JASON BELMONTE ESCAPES SERIOUS INJURY ON EVE OF USBC MASTERS

SYRACUSE – Australia's Jason Belmonte, arguably the most successful bowler in USBC Masters history, may limp into Syracuse, N.Y., next week after escaping serious injury earlier this week while helping his grandmother move.

Belmonte, in a Face-

book post where he included a photo of his foot covered with colorful ice packs, said his father accidentally ran over his right (push away) foot with a one-ton trailer.

"It's fine," the defending Masters champion reported. "A little sore, but I

can walk just fine. (I) was helping my grandmother move and my foot got in the way of the trailer. But no breaks. All good."

In addition to trying to defend his 2017 Masters title, the Australian two-handed star also will be trying to win the Masters for a fifth time (he's the only four-time winner), and if he's successful, he will join the late Earl Anthony and Pete Weber as the third player in PBA history to win 10 major championships.

Belmonte will bowl the qualifying rounds beginning Tuesday, but because he's automatically seeded into the 64-player double-elimination match play field, his real competition will begin next Friday.

All qualifying and three-day match play elimination rounds of the Masters will be covered live, exclusively by PBA's Xtra Frame online video streaming channel.

Raised in Dalton, Georgia, Joey enlisted in the Marine Corps after high school. During his eight years of service, he worked as an Explosive Ordnance Disposal (bomb) Technician, deploying to both Iraq and Afghanistan on separate tours. During his last deployment to Afghanistan, Jones was responsible for disarming and destroying more than 80 improvised explosive devices (IEDs) and thousands of pounds of unknown bulk explosives. On August 6, 2010 Joey was struck by an IED, resulting in the loss of both of his legs above the knee and severe damage to his right

forearm and both wrists. He recovered at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center in Washington D.C.

After his initial recovery, Jones enrolled in Georgetown University, where he earned a bachelor's degree. During his time at the university, he was a leader within his student body and co-founded the first veteran student organization at the school. His time at Georgetown fostered relationships and efforts that are still changing the lives of veteran students on campus today.

PBA’S “60 MOST MEMORABLE MOMENTS” UNVEILING CONTINUES: 36 THRU 40


The countdown to unveil the complete list of the PBA’s “60 most memorable moments” in its 60-year history continues, one a day, Monday through Friday, on all PBA Network outlets. Last week, “memorable moments” 36 through 40 were unveiled. Here are those five moments as the countdown continues:

- 36) At age 50, **Walter Ray Williams Jr.** swept every major statistical category during the 2009-10 PBA Tour season en route to a record seventh Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year honor. Williams also was named Bowler of the Decade for the second consecutive decade – a feat unprecedented in the sports world. A season earlier Williams became the first player to surpass \$4 million in PBA career earnings.
- 37) PBA Hall of Famer **Pete Weber** became the first player to complete the PBA Triple Crown for a second time when he defeated Jason Belmonte, 224-179, to win the 2013 PBA Tournament of Champions at Woodland Bowl in Indianapolis. He also became the oldest player to win the TOC at age 50.
- 38) The 1991 PBA Tournament of Champions was delayed 40 minutes due to a bomb threat at Riviera Lanes. It turned out to be a hoax and **David Ozio** went on to defeat **Amleto Monacelli**, 236-203, for the title which led to 1991 PBA Player of the Year honors.
- 39) In 2016 at age 20 years and 357 days, **Jesper Svensson** defeated **Mitch Beasley**, 231-221, to become the youngest player to win the PBA Tournament of Champions. The previous record was set in 1976, 40 years earlier, when **Marshall Holman** won the TOC at age 21 years, 207 days.
- 40) In 1994, **Bryan Goebel** defeated **Norm Duke**, 296-280, in the title match of the PBA True Value Open in Peoria, Ill. Goebel left the 3-6-9-10 on his final shot to lose a \$200,000 perfect-game bonus offered by True Value in its own tournament and Duke’s 280 game still remains the highest losing score in a televised title match.

Same goes for Pete Weber and Walter Ray Williams Jr.

Well, *perhaps* those pros could find Lady Luck and enjoy that same heady feeling as Christine. But they undoubtedly would be hard-pressed to convert a killer split like Christine – a 135-average-and-rising bowler.

