
death roll-offs.

In the first semifinal match, Silver Lake rolled four strikes out of the gate, but Brooklyn answered with a string of five strikes and clinched a 244-230 victory when Sean Rash and Parker Bohn III put together three strikes in the final two frames. Silver Lake anchor bowler Dick Allen could have given the Atom Splitters a 1-0 lead with a strike on his first shot in the 10th frame, but he left the 1-2-4-6-10 to end his team's hopes.

SEAN COCHRAN rolled the first eight hundred series (802) at Canyon Lanes in 2008



THE STATE OF BOWLING

A DISCUSSION WITH LEGENDARY HALL-OF-FAMER, CAROL MANCINI

Editor's note: Bowling has seen many changes over the years. With the number of league bowlers in steady decline, I thought it was time to discuss the situation with someone who's knowledge and opinion I highly respect. Unfortunately...... only Steve showed up.

Carol: Well Steve, I'll keep this simple. Over the years, do you think the changes made to our sport have made it a better?

Steve: Better is in the eyes of the beholder. While certain aspects of bowling are very different today, the game itself remains intact. All things evolve; bowling is no exception. In some ways it's better, but in others it's not. Change is a double-edged sword.

Carol: What do you mean? Changes are either good or bad.

Steve: Like I said, it depends on your point of view. If we examine all the changes, I'm sure we can find positives and negatives for all of them.

Carol: Okay, let's start with electronic scorekeeping. Hasn't that corrupted our sport beyond repair?

Steve: Corrupted? That's pretty strong language. You must not like it very much.

Carol: I really don't! But what do you think of it?

Steve: Personally, I......

Carol: Oh, never mind! Here are my thoughts about those monstrosities! I HATE 'EM!!! How are kids supposed to learn about bowling without learning to keep score?

Steve: On the other hand, those "monstrosities" make accurate record-keeping much easier and less expensive for everybody. Just ask your friend, Lucy Seiple or any other league secretary.

Carol: I still hate them! Understanding scoring is an important part of this game! Beginners should start like we did; with pencil and paper!

Steve: But think of all the trees that have been turned into housing and furniture instead of scrap-paper in a landfill. That's good for businesses and the environment.

Carol: GRRRRRRRR

Steve: Okay! Just for you, we'll put Auto-Score in the "BAD!" column......

Carol: Absolutely!

Steve:but I doubt it has anything to do with the declining number of bowlers.

Carol: I disagree. I'll bet there are lots of old-timers who would love to come back and roll a few games, but don't because they can't figure out how to use those things!

Steve: Good point, but kids don't have a problem with them. Maybe some bowl because they don't have to learn to keep score. Maybe pencil and paper should be optional.

Carol: "H.. E.. double-hockey-sticks" must be freezing over! I just agreed with you about some-

and eight PBA50 Tour titles to his credit. Boresch, who was inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame in 2012, has won three USBC Open Championships titles.

"The opportunity to represent my country is a great honor," said Learn, who has nearly \$1.4 million in career PBA earnings. "I have done many things in our sport, but bowling for Team USA has always been something I have desired to be a part of."

Vidad, who has won nine gold medals at the Tournament of the Americas for the United States, won the 2011 USBC Senior Queens and the Senior Women's U.S. Open in 2013 and 2014. Sandelin, a 10-time Team USA member who has won numerous international medals for her country, won the USBC Senior Queens in 2008 and 2013.

Johnson, a member of Team USA in 2008, has won 25 professional women's titles, including five majors, while Romeo is an 18-time professional tour winner and won the Senior U.S. Women's Open in 2012.

Sandelin, Johnson and Romeo are also members of the USBC Hall of Fame.

"There is no higher reward than to represent your country and wear red, white and blue," Vidad said. "There is no dollar amount that can equal that of a medal hanging on your neck and the national anthem play-

Countries from around the world will compete in the World Bowling Senior Championships and will battle for medals in five events - singles, doubles, team, Masters and all-events. All participants must be age 50 or older to be eligible.

Koivuniemi and Chris Barnes gave Silver Lake a temporary 12pin lead in the seventh frame, but Craig Nidiffer's 4-6-10 split helped Brooklyn get back in the game. The match came down to the 10th frame where Allen threw three strikes to lock up a 204-192 decision and send the match into a roll-off where his strike gave Silver Lake the win, 10-9, after Bohn left a 10 pin.

