Jimmy Schmitzer Bowls 900!!

NORCO, CA - Richard "Jimmy" Schmitzer rolled the second certified 900 series in Citrus Belt history last Friday night. It has been just over ten years since VINCE WOOD bowled his Triperfecta at Pinky's Cadillac Bowl in Moreno Valley.


Schmitzer bowled his historic set at CLASSIC LANES in the Green River League, using his Storm Virtual Gravity Nano. The ball was drilled by former PBA star GIP LENTINE, proprietor of Bowlers Edge Pro Shop. At eighteen years and eight months, I believe Jimmy is the second youngest to score 900. I also think that he is the first two hander to do it.

I spoke to Jimmy's mom and dad (Marti and Jim) yesterday and was told that the road to nine hundred began eleven years ago, at Arlington Lanes in Riverside. Jimmy was seven years old when his parents introduced him to their favorite sport. He bowled with two hands from day one and nothing could persuade him to

use one hand. While he is a natural lefty, Jimmy releases the ball from the right side. While he is a self taught two-hander, Jimmy did work with Gip Lentine on the finer points of the game. Every diamond needs some polish.

This blooming star stands six feet tall and is very graceful on the approach. Probably the smoothest two hander I have observed. He gets low enough at the line to roll a ball as smooth as Josh Blanchard, Kelly Kulick, Dan McClelland or Eddie Van Daniker. All are PBA competitors who roll a bowling ball as if it were gliding silently through the air. While Belmonte and Palerma are power personified, Schmitzer exhibits power but with much more grace. It is exciting to watch him bowl.

Jimmy told me he is headed to the University of Nevada Las Vegas (UNLV) and plans to enroll next January. While he has competed in many youth tournaments over the years, he is proudest of his two gold medals and one sil-

ver medal won at the People to People World Games in Australia, seven years ago. His next goal is to become a member of Team USA.

Jimmy's previous high series was 819 (279-268-272).

He has five certified eight hundreds and eight three hundreds. In practice he has bowled approximately twenty eights and fifty perfect games.

What about pressure when you're on a 900 pace? I know

my hands and legs would be shaking. Not Mister Schmitzer. He said he was calm throughout his three game strike fest. No tenth frame jitters, no nerves, no shakes.

How come? Because of his experience of rolling so many high scores in the past. Also, because of his confidence in himself and his equipment.

Repetition breeds success. The possibility of bowling 900 first entered Jimmy's mind after his second game. The thought that he would actually do it came after the seventh frame of game three. Thirtyone consecutive solid hits that carried convinced him that 900 was inevitable. Jimmy smiled at me when describing the feeling of being focused and mentally locked in. Sport psychologists would say that Jimmy was "in the zone." He saw and heard nothing that distracted him.

He felt as if he was in the eye of a hurricane. While excitement swirled all about him, he was perfectly calm. Not many mortals have been where this young man has.

The three leading votegetters in the Player of the Year race will be announced on Wednesday, May 16, followed by the first-ever live announcement of the winner on PBA's Xtra Frame online bowling channel on Monday, May 28, during the PBA Summer Shootout at 10pin Bowling Lounge in Chicago.

The leading PBA Player of the Year candidates, in alphabetical order are:

• Jason Belmonte, Australia, won three titles including the Elite Players Championship, had seven top-five finishes, finished third in average and second in both points and earnings. Belmonte also finished third in the U.S. Open and Tournament of Champions, fourth in the PBA World Championship and ninth in the USBC Masters.

• Norm Duke, Clermont, Fla., won three titles, including the Dick Weber Playoffs, and had five top-five finishes. The Hall of Famer moved into third place in all-time PBA Tour titles with his 37th career victory. He ranked sixth in average, points and earnings.

● Mike Fagan, Dallas, qualified for TV shows in all four PBA Tour majors. He won the USBC Masters, finished second in the U.S. Open, fourth in the Tournament of Champions and 12th in the PBA World Championship. He also won an international PBA Tour title, the Brunswick Euro Challenge in Paris, France.

Statistically, he was second in average, and third in points and earnings.

• Osku Palermaa, Finland, became the first two-handed player to win a PBA major (PBA World Championship) and he won the Kuwait International Open, the first international title ever awarded under a new agreement between the PBA and the World Tenpin Bowling Association. He had two other top-five finishes, and finished eighth in the U.S. Open and Tournament of Champions. Palermaa was

fifth in points and earnings.

• Sean Rash, Montgomery, Ill., won PBA's signature event, the Tournament of Champions. He led the Tour with eight top-five finishes, including third place in the PBA World Championship, and finished first in average, points and earnings. He also qualified continued on page 8

PINS AND PUNS

...Bowling has been fortunately immune from many natural disasters but recently the Eastern United States had to alter league and tournament activities because earthquakes and a hurricane—all in the same week.

There's an oft told tale about a bowlers in Japan who had a string of strikes and when the final ball was rolled an earthquake hit. All the pins went down but the question remained whether the bowler or the guake caused the final pinfall. Every possible witness had left the building.

...Slow bowling is still a problem in bowling and the pro and high average bowlers take the most time. In most cases they just wait for too many lanes to clear before they bowl.