That's part of the charm of bowling. A once-a-week league bowler who is loaded down with 13-hour work-days, such as Christine, can execute an improbable shot – knowing full well that even the pros would struggle to replicate it.

What Christine did was knock down the super-imposing 4-7-10 split with the greatest of ease. At least that's the way it looked.

Christine, a right-handed fire-baller, drilled a cross-alley shot that split the 4 and 7 pins and sent the 4 pin careening across the alley where it upended the 10.

That conversion, which took place in the "Guys and Dolls" league, was no accident either. *"I always try to go for it,"* affirmed Christine about zeroing in on splits.

Beaming from her marksman's shot, Christine floated back to her seat and got a hero's welcome from teammates Isaiah Franco, Jim Hartt and Kevin Hartt.

Her reaction to the nifty pickup? *"I was screaming and then jumping up and down. No one would believe it,"* said Christine, a San Fernando Valley resident.

It should be noted that this is Christine's first year of league bowling.

Asked if that split conversion was the highlight of her career, Christine didn't hesitate.

"Oh my Goodness yes, especially 'cause my teammates were there to see it," she said.

Christine found it one night – and embraced it. That's how memorable moments are made.

BALTIMORE – Danny Wiseman has had his share of time in the spotlight as a 12-time PBA Tour champion and PBA Hall of Fame inductee, but he got an unexpected “15 minutes of fame” on opening day of the Major League Baseball season when he attended the Orioles’ home opener against the Minnesota Twins – and caught the game-winning 11th-inning walk-off home run by Baltimore’s Adam Jones.

Well, he sort of caught the ball. Wiseman admitted the sizzling line drive went right through his hands and hit him the chest. But, he noted, he got the ball...and a sizeable welt.

“It won’t out-rank my (USBC) Masters win (at Miller Park in Milwaukee) or my title in Baltimore in 1990, but in terms of excitement, yah, it ranks right up there,” Wiseman said.

FORMAT: If entries are less than 96, the top sixteen (16) bowlers, based on total pin-fall, will qualify for the FINALS. If entries are 96 to 127 the top twenty-four (24) will qualify for the finals. If entries are 128 or more, the top 32 will qualify for the finals. Finals will be held April 15, 2018 @ 8:00 am. If a tie exists for the last qualifying position, a one (1) game roll off will be held on April 15, 2018 at 7:15 am. If a tie still exists, a one ball roll off will take place, until the tie is broken. The higher seed to choose lane and order of bowling. Higher seed will be determined by high game in qualifying squad. Practice for Match Play will start at 7:45 am.

Entry fee breakdown: Prize fund \$94.00, High Game Pot \$7.00,
Lineage \$27.00, Scholarship fund \$5.00, Expenses \$2.00.

There shall be one cash prize for every four entries.

For consideration to participate in the Masters Tournament, I agree to the following:

To abide by all Tournament rules and regulations of the United States Bowling Congress and all special rules and regulations governing the Tournament.

SEE RULE #9 on BACK for DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS.

After my entry has been accepted, I cannot transfer the entry except with the written consent of the Tournament Committee. In no case is the Tournament Committee or Modesto USBC Association obliged to return my entry fee. Request for transfers shall be made no less than one hour before assigned squad time.

The only sum(s) of money in which I will be entitled to as a result of participation in this Tournament are those prizes or awards listed in the prize fund.

A bowler may only bowl once.

A 1099 form will be issued to all bowlers who receive prize money of \$600 or more.

MASTERS FINALS

1. The tournament will be Double-Elimination format, with two game matches. The Tournament Committee shall determine starting lanes for Match#1. Lane assignments will be posted before the start of the finals. Practice at 7:45 a.m.
2. **Bonus money:** In addition to position money, there will be bonus money for the high qualifier, regardless of the number of entries. Based on the total number of entries, additional spots shall receive bonus money for their qualifying position, but no more than the top eight qualifying spots.
3. **Local incentive:** The top local bowler, who is a Modesto USBC member with at least 21 games in a 2017-2018 winter season league, out of the prize money, shall receive \$135.00.
4. Alternates: None. If the qualifying bowler does not show up for the finals, he/she shall receive zero for frames missed. See rule #10.
5. Winners will continue to bowl in the Winners Bracket. Losers will drop to the Losers Bracket.
6. In case of a tie, a one ball roll off will take place to determine the winner. Higher seed will choose lane and order of bowling.
7. The Winner of the loser’s bracket will then bowl the Winner of the winner’s bracket. In the event of the winner’s bracket winner losing their first match, a second match will be bowled to determine the Masters Champion.

