Australia's Belmonte Wins Third 2011-12 Title in Pepsi PBA Elite Players Championship

LAS VEGAS – Australia's Jason Belmonte won his third Professional Bowlers Association Tour title of the 2011-12 season, and the fourth of his career, when he defeated Mike DeVaney of Murrieta, Calif., 255-238, to win the Pepsi PBA Elite Players Championship at South Point Casino and Hotel.

The finals of the eighth and final event in the PBA World Series of Bowling aired Sunday on ESPN.

The victory tied Belmonte with PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke for current season titles as the PBA Tour heads into its final event of the 2011-12 season, the PBA Tournament of Champions, which gets underway Monday at Red Rock Lanes in Las Vegas. The TOC, the fourth major championship of the season, offers an \$80,000 first prize. The finals will air live on ESPN Sunday at 1 p.m. ET.

Belmonte, whose only PBA Tour title prior to this season was in the 2009 Bowling Foundation Long Island Open, wrapped up a stunning PBA World Series of Bowling performance with his Elite Players Championship. He won titles in three of his six WSOB television finals, plus he had a third-place finish in the World Bowling Tour Finals presented by the PBA which kicked off the World Series.

As he had done in previous World Series eliminatorformat events the Australian two-handed star got off to a modest start in the Elite Players Championship. DeVaney, a two-time PBA Tour title winner, led the four-player opening match with a 257 game. Mike Scroggins of Amarillo, Texas, was second with a 247. Belmonte was third with a 237. Duke's hopes for his 38th career title, and fourth of the 2011-12 season, ended when he left a 7-10 split followed by a "big four" 4-6-7-10 split in the eighth and ninth frames, respectively, bowing out of the competition with a 222.

DeVaney again led the three survivors in game two with a 234. After finishing with a 205, Belmonte got a break when Scroggins, needing a strike in the 10th frame to advance, left the 4-6-7-8-10 "Greek Church" and opened for a 190.

If there was one player in the field who wasn't concerned about Belmonte's dominating performance in the World Series, it was DeVaney.

"I won't be watching Belmo.(His two-handed technique) doesn't impress me," DeVaney said before the match. "I'm not interested. I don't care. I throw it the right way. I put my thumb in there the way I was taught and how everybody should throw it."

In a classic title-match battle, Belmonte and DeVaney both pounded the pocket, but DeVaney left an 8 pin in the fifth frame, a 9 pin in the seventh and a 10 pin on his first ball in the 10th, and Belmonte capitalized with a late string of five strikes to take charge of the contest.

"Anyone who wins has a little luck go their way," Belmonte said, "but to win three times during the World Series, I had a lot of luck go my way. Osku (Palermaa) missed a 10 pin (allowing Belmonte to reach the Chameleon Open title match)...Chris Barnes shooting 300 (in the second

game, not the title match of the GEICO Shark Open)...Scroggins opening in the 10th...a lot of things really fell into place.

"I'm just overwhelmed right now.

"That second game might be the best 205 game I ever bowled," he continued, referring to seven single pins he left standing during that game. "The pins were brutal to knock over. I didn't know how I was going to double. But in the final game, I got the pins to fall.

"My expectation coming into the World Series was just to bowl well, and if I bowled great, to make a TV show," Belmonte added. "To come home with a title was the ultimate dream, but to have ex-

ceeded that three times over? There's no way I would have predicted it. I'm seriously overwhelmed."

With Belmonte's Elite Players victory, the international players in the World Series field completed a sweep of seven individual titles awarded (PBA World Championship: continued on page 3

Bowling has been a sport rich in award giving and if you don't win an award it seems as though someone will give you a trophy for never having a trophy.

Not quité.

But bowling trophies have intrigued bowlers and those involved in bowling for a long time longer than a century and draw great interest as national and local exhibition sites at halls of fame sites and tournament presentations.

Bowling trophies and awards show great imagination, fine and classic beauty at times, but also some blatant commercialism. They come in all sizes, shapes and materials and can cost for next to nothing to next to a fortune. They come as small as a thimble to as large as a bowler. They are constructed from materials as paper and cardboard to the most precious of metals and best of gems or stones.

I've seen totem poles carved from a single log and stone carvings, bronzed mufflers, silver replicas of products, the finest blown glass, and the least expensive plastics.

