Lynda Barnes Looks To Stay in Spotlight at USBC Queens

ARLINGTON, Texas -Lynda Barnes went on a major roll last spring, winning the United States Bowling Congress Queens and Bowling's Clash of Champions on national television. The victories made her an instant household name.

But her household already had a star - her husband, 2007-08 Professional Bowlers Association Player of the Year Chris Barnes. Lynda's success, of course, led to the inevitable question: Which Barnes is the better bowler?

Although the debate raged on the Internet and in bowling centers across the country, Lynda didn't quite understand the fuss. There's no doubt in her mind that Chris is the better of the two. And it's not even close.

When I hear people talking about it or see poll results, I just laugh," Barnes says. "I

consider myself a good bowler, but Chris is definitely one of the best."

With her husband by her side, Barnes blasted through the Queens field last year in suburban Detroit, going undefeated in match play and earning the top seed for the TV finals. She will look to defend her Queens title when the event takes place April 25-29 at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev.

In the final frame, she stepped up and delivered what she considers three of the best shots of her life to earn the title with a 215-195 victory over Amy Stolz of Castle Rock, Colo.

She used Chris' guidance and bowling savvy to help her advance through match play, but when it came time to step up in the championship match, Barnes was on her own. Chris was the color commentator for the television show, and watched from just a few feet away as his wife took the title.

"I could feel his energy and a great big smile coming from that direction," she says.

At age 41, Barnes, who also won the Queens in 1998, feels like she has finally made it to the top of the bowling world, even if it wasn't the traditional route of competing professionally that many of the bowlers of her generation took.

The stay-at-home mom of twin boys - Ryan and Troy, who turn 7 in May - is starting to get the feeling it might be time to back off a bit from bowling competitively.

"As I get older, it gets to be more work, and I think I always want to go out on top," she says. "I don't want to be one who hangs on forever. I think it's more fun to look back and think that I did it all, and I'm happy and fulfilled so that I can move on."

But before she moves on, Barnes has a little unfinished business. She, of course, has two titles to defend - the Oueens and the Clash. And there's one title that has always eluded her - the team gold medal at the World Women's Championships, an event the United States hosts in Las Vegas this July. "If we could win the team gold medal on our home turf this year, it would be the icing on the cake," she says. "I couldn't think of any better way to end my career on Team USA.'

The Queens kicks off with 10 qualifying games over two days before the field is cut to the top 100 for five additional qualifying games. The top 63 then advance to join Barnes in double-elimination match play, which begins at 1 p.m. April 27. The final five players will advance to the televised



"King of Bowling" Series Kicks Off Wednesday at 6PM on ESPN 2

LAKE WALES—Newlycrowned Professional Bowlers Association Player of the Year Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, steps back into the spotlight Wednesday night in a head-to-head battle as professional bowling returns to "prime time" in the first King of Bowling Powered by Amp Energy telecast.

A five-week series of onehour King of Bowling Powered by Amp Energy telecasts will air on ESPN2 at 6 p.m. Pacific on Wednesdays April 22 through May 20.

Each King of Bowling Powered by Amp Energy show will open with two of the top players from the 2008-09 Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour season bowling a one-game match for the right to bowl the reigning "King" for a \$10,000 prize. The winner of the "King of Bowling" match will return the following week where two new challengers will try to knock him off his throne.

Malott earned the throne for the opening telecast as PBA Player of the Year for the 2008-09 season. His opponent in Week One will be the winner of a match between Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla., and Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, who finished second and third, respectively, in the Player of the Year points race.

A highlight of the opening telecast will be a special appearance by ESPN's "Pardon the Interruption" co-host Michael Wilbon, who criticized Malott for not competing at PBA's GEICO Plastic Ball Championship in February. After winning the Etonic Marathon Open in the next Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour event, Malott responded to the controversy and issued the challenge with the resulting public feud playing out over several PTI shows.

Wilbon agreed to take on Malott in the upcoming April 29 and May 6 King of Bowling telecasts in a special challenge match.

Wilbon will have a 57-pin handicap and choice of bowling equipment while Malott will be using only the plastic ball allowed in the Plastic Ball Championship.

In subsequent weeks, the "King of Bowling" will face challenges from Patrick Allen and Mike Scroggins, Walter Ray Williams Jr. and Bill O'Neill, John Nolen and Rhino Page, and Brad Angelo and "wild card" competitor Parker Bohn III.

USBC Hall of Famer Patty Costello Dies in Pennsylvania

ARLINGTON, Texas -Patty Costello of Scranton, Pa., one of the most successful women bowlers in history, died Thursday at VNA Hospice at Community Medical Center after a valiant battle with pancreatic cancer. She was 62.

Born in Washington, D.C., daughter of the late William Joseph and Marjorie Moran Costello, Costello was one of the most dominant left-handed women in professional bowling in the 1970s and '80s when she won the majority of her 25 professional titles.

Despite the fact that she didn't take up the sport until she was 16, but she quickly made a name for herself after winning the 1970 Columbia 300 Open.

Among her victories were the 1976 Women's U.S. Open and 1985 Ladies Pro Bowlers Tour Tournament of Champions titles. In 1976, she won seven events, setting a record for most titles event in a ware California native Pat Costello, was named Woman Bowler of the Year by the Bowling Writers Association of America in 1972 and 1976.

