Butturff Wins USBC Masters

LAS VEGAS - After finishing second three times in major events, Jakob Butturff finally got the job done Monday night.

Butturff defeated Mykel Holliman, 228-196, to claim his first career major title at the 2019 United States Bowling Congress Masters. It's Butturff's sixth overall title.

Prior to Monday's win, Butturff had finished second at the PBA World Championship last week and was the runner-up at the 2017 U.S. Open and the 2018 U.S. Open.

"After the second U.S. Open, it hurt because it was back-to-back years, and I wondered if I would ever get another opportunity like that again," Butturff said. "Today, that all changed."

Battling severe upper

back pain in the closing days of the Masters, Butturff persevered to get the victory and was clearly emotional as he threw the winning shot in the final

Butturff spent part of his day leading up to the show getting a massage to try to lessen the pain he was feeling in his back, but he told FloBowling there was still significant pain just before the finals. He said he was grateful he only had to bowl one game.

The lefty with the quirky release and conventional grip drilling struck on four of his first five shots to start the championship match but not all of them were solid strikes. He went Brooklyn to open the match and then carried a light hit for a double in the second frame.



By making his spares and staying clean, Butturff was able to stay ahead throughout the title match.

Holliman was within 14 pins heading into the ninth and 10th frames and had a chance to put the pressure on Butturff down the stretch. Instead, Holliman

struggled, leaving the 2-4-7-8 in the ninth, and the 1-3-4-6-7 super washout in the 10th frame. He converted both but the damage was already done.

The finals appearance was the first in Holliman's career and came in just his 11th PBA Tour event.

With the second-place finish. Holliman is easily the leader for PBA Rookie of the Year honors at this stage in the season.

In the semifinal, Jake Peters built a 20-pin lead heading into the commercial break but Holliman ralcontinued on page 4

One of my favorite television programs is Storage Wars. Every Friday night I look forward to hours of reruns from the A & E Network. The show allows me to reminisce about the time that I lived in Southern California, visiting many of the towns featured in the program while living with the Lewis family in Burbank, and sharing an office with regional supervisor Dan Rochin at AMF Rocket Bowl in Chatsworth.

Perhaps a more appropriate program for me to watch would be Hoarders, also offered by A & E. It's a reality show that depicts the real-life struggles and treatment of people that suffer from a compulsive hoarding disorder. While I don't believe that I suffer from this compulsion, the mere fact that I'm frightened to watch the series makes me wonder if I suffer from this collection difficulty.


My weakness is paper. I have so many file boxes of old brochures, flyers and manuals that I actually maintain a "Mini-Storage Museum" of my memoirs. While I regret throwing away many items over the years whenever I moved to a new location, the collection of items that I have re-tained is impressive.

The most difficult aspect of maintaining the "museum" is trying to locate a particular item. A case in point was last month's feature that I wrote involving bowling superstar Leanne Hulsenberg. In the story I mentioned a particular thank you note that I received from her way back in 1987, when she participated in the Seagram's Coolers U.S. Open at AMF Major League Lanes in Win-ston-Salem, North Carolina.

Now I am relatively certain that I never threw away that thank you note, but in the process of looking for the note I stumbled upon another flyer I was looking for two years ago, when I wrote a story in the May 2017 issue of BCM Magazine entitled "Good Promotions Never Grow Old."

In that article I commented about the Youth Pick-Your-Pro Tournament that I ran for many years at AMF Bowling Centers. I patterned this event after my recollection of the original promotion conducted by the Bowling Proprietors Association of America (BPAA), in conjunction with the All-Star Tournament (now known as the U.S. Open).

In the AMF version of the event, I combined the pro's scores in the AMF Grand Prix with those of the local amateur entries. We used the amateur scores for three games, combined with the professional scores from the first six game block of the Grand Prix.



As a youth bowler I remember bowling multiple times in this event, combining my scores with all of my favorite pros. When I introduced the concept at AMF Bowling Centers, I continued this multiple entry process to encourage additional revenue and publicity. What I failed to remember from the BPAA version of the tournament was that the youth participants were required to return following the pro tournament for a final three game set.

BRAD MILLER WINS WORLD SERIES "CARANO AWARD" AS MOST IMPROVED PLAYER

Brad Miller of Lees Summit, Mo., earned the 2019 PBA Don Carano Award as the most improved player in PBA World Series of Bowling X compared to his performance in WSOB IX in Reno in 2017.

