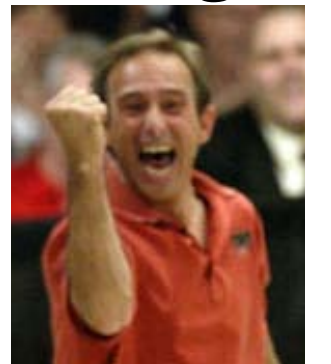
Duke Is King!

NORTH BRUNSWICK—The Grand Slam, two Majors in a season, \$100,000 and the one accomplishment that has eluded him in his illustrious career.

With so much riding on the line, getting a mark in the 10th frame was never more difficult for Norm Duke.

Needing any spare to win the 65th Denny's U.S. Open, Duke left the 2-4-5-8, giving him flashbacks of the 2000 U.S. Open that slipped out of his hands by one pin. But facing the biggest spare attempt of his career, Duke converted to defeat Mika Koivuniemi, 224-216, to win his fourth career Major and 28th Denny's PBA Tour title.

Additionally, he became just the second bowler in history to win the four Grand Slam events – the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Masters, Tournament of Champions, World Championship and the U.S. Open.



Norm Duke is the second bowler to complete the Grand Slam.

The win capped a wild roller coaster ride of a season for Duke, who just five weeks ago was on the verge of losing his Denny's PBA Tour exemption. He sat 51st in the PBA World Point Rankings after battling numerous injuries and, even worse, caught the flu the week of the Denny's World Championship.

Always known for having a flair for the dramatic, Duke continued on page 11

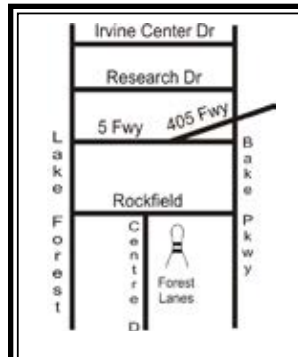

More Accurate Bowling Through Shoulder Control Can An Open Shoulder Be Made To Work?

Are you one of those bowlers who has trouble adding ball speed without muscling the ball...who believes that the only way to add speed when needed is to throw the ball harder?

Well, relax it ain't so!
When you ask a professional, "How do you throw your spare shots so accurately?" the answer you virtually always get is, "Hard and straight!" Well, yes...that's true...in a way. However, that word "hard" is usually misunderstood by most bowlers. It is often interpreted to mean that the downswing must be forced down in order to increase ball speed. Unfortunately for the bowler, throwing hard by force destroys any chance of creating the all important free arm swing, because it requires "muscling" the ball. It also helps destroy accuracy.

But...you can easily eliminate any muscling of the downswing by doing two simple things which will increase ball speed with no help from you, whatsoever:

Push the ball slightly upward at an angle during the pushaway (or "over the bar" as coach of the pros John Jowdy so aptly puts it). This creates a higher starting point for the ball's backswing, thus allowing it to go higher in the back without having to pull on it. Then, allow the pectoral muscle (which acts like a rubber band) as it stretches during the backswing, to actually provide the action to initiate the downswing itself. Thinking of that stretched rubber band snapping back is how that downswing gets its start, with no help from you! That way, the ball will sort of float downward with no force at all, thus increasing ball speed with a true "free" arm swing all the way to the release point. If you've got it right, you'll notice a new feel...as though the ball is swinging the arm, rather than the other way around.

"Hit" the ball...with the hand only and at the bottom of the swing only! This is created by waiting until the ball reaches the release point near the swing's bottom, then hitting or slapping it...not with the arm, but as stated above, with just the hand! To make this easier to understand, I always taught my students to imagine a cotton bowling ball suspended in mid-air at the release point, then to picture themselves hitting it, something like a handball. The critical thing is to wait until that hand is at the release point near the bottom of the swing! That way you'll get a totally different and new sensation...one of all the power moving from the hand up the arm, rather than from the shoulder down the arm, as in a muscled ball.

I might mention here that some bowlers add steps to their approach in an effort to speed up the ball. Those of us who remember the style of the great Marshall Holman will also remember that he would change the number of his approach steps from four all the way up to seven at times. His steps were short and fast, especially his pushaway step and power step. For him, that worked, especially with his outrageously long slide.

In modern bowling, however, I recommend the four step ap-

proach as the most successful most of the time, especially with shorter 1st and 3rd steps. Since modern approach timing demands that the body get to the line slightly ahead of the ball to create optimum leverage, extra steps don't really help much. You're better off with slightly faster steps to go along with that faster pushaway which is so important in today's bowling environment.

The Open Shoulder Approach Technique

In this style the bowling shoulder is opened up as the arm swings back, to allow for a higher backswing without pulling on the ball. This also allows a bigger swing arc on the way down, thus generating more speed, since the bigger the swing, the more speed at the bottom, all without pulling. Otherwise the only way to get such a high backswing is to overbend, or overtilt forward from the waist, which won't work, because it destroys any hope of creating leverage.

Therefore, opening the shoulder to create such a backswing can be facilitated by keeping the balance arm pointed forward rather than at the side as is normally done by a majority of better bowlers, especially the smaller ones, including the ladies. Then, during the last step, the bowler switches arms, thus realigning the bowling shoulder with the target. (see illustrations 1 & 2).

Most taller, more muscular bowlers don't really need to go through this shoulder opening tactic, since they already throw a faster ball by virtue of their strength. (Some of these actually have to work at slowing the ball speed instead.) Therefore, many of those stronger types simply keep the balance arm pointed directly to the side, like an airplane wing...a method with which most bowlers are already familiar. The result is that with some exceptions, of course, many of the smaller bowlers plus many women, including professionals, are the ones who use the above arm switching method of adding ball speed.