There have been six game blocks of bowling that took longer than it takes to fly across the country. But don't just blame the higher averagers. Many of the lower averagers are busy chatting or watching TV and must be reminded when it is their turn.

Remember, most of the greatest bowlers took little time once they set themselves for trips to the foul line.

...There once was a bowler who was annoyed because every time he was ready to roll his opponent would suddenly cough loudly. "You cough one more time when I'm about to bowl and I'll punch you out", said the bothered one. There were no more coughs.

At the end of the match the would be puncher presented his foe with a bill for \$50.

"What's that for?" said the startled loser. The winner smiled as he noted, "I cured your cough, didn't I."

...Bowling Halls of Fame, on all levels, are usually criticized of not electing enough persons to their Halls—or too many. What are the extremes in other sports? In women's pro golf in some cases you need 30 titles, while on the flip side the boxing Hall often honors 20 new inductees in a single year.

That's what makes Hall of Fame committees so important, figuring out what is best for our particular Hall. The main attribute should be domination in any sport in the years in which you competed. A talent in one era likely would have been a talent in any era.

... A bad tournament bowler is a person who now carries copies of scoresheets where his money used to be.

...Somewhere along the line every great was an unknown. A win or steady stellar performances make an unknown a known. Future success and recognition depends on future wins. Seldom is there more than a few lucky wins. It is too hard to practice luck.

...Did you ever notice that the bowlers who keep telling other bowlers that it is only a game is always the bowler who is winning.

...A 1914 edition of Spalding's "How To Bowl" advised women bowlers, "A woman should dress properly. A short walking skirt, shirt waist and low heeled shoes make an excellent combination. Every garment should fit loosely, and allow freedom of action to the muscles." That was good advice nearly 100 years ago—and still is.

...I repeat, how many bowlers who kick the rack, would kick the rack if the rack could kick back? And I wonder what the bowler who kicks the ball return would do if the bowling center owner kicked the bowler's car?

SCOTT PIPHER Can Imagine 900

by Frank Weiler MURRIETA -Scott Pipher tells me that the lanes at BRUNSWICK CAL OAKS BOWL are perfect. I can't argue with him after he bowled 837 (300 - 258 - 279), for a season high series in the 600 Scratch Trios, the other night.

Pipher's big score included thirty-two strikes and four single pin spares. As JOHN LENNON once said: "IMAGINE." Just imagine if Scott carried those four solid ten pins. Guys and gals, can you imagine 900?

Scott is averaging 214 on Monday nights and is consistently putting up some big numbers. He has three 800s to his credit and more than ten perfect games. Scott has one more bowling goal in mind, making that imaginary 900 a reality. Watching him bowl makes me think he can do it. I say this because Scott has a high powered game.

High powered, high octane or whatever. Just say that Pipher loves firing bullets from the corner. He generates speed with a quick back swing, usually placing the ball on the lane at eighteen miles per hour. Sometimes he lofts the ball and sometimes he doesn't. The oil pattern dictates his game plan. I mean "LANE PLAN." I plan to be the first to tell the world when Scott scores 900. When Manager VICKY INGERTSON heard what Scott had to say about the lanes at Cal Oaks, she told me that Cal Oaks is striving to keep their bowlers happy. Her goal is to have a challenging oil pattern, but one that is fair and consistent. She wants her bowlers to know what to expect. Thank you Vicky for looking out for your bowlers and the BOWLING NEWS for tracking their progress.

MDB League originally began as Motor City Deaf Bowling League in 1937 bowling in the old Detroit Recreation Building which has bowling alleys on the 2nd and 3rd floors. It was located near downtown Detroit. When its club Motor City Association of the Deaf folded up in 1980, the bowlers moved to Michigan Deaf League.

Prior to moving to California in in fall of 1949, I was the Motor City League Secretary for two years. Lombardi was in his late teens when I asked him to join the league in 1946.

Incidentally Lombardi wrote that he had a 1946-47 picture of all 40 bowlers in the Motor City League and sadly 35 of the 40 had deceased, leaving 5 of us with me in California and Geno Zeni in Florida

In researching Lombardi asked me if Motor City League was one of oldest deaf league in US. Nope the other deaf club in Detroit, Detroit Association of the Deaf had a league before Motor City. The DAD League lasted until 12 years ago when its long time secretary treasurer Harvey Ellerhorst passed away. No one took his place so the DAD bowlers moved to Michigan Deaf League. There were deaf leagues in US and in the world as far back as 1933.

Lombardi, himself made a name for himself improved as a deaf bowler. He was one of the five deaf bowlers team sponsored by Bill Tucker Pro Shop bowling in a Detroit Major League. The others were Pete Kaczmaryck, Jim Theyken (San Diego), Gerald Balkely and Nino Genna.. Lombardi along with Kaczmaryck and Balkely joined PBA but Lombardi quit after a year trying followed by Balkely little later. Kaczmaryck stayed longer and Theyken joined PBA to bowl in Seniors. A sore wrist forced Lombardi to quit bowling a couple years ago.



