Walter Ray Williams Jr. Wins PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open

Hall of Famer beats Sammy Ventura 288-205 in title match

CLEARWATER, Fla. – PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Florida, won the PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open Wednesday for his 12th career title on PBA's tour for players 50 and over, moving him into a tie for second on the all-time titles list with three other

In the first tournament of the 2019 season, the 59-yearold Williams beat finals top qualifier Sammy Ventura of Syracuse, N.Y., 288-205, in the title match at Maple Country Lanes to tie Tom Baker, Gary Dickinson and Dale Eagle on the all-time list. John Handegard holds the record of 14 PBA50 Tour titles.

Technical difficulties prevented the finals from airing live on FloBowling but the stream will be archived for later viewing on www.flobowling.com.

"I wasn't really bowling well in qualifying until I made some ball changes later in the tournament where I could play outside and go straighter to the pocket," said Williams, who had to battle all the way from the cashers round. "I started getting a much better ball reaction as the tournament went on. I was finally able to get to the pocket and then it was just a matter of getting all the pins to go

In the semi-final match, Williams, who qualified second for the finals, also dominated by beating 2017 PBA50 Player of the Year Brian LeClair of Albany, New York,

LeClair, the 2017 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open winner, started the finals by beating No. 4 qualifier PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke of Clermont, Florida, 10-9, in a oneball roll-off after tying the match 237-237. LeClair then went on to beat No. 3 qualifier Brian Kretzer of Dayton, Ohio, 238-213, to advance to the semifinal against Williams. Duke was trying for his sixth career PBA50 Tour title and Kretzer his second.

With his win, Williams, the PBA Tour's all-time titles leader with 47 wins, moved a step closer to becoming the all-time leader on both of PBA's national tours.

"If I'm going to challenge that record I'm going to need to get going," said Williams. "The senior tour keeps getting better and better which means it's going to be much harder to get the wins."

Williams' last win on the PBA50 Tour came in the 2017 USBC Senior Masters. He finished second three times in 2018 including the Johnny Petraglia BVL Open which was held at Farmingdale Lanes in Farmingdale, N.Y.

Ventura's second-place finish was his career best on the PBA50 Tour eclipsing his previous best of third in the 2017 Race City Open.

2019 PBA50 Power Rankings by Jef Goodger

2019 PBA50 Power Rankings: April 19, 2019

Ranking the top players on the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) 50 Tour throughout the 2019 season.

The first event of the PBA50 season showed us a lot. Steve Hoskins made it to match play in his first PBA-level event in 15 years, Sammy Ventura locked himself into a title match after a superb final-day performance and Walter Ray Williams Jr. collected his 12th PBA50 title.

Still, Norm Duke holds the top spot on our list.

Here are the power rankings following the PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open:

1. Norm Duke (previous ranking: 1)

Despite finishing fifth, Duke remains at the top of the power rankings due to an incredible qualifying-leading performance during which he averaged over 240. With two byes through the Matrix of Fairness, Duke qualified fourth for the stepladder and lost to Brian LeClair in a roll-off, finishing fifth. Such a scenario isn't enough to topple Duke on this list just yet.



2. Walter Ray Williams Jr. (3)

Williams had to battle through the entirety of the Matrix of Fairness, starting with cashers round, then both match-play rounds and finally two stepladder matches. He put up an impressive 18 games in a single day to claim the title, which is an amazing feat, especially when we consider he bowled more games that day than during all of full-field qualifying.

3. Brian LeClair (15)

A 12-place jump in the power rankings will be a hard record to beat but so is LeClair. He was ranked 15th last week due to uncertainty over his injury situation, but with an eighth-place qualifying score and third-place finish, LeClair instantly inserts himself as one of the week-to-week favorites.

4. Michael Haugen Jr. (2)

As usual, Haugen bypassed cashers round and the first round of match play. He qualified sixth but couldn't get much going in the second round of match play, ultimately finishing 11th.

5. Brian Kretzer (4)

Like Williams, Kretzer had to start with cashers round and make his way all the way to the stepladder finals. His 17game day ended with a loss to LeClair, leaving Kretzer in fourth place for his first event of the season.

6. Amleto Monacelli (8)

Even though Monacelli didn't make the top five in Clearwater, it feels wrong not to include him in the top five here. Maybe it is. He qualified third overall with nearly a 237 average but a 2-4 record in match play round two cost him a chance at the stepladder finals.