It was a match where Silver Lake manager Mark Baker front-loaded his lineup with proven stars Koivuniemi (15 career titles) and Barnes (18 titles), followed by Nidiffer (no title), Tom Daugherty (one title) and Allen (three titles) because "Mika and Chris throw the ball the straightest," Baker said. "I thought the lane condition would break down more than it did."

The surprising lineup put Allen in position to deal with the 10th-frame pressure, but it was situation he embraced.

"In the first game, I picked up the wrong ball," Allen said of his five-count shot in the 10th frame. "But I got loose and picked up the right ball the next time, and that was the key.

"I knew (the roll-off) shot was good when I let it go," he added. "I like being in that position. I want to be there. That's what makes you a better bowler."

In the second semifinal match, Pittsburgh started with a pair of single-pin spares followed by a string of five strikes, running away with a 234-197 win. But game two also turned into a struggle for both teams to throw back-to-back strikes. The Jack Rabbits filled every frame, but managed only two strikes. L.A. X got the lead when Sweden's Martin Larsen, Australia's Jason Belmonte and England's Stuart Williams threw consecutive strikes in the middle of the game, and held on for a 202-190 decision to send the match into sudden-death.

In the roll-off, Pittsburgh's Wes Malott (4 pin) and Belmonte (10 pin) bowled first and tied, 9-9. Pittsburgh's Ryan Ciminelli and L.A. X's Williams each threw strikes. On the third roll-off shot, Larsen struck and the Jack Rabbits' Osku Palermaa left a 10 pin to send L.A. X into the Elias Cup finals.

That's why you practice hour after hour, and travel so much, and leave your family – for moments like this," Larsen said. "It's great when you do it for yourself, but it's five times more fun when you do it for your team."

Next Sunday's Elias Cup title match will consist of singles, alternate-ball doubles and Baker trios matches – each worth one point - and a Baker team match that will be worth three points. If the match ends in a 3-3 tie, the title will be decided in a one-ball sudden-death roll-off.








Fresno State Bulldogs Men's Team Brings Home the Carlson Cup

Bowlers Deeply Saddened at Announced Closing of Mission Hills Landmark

MISSION HILLS — It's time to mourn the passing of yet another San Fernando Valley bowling center.

This time it's Mission Hills Bowl, which will be closing May 31 after a run of nearly 41 years. Bill Mossontte, the managing partner of Mission Hills Bowl, made the surprise announcement to about 25 of his employees last week and then wrote a first-person story in the California Bowling News explaining his action.

It was an insurance and affordability issue, wrote Mossontte, who owns varying ownership stakes in many other Los Angelesarea bowling centers, including Corbin Bowl in Tarzana.

"We are faced with spending a couple of hundred thousand dollars to do electrical and plumbing upgrades to the 65-year-old building or we have been informed our insurance will be nonrenewed," Mossontte wrote.

He added that it "wasn't possible to continue" with just a "few years remaining on our existing lease and no chance at a new lease."

The closing represents a devastating blow to about 1,100 bowlers who participate in league play at the north San Fernando Valley bowling center and are faced with scrambling to find a replacement center.

"This is home. It's always been home," said Mike Brandt, who has rolled five perfect games and has been a regular league player at Mission Hills Bowl for more than 20 years.

"You could come down any time and see your friends. And the [center's] personnel are always terrific. People are always coming by who you could relax with and have a good time. The pro shop's Rusty [Bryant] and Karl [Kurtz] – they just don't get better than that."

Brandt's wife, Francis, echoed those sentiments.

"It's like my second home – with no reservations," she said, smiling. "We're going to miss it."

Only six years earlier, another iconic bowling center closed –AMF Rocket Bowl in Chatsworth. That landmark had been in business for 47 years. The closing of Rocket Bowl – known as Comet Bowl when it opened in 1962 – represented a similarly heavy blow to players.

After the closing of Rocket Bowl, Keith Kitti spoke of his sadness of losing a treasured facility – much the way Mission Hills Bowl players are now feeling.

"The center was part of the Golden Age of bowling," said Kitti, who was Rocket Bowl's facility manager when it shut. "And it just added another chapter to the end of the era. It wasn't so much a business as a gathering of friends. It was a watering hole of sorts. It was a place where the same people gathered for 52 weeks a year and they would come not planning to spend a dime as much as to engage and talk."