Every top bowler has or had a collection, not to mention a huge assortment of rings, pen sets, watch fobs and chains, belt buckles.

Few top bowlers have ever had to buy any rings or watches because their awards kept them fully supplied. They also have barometers, thermometers, bracelets, pins, and dozens of personal or household items.

Medals have made a big comeback now that there are more and more major international events catering to both amateur and pro events.

The most beautiful and probably among the most expensive awards I recall were made of the finest see through material in the shape of a cylinder. Inside was suspended the replica of a tobacco leaf of gold. The gold leaf seemed suspended in the air, floating on its own and it took the work of master craftsmen with plenty of talent and patience to complete the artistic work.

These days, though trophies are not as numerous as they once were, there are no bounds, so trophy and award builders let their flair for a fantasy world go wild. Any junior bowler worth his salt has dozens of awards and all the major stars have hundreds, many exhibited in different bowling settings.

Some bowlers love their trophies. Others would just as soon leave them somewhere, anywhere, or in such modest tasks as paper weights or door stops.

One thing sure, bowling awards have been around for the better part of bowling history, and figure to be always a special piece of that tradition.



NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

ROBERT ELLISON IS AN CERTIFIED USBC BRONZE LEVEL COACH

SAN DIEGO—A month ago this writer got an email from a three time Deaf Team USA member Robert Ellison of Alpine, CA announcing that he is now a certified Bronze Level coach and wanted to know if he is the first deaf bowler to get to that level.

Ellison said he had to pass level 1 coaching, then took bronze level certificate exam and passed that. He is not sure probably the first deaf coach who has this level. He believes Ed Abakumoff (Riverside) and Carol Moers (Denver) were certified level 1 coaches.

This writer congratulated Ellison on his being a USBC Bronze Level Coach and explained that Ray Bellofatto who owned a pro shop in New York before he moved to Denver was the first deaf bowler as a Bronze Level 1 Coach under USA Bowling banner. His daughter who served as his interpreter helped him. Later on Carol Moers passed as the second one also with her daughter as interpreter. USA Bowling was replaced by USBC when UDBC became one organization.

Ed Abakumoff along with this writer were part of 29 other deaf bowlers as certified Junior Olympics Level 1 Bowling Coach. All were passed in 3 separate coaches clinics this writer set up for USA Deaf Sports Federation in White Plains, NY (1995) and Rochester, NY (1999 & 2000).

These 29 were supposed to take up J O Level II before going on to Bronze level but with USA Bowling gone, so all must pass USBC's Coach Level 1 first like Ellison did.

Also this writer suggested to Ellison that since Edwin Miller organized a league for deaf and hearing kids in Riverside, Ellison could get some coaching credits teaching the kids to bowl.

WEST COVINA—We returned to West Covina Lanes where we saw 235 entries come out on Saturday and bowled on a semi-tough shot, with approx. 143 bowlers during our final squad at 6 pm. A total of \$938 dollars was paid out in sidepots across the three games. Pots are now guaranteed \$100 min at 4:00 PM and \$200 Minimum at 6:00 PM. The cut scores on Saturday night were + 50 for the men and + 46 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Art Windsor (46), and Ping Tubera (+40). For the women it was Angelina Nillo (+34). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 57 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

Each week the top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$2,002. Ben drew a 642. We had no bowlers that bowled this score during the qualifying squads, but we had one bowler who missed this by one pin, and that was Marvin Crowder. We will estimate the Match Series at \$2,500 at Bowlium event. The last bowler for the 3-6-9 roll-off was Demetrius Cash. When he came up to shoot for the \$1,100 he missed on his first shot, so he got \$50 for beer Money as a consolation. The pot will be \$1,200 at

Bowlium.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Deborah Sanders and Marvin Crowder

(and a Happy Birthday wish goes out to Marvin, who had his two sons visit him at West Covina. It was nice to see Tim and Marvin Jr again) with a 1393 for \$130. Finishing second was Julian Conwi and Teddy Villaroman with 1372 for \$110. There was a total of \$1,370 paid out in doubles and 23 paid spots with low to cash of 1311.

