Households, Viewers of **PBA on ESPN Increase**

SEATTLE—Denny's PBA Tour telecasts on ESPN during the 2007-08 season saw a five percent increase in average household audience and a four percent increase in total viewers from the 2006-07 season.

The 21 telecasts on ESPN averaged 745,000 households, up from 710,000 in 2006-07 - a five percent increase – and was a seven percent increase over the 698,000 average household audience in 2005-06.





On A Roll

A POINT OF REFERENCE

Would you like to be a bowling coach? Ask yourself this question: "What is my point of reference?" The answer will set you free. Not too long ago, I believed the bowling industry should try to train as many coaches as possible. I now believe that the bowling industry should re-examine who qualifies as a "Coach".

Look in bowling centers; you will see certified coaches wearing their 'colors'; sporting patches or logo shirts that signify that they have been certified to coach; but are they properly trained and qualified to coach the level of students they are working with?

In coaching training programs, there should be a 'performance' segment. Coaches would only be expected (allowed) to work with bowlers who have similar abilities as the coach. In other words, you would not see a coach who averages 150 working with kids who average 185 or better. This concept can be described as having a 'point of reference'

A coach who averages 150 cannot be expected to help a 185 average bowler with the techniques needed to carry the 10 pin, or adjust to lane conditions, or prepare for pressure shots in the final frame of a crucial match. Why? Because the coach has no point of reference for that information.

Before anyone gets upset and tells me that "one doesn't have to be a good bowler to be a good coach"...hear me out.

Here are the possible benefits of what I am proposing:

It would eliminate many of the 'wanna be' coaches; those whose egos are massaged simply because they get to wear the shirt or the patch and call themselves coaches. When these coaches step beyond their level of expertise, they do more harm than good. You can here it every Saturday in youth

programs around the country. Listen..."you're rushing the line"; "you're topping the ball"; and my favorite, "you're dropping your shoulder". When queried about what to do to avoid the above, the answer is often, "don't rush the line", "don't top the ball", and (for goodness sake) "don't drop your shoulder"

It would have coaches really coaching and passing on what they know...not what they think they know or should know.

People who were looking to be coaches might understand that not just anyone qualifies to be a coach. We will take all comers as assistants, or associates (come up with a label), but to qualify as a coach, one must demonstrate a certain amount of proficiency for performance in the sport.

Bowling can take a cue from other sports like basketball, baseball, football, and soccer. At the entry level, the coaches in these sports often come from a pool of interested parents and many others who have a love for the sport. This love for the sport very likely came from that person playing the sport as a kid themselves - a point of reference. Once these kids get to the ages of 12-13, the coaches start to take on a whole new persona. A much higher percentage of these coaches actually played the game in high school ... another level of performance qualification and an advanced point of reference.

As the kids get to high school age and then to college...check out the coaches. Now you have coaches who not only talk to the talk, but have walked the walk. They come from high school teams, collegiate teams and sometimes even from the professional ranks. Go to your local high school and check the background of each head coach of your main varsity sports.

And by the way...if your high school has a varsity bowling team, or even a club, check out the head coaches' credentials for that as well.

Of course, there are exceptions to every rule. Any person who wants to be a coach but cannot meet the performance criteria could apply for an exemption. Very few will apply because for the most part, they know they are limited. They don't want to embarrass themselves, nor do they wish to give students anything less than they deserve.

It has often been said that gifted athletes don't make the best coaches. In fact, great athletes often make poor coaches, many freely admit it. Maybe they expect it to be as easy for others as it was for them; maybe they know their own style (how they did it), but when trying to get others to do what they did, the results fall short.

The very best coaches often come from the ranks of those marginal athletes at the high school, collegiate and professional levels. The reason, I believe, is that they had to work harder to make it than the gifted, and along the way they experienced success and failure, but persevered. That experience provides them with a point of reference to help many other hopeful athletes in their chosen sport.

Certifying coaches who are not able to help beyond the most basic of introductory skills can undermine any youth program. We can fix the problem by bringing the skill level of our coaches up to a point where they can meet the challenges of their students.

If coaches really want to help the sport, they should either step UP, or step DOWN. In either case, the bowler and the sport benefits.