The 24-lane Mission Hills Bowl is among about 25 Valleyarea bowling centers to shut in the past 30 years.

It's common knowledge that bowling centers have been closing every year across the country because of the financial difficulties they face.

Only two years ago, Bowlmor swooped in to rescue the huge AMF Bowling Worldwide chain from bankruptcy. At the time, Bowlmor was a chain of six upscale bowling houses known for its Las Vegas-style sports look and laneside food and drink service.


Bowlmor was the only company willing to bid on AMF, which had fallen into bankruptcy for the second time in 10 years.

Tom Shannon, now the chief executive officer, chairman and president of Bowlmor AMF, has said that if Bowlmor had not entered the picture, AMF would likely have been forced to sell its bowling centers – or would have closed its facilities.

So financial conditions have been crimping the style of many bowling houses. Many of the Mission Hills Bowl staff members and players had suspected that its beloved center was running out of time

David Critchfield, who works at Mission Hills Bowl as a customer service manager, has been with the facility for 20 years. He said he was not totally surprised when Mossontte announced that the facility was planning to close.

"We knew it would be sooner or later," he said. "We just didn't think it would come this quickly."

"It's a very sad and emotional day for me. It's been 41 years of my life."

So said Bill Mossontte, the managing partner of Mission Hills

Bowl, which will be closing May 31.

Mossontte launched the bowling center on Sepulveda Boule-

vard in the north San Fernando Valley on Aug. 16, 1974. Since then, the bowling center has enjoyed many highlights and has served some of the top bowlers in the area and nationwide.

For a 25-year period, the bowling center grabbed national at-

For a 25-year period, the bowling center grabbed national attention when it hosted a Western Women's Professional Bowlers tournament on an annual basis.

"We were very successful at it and stopped about three or four years ago when participation was dwindling," Mossontte said.

The biggest names in women's bowling took part in that tournament, which included United States Bowling Congress Hall-of-Famers Tish Johnson and Robin Romeo.

Both of those bowlers, incidentally, have used Mission Hills Bowl as their home bowling center and have rolled numerous perfect games and 800 series there.

Another bowler who made a name for himself at Mission Hills Bowl was Bryan Alpert, who bowled a 299, 300 and 800 series with each hand in the 1996-97 season. That means that Alpert rolled in that one year a 299 left-handed and right-handed and the same for a 300 and 800 series.

Alpert, now the manager of Corbin Bowl in Tarzana, racked up all those scores at the Mission Hills bowling center.

"At the time it happened, I wasn't aware of the impact it would have," said Alpert," whose feat earned him recognition as the USBC ambidextrous record holder – a mark that stands today. He now has rolled approximately 30 800 series and 60 perfect games and bowls just as well with either hand.

Alpert called Mission Hills Bowl a "bowling landmark. It's an unusual bowling center because it was so full of die-hard bowlers. It was old school. Bowlers went there just to bowl . . . You have to tip your cap to the bowling center. It was 41 great years."

Eric Forkel, perhaps the best professional bowler to come out of the San Fernando Valley, also has been a well-known presence at Mission Hills Bowl. He sent an email expressing his disappointment about the news of the center's imminent closure.

"I spent a lot of time practicing there back in the '80s and '90s," wrote Forkel, now a Henderson, Nev., resident. "Bill was always a great proprietor and was a fan of scratch bowling. I hate to see the old centers go and all the nostalgia with it.

"Back in the '80s, my coach ran the Pro Shop there and I was there a lot. It seems like more and more that these great old places are going away, kind of like the dinosaurs, I guess. Wow, I guess that makes me a fossil too."

And Johnnie Englehart, arguably the top bowler in the L.A. area, has been a regular in Mission Hills Bowl's ultra-competitive Thursday night scratch league.

Mission Hills Bowl has hosted a West Coast Senior Tour tour-

nament six times between 2006 and 2012. "It's a great bowling center. Too bad it went down," said Dick Sanders, the WCST's owner and director.

Another feather in the cap of Mission Hills Bowl is its league program, which enlists a whopping 1,100 bowlers, many of whom are of the high-roller variety. "We're way up there [in league participation]," Mossontte said. "We have many more than other bowling alleys, especially in L.A. I've always been a big proponent of leagues."

One of the more heart-warming stories is that a Mission Hills Bowl league named the "Friday Foxes" is still alive and well. That all-women, Friday-morning league started when the bowling center opened. "The women were all in their 20s," Mossontte said, "and some [of the same] women are still there. We had a lot more then, but we still have 20-30."