After bowling the three game semi-finals, finishing in first was Victor Fabian with a +155. Finishing in 3rd during the semi-finals was Carlos Umana at a +142. He missed in the 10th frame his 2nd strike to overtake Victor for the top seed. He sat out the first round. Our top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$2,285. Victor Fabian drew a 191. We had four Lucky Bowlers who matched that score. They were Demitrius Cash, Fred Go, Jhickie De Luna, and Teddy Villaroman. They will each get \$571 for that 191 score. We will estimate the pot at \$1,300 for Bowlium.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. This would get us down to the final four bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$23 (Carlos Umana) to a high of \$140 (Mary Huynh) depending on

who would win. In this round we saw Mary Huynh (9th seed) bowling Sam Wu (11th seed). We would see an exciting match where it was the bowling of Mary who hit some key shots towards the end to beat Sam with a 211 to 202 and advance to the next round, which was the most rounds she had ever gone. What Drama Awaits at the 2012 PBA Tournament of Champions?

2011-12 season comes full circle with PBA's signature event at Red Rock Lanes in Las Vegas

LAS VEGAS (April 5, 2012) - For the past four seasons Red Rock Lanes in Las Vegas has hosted some of the most dramatic Professional Bowlers Association Tournament of Champions finals telecasts in history. This year, with the PBA's signature event moved into position as the final event on the 2011-12 schedule, it holds promise to add another chapter to its colorful history.

In 2008, Michael Haugen Jr. came back from a 50-pin deficit in the championship match to defeat Chris Barnes, 215-214.

In 2009, needing only a nine-count and spare in the 10th frame to win his first major title, Rhino Page missed the headpin, got four pins on his first shot and lost the TOC title to Patrick Allen,

In 2010, Kelly Kulick made sports history by becoming the first woman to win a PBA Tour event when she defeated former PBA Player of the Year Chris Barnes in the championship match, 265-

In 2011, Mika Koivuniemi of Finland defeated 2009 World Championship winner Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Mich., 269-207, to win the richest first prize in PBA history (\$250,000). But it was Koivuniemi's 299-100 romp past Tom Daugherty in the semifinal match that created a national wave of media attention. In addition to providing a dramatic conclusion to the season, the tournament offers a year-long incentive for all PBA players to win a title in order to qualify for the elite finale. In 2012, that end-of-season drama returns as the PBA Tour comes full circle - returning to Las Vegas for its big finish after starting the season six months earlier with the PBA World Series of Bowling at South Point Lanes on the south side of the city.

When the tournament gets underway Monday, PBA regional, senior tour, national tour players and PBA Women's Series players who have won titles will begin the week-long battle to determine which four players advance to the live ESPN stepladder finals on Sunday, April 15, at 1 p.m. ET (10 a.m. Pacific). The known storylines are plentiful:

- PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke and Australian two-handed star Jason Belmonte come into the event in a heated battle for PBA Player of the Year honors.
- The winners from the three previous PBA majors U.S. Open

champion Pete Weber, USBC Masters champion Mike Fagan and PBA World Championship winner Osku Palermaa of Finland will be trying for a second major title, and Player of the Year consideration for themselves.

- A win by Pete Weber would make him the first player in PBA history to complete the "Triple Crown" twice.
- A win by Walter Ray Williams Jr., the winningest player in PBA history with 47 titles, would make him the seventh member of the elite Triple Crown club as well as the third "Grand Slam" winner in PBA history. Williams also needs to reach the stepladder finals to extend his record streak of 26 consecutive seasons with at least one TV appearance
- •International players have made their mark on Tour this season winning a total of seven titles. In addition to Palermaa and Belmonte, 2011-12 titlists Andres Gomez of Colombia, Stuart Williams and Dom Barrett of England are also entered. Reigning Player of the Year Koivuniemi, who is winless so far this season, will be trying to defend his title.

The 2012 TOC will combine the best of the event's traditions with its newest features.

- The 11 players who won PBA Tour titles during the 2011-12 season have earned automatic berths in the Round of 36. Belmonte, Weber, Fagan, Palermaa, Duke, Eugene McCune, Scott Newell, Dominic Barrett and Stuart Williams of England, Wes Malott and Andres Gomez of Colombia will be exempt from Champions Field and Elite Field qualifying, and enter the competition on Thursday.
- The Elite Field will include any player who has won a PBA Tour title, the winner of the 2011 PBA Regional Players Championship and Doubles Championship, 2011 PBA Senior U.S. Open and USBC Senior Masters champions.
- The top four players who will compete for the title will be determined over 18 qualifying games on Thursday and 18 games of round-robin match play on Friday.

