# The Perfect Game by Steve Felege

### THE STATE OF BOWLING Part 2 of 6

#### A DISCUSSION WITH LEGENDARY HALL-OF-FAMER, CAROL MANCINI

Editor's note: Last week's talk about the effect of electronic scoring on bowling membership was inconclusive. This week's topic is synthetic lanes.

Carol: Well, what do you think? Are they good or bad for the numbers of people who bowl?

Steve: That's a complicated subject.

Carol: Keep it simple.

Steve: Okay. Compared to real wood, synthetic lanes are superior in a couple ways. The surface requires much less maintenance and the lower costs help keep bowling affordable. That's good for bowlers and the businesses that rely on them. Second, for the first time in the history of this sport, surfaces are identical lane-to-lane, house-to-house, and state-to-state. That's good for the integrity of bowling.

Carol: But is that good or bad for league memberships?

Steve: Bowlers must recommit to leagues year after year. With that in mind, the new lanes are probably the best thing that ever happened to bowling.

Carol: That's quite a claim. Why do you say that?

Steve: Because wooden lanes were much more challenging. Like snowflakes, no two were perfectly identical. High boards, patchy lacquer, worn tracks and other surface defects were like a mine-field to a bowling ball. Bowlers had to navigate surface conditions while adjusting to the oil pattern on each individual lane. That was discouraging to some.

Carol: But how do you explain the fact that bowling was most popular when lanes were made of wood?

Steve: The popularity of bowling has little to do with lane composition. The psychology behind why people bowl is more important.

Carol: And that is....?

Steve: Bowling is about competition; competition is about self-esteem.

Carol: That doesn't explain why the numbers are declining. The competition is still there!

Steve: Bowlers compete for two things; championships and awards. On wooden lanes, a 700 series was rare and awards reflected that. Synthetic lanes provide the best surfaces on which to compete, but the plethora of perfect games and 800 series they produce has reduced the importance of those scores.

Carol: And your point is.....?

Steve: Bowling requires a large obligation of time and money, both of which are in shorter supply than ever. The Incentive to commit limited resources is diminished when, instead of rolling for a gold ring, the award for a stellar performance is a stainless steel trinket.

Carol: So you're saying synthetic lanes are good for the game but bad for retaining membership because achievements are less rewarding.

Steve: That pretty well sums it up, but there's one more point to make.

Carol: What's that?

Steve: Synthetic lanes provide bowlers higher scoring potential. While that's good for elite bowlers and keeps them coming back, seeing others shoot those scores is discouraging to those who don't know how to achieve them. Those are the bowlers who eventually leave and don't return.

Carol: How should that be addressed?

Steve: I wish I knew the answer to that question. All bowlers can improve. It isn't terribly difficult and the information needed to do so is readily available from multiple sources. Why so many settle for status quo is a mystery to me.

Carol: Well, do synthetic lanes go in the "Good" or "Bad" column?

Steve: Overall, I believe today's lanes keep more people bowling, by far, than the few that use them as an excuse to quit.

Carol: So we'll put synthetic lanes in the "Good for Membership" column. That gets us to a discussion about modern bowling balls.

Dean: No it doesn't! Time to say, "Goodnight!" folks! I have room for one column and you two want to take up the whole paper! Save something for next week! OKAY?!

team finale, 225-203, the Atom Splitters rallied from an early 10-pin deficit for a 236-215 victory to retain the Elias Cup. Allen started the come-from-behind victory with a strike in the fifth frame, and capped a string of six straight strikes with the first strike in the 10th frame to ice the title.

This is definitely the highlight of my career," the 36-year-old Allen said. "The whole situation of being chosen by (team manager) Mark Baker and Chris (Barnes) and Mika (Koivuniemi) to put me at anchor surprised me a little, but I like that position. They instilled a lot of confidence in me this week. It did a lot of good for me personally."

Heading into the Elias Cup finals, Allen had made clutch sudden-death roll-off shots to give Silver Lake victories in both the quarterfinal and semifinal rounds despite a stiff, sore neck sustained in his one-car accident the previous Sunday near his home in South Carolina.

"I was coming around a corner, swerved to avoid hitting a dog in the road, and lost control," he said. "I went into a ditch and hit a pole. I thought I was done for, but I got away with just some whiplash.'

His pain-in-the-neck was one issue, Allen said, but the loud, non-stop chanting and cheering by the Bayside Bowl fans didn't bother him at all. In fact, it actually made him feel at home.