The bowling center also has had a special-needs program and has made a special effort to help disadvantaged bowlers find a niche through bowling. "We've turned around a lot of lives through bowling," Mossontte said.

Bowling centers have been closing across the nation each year – especially the ones that don't own the land at their site. And that was the case with Mission Hills Bowl.

"The owner of [our] shopping center said when the lease is up, 'it's over,' "Mossontte said. "It's not viable to have a bowling center when you can have a building twice as big and collect eight times the rent.

"Land is very valuable and the worst thing you can put on land is a bowling center."

The Mission Hills Bowl lease still had four years to run, but Mossontte was faced with insurance issues that required several hundred thousand dollars in improvements.

"It was just pure economics," he said about the closing.

He expects the bowling center will be torn down and that the entire shopping center will be revamped.

Mossontte said his "No. 1 priority" now is to look after his employees. "No. 2," he said, is to find a new home for his bowlers.

"I want them to land somewhere," he said.

Mossontte remains the owner in varying stakes in many other bowling centers, such as Corbin Bowl and Valencia Lanes in the Santa Clarita Valley.

"It's been a pleasure to be a bowling proprietor and I'll continue to be one," said Mossontte, adding that "the best friends I've made have been bowlers – without question."



Tonight it was Billy Myers Jr. and Jared Lawrence leading the way with 258/720 & 279/709 respectively. They swept past Blizz Yogurt who were topped by David Cogswell with 685. Moving into 2nd place was Threadworks, who also gained a sweep, brushing aside Pino's Pizza 5-0. Eric Snow 278/733 & Butch Jackson 276/724 paved the way for the winners, while Joshua Tajiri shot 678 for Pino's.

Power House Video Games stayed in contention with a 4-1 win over Los Altos Trophies, despite 3 700 series from the Trophy troop. Lee Liu 278/754 and Nicole, not Eddie VanDaniker, 246 paced Power House, while Los Altos got strong efforts from PJ Yarns 719, Jonathan Huezo 714, and Buddy Lucas 710. Team DV8 overcame a game 1 loss and came back to win 4-1. Leading the comeback was Sam Hitchcock with 693, while Mikey Villarreal paced Herzog Insurance with 673.

Tonight's top scorer was Joe Jimenez who had 279/278/803 for CASAMIGO'S Tequila, but it was only good for two wins, as Alhambra Coin Center used a huge game 1 to maintain Total Series by 7 pins, and finish 3-2. George Gaucin led Alhambra with a pair of 268 games to end with 762. Linder Insurance swept past Tifco Industries 5-0 as it was Ladies Night on their pair. Michelle Tran 279/710 and Jamie Rovner 677 led Linder, while Kevin Gagnon also shot a 279 first game on his way to 726 to lead Tifco.

The night's highest scoring match occurred on 11-12 where the top two seeds squared off, going toe to toe for 30 frames. #1 Seed Keystone Lanes came out swinging, shooting a huge 1048 team game to build a lead over Erickson Foods, who shot quite well themselves with 970. The next game the scoring slowed, Keystone winning 912 to 858, but then Erickson came alive, two guys shooting 279 to pair with 246, 256 for a league high 1060 game to not only win that game, but coming from 132

Ramiro Garcia 300/760, Mike Mellick 275/725, and Kevin Jones 267/723 were the scorers for American Harvest, while GJC Services got a 707 from Joey Hanna. Cook's Bowling Supply also won 4 games as Steve Boring 268/689 and Matt Mosley 687 led the way.

Sidepot winners were Game 1 – 3 way tie: Kevin Gagnon, Mikey Villarreal, and Mason Sherman all with 279, Game 2 –Ramiro Garcia 300, good for both 2nd Game and 1st in Financial Advisor's pot. 2nd place was another 279 tie splitting \$100 were Joe Jimenez and Jared Lawrence. Game 3 Super Pot went to David Brown with 279, as all sidepots were won with 279 or 300. The TRUE ANCHOR award once again goes to Ricardo Baca with 482, as he was low "man" again.

Four weeks gone in Round 5, four weeks to go. Next week will be humbling after the past two, as we take on the US Open pattern, which typically turns out to be the league's toughest challenge. Honor scores are not likely to happen, but that won't deter the intensity as teams battle for position, or even a roll off spot.
