

Glenn Allison Making History..... Again


NORWALK - Next month Glenn "Mr. 900" Allison will be competing in his 68th USBC Open Championships.

WINNETKA – Call him the "Split Killer."

That's Bruce Zietz, and what else would you call him after he continues to showcase his wondrous ability to knock down splits?

Fresh off a spectacular day in which he converted two insanely difficult splits in back-to-back frames, the 79-year-old Zietz resumed splattering splits the following week in his Funtimers senior league at Winnetka Bowl.

This time, Zietz picked

up two splits in one game - though not the forbidding ones of the previous week.

The "Split Killer" started his magical streak March 27 when he knocked down the extremely difficult 4-10 in the seventh frame of his final game and then he picked up the equally troublesome 4-7-10 in the following frame.

The next week – on April 3 – the splits just kept on coming and Zietz kept on converting. Although not so challenging this time, Zietz still made good on the 3-10 baby split and then the 2-7 baby split in the sixth and eighth frames of his second game.

"Quite frankly, I've always been a competitor," says Zietz about his knack for converting splits.

And he adds: "The way I approach splits is that you have to be more precise in getting the pins [down]. I don't give up on them."

The right-handed Zietz has bowled a high of 279 and averages 172. He's been bowling off and on for 65 years so he knows more than a little about how to attack splits.

He also knows that when splits appear, it generally means something isn't working.

"Splits really are a [result of a] bad throw," said Zietz, discounting the luck factor. "There's something bad that you're doing. Either you're jerking the ball to the left or putting the ball at too much of an angle."

To make the split, Zietz says, one has "to slow the ball down. I throw 11 or 12 [m.p.h.] so I have to throw 9 or 10."

Zietz has picked up a number of nearly un-makeable splits through the years, but never the railroad. "Picking up the 7-10 is a miracle," says Zietz, a West Hills resident.

Picking up splits apparently runs in the Zietz family. Bev Zietz, Bruce's wife, averages 136 and may qualify as "Ms. Split Killer."

Zietz said Bev knocked down the formidable 6-7-10 split last week. "My wife is better than I am [at converting splits] because she throws the ball softer than I do," he said.

Meanwhile, Zietz has been enjoying the challenge of all the splits he's been facing. "Once you get a split, it kind of energizes you," he said.

Then he harnesses that energy and splatters those splits!

four days and across four different lane conditions. Players earned points based on their daily finishes and for their 24-game pinfall totals, which accounted for 60 percent of the qualifying process.

The remaining 40 percent of the qualifying process took place at the 2019 USBC Masters, where Team USA members earned points based on their finishes in qualifying and the match-play bracket.

Among Team USA members at the Masters, Butturff was third in qualifying and first in the bracket, while Pate was sixth in both qualifying and the bracket to edge AJ Johnson of Oswego, Illinois, for the second spot on the 2019 Pan American team.


The two women's representative will be determined at the 2019 USBC Queens, which will take place May 15-21 at Northrock Lanes in Wichita, Kansas.

Stefanie Johnson of McKinney, Texas, leads the women's qualifying through the Pan Am Trials and is followed by Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey, Shannon O'Keefe of Shiloh, Illinois, **Missy Parkin of Laguna Hills, California**, and Sydney Brummett of Fort Wayne, Indiana.

The Pan American Games, held every four years, are the second largest multi-sport event, bringing together the 41 National Olympic Committees that make up PanamSports. The United States Olympic Committee has specific requirements for the selection of athletes who will compete in the event.



Gomez, Page, Troup, Prather Advance to Round of 16 After Opening Round of PBA Playoffs Second half of Round of 24 to air on FS1 April 15 at 5 p.m.



PORTLAND, MAINE – After 13 tournaments on the 2019 GoBowling! PBA Tour – including four majors – the journey to determine the winner of the inaugural PBA Playoffs and a \$100,000 payday began Monday at Bayside Bowl with the first Round of 24 telecast that aired live on FS1.

Advancing to the Round of 16 after one-game matches in the first half of the Round of 24 were Colombian Andres Gomez; Rhino Page, Orlando; Kyle Troup, Taylorsville, N.C., and Kris Prather, Plainfield, Ill.

In front of the normally wild Bayside Bowl crowd, No. 21 seed Gomez defeated No. 12 seed Dick Allen, 236-199; No. 13 Page defeated No. 20 Shawn Maldonado, 266-205; No. 17 Troup def. No. 16 Chris Barnes, 236-205, and in the fourth match of the telecast No. 9 seed Prather beat No. 24 seed Darren Tang, 207-183.

The PBA Playoffs continue Monday, April 15 at 8 p.m. ET on FS1 with the completion of Round of 24 single-game elimination action. The second half of the Round of 24 will feature Wes Malott vs. Josh Blanchard; Marshall Kent, vs. Jesper Svensson; Dom Barrett vs. Brad Miller and Kyle Sherman vs. DJ Archer

Round of 16 and Round of 8 matches will be contested April 9 and 10 at Bayside Bowl – which will be televised by FS1 on consecutive Monday nights at 9 p.m. ET beginning April 22 – to reduce the field to four survivors who will return to Portland for the semifinal and final rounds June 1-2, with both shows airing live on FOX at noon Eastern.

Once the Playoffs reach the Round of 16, the format will change to a Race to 2 Points format where each game won is worth one point. If the players split the first two games, a ninth and 10th frame tie-breaker will be used to award the deciding point. The eight winners from the Round of 24 will take on the top eight Playoffs seeds – Jason Belmonte, Jakob Butturff, Norm Duke, Anthony Simonsen, EJ Tackett, Sean Rash, Bill O'Neill and Tom Daugherty – who earned a bye to the Round of 16.

Players earned their berths in the Playoffs by finishing in the top 24 in points which were awarded beginning with the season opening PBA Hall of Fame Classic in January and ended with the USBC Masters which concluded on April 1. Points were awarded based on tournament classification. Tier 1 (major championship), Tier 2 (traditional format tournament), or Tier 3 (small or limited field, short format) events. Tier 1 events awarded 50 percent more points than Tier 2 and three times as many as Tier 3 events.




With only two players protected, Brooklyn Styles Manager Johnny Petraglia chose two-time tour winner Brad Angelo to fill out his team's roster.
