with an 11-1 match play record and a total of 5,120 pins for 20 games, including match play bonus pins. Along with his first PBA50 Regional title, he also earned \$2,100.

• Chris Collins of Myrtle Beach, S.C., defeated Chris Johnson of Nashville, N.C., 217-180, to take the \$2,000 first prize in the PBA50 Fayetteville South Open at Lafayette Lanes in Fayetteville, N.C., on Sunday, March 8, improving his all-time PBA Regional titles record to 15

Collins, who qualified No. 1 for the four-man stepladder finals with a 7-1 match play record and a 16-game total of 3,906 pins, had one of two perfect games in the event. Brett Caramagno of Goose Creek, S.C., had the other.

In the first stepladder match Johnson defeated Jimmy Jean of Kathleen, Ga., 172-155, Johnson then defeated Craig Auerbach of Sunrise, Fla., 203-194, to set up the championship match.



ZACK JELLSEY - On The Road To Another High Average Award

REDLANDS – Zack Jellsey is averaging 245. After 54 games in the NFL Clubhouse League at Empire Bowl he is on a pace which should win the Citrus Belt USBC Association High Average Award. Usually the High Average Award is won by a bowler averaging about 240.

Zack lead the Citrus Belt Association in average in 2015, 2018 and 2019. His 240 average in 2016 did not qualify for the award because he didn't bowl the necessary 60 games.

Zack's Citrus Belt averages for the past five seasons were (*High Association Average):

2015 244* (81 games) Empire Bowl 2016 240 (33 ") "

2017 Did Not Bowl in Citrus Belt

2018 245* (78 games) Empire Bowl 2019 237* (81 ") "

Time will tell but my money is on Zack Jellsey to repeat as the Citrus Belt USBC Association High Average Award winner this season.

For those interested, the record ALL-TIME HIGH Citrus Belt Association season average (60 game minimum) is 253 bowled by VINCE WOOD at Palm Springs Lanes for the 2012-13 season. Vince is the only Citrus Belt bowler to average 250 or better for a season with a minimum of 60 games bowled.

During the 2008 – 2009 season BOBBY CAMPAGNALE averaged 250 at Empire Bowl but he only bowled 28 games. Bobby led the Citrus Belt in average that season with a 243 average bowled at Del Rosa Lanes in San Bernardino.


