



Kent Rolls to Riches



Doug Kent capped a dream season with a win in his first Motel 6 Roll to Riches appearance.

COLUMBUS, Ohio—It's hard to top a season in which you win two Majors and set a career-high in earnings, but 18year Denny's PBA Tour veteran Doug Kent added to what was already a dream season.

Kent defeated Norm Duke, six-strikes-to-three, to win the third annual Motel 6 Roll to Riches special event and take home the \$150,000 winner-takeall top prize.

The final round consisted of a Race to Six Strikes, with the first bowler striking six times taking home the title.

Kent jumped out to the early lead, striking with his first shot after Duke had missed on his first. Though Duke struck with his next shot, he got bad breaks in his next two frames and Kent capitalized to take a 3-1 lead.

After missing with his next shot, Kent struck twice in a row to put Duke on the ropes, but he missed in the next frame to give Duke another chance. Duke could have pulled within one, but the 5-pin wobbled and stayed up and Kent struck with his next shot to win in his first Motel 6 Roll to Riches appearance.

"It's a great finish to a great year. You come in here against five of the best players in the world and you think, 'what are your chances against Norm Duke, Pete Weber and Walter Ray Williams Jr.?" Kent (Newark, N.Y.) said. "It's just an incredible finish to a great year."

Though Kent's win does not count toward official PBA earnings or titles and does not factor in a wide open PBA Player of the Year race, few have ever topped Kent's 2006-07 season in which he became just the sixth bowler to win two Majors in a season and took home a careerhigh \$200,530.

Kent advanced to the Race to Six Strikes by winning a oneball sudden death roll-off over Walter Ray Williams Jr. in the semifinals after they tied at 116 through six frames.

All Semifinal Round and Elimination Round matches consisted of six-frame matches with a maximum score of 180.

Williams could have won by one pin by striking in the 6th frame, but after doubling he left a 10-pin to send the match to an extra frame. In the roll-off, Kent struck while Williams could only muster an eight count.

The second semifinal featured a battle between the only two bowlers who have competed in all three Roll to Riches events. Duke (Clermont, Fla.) advanced with a 159-124 win over Tommy Jones in the first of the two Semifinal Round matches.

The event started with the Challenge Round, where bowlers participated in one-ball roll offs with the lowest score after each frame moving into the Elimination Round and the two surviving bowlers earning byes into the Semifinal Round. After all six bowlers struck on the first ball, Pete Weber (St. Ann, Mo.) and Jones (Simpsonville, S.C.) had eight counts on the second ball to drop into the Elimination Round.

The remaining four bowlers all got nine on the third ball and struck on the fourth ball, but on the fifth, Williams (Ocala, Fla.) and Wes Malott (Argyle, Texas) both left 7-10 splits to drop into the Elimination Round. Duke, who struck, and Kent, who had a nine-count, earned byes into the Semifinal Round.

In the Elimination Round, Jones eliminated Malott, 138-137, while Williams eliminated arch rival Weber, 138-115. Williams, who is 5-0 lifetime in title matches against his fellow PBA Hall of Famer, also eliminated Weber in last season's Motel 6 Roll to Riches.

Jowdy's Journal

Bowling....Life after death

Up until two years ago, the only news regarding the bowling industry had been of the "Gloom and Doom" variety.

League membership continued to tumble; bowling ball sales began to dwindle; the Ladies Pro Tour collapsed; entries for megabucks tournaments were at an all-time low; the PBA was struggling to keep afloat; and bowling centers were closing at an alarming rate.

BUT, for the past two years, the bowling industry has taken a miraculous turn for the better and the future looks much brighter. What happened to reverse this trend?

Perhaps the unification of all integers of the bowling industry

has begun to bear fruit.

Although the United States Bowling Congress has not fully succeeded in unifying all local associations into their organization, the overall cooperation of the USBC with the Bowling Proprietors Association of America and the Professional Bowlers Association has began to indicate an upsurge in the game's future.

While membership figures are lower than in the past, perhaps the figures released by the USBC are greatly misleading. For instance, over one million seniors bowl in unsanctioned leagues. These bowlers play a major role in the success of bowling establishments. Also, we must presume that perhaps an additional million bowlers participate in leagues that are not included in USBC membership


Although some bowling establishments continue to relinquish their prime properties to "Offers they can't refuse", more and more bowling centers are being erected to replace them with state of the art facilities that feature the latest innovations in equipment. In addition to this, the new 40 to 60 lane centers include other enticing means of entertainment, including theaters, game rooms, miniature golf, and great food facilities.

Despite the fact that USBC membership figures aren't overwhelming, bowling proprietors around the country have increased their overall income by open bowling, glow bowling, and private parties. For example, Mike Monyak, general manager for Coast Casinos in Las Vegas, (which include the Orleans, the Gold Coast, and Sunset bowling centers,) estimates that league bowling comprises about 22 percent of his total business. Birthday parties, business parties, and tournaments more than compensate for smaller league play. Even more surprising, Monyak's centers average around 40 lines per bed, a staggering figure when compared to the coveted 35 lines per bed during the game's booming era. .

Although I am not privy to other bowling establishment figures, these numbers seem to portray the overall picture in Las Vegas, undoubtedly the bowling capital of the world. For example, Frenchy Letourneau, editor/publisher of the Ten Pin Alley publication in Las Vegas, accepted a position at Santa Fe Lanes as Promotions Director about two years ago. In a recent conversation, Frenchy informed me he has conducted over 1500 parties during this period. Furthermore, he envisions no slowdown in the future for these activities and, although Santa Fe Lanes may be the leader in the "party' category, most other bowling centers in Sin City are profiting from their share of open bowling, glow bowling, and party bowling.

Currently, the most negative comments relative to any sport today are the numerous choices of recreational activity available to the public. Bowling must compete with movies, television, golf, tennis, soccer, football, baseball, basketball, and other forms of entertainment. Yet, with all these pastimes readily available in Las Vegas, bowling has more than held its own in a city that features the largest and most modern bowling facilities on the planet. Las Vegas investors continue to build more bowling centers, and, to date, no one has issued warnings of "over-building"

Fortunately, while the rest of the country's bowling atmosphere isn't quite as appealing as Las Vegas, the future of the game, under the combined efforts of the USBC, the BPAA, and the PBA, seems to be headed in the proper direction.






