Deloris was a member of the Los Angeles WBA; the Los Angeles "600" Bowling Club and prided herself in remaining competitive by participating in the local, state and national tournaments. Deloris is survived by her sister LaVaughn, her daughter Kelli, son-in-law Brent Gill; her four grandchildren; two nieces Sharyl Minnis and Kim (Raymond) Scales; four nephews Marc and Anthony Minnis, Kenneth and Bryan Jennings; sister-in-law Frances Douglass Cottrell and brother-in-law James R Douglass, as well as a host of other relatives and friends.

Deloris was a member of the Board of Directors of our Los Angeles "600" Bowling Club and in her honor and on behalf of all our members, I will be presenting a \$50 check to the BVL Committee at the CWBA Convention Meeting May 22nd at the Pacific Palms Conference Resort, City of Industry.

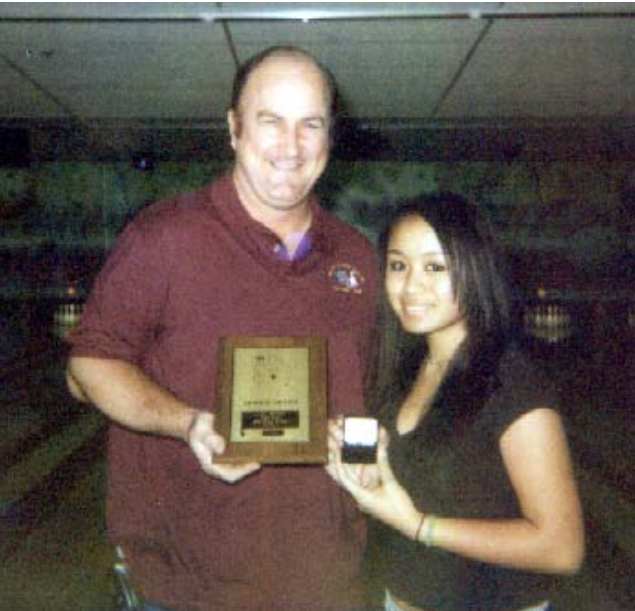

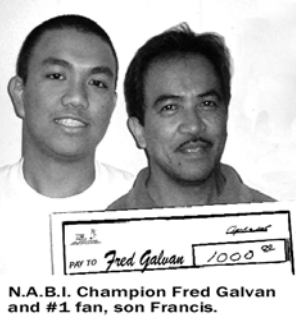
Galvanized!

Rose hits \$3,090 Match Game Pot

Other Pots carry over to La Habra “300” Saturday (Early Event)

WEST COVINA—Mark Wayman, gentleman to the core, certainly bowls well at West Covina Lanes. He performed superbly, winning his second ABTA Title and his second at West Covina Lanes. A nice \$1,100 top prize downing the top seed Bret Rose in the title game made for a nice win.

In our return to West Covina, Mark topped a nice turnout of 209 entrants (four squads only) at the popular Center. The bowlers produced great cut scores of +107 for the men, and +59 for our lady bowlers. Due to the nice turnout, we had 55 bowlers advance to the semis. We also added Super Seniors Javier Avila, Lonzell Burnett and Karen Sargent to the semifinals.

The bowlers took to the lanes in hopes of advancing to the top 16 single elim finals. Leading the Semis was Big Bret Rose with his big +171. 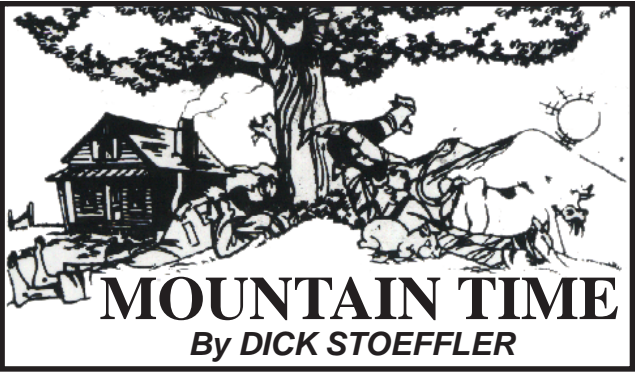

LAS VEGAS, NV. On March 28, Sports Illustrated graced bowling with a single paragraph., 121-Word essay about Liz Johnson’s monumental second place finish in the PBA Banquet Open. With possible intervention from above, SI “discovered” that ... good grief ... a WOMAN barely missed winning a MEN’S professional title, thus on April 4th they found room for more on her astonishing performance.