Patty Costello was inducted into the Women's International Bowling Congress Hall of Fame in 1989 and she bowled her last professional tournament in 1993, finishing second in the WIBC Queens.

Should Barnes come away with another victory, she would become just the third woman to win three Queens titles, joining Millie Ignizio (1967, 1970 and 1971) and Wendy Macpherson (1988, 2000 and 2003). Costello, who frequently was confused with fellow competitor and right-handed bowling to a career with the Community Medical Center in Scranton, where she was a transport driver.



Great bowling by Robert Hernandez who was bowling well to say the least. Robert is a very nice man and surely could have won this one. Kudos!


Dom Laguardia is one of our Finest and Faithful members. He almost won title #2. Great bowling Dom and same to Don Eide and David Bartlett.



However she was chided into going and after being seated Joan quietly came up behind her and set down a setting of silverware wrapped in a napkin and said, "Make sure you bring it back!" Many said, "Joan was always ready, willing and able to give help. She answered questions, sent information and was ever available to chat making us feel like we were special." From Patti Green - "As I was reading about Joan's death I was thinking of Joan and Joan Feinblum in some of the skits they did over the years at state convention. She was always such a good sport and a really nice woman to deal with. She will be missed by all." Rosie Parker commented that Joan was a believer and staunch supporter of BVL." Lynn Graves said, "When I took over a committee she had she was so much help to me and made sure I had everything to work with making it so easy for me. She was a great and terrific person and has consistently been in my prayers." Leslie Spears - CWBA Secretary Treasurer commented, "I think everyone who was privileged to get close to Joan received something special. She was a perfectionist and dedicated worker at anything she did."

Although Joan was a private person in many ways, she touched people in a hundred ways and many said she would always have a special place in their heart. Joan Scharsch was one of the major engine parts that make for a well oiled machine. A valued employee, she retired from Advanced Document Concepts (formerly AB Dick) after 30 years.



National Deaf Bowling News Fisser's Two Teams Had Fun In **USBC Open Championships**

LAS VEGAS - Mark Fisser's two teams, West Coast Deaf and East Coast Deaf, were part of the 17,200 five-some teams entered in the USBC Open Championsips which started last February and will run til July in Las Vegas' Cashman Center. The two teams bowled last weekend, April 11-12; did not do well but had fun bowling together.

On Saturday afternoon East Coast bowlers outscored West Coast, 2854 to 2724, both totals will not cash in any prizes. The placing board shows Linds Limited of Milwaukee, Wis. at top with 3449 in the Regular Team Event. At the end there will be a very long list of cash prizes with maybe 2900 as low to cash.

Pacing the East Coast team was New York's Tom Cramer with 610, followed by Kevin Moran 593, James Morris 575, Josh Phelps 569 and John Fisher 507. Fisher, who is in his 9th USBC tournament, led West Coast with 573, followed by Carl Malucci 551, Robert Ellison 545, Mike Scharnow 537 and Daniel Vasquez Jr. 518.

On Sunday morning's Doubles and Singles events (sorry I do not have the D&S scores). Ohio's Fisher bounced back with 207 plus average in his D&S event 6-games to lead East Coast team with 1754 in all-events. Two hundred bowler Phelps (Ohio) followed with 1736, Moran (Maryland) 1732, Cramer (NY) 1714 and Morris (MD) 1506. The West Coast was led by Scharnow (CA) who also bounced back with 200 plus average for his D&S 6-games for 1738 all-events total, followed by Malucci (NV) 1736, Ellison (C) 1701, Fisser (CA) 1690 and Vasquez (CA) 1567. In Team All, which is important to show how the team works together, East Coast outscored West Coast, 8442 to 8451.

When interviewed by USBC public relations, hearing-impaired Phelps in his early twenties participating in his first USBC Open Championship said, "It's fun to come out here and bowl with the best of the best. This is a tough tournament with tough lane conditions. We are taking a step up from deaf association bowling and competing with some of the countries best bowlers. It was a cool experience, from walking down center aisle to hanging out with the guys." He also added, "Not many pepole know that there are a lot of really good deaf bowlers out there. That's why we are here and we will keep coming back." Well said! Next year's USBC Open Championship will be in Reno in the National Bowling Stadium. The tournament is not limited to good bowlers. There are two divisions, Regular Team with teams averaging 900 and over, and Classified Team with teams under 900. Both are scratch touraments, no handicaps issued. A 180 bowlers can get a team of four bowlers with 180 and under average entered in Classified Team. Deaf bowling history had deaf teams as Frank Gilardo's Gilardo Lathing and Herman Cahen's World Publishing Co. Both all deaf teams from Cleveland, OH bowling in old ABC tournaments as far back in the 1940's. This writer had his So. Calif. Deaf Traveling team with over 900 average entered in the 1964 Oakland ABC tournament. He also had a squad of 9 deaf teams in the 1972 Long Beach ABC tournament. The following year Angelo Coppola and his Syracuse (NY) Deaf Club had 13 teams entered on the opening squad of 1973 Syrcuse ABC tournament. This writer again had a team of NDBA officers entered in the 1977 Reno ABC. Don Warnick of the National Deaf Bowling Association organized the largest squad of 26 deaf teams for the 100th anniversary ABC tournament at Reno. Prior to Fisser's two teams entries, the National Deaf Masters Bowlers Association Director Billl Cozad had a couple years or so of two to 4 deaf teams entered.