7. Lennie Boresch Jr. (10)

Boresch tied for ninth with Monacelli after qualifying 14th, requiring him to bowl the first and second rounds of match play. He's the defending PBA National Champion and has won three times in The Villages, including each of the past two years.

8. Parker Bohn III (5)

Parker Bohn qualified ninth, a mere 14 pins behind getting two byes through the Matrix of Fairness. Instead, Bohn had to bowl the first match-play round and, despite posting a 4-1 record, missed the top eight by 41 pins and ending his tournament. He always bowls well in The Villages and we can expect him to do so again next week.

9. Ron Mohr (6)

Mohr qualified for five stepladder finals in 2018 and won the PBA50 Northern California Classic for his 10th career PBA50 title. He also won the PBA60 Dick Weber Championship for good measure. Until he decides otherwise, he's one of the most dangerous players in every event.

10. Ryan Shafer (7)

Shafer wasn't happy with his performance in qualifying, but even having to start early with cashers round, Shafer advanced all the way to the final round of match play, then finished tied for sixth, a mere 30 pins off the show.

11. Pete Weber (13)

Weber qualified 24th, giving him the last spot to earn a bye past cashers round. During the first round of match play, Weber made a run at the top eight, but faltered late and didn't advance.

12. Steve Hoskins (14)

Hoskins ended his tournament one spot behind Weber in match play round one, immediately making his presence felt on the PBA50 Tour. He qualified 18th and averaged 224 in his first PBA-level event in 15 years.

13. Bryan Goebel (not ranked)

After full-field qualifying, Goebel was second overall with an average of 237. His ability to contend in every tournament on any condition is impressive, and we'll see him climbing the power rankings in the coming weeks. Unfortunately for Goebel, he was victimized by the Matrix of Fairness and came up 77 pins short of the stepladder.

14. Harry Sullins (12)

Although eligible for one of the extra eight spots for super seniors (players aged 60 or older), Sullins didn't need to take advantage of it as he qualified 50th, just inside the cut of 52 players. He couldn't get out of cashers round, but will likely contend in The Villages.

15. Joe Scarborough (NR)

Qualifying fifth and earning two byes into match play round two constituted a great start to the season for Mr. 900. Unfortunately, his 1-5 record in match play led to a 14th-place finish, but we'll see if his good start leads to more opportunities as the season continues.



Imperial Valley USBC Masters/Queens

EL CENTRO - It was a major undertaking from deep in the field, but David Granados didn't let the odds discourage him as the El Centro native went undefeated in winning his first Coyne Powersports Masters Bowling Tournament today.

The two-day tournament featured top bowlers in the county in a scratch bowling formula. "It's unbelievable. We bowled against some good bowlers," described Granados after the title match 446-438 victory against Gordon Belt. "But I had some lucky turns and it turned out great. The result was good."

Granados, the Singles Champion in the recently completed IVUSBC City

Open, was seeded 15th in the field of 16. He began his ladder to the title match by defeating second-seeded Gerald Bonneau Jr. 459-390 in the scratch tournament. A secondround win over 7th seeded Ceazer Moore 426-395 was followed by by a narrow victory over Danny Chin to move into the winner's bracket semi-final against Derek Murray.

The top-seeded Murray fired a monster 803 scratch series during team competition in the IVUSBC City Open to earn the No. 1 seed. He opened Masters with a 418-390 victory over Enrique Garcia before sending the 8th seeded Belt to the elimination bracket with the highest 2-game score of the tournament, 504-447. A 476-326 win over Nolan Coyne sent Murray into a showdown with Granados, the winner securing a spot in the finals. Granados claimed a 483-443 win and waited to see who his opponent would be.

Belt had to win several eliminations matches to make it to the finals. He began by eliminating Bonneau 462-350 before knocking out 4th seeded James Gray 444-394. The next eliminator game ended in a 428-428 tied with Chin, Belt earning the victory 60-59 in a two-frame roll-off. Belt defeated Garcia and then Murray (450-429) to get in the title match. In the Championship match, Granados rolled a huge 246 game, stringing 6 strikes in a row at one point to take a 42-pin lead into the final game. "I was lucky to get some ball movement on that," Granados admitted. But he knew that was not a comfortable lead against a bowler like Belt. "No, it isn't, not against Gordon," Granados explained. "Because he can turn that around on you and all of a sudden, you're behind".

