RENO-The USBC convention is scheduled for April27-May 1 in Reno. Membership has been waning at an alarming rate and something must be done to stem the tide.

In order to generate added revenue, the USBC board of directors decided to permit bowlers to drink during the USBC National Championships. The decision did not sit well with bowling purists. Besides that, it will do nothing to increase membership and it is doubtful if the sale of liquor can generate enough revenue to make it worthwhile.

It's time for a change of policy. We NEED to do something different, something refreshing to increase membership o four or five million sanctioned bowlers. However, it will require an all-out effort and total unification of the USBC, BPAA and principle integers of the industry. And what better time to start than this year's USBC convention. In Reno, April 27-May1. For too many years, we have been depicted in sport circles as a bunch of beer guzzlers with towels dangling from our hip pockets. To borrow a slogan from Phantom Radio, we need to do something to "Save Our Sport" It's continued on page 6

LAS VEGAS—Mike Clemence (Las Vegas), won his 3rd WCST Championship in the Regular Division at the Silver Nugget Lanes, in N. Las Vegas, NV. On Saturday, in the qualifying, Frank led the nearest bowler going into this 6 man finals, by 235 pins. The rest of the field closed up fast, as he lost his 1st two matches, and the rest of the finalists picked up over 100 or more pins on him.

Eric Forkel, actually passed him by 30 pins, after Game #4. Eric at the beginning of the finals, 223 pins down to Mike. John DeBenedetta, and Joe Wilhite closed in on Mike & Eric, along with Tom Spigelmoyer gaining ground, then going into the position round, it looked liked a horse race with all bowlers trying to finish in the highest place possible.

Gary Emerson, although finishing in the last place of the finals, bowled the highest scratch for the 6 bowlers with a 1407. It shows you how close the finish was. Mike ended up winning by 54 pins, due to his best game of the finals of 258, beating Eric Forkel's 217. Eric's loss dropped him to 4th place, with John Debenedetta ended in 2nd, while Joe Wilhite, finished in 3rd place. Joe also rolled a 300 game in the qualifying on Saturday. A difference of only 75 pins separated 2nd to 6th. A total of 00.00 was out for 6 checks, as the Regular Division, bowlers. We are looking to build this division again with the age eligibility, dropping down to 40 years old. 38 Super Seniors, entered, with a pay-off of \$5,435.00. A total of 12 checks paid out. For 5 tournaments this year, a total of \$44,145.00 has been paid out, and for 303 tournaments, a total of \$3,520,226.00 paid out. 27 bowlers for the 5 game singles sweeper last Friday. Thanks to the Silver Nugget Lanes, for being our host, and thanks to Mr. Joe Chattin, for doing the brackets, and to ShellyWooley for all her hard work, getting scores and posting.





great to feature Glow and Cosmic Bowling but this does nothing to increase membership...unless we can succeed in signing up many of these recreational bowlers.

We can begin with a rallying cry of "Strive For Five Drive"; that is a goal of five million members. The USBC needs to increase income in order to operate properly. This can be done in several ways. But an increase in membership is the first step. It is the primary goal, a goal that can be reached. Here is a six-point plan to jump- start the project:

1. Seek a dues increase, even if only for one or two dollars. This will not increase membership but it will add dollars to the treasury. Those who object to this slight raise at such a ridiculously low rate should try to buy memberships for golf or tennis associations.

2. There are thousands upon thousands of seniors who are not sanctioned in every state. Give seniors a "senior" discount, even as low as two dollars. Two dollars times whatever number of unsanctioned seniors can run up a tidy sum. This is one area where the USBC and the bowling proprietors must absolutely work hand-in-hand. It would benefit both sides. Perhaps a few free games of practice at specified hours would be an incentive.

3.Entice youth bowlers with lower sanction fees. Also offer some sort of incentive to junior bowlers for soliciting new members. This could add additional bowlers to the membership.

4.Select committees in all areas to canvas neighborhoods, private clubs, churches, and businesses and present the advantages of belonging to an elite sports/recreational group. I'm sure that most proprietors have these programs on their agendas ... implemented by their employees. Nonetheless, a concerted effort by ardent bowlers and proprietors could double or triple the possibilities of added membership.

5. Explore possibilities for a USBC lottery for members only. Bowlers are a different sports breed. They may object to a dues increase but willingly gamble on anything. Each state has its own gambling regulations and many states do not allow gambling. A lottery would need similar recognition from ever state and each state would want a hunk of the money. Nevertheless, it's worth a try.

6.Concentrate on soliciting new members during the Glow-Bowling/ Cosmic Bowling events held on weekends throughout the country. Demonstrate the advantages of "belonging" to a league.

A big portion of these incentives would be in the form of free games by proprietors. But it would be worth the price. MANY proprietors offer free games to "regular" customers. These freebies are all contingent on slow periods of operation and are hardly costly. Some short-sighted proprietors will refuse to "give away" any of their business. But is this not promotion? Can anyone doubt that Denny's gave away millions of Grand Slam breakfasts during Super Bowl week? The dirty little secret is they made up for it in charging for coffee... anywhere from \$1.95 to \$2.25 per cup. How about all the give-away and coupon promotions and "early bird menus" offered by many topnotch restaurants. Look at the never-ending promotions offered by Burger King, McDonalds, Del Taco,

Taco Bell, and so many other major corporations? My wife Brenda and I are regular Del Taco customers on Tuesday afternoon specials of three hefty tacos for \$1.29. ...a great buy! But if you want a drink, you pay the full price. It's called PROMOTION. And these corporations are far larger than the BPAA. In addition, these food establishments have to spend money for their give-aways. Proprietors need only furnish a playing field at his/hers bowling center during the dullest hours of operation. As a matter of fact, many proprietors feature bargains on lineage, beer, and other specials from the food concessions during dull hours of operation.