If you have seen players who use this system and there are a number of them, it may appear to be relatively easy. It is, for those who have mastered it. But for those not used to it, it can sometimes be time consuming to learn and occasionally difficult to teach. That's because the problem of getting the bowling shoulder

realigned again from that open position for the release takes a lot of practice, even for many better bowlers.

Some believe that realigning the open shoulder for the release just automatically happens by aiming the release toward the target. That's seldom successful, since it requires "steering" the ball, which we all know virtually never works.

A Successful Method

But there is a system that does work. It is based on the concept of getting the bowling shoulder to face toward the target by simply reversing the process which opened that shoulder in the first place...namely, bringing the balance arm from its forward pointed position back to the side again! In other words, while switching arms during the downswing, being sure to stop the balance arm once it gets facing directly sideways.

This works, simply because since the arm is attached to the body at the shoulder, moving the arm forward or backward will obviously take the shoulder with it. So the "switch arms" tactic will turn the shoulders back to their original aligned position, taking the arm alignment with it, thus assuring a more accurate shot along with desired extra speed...and no muscling of the ball.

A Problem

Sounds simple, right? Wrong! The main problem faced by bowlers in attempting to learn this technique from scratch, is that during the arm switching process, there is an inherent difficulty in bringing the balance arm back exactly the right amount during that last step. Too far and the bowling shoulder overturns, causing a pulled shot. Not far enough and the shoulder and arm fall short of getting back into target alignment, causing an outside miss, sometimes even into the gutter.

It looks so easy when correctly done by bowlers experienced in the method, that many bowlers find it hard to believe they have trouble with it at first. They'll see it done to such perfection on television during pro tournaments, that it's difficult to believe that mastering it isn't as easy as it looks. Of course, there are always a few bowlers who have less trouble than others in developing it, but in my experience these are in the minority.

A Solution

The solution comes in two parts:
Check yourself out (or have someone watch you) during your normal approach to see exactly where your balance arm is during the last step (downswing and release). Do this a number of times, at least until you become aware of the feel of the exact position that arm assumes during the release. You might notice that until now you've never been aware of the balance arm's position at the release point. Then make an attempt to use the open shoulder technique, deliberately switching that arm into that specific position, with that same feel as in your normal shot.

Once you have done this a number of times, the rest is practice, practice, practice! If this is new to you, patience is a must! Be prepared to possibly live with lots of errant shots at first. Of course, there are always those bowlers who learn and develop this tactic more quickly than others. If you are one of these, great. But if not, keep in mind that the reason you're learning it in the first place is because the desired extra ball speed has eluded you no matter what else you have tried. Remember, you wouldn't even be trying it if the other methods of increasing speed had worked. This is definitely worth the effort once mastered. Good luck!

made an incredible run through the World Championship to win his third career Major and, more importantly, earn a two-season exemption.

Fueled by the desire to win the most coveted event on Tour and the one he has had several close calls in, Duke was a man on a mission all week. Though he lost the top seed for the finals by going just 3-5 in the final round of match play Saturday, he salvaged the No. 3 seed which meant he had to win three matches on Sunday for the title.

After looking unstoppable in defeating No. 4 Doug Kent, 234-160, and No. 2 Chris Loschetter, 267-245, to reach the title match, Duke faced the top-seed Koivuniemi, who was looking for his second U.S. Open title.

Koivuniemi held the lead until a spare in the eighth frame after which Duke struck in the eighth and ninth to take the lead. Koivuniemi had a chance to put some pressure on Duke by striking out, but he left a 2-pin with his first shot in the 10th, converting the spare and finishing with a strike to force Duke to mark.

With everything on the line, Duke re-racked but left the 2-4-5-8, one of the few bad shots he threw all day.

"I was protecting against going high because you can make the bucket but you can't make the 4-6," Duke (Clermont, Fla.) said. "But I wanted to strike, too, so it had to be somewhere in between. I didn't throw it awful, I just missed it enough. When I left that I thought, 'It's over. I've done it again.'"

Duke was referring to the 2000 U.S. Open title match against Robert Smith where he needed a strike with his first ball in the 10th frame to win, but he left the 8-pin to lose, 202-201.

"That was the longest 10th frame today," Duke, the first No. 3 seed since Dave Husted in 1996 to win the U.S. Open, said. "Under those circumstances, I was a lot calmer today than I had been on Friday and Saturday. Fatigue really plays a role in this event. If you watched last night, guys were dying and I was one of those guys. Not dying mentally, but physically. But I threw some warm-ups this morning and had the game I wanted to have and that really calmed me down."

After Duke picked up the "bucket," the diminutive crowd favorite who is one of the most emotional players the Tour has ever seen, pumped his fist and jumped wildly, showing just how much this event meant to him.

"I cannot put into words how special this is to me," Duke said. "Five years after I missed that shot against Robert I would still cry about it. It was the one thing I would constantly think about that I hadn't done. I could just never cap it off. Now, I'm the reigning champion of the U.S. Open."

The win capped off an incredible month for Duke, who became just the seventh bowler to win two Majors in one season. He moved past Mike Aulby into sole possession of sixth on the all-time titles list, moved into a tie for fifth all-time with his fourth Major and joined Mike Aulby as the only bowlers to win the Grand Slam, although his 1993 Masters title does not count as an official PBA title.

"This format, this grind... it's why so few people can actually win this event," Duke said. "There are probably 25 people out here who can actually win this. It's why Pete (Weber) has

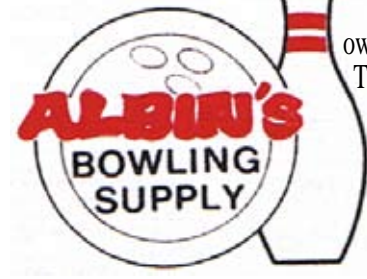