Belt proved that by roaring back with a 234 game against Granados's 200, but came up 8 pins short. Granados admitted it was a bit stressful at times.

'Oh, you bet", he admitted. "There were a couple of bowlers there that I thought I was in over my head, but I persevered and bowled in my head and said, you can do this."

Granados, an even-tempered El Centro native, was very happy with his first Master's win. "It feels great," Granados reflected. "Because there are a lot of good bowlers ahead

EL CENTRO - Experience prevailed in the Championship match as Patsy Robinson won her second Queens title at the Strikezone Imperial Valley today. The veteran bowler from Brawley defeated first year bowler Connie Arredondo 459-415.

The tournament was sanctioned by the Imperial Valley United States Bowling Congress and open to all Valley USBC members. It was a handicapped-based tournament, meaning that a percentage of pins are added to each bowler's average to even up the competition.

"I'm excited," the new Queen exclaimed after the two-game title match. "I haven't bowled this well in a very long time. I've been

working hard with my coach (Fred Curtis of Leo's Pro Shop) and we've been working on a lot of things."

"Knowing when to move (on the approach)," Robinson explained the key element in her practicing. "So when I start getting shots I don't like, I need to move. And I've always been afraid to move. So, it's making those decisions, knowing when I need a stronger ball, so we've been working on it."

Robinson, who entered the tournament as the 8th seed after the recently completed IVUSBC Women's City Tournament, defeated 9th seeded Maria Grijalva to open play, 482-414. She then knocked out top seeded Tuesday Verbrugh 472-389 and Debbie Angulo 384-322 to set up the title match.

Arredondo, who just started bowling less than 8 months ago, entered as the 3rd seed and beat Megan Robinson 426-372 before setting up a semi-final match with 7th seeded Teri Woodruff. The bowlers finished the two-game match even at 461-461. It set up a roll off, using the 9th and 10th frames to decide a winner. Arredondo eliminated Woodruff 46-40 in the roll off to face Robinson in the title match.

An injury in the third round caused some concern for Robinson, who won the Queens title in 2012. A blister on her thumb developed and needed attention.

"I got the blister halfway through," Robinson shared, "but I covered it up with New-Skin, made it hard, taped it up and said let's bowl."

"Once I started getting into it, I forget about everything. I just bowled."

Arredondo, who increased her ball weight from 10 to 15 pounds recently, has been hobbled by a muscle strain in her throwing arm. But she made no excuses.

"It was only my fourth time using this ball," the runner-up said, adding that the muscle strain didn't bother her at all today.

"She did awesome, she did fantastic," the new champion said of her opponent. "I'm



Roger's breakout effort is not the most notable effort by a sub in this area. That distinction is owned by Anthony Sharpsteen, also known as "Mr. 888." Or as Johnnie Englehart calls Sharpsteen: "Triple 8."

Those nicknames are a tribute to Sharpsteen, who was called to fill in for Mario Fiumara in the Men's Classic League at now-defunct Mission Hills Bowl.

The date was Jan. 25, 2011, and all Sharpsteen did was crush the top series in Los Angeles-area history. The right-hander from the San Fernando Valley finished with scores of 289, 299 and 300 for his 888. Amazingly, it marked Sharpsteen's first 800 series.

Asked last week whether there was less pressure because he was a sub, Sharpsteen said only that he "felt relaxed."

Added Sharpsteen: "I looked at it as extra practice."

To Paskell, being a sub is a no-doubt-about-it score stimulator.

"No one bothers you," said Paskell, smiling. From all accounts, that's a huge help.

He then defeated Greg Ostrander of Brick, N.J., 204-162, in the semifinal match.

Haines, looking for his second career title, qualified sixth. He defeated Michael Ruben of Selden, N.Y., 2-0; Dominick Snyder of Glen Burnie, Md., 2-1, and Carvel Waters of Ft. Washington, Md., 279-176, in his matches leading up to the championship round.

• Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., posted a 12-4 match play record and a 24-game total of 5,730 pins Sunday to win the PBA Earl Anthony West/Northwest Memorial at Earl Anthony's Dublin Bowl in Dublin, Calif., while Craig Miller of Tracy, Calif., won the PBA50 portion of the doubleheader weekend.