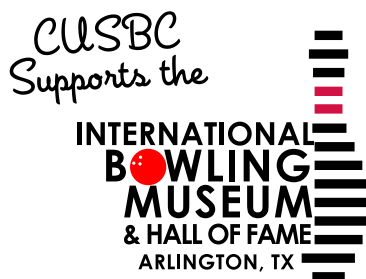

- Well, well. Three pictures on the front page of September 11, 1981; the 37 year younger faces of GARY FORD, JOHN FALZONE, TOM CRISTI, ELI ALTER, and MARK BAKER.
- ROBIN ROMEO set a new W.I.B.C. record. She was the first female to roll 2 800's.
- I (Carol M.) was sent to **BEL AIR LANES** to "clean house". I found 110 cases of off-breed beer in the cooler. We sold it for \$1 per bottle. A bargain? You didn't get your choice of brand!
- DR. BOWL answered questions in his column every week. Same questions are still asked today. For instance, how do you read a lane? How do I generate leverage? What do the pitches in a bowl do? What is the difference in the releases of conventional and finger tip?
- A local "big mouth" (to be unnamed) decided to run out a delivery and broke his ankle and missed 8 weeks. We all know who.
- Wanted to Buy- A piano. Nice ad. Another ad: For Sale- Jeeps, cars and pickups. Over-seas jobs? Stuff envelopes? A Bowling Center for sale. You could sell anything (almost.)
- World bowling news was contributed from Australia, Spain, Indonesia, Sweden, Cyprus, Mexico, Argentina, Ireland, Canada and England. Bowling was becoming a world-wide sport. Japan had the most lanes.
- The "Bowl your Way to Maui" league at **RESEDA** had one drawback. No airfare was included in the trip! \$6.50 a week X 40 weeks got you a car and a hotel.
- 12 homes in the LA area had private lanes.
- Partners RICK TAYLOR (300) and GIP LENTINE (298) stacked up a first game 598 at **FRIENDLY HILLS**.
- BRIAN LA MAGNA was crowned Cal- State Maters Champ in San Jose.
- P.C.B. Doubles report from **CANOGA PARK** champs were MARK BAKER and STEVE COOPER. Runner's up were MARV SARGENT and ALVIN LOU.
- "The only record that can't be broken is considered the 900 game scratch series," suggested KEN LOWMAN, Bowling News owner.
- DON CRAUSE rolled back to back 300's at **CANOGA PARK BOWL**. A.P.C.B. first.
- It was VIRGINIA NORTON'S big year. Between her bowling competition and lessons, she made all 52 issues of 1981. She assured the press she wasn't a twin.
- Burger King was a PBA sponsor. RANDY LIGHTFOOT won the \$30,000 first place money. CHRIS SCHENKEL kept asking him what he was going to do with the money. Finally LIGHTFOOT snapped , "Well, I'm sure not going to buy any Whoppers with it." Burger King did not renew their sponsorship.
- CHUCK REESE of Valley Bowling Supply broke his leg playing baseball. Tried sliding into second.
- The Bowling World Cup was held in Madison Square Garden. Its center opened in 1968. Is it still there? I don't know!
- Why did "sponsors" stop paying fees, buying shirts, adding to prize funds and footing all the bills? Because the recipients didn't say a simple "thank you."
- The oldest known bowling lanes were installed in 1908 by MIKE SKOWRONSKI in Milwaukee. **SKOWRONSKI LANES** remains the same in 1981 as when built.
- The staff of the Bowling Proprietors of Southern California was very active and well known. G.M. DON DROOKER, V.P. TERRY BRUTOCAO, Secretary HARLEY PLANDER___ Directors listed were DON SWEENEY, GARY FORD, NAT ROSENFELD, JACK COGAN, ALLEN SHAW, JIM CAMPBELL, and MANNY LEVY. New comers joining were VINCE CALDERON, IRV MIRO, RAY SVELA, JOHN HAVELES, MARGE TURNER, and SHELL SHELLENBERGER. I hear you saying, "I remember him!"
- I'm still trying to find out what DICK SBOTRIDGE died of. No one has called.
- TISH JOHNSON came in second in LPBT. It was televised and Virginia Norton provided the color commentary.
- What happened to CIPPY CAKE (female bowler), and MARK BAKER (male bowler)? They could have made good press as a doubles team. Add PAT BRYNE for a twist.
- LEONARD BRUTOCAO (Covina ad West Covina) was honored by the City of Hope with their Spirit of Life award.