Miller, a 29-year-old seven-year PBA member, finished 41st in the 135-player field at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich., moving up 99 places compared to 2017. He won the honor by a single place in the standings over Brian Robinson of Morgantown, W.Va., who finished 43rd on the overall standings after the Cheetah, Chameleon and Scorpion Championship qualifying rounds, 98 places better than his 141st place in 2017. Coincidentally, Miller and Robinson were the only two players in the 2019 field who posted higher averages than they did in the 2017 qualifying rounds. Miller averaged 209.63 for his three animal pattern events in 2019 – up 1.36 pins over 2017 – while Robinson averaged 209.33 this year compared to 208.25 – a 1.08-pin improvement over 2017.

"A lot of great things are happening this year and this just solidifies it," Miller said, referring in part to his second-place finish in the Mark Roth-Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship earlier in the season with partner Kyle Sherman. "From year to year I worked on my balance. Before, I didn't have a lot of leverage, so I got lower to ground and got my hand under the ball, and it's changed everything." As the winner of the second Carano award, Miller will receive a premium bottle of Ferrari Carano wine from the Carano family winery, dinner for two at Carano's La Strada Ristorante and complimentary luxury accommodations at Eldorado or Silver Legacy Resort Casino.

Germany's Tobias Börding won the inaugural PBA Don Carano Award in 2017, honoring the patriarch of the Carano family that was integral in the building of the National Bowling Stadium and the development of Reno's Tri-Properties. Carano died on Oct. 3, 2017, at age 85.

rosters based on previous performances in PBA League competition.

PBA League fans can begin the debate over who will fill out the team roster vacancies when the PBA League Draft is held on Monday, April 8 at Bayside Bowl. Among those hoping to make their PBA League debut in 2019 are 2018 PBA Player of the Year Andrew Anderson of Holly, Mich., and first-time PBA Tour title winners Kris Prather of Plainfield, Ill., and Matt Ogle of Louisville, Ky.

For the first time, Bayside fans will have an opportunity to attend the draft when the eight 2019 team managers complete their rosters as the draft airs live on FloBowling, PBA's official online live-streaming outlet, beginning at 1 p.m.

Leading off the draft, Portland Lumberjacks manager Tim Mack will make the first pick from a pool of players who finish in the top 40 in 2019 competition points as of Monday, April 1 by virtue of the Lumberjacks' last-place finish in the 2018 Elias Cup tournament. Choosing second will be L.A. X, followed by the Brooklyn Styles, New York City Kingpins, Motown Muscle, Dallas Strikers, Philadelphia Hitmen and defending champion Silver Lake Atom Splitters. The serpentine draft will then find the Atom Splitters making the first selection as the second round reverses the selection order. The Brooklyn Styles, who protected only two of their five 2018 rostered players, will then make the final selection to complete their five-player roster.

In order to be eligible for the draft pool, PBA members must be ranked in the top 40 in the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour competition points standings at the conclusion of the 2019 USBC Masters on April 1. The PBA points list heading into the Masters is noted below, with players in bold already selected for 2019 and an asterisk identifying players who were on a 2018 roster, but not protected and therefore returned to the draft pool.

Once the PBA Playoffs point list is finalized, eligible players will have until Wednesday, April 3, to declare their intent to enter the draft. Following the draft, managers will have until Monday, April 15, to make player trades if they are so inclined.

April 8 will not only be "draft day" in Portland but will also debut the inaugural round of PBA Playoffs matches that will air later in the evening, live on FS1 at 4 p.m. The PBA Playoffs is a new Go Bowling! PBA Tour singles competition that will feature the season's top 24 players in competition points in a single-elimination match play series. The entire PBA Playoff series will air in eight FS1 telecasts in April and May, leading up to the live FOX telecasts of the semifinal and final rounds on June 1 and 2. The winner will earn a PBA Tour title and \$100,000. Bayside Bowl will host the entire PBA Playoffs series.

PBA League players will return to Bayside Bowl for the 2019 PBA League Elias Cup competition on July 16, 17 and 18. All rounds will air live on FOX Sports' FS1 in prime time.

The first frame out of the commercial break, Peters was working on a double but went high in the sixth and left the 3-6-9-10, which he missed. Peters struck in the seventh, but Holliman popped a couple strikes in the seventh and eighth to take an 18-pin lead.

By the time the final frame came around, Holliman just needed a mark to ensure victory, and he tossed a perfect strike

Peters moved into the semifinal with a 254-226 victory over Ireland's Chris Sloan in a match that was closer than the final score indicated.

The opening match of the stepladder featured the first tie of the season as Sloan and Mitch Hupe finished regulation knotted up at 214.

Hupe forced overtime when he left and converted the 3-6 spare and struck on the fill to end regulation. In the extra frame, Hupe had choice of lane and order as the higher seed and elected to go first. He left a light 4 pin. Sloan then stepped up and delivered a strike to advance.