All of which caused me to write the SI Editor...a message which will never see the light of day... it is too long and too critical of the author. So let me offer it to you for review:

“LETTER TO THE EDITOR:

The ecstasy of it all! Imagine: “BOWLING” received SI mention on consecutive weeks! (Mar. 28 & Apr. 4.) Why? A professional woman. bowler, Liz Johnson, basically did the impossible when she not only qualified in a “rabbit squad” shootout, but also “made the cut” in the PBA (Banquet Open) Tour event, and, went on to finish second in the ESPN televised finals’. This unbelievable accomplishment rated a one paragraph., 121-word mention, March 28. THAT, had it been accomplished or. the PGA Tour by Annika Sorenstam or other female golfer, would have received a cover and six pages inside plus another Rick Reilly piece. By April 4, SI must have had an “oops,” and discovered Liz Johnson’s feat was MAJOR, responding with two-thirds of a page about her brilliant effort, which noted she was a long-time member of the now defunct PWBA Tour. But the dunderhead coverage suggested she had won 11-titles in the PWBA league. No, it Was NOT a LEAGUE, you twit, it was a PROFESSIONAL TOUR ... like the LPGA or the PGA or the PBA. While top pro’s in each tour are equally talented athletes tho’ unequally compensated, the degree of difficulty in each sport is enormous at the pro level. You’d think the sport that has 70-million participants on a yearly basis would get a little more ink, especially during the 20-week PBA run. But ... thanks for the blurbs ...even if it took a great lady to get it... league or not.”

* SI has some fine writers, but alas, not too versed in hurling a bowling ball.

* On April 3, the PBA Talkathon and Advertiser Show; alias the PBA “Denny’s World Championship” began at 10am and finished at 11:45am, running 15—minutes overtime on ESPN. The telecast featured THREE-games of bowling! ONE-HOUR-AND-FORTY-FIVE MINUTES for THREE-games??? You’ve got to be kidding! (On April 10 they did much better ... five minutes extra was all that was needed!) As I’ve mentioned in the past, my partner Dick Holst and I produced 344 ONE-HOUR shows featuring So. Calif.’s finest; during which we showed three-games in a live program, included an opening and closing segment, got in all the advertising, had fewer time-saving strikes due to the conditions in the 1960’s... yet we got it done in the allotted time frame. In prior years, the PBA has always managed FOUR-GAMES in 90-minutes.

This season the PBA is sadly replete with more drivel and inane non-bowling blather and trick-shot goofiness when people tune in to watch the greatest bowlers in the world and come away sadly short-changed. What can be done to restore this once excellent sports show to its former glory...some might call it the “pre-Steve Miller era,” when gimmicks did not over-shadow the super stars bowling as the game is meant to be played ... which is not tossing a ball thru the legs of chairs, or some idiotic thing? Here’s a couple of easy-to-accomplish ideas to get back the viewers we’ve lost and keep the one’s we got, and to generated a host of new fans:

1) Dump the two announcers. You really only need one GOOD one. (Vin Scully has been a great solo act for years.) How about Marshall Holman, a proven commodity as a bowler and announcer, for next season?

2) Bowl two one-game matches to determine the two finalists, make the title duel a two-game, total pinfall slugfest.

3) Dump the “sideline reporterettle.” It is simply more blather.

4) Bury the “trick shot” lunacy. (If it is such a big deal to the Seattle PBA leadership, put it on as a half-hour separate show for after-midnight TV.

5) Forget all the technical jargon about the lane oil. Mention which pattern is being used, and remind the viewers how the oil “moves” with each shot.

6) Then the perfect remedy for fairness: Use lanes 1 & 2 for ALL practice before the show and between games. All actual match games would be rolled on lanes 3 & 4, which would be oiled prior to bowling, and properly dressed between EACH match, easily accomplished during the endless advertising “breaks” in the competition. The first ball any player rolls on that pair counts! No more excuses. Fresh oil for every match.

7) Have the PBA brass re-read above six items until they get them memorized, which means ... getting it right. We got more... let them absorb this, for now!