Butturff, who won the USBC Masters on April 1 for his first major PBA Tour championship, cruised to his 21st PBA Regional title and the \$2,500 first prize by 121 pins over PJ Haggerty of Roseville, Calif., who had an 10-6 record and a 24-game total of 5,609 pins, including match play bonus pins.

Miller went 12-4 in the 16-game PBA50 match play finals and knocked down 5,307 total pins for his 24 games to top Wayne Garber of Modesto Calif., by 76 pins. Miller collected \$1,500 and his second PBA50 regional title.

• Jason Lundquist of Columbus, Ohio defeated Brandon Novak of Chillicothe, Ohio by 131 pins Sunday to win the Professional Bowlers Association Debbie & Leo Nunan Memorial Central Open presented by Track at AMF Stardust Lanes in Grove City, Ohio.

Lundquist finished with an 9-2-1 match play record and a total of 4,471 pins for 20 games, including match play bonus pins, for his fifth career regional title. He also earned \$2,500.

• Dick Allen of Lexington, S.C., won \$2,500 and his 23rd PBA South Region title Sunday, defeating Colin Champion of Spring Hill, Fla., 213-195, to win the third annual PBA Jac's Lanes Valdosta South Open at Jac's Lanes in Valdosta, Ga. 

Belmonte and Prather Win Round of 16 Matches to Advance to PBA Playoffs Round of 8

Playoffs Round of 16 action continues April 29 at 6 p.m. on FS1



PORTLAND, Maine – In a Round of 16 PBA Playoffs match that featured two of the Go Bowling! PBA Tour's premier two-handers, No. 1 seed Jason Belmonte of Australia beat No. 17 Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, North Carolina, in a Race to Two Points match at Bayside Bowled that aired on FS1 Monday to advance to the Round of 8.

Also advancing to the Round of 8 was No. 9 Kris Prather of Plainfield, Illinois, who won his first PBA Tour title in the Scorpion Championship at World Series of Bowling X, beating two-time tour winner No. 8 Tom Daugherty of Riverview, Florida, 2-0, in the second Round of 16 match.



players split the first two games, a ninth and 10th frame tie-breaker is used to award the deciding point. As the Playoffs reached the Round of 16, the eight winners who advanced from the Round of 24 take on the top eight Playoffs seeds – Belmonte, Jakob Butturff, Norm Duke, Anthony Simonsen, EJ Tackett, Sean Rash, Bill O'Neill and Daugherty – who earned a bye to the Round of 16.

The winner of the Playoffs, which features the top 24 players in competition points after the first 13 Go Bowling! PBA Tour tournaments of the season, will earn a \$100,000 first prize. In front of the raucous Bayside Bowl crowd, Belmonte, who won the PBA World Championship for a record 11th PBA major in February, beat Troup soundly 245-186 in the first game. Troup, a three-time tour winner with two third-place finishes this season, rebounded in the second game after a slow start with a run of six strikes from the fourth to the ninth frame, beating Belmonte 223-217 to force the 9th and 10th frame roll-off. Belmonte won the roll-off 49-40 benefitting from Troup leaving a solid nine pin on his first ball of the 10th. "The crowd is so infectious here if I let them in to my head I'll explode," said Belmonte of the Bayside Bowl fans. "I have to balance the electricity generated from the fans with the focus that's necessary to get the job done.

"Some guys feed on being more animated with the crowd and can get their energy that way," the four-time PBA Player of the Year added. "We all like the energy from the fans, but for me, if I come out of my zone it will be a distraction so I have to stay in a bubble."

Prather beat a struggling Daugherty 222-137 in the first game of the second match and then held off Daugherty, who got back on track in the second game, winning 228-222 to advance to the Round of 8.

"After the first game I obviously knew he (Daugherty) was going to bowl a better game but I felt pretty confident that if I could bowl something in the 220s or 230s I liked my chances," Prather said. "After the first game, I made a good decision by switching to a ball that went further down the lane before it hooked and that enabled me to control the pocket. I didn't want to leave the match in the hands of a roll-off so I was glad I could get it done in the second game."

Round of 16 action continues on FS1 April 29, May 6, and May 13 at 6 p.m., which will determine the top eight for Round of 8 competition May 20 and May 27 that will reduce the field to four survivors who will return to Portland for the semifinal and final rounds June 1-2, with both shows airing live on FOX at 9 a.m..