The more you bowl on TV, the more loosened up you get," Allen, a three-time PBA Tour title winner, said, "but the crowd here was highly unexpected. Fortunately I'm used to that because back home, I practice with my buddies after the bowling center closes, and we crank up the music, and my buddies trash-talk non-stop, so bowling here was just like after-hours practice at home.

Allen admitted the crowd did influence his errant final shot in the Baker trios match, spoiling the team's bid for a 300.

"The crowd got me," he grinned. "They had been so loud, but in about my third step, they got quiet. I didn't expect that. In that little moment, it kinda got me. My fundamentals collapsed." The PBA Tour will resume competition May 9-17 when Fire-Lake Bowling Center hosts the preliminary rounds of the Oklahoma Grand Casino Hotel and Resort Summer Swing in Shawnee, Okla. The multi-event competition will include the Wolf, Badger, Bear and Oklahoma Open title events, followed by the King of the Swing special event. All finals will be held in the Grand Casino Event Center and will air on CBS Sports Network. Dates and times will be announced later.

## **PBA HALL OF FAMER JOHNNY PETRAGLIA RECEIVES BBIA INDUSTRY SERVICE AWARD**

The Billiard and Bowling Industry Association presented PBA Hall of Famer Johnny Petraglia with its Industry Service Award Tuesday night at the organization's annual meeting in Hilton Head, S.C.

Petraglia, the only player ever to win PBA national titles in six different decades, is currently competing on the PBA50 Tour - 50 years after making his debut in 1965. The 67-year-old lefthander from Jackson, N.J., has won 14 PBA Tour and eight PBA50 Tour titles; is one of six PBA Triple Crown winners; ranks 31st on the all-time PBA earnings list with \$1,249,250, and his a member of the PBA (1982) and USBC (2003) Halls of Fame. He also was the recipient of the 2010 BPAA Dick Weber Bowling Ambassador Award.

In addition to his sterling record as a competitor, Petraglia has been active for decades off the lanes in BVL and other charitable programs in support of United States military veterans. Petraglia served a tour of duty with the U.S. armed forces during the Vietnam War.

# Bohn Defeats Duke to Win PBA50 Pasco County Florida Open For Second Career PBA50 Tour Title

NEW PORT RICHEY — In a title match that featured two of the Professional Bowlers Association's all-time greats with 72 PBA Tour wins between them, Parker Bohn III defeated fellow Hall of Famer and reigning PBA50 Player of the Year Norm Duke Tuesday in the title match to win the PBA50 Pasco County Florida Open at Lane Glo Bowl.

Bohn, a 34-time PBA Tour titlist, won his second PBA50 Tour title by defeating Duke, a 38-time Tour winner, 263-222, in the title match. Duke, who also finished second in the Pasco County Open last season, was trying for his third PBA50 Tour title.

Bohn took the lead early in the match striking in the first three frames and after Duke opened in the second frame he was able to take command for good by throwing seven consecutive strikes to complete the match.

"We've bowled against each other many times during our careers," Bohn said. "Even though I knew I had things pretty well under control heading into the end of the match you can never let up against guys like Norm because if there's room for him to catch you he will. The strikes I had in the eighth and ninth frame were crucial because they put the pressure on him."

One of Bohn's concerns throughout the tournament



was dealing with humid conditions that could play havoc with his grip.

"It can be a challenge to get the right feel," Bohn said. "You can have a situation where you have to squeeze the ball to hold on or go the other way where the ball can hang in your hand. If you have either one of those situations you're not going to repeat shots. With the help of (Brunswick representative) Chuck Gardner we put a good game plan together with my equipment so then it was just a matter of me standing in the right place and hitting my target."

Bohn advanced to the championship match by defeating 10-time PBA Tour winner Bryan Goebel of Shawnee, Kan., who was trying for his first PBA50 Tour title, in the semifinal match 247-238.

In the opening stepladder match United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer Lennie Boresch Jr. of Kenosha, Wis., trying for his third title, defeated Hall of Famer and nine-time PBA50 Tour winner Walter Ray Williams Jr., 255-209.

In the second match Goebel defeated Boresch 227-192 to advance to the semifinal.

The PBA50 Tour travels to Spanish Springs Lanes in The Villages, Fla., April 18-21 for the PBA50 United Healthcare Sun Bowl In The Villages presented by Radical, the second stop of the 2015 season.