In addition to the TOC competition, the 2012 PBA Hall of Fame induction ceremonies will be held on Saturday, April 14, when Jason Couch of Clermont, Fla. (the only player to win three consecutive TOC titles) and 11-time Senior Tour winner Gene Stus of Taylor, Mich., will be inducted.

While recent TOCs have provided many dramatic televised moments in PBA Tour history, other memorable moments include Don Johnson's 299 game in 1970; Jack Biondolillo bowling the first televised 300 game in 1967; Mike Durbin becoming the event's first three-time winner in 1984 and Couch becoming the first to win it in three consecutive seasons in 2002, just to name

What Happened To Bowling: PASSION

Passion. A seemingly simple word that has the connotation of enthusiasm and an insatiable craving for something. Whether it be a car, an activity or a special someone in your life, passion dictates our desires and pushes us towards achieving our goals. However, what happens when passion can only be linked to one's self? This week on "What Happened To Bowling" we discuss the concept of passion and why it's one of the key elements to not only becoming a better bowler but to bettering the sport.

Ask yourself a question; what was your intention when you became a bowler? For some, it may of been just something to do to have some fun. For others it could be an outlet to get away from the hardships of day to day life with friends and family. However, if you're surfing a website to improve your game then you are probably a bowler that wanted to bowl on the next level. You want to be the upper echelon of competitor that goes out to the lanes and achieves the goals that people dream about. That, my friends, is passion.

In today's modern game passion is seen in a variety of ways. From the antics of Pete Weber on the PBA to your local scratch bowler yelling out after a good shot, passion is seen on every level of the game. Without passion competitive bowling ceases to exist as the intangible want to improve evaporates in a cloud of smoke. Bowlers have to want something in order to better themselves and must be willing to do what is necessary to achieve those goals. Unfortunately, however, many bowlers make the mistake of overlooking the bigger picture of the sport and find themselves stuck in an area where passion is outshined by ignorance.

For better or worse, the modern game has changed the face of bowling. The days of throwing rubber on lacquer have long faded away and we are faced with the development of new technology with stronger and younger bowlers viding for ways to be on top of the sport. While these bowlers have developed their own strong sense of obligation to bettering themselves, they have completely ignored the onset of troubles within the sport. Ask the majority of your bowlers who runs the associations. Ask the majority of your bowlers to explain changes to the playing rules. Ask the majority of your bowlers what is being done to equalize and strengthen the sport. Ask the majority of your bowlers simple questions about how and why things are done in bowling. The sad truth is that the majority of these bowlers will not be able to give you an answer because, quite simply, THEY DON'T CARE.

The passion that resonates in the bowler to improve one's self falls desperately short when looked at in the context of improving the game around them. Bowlers would rather pretend that everything is being done as it should rather than questioning and understand the wheres, whens and whys of bowling. Many of these bowlers are also quick to jump on the bandwagon mentality that individual concerns outweigh the global scope. For example, one would rather complain about themselves having a bad night then looking at the hundred bowlers around them and seeing how they shot. If ninety-nine other bowlers shot good and you shot bad then the problem may lie in you. If ninety-nine other bowlers shot bad and you shot bad then the problem may lie elsewhere. The point here is that you take the time to figure out the whys and look beyond the individual.

Passion for the sport of bowling has to grow from the outside in. If you don't have a passion for the national sport then you can't have a passion for the local. If you don't have a passion for the local then you can't have a passion for yourself. You become stuck in a bubble only improving against yourself and never seeing past your own achievements and shortcomings. Don't be one of those bowlers who becomes all about themselves and berates or ignores the onset of other estimations and facts. Formulate your opinions and find ways to improve the sport for future generations in order to improve the game for yourself.

Bowling is a great thing but like all other sports there are problems that can be addressed. You may not see it but be open to others who might. Ignorance breeds destruction and, if you are truly passionate about this sport, you will do whatever is necessary to stop that from happening. Passion is the word ladies and gentlemen and that is what needs to happen to bowling.