will be held on a Sunday – a rarity. Sanders says he can recall his club holding tournaments on Sundays “only two or three times,” including once last year at Linbrook.

“We used to have Sundays as the finals when we had three-day tournaments,” Sanders says. “Now it’s 99% Saturdays.”

Those Sunday finals were during the WCST’s halcyon years in the mid-1990s when the tour averaged about 130 entries a tournament. One 1995 tournament at Buena Lanes in Ventura lured 237 bowlers during a three-day event.

Now, Sanders focuses on all particulars of his tournaments to increase entries. He’s repeatedly changed age eligibility, competition formats and the number and location of his tournaments – all with one mission.

He’s trying to bring in new entries and retain old ones.

Sanders got 27 entries for the WCST’s last tournament in March at Canyon Lanes in Cabazon. He said he shoots for 30 to 35 entries.

The tournament is open to eligible bowlers 60 and older. Women can participate beginning age 55.

Sanders repeatedly has urged top-caliber bowlers to move out of their league box and take a whirl with his tournaments. The WCST has attracted some of the premier bowlers in the West, including Eric Forkel, a five-time Professional Bowlers Assn. tour champion and the late Barry Gurney, a standout on the PBA senior circuit.

Says Sanders: “Every bowler cannot be a touring tournament bowler. But if you bowl in league play and carry a decent average, and with our organization of being age 60 or older, you should try at least one time to bowl our WCST tournaments.”

Bowling has its up-and-down cycles and Sanders acknowledges that he has to change according to the times to make his tournament relevant and appealing.

“I’ve even tried standing on my head and that didn’t help,” joked Sanders, 82.

Still, he keeps trying. And he’s not going to quit trying to find the best formula to generate more interest in his venerable tour.

Sanders says he has no plans to stop the show, which attracts a plethora of 200-plus-average bowlers to his events.

How long will the tour continue?

“As long as I’m alive,” Sanders says.

FINAL ROUND OF BRUNSWICK INVITATIONAL SEES TWO TEAMS GET OFF TO A 5-0 START

DOWNEY – Four teams have clinched their spots in the Brunswick Invitational playoffs this season. Those four teams will battle amongst each other of the final eight weeks, bowling two weeks on each of the four patterns. The rest of the teams remain alive for the final two spots in the playoffs. One will earn it by winning the fifth round, and the other will win the wild card by having the most total wins of any team that isn't a round winner. So, after 28 weeks of competition, the standings have started over one last time in the final push for the post-season.

Sysco took on **Buddy's Bowling Supply** on the top pair of lanes featuring round winners. Sysco went into the night with a five game lead over their nearest competitor for total wins heading into the night. The hole only got bigger for Buddy's Bowling Supply, as they dropped four of five games to start the round. Sysco took the first game by 60 pins. They dropped the second by well over 100 to fall behind in total pins. Sysco stormed back in the third, winning 744-672, regaining their lead for totals to take the match. Paul Barraco led the pair, topping Sysco with 217-204/586.

The other match between round winners pitted **J.A.T.** against **Cal Bowl**. This was the only match of the night that ended with a 3-2 score, and it fell in favor of J.A.T. Cal Bowl took two of the three games, but only by a total of 39 pins. J.A.T. won the middle game only, but did it in impressive fashion, 815-613. That was more than enough margin to earn the points for total pins. Larry Campbell topped J.A.T. with a 221/552. David Yamauchi was right behind with 215/549.

Forest Lanes and **Herzog Insurance** battled on the next pair. Going into the night, these were the top two teams in total wins that had yet to win a round yet. Forest took the first game, 704-654.