Is this a pipe dream or just a figment of my imagination? NO matter what, something MUST be done to save our sport.

The rallying cry at this year's USBC convention should be "Strive For Five"!



HALL OF FAMER JOINS ELITE CLUB **AT USBC OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS**

RENO-United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer Les Zikes of Palatine, Ill., has a bowling resume filled with accomplishments at the USBC Open Championships, and he added another milestone to his legacy at the National Bowling Stadium on Thursday night.

The 75-year-old right-hander entered the 2010 USBC Open Championships needing just 272 pins to become the newest member of the tournament's elite 100,000-Pin Club, and he got there in the seventh frame of his second team game. As always, his wife, Mary Cay, was by his side, and he was joined on the lanes by his granddaughter Cathy Kipp and his son, Lyle.

Zikes posted games of 171, 178 and 150 for a 499 series as he became the 12th bowler in 107 years of tournament competition to eclipse the 100,000-pin mark. Late USBC Hall of Famer Joe Norris of San Diego tops the all-time pinfall list with 123,770.

"Tonight was very special," said Zikes, who is the proprietor of Beverly Lanes in Arlington Heights, Ill. "I was hoping to bowl better for my teammates, but it was a big thrill. I only needed 272 pins to get to 100,000, and for a minute, I thought it was going to take me all three games to get there. I do feel very proud and very fortunate to be able to bowl for that long.'

Zikes began his Open Championships journey at the 1950 event in Columbus, Ohio, as a curious 15-year-old. Just 12 years later, he claimed the first of his six titles as he helped Strike 'n Spare of Chicago to the top spot in Regular Team at the 1962 tournament in Des Moines, Iowa. He added another Regular Team title in 1963 and Regular All-Events and Team All-Events crowns in 1964 to become the only bowler in history to win in three consecutive years.

The hall of famer later took home the Classic Singles title in 1975 and Classic Team in 1977. He also is a two-time Professional Bowlers Association national champion and a three-time winner on the PBA Senior Tour.

Over the years, Zikes also found international success, winning gold medals at the 1963 and 1967 World Championships and the 1964 Pan American Bowling Confederation Championships.

"I have had a lot of milestones," Zikes said. "To win three consecutive years against that many bowlers, you have to be at the right place at the right time. I have had so many big thrills, and tonight, achieving 100,000 pins and receiving a crystal pin was another one for me. I am so lucky to have been at the right place at the right time. Someone has been looking out for me.'

Although Zikes has made 58 Open Championships appearances, every year seems like his first.

"I still get goose bumps when I walk down Center Aisle," Zikes said. "When a team walks down the Center Aisle, they may act nonchalant, but they are really nervous. There is something about this tournament that 70,000 bowlers look forward to. I still feel the butterflies when I walk down the aisle, and I hope I always will."

There aren't many milestones left for Zikes to achieve, but he does have his eye on making 60 Open Championships appearances. Only 13 bowlers have reached the 60-year mark.

"If I'm healthy, I will be back," Zikes said. "The last few years, I have had a few physical problems, which has not allowed me to practice like I normally would. I feel pretty good right now, and if I feel this good next year, I will be back. So if I am healthy, I hope to reach 60."

Zikes closed out his 2010

tournament campaign with 581 in singles and 513 in doubles for a 1,593 all-events total. In 58 years on the championship lanes, he has knocked down 101,321 pins for a career average of 199.8.

Mike DeVaney (O'Neill went spare, four-bagger while DeVaney went four-bagger, spare) heading into the second half, with each of the other players holding onto a chance to qualify for the final.

With O'Neill coasting to a 255 score, the second five frames came down to a battle between Duke, Page and De-Vaney for the second spot in the final. Duke's chances were ended when he failed to strike out on the pattern he'd won on during the season, as his first shot in the 10th checked up early leaving a 9-pin on a tripped-4 hit for 213. DeVaney squandered his early four-bagger with a big-four in the 7th, then also failed to strike out on Cheetah when his first pitch in the 10th also hooked high, leaving him with 217.

Page, who actually went third in the rotation, had posted a respectable 223 score when he overcame some issues on the Shark and Chameleon by finishing with a late hambone in frames 7-10.

The score (unlike Anthony Kim's late heroics at the Masters) held up and Page, like fellow lefty Phil Mickelson, punched a ticket into the finale.

This five-frame showdown saw Page continuing his struggles on the Shark, as he missed the headpin for the second time in three shots (his other shot left a 3-4-7-9, which he converted). Page was able to right the ship, however, following his frame one spare with strike, spare strike.

O'Neill threw a quick double, then a nine-spare, but pitched one wide on Viper for a difficult 1-2-4-10 washout. After failing to convert, the best he could do in the end was post 104 with three strikes on the Cheetah, which he did.

He then hummed his spare ball down the middle for the necessary count and grabbed the \$25K first-place check for his troubles (O'Neill collected \$13K for second). Overall, the telecast was a solid showcase for the PBA Experience program as well as the new USBC headquarters in Arlington, Texas and some in-show features provided us with a tantalizing glimpse of the new facility. Personally, I was disappointed not to be able to make the trip. I would have loved to throw a few shots with the "glasses cam" and make everyone seasick watching my head bounce up and down like a PDW bobblehead doll. Or check my grip pressure to prove, empirically, how much I actually squeeze the ball. And considering how golf's Masters ended a few hours later, Sunday was definitely a great day for lefties. 