Zietz trudged back to his seat after converting the insanely difficult 4-10 split and beamed.

"Unbelievable," he said. Then on the next frame, Zietz converted another insanely difficult split.

Two conversions of ridiculous splits in back-toback frames!

The second time, the

79-year-old Zietz nailed the

4-7-10 split in nearly identical fashion as the previous frame – sliding the 4 pin all the way across the lane and upending the 10.

This happened during Zietz's weekly foray in the Funtimers senior league on March 27 at Winnetka Bowl – in the seventh and eighth frames of his final game of his threegame series.

"It was a real outlier," said Zietz, a retired highly successful oncologist from West Hills. "I've bowled a lot of games and I've never seen it."

In fact, longtime bowling observer Karl Kurtz said it was a remarkable feat and that he could think of only one comparable performance – by superstar Charles Kenny, who made two dazzling splits in one night, including the 7-10 and Big 4 – but they were not back-to-back.

Zietz, who has bowled a 279 and averages 172, said he actually tried to convert both splits. "I was thinking about hitting the 10 [on the first split] for practice but then I thought it was doable," Zietz said.

The right-handed Zietz oh-so-gently brushed the 4 pin on the left side with his shot, sending the 4 rolling oh-so-slowly toward the right gutter where it barely upended the 10.

On his spare shot in the next frame, Zietz didn't leave so much drama – squarely popping the 10 pin with the 4.

"I'd rather throw a 250, but at my age, I'm just happy to get up in the morning," laughed Zietz, who bowls three leagues a week.

PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: O'GRADY WINS FOURTH CONSECUTIVE HUBBARD OPEN TITLE

• Matt O'Grady of Rahway, N.J. defeated Patrick Dombrowski of Parma, Ohio, 215-209, to win the PBA Hubbard Central Open presented by Brunswick at Bell-Wick Bowl in Hubbard, Ohio, on Sunday for the fourth consecutive year.

O' Grady, who won his first and only PBA Tour title in the 2018 PBA Tournament of Champions, earned his sixth career PBA Regional title and the \$2,500 first prize.

Dombrowski defeated Chris Via of Springfield, Ohio, 202-187, to advance to the championship match after downing Graham Fach of Urbana, Ohio, 235-222, in the first stepladder match.

• Ray Edwards of Middle Island, N.Y., defeated Mike Hastings of Millsboro, Del., 237-216, to win \$3,200 and his 22nd overall PBA Regional title in the PBA50 Rossi Lanes Eastern Open at Rossi Lanes in Elmira, N.Y., Sunday.

Edwards, a three-time East Region Player of the Year and a two-time East Region Senior Player of the Year, qualified fifth, earning a bye for the first round of Sunday's finals. He defeated 2013 champion John Conroy of Mahopac, N.Y., 2-0, in the best-of-three-game Round of 12 and Don Herrington of Ballston Lake, N.Y. 2-0 before eliminating 2016 winner Brian Boghosian of Springfield, Mass., 225-212, in the semifinal round.

Hastings, who also had a one round bye, defeated Larry Woomer of State College, Pa., 2-0 in the Round of 12; Sammy Ventura of Norwich, N.Y. 2-0 in the Round of 8, and two-time Rossi Lanes champ Jeff Zaffino of Warren, Pa., 206-178, in his semifinal round match.

• Jeff Bellinger of Columbia, S.C., defeated Brett Caramagno of Goose Creek, S.C., 252-206, to win \$2,000 and his 15th overall PBA Regional title in the PBA50 UltraStar at Harrahs Cherokee Resort South Open at UltraStar Lanes in Cherokee, N.C., Sunday. Bellinger started of the championship match with a four bagger and never looked back as Caramagno had some early opens. It was Caramagno's second event as a senior.

In the semifinal round, Bellinger defeated Aaron White of Cleveland, Tenn., 198-183, while Caramagno disposed of PBA50 rookie Mitch Beasley of Clarksville, Tenn., 243-231.

• John Marsala of St. Louis defeated Harry Sullins of Chesterfield, Township, Mich. by 149 pins to win the PBA50 Monte Skeels Allstate Midwest/Central Open presented by Ebonite at Liberty Lanes in Carpentersville, Ill., Saturday.

Marsala, who won a national title in the 2018 PBA50 Dave Small's Championship Lanes Classic in Anderson, Ind., finished with a 5-3 match play record and a total of 3,914 pins for 15 games, including match play bonus pins, to win his first PBA50 Regional title. He also earned \$1,500. The one day-reduced entry fee event drew 57 entries.