Manny Natividad 1st ABTA Victory Kong & Moore Share Match Series of \$370

LAKEWOOD — We returned to popular Covina Bowl where we saw 216 entries come out on Saturday and bowl on a fairly tough shot.

The cut scores on Saturday night were + 50 for the men and +31 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were D.A. Wright (45), Pablo Castro (41), and for the women it was Bobbie McCollum (-3). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 52 bowlers making it to the semi-finals, with 50 bowling.

Tourney high qualifier for the Men was Tomas Chavez with a +164. For the women it was Kristine Soliman with a +99. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Our top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$370. Tomas drew a 519. We had two bowlers that bowled this score during the qualifying squads. They were Mike Moore and Michael Kong. They will share the \$370, with each getting \$185. We will estimate the Match Series at \$450 at Cal Bowl event, that is two weeks in a row that the Match Series was hit. The finalist for the 3-6-9 roll off was Je Je Gabriel. When he came up to shoot for the \$1,200 he missed on his first shot, so he will get \$50 as a consolation. The pot will be \$1,300 at Cal

In our optional doubles, finishing first were John Licauco and Thomas Licauco (father and son combo) with a 1409 for \$130. Finishing second was Ted Villaroman and John Licauco with 1380 for \$110. There was a total of \$1,290 paid out in doubles and 23 paid spots with low to cash

After bowling the three game semi-finals, leading was Manny Natividad with a +146. Finishing in 2nd was Ben Bagaoisan at a +124. He will sit out the first round. Our top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$2,515. Manny Natividad drew a 289. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had no bowler who shot that score, so the full amount will carry over to next event at Cal Bowl. We will have a \$3,500 Pot for Cal Bowl.

It took Men +55 and +47 for the three guaranteed women to make the top 16. This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Billy Chao, Ryan Nam, Marvin Galsim Sr, Kristine Soliman, Mikko Miller, Teddy Villaroman, and Jimmy Wong. They received checks of \$100 each. In the second round, the losers were Vuong Do, Galdino Chavez, Victor Arteaga, and Reno Pignootti. They get received checks of \$107.50 each. This would get us to the final five bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$54 (Ben Bagaoisan) to a high of \$103 (Catherine Cheung) depending on who would win. In this round we saw Catherine Cheung (16th seed) bowling Wai (Roy) Li (8th seed). We saw an exciting match between two fine bowlers. In this match it was Roy who had the hot hand and continued his march with a 274 to 219 finish to advance to the 4th round of match play. In the other match we saw Sonia Coronado (6th seed) bowling Ben Bagaoisan (2nd seed). In this match, it was the lady, who made the statement and continued her hot bowling with a 230 to 186 finish to advance to the next round. Both Ben and Catherine finished in 4th and 5th getting checks for

\$115 each. Our semi-final match was all set, and would pit the 6th and 8th seeds from the semis against each other. In the weekly "horses" we would see Roy paying \$57 and Sonia paying \$93 if they would win their match. In this match we saw Roy continue his hot bowling and Sonia have a little bit of nerves and leave some early opens that put her behind big after 4 frames. That would be enough for Roy as he stayed clean to finish with a 198/252 to 137/2184 and advance to the title match. Finishing in 3rd place was Sonia Coronado this week for \$200. For those lucky "investors" that had Roy as a horse, he paid \$57.

The title game was set and it would be Wai (Roy) Li vs top qualifier Manny Natividad. Manny elected to start the match first. Manny would start off with a mark. That brought Roy up, he would get a strike but open in the 2nd frame. Manny got marks in the 2nd and 3rd frames, and at this point took a 2 pin lead. Roy came up and got a mark in the 3rd frame but opened again in the 4th frame. Manny was able to mark again in both the 4th and 5th frames to take a 18 pin lead. When Roy came up again, he continued to get a mark on the right lane, but would miss again on the left lane to give him 70 after six frames. Manny was able to mark in the 6th and 7th frames, thus had a 31 pin lead and would not look back. At this point he would go on to finish with a 181/219 to 131/185, and his 1st ABTA championship. He would take home \$1,000 1st place and \$850 in Cash and Carry, for a total of \$1,850. Finishing in 2nd place for \$500 was Wai (Roy) Li, a past champion at Oak Tree Lanes.





for a record five consecutive TV finals during the World Series of Bowling.

• Pete Weber, St. Ann, Mo., won the U.S. Open, the 36th title of his career, as he became the first player ever to win that prestigious title five times. The Hall of Famer, who has never won Player of the Year honors, also had two other top-five finishes including fifth in the PBA World Championship while finishing 12th in average, and fourth in both points and earnings.

Also on the Player of the Year ballot, based upon a top-10 finish in either competition points or earnings, are Chris Barnes, Ryan Ciminelli, Andres Gomez, Bill O'Neill and Ryan Shafer. A detailed breakdown of the Player of the Year candidates' stats is available by clicking the link in the Player of the Year story currently featured on the pba.com homepage.

The PBA has also announced six players will be considered in voting for PBA Harry Golden Rookie of the Year with Arizona's Josh Blanchard the clear-cut favorite based on his 10 cashes, five match play finals and one television appearance in 13 events. Five players will be considered by their PBA peers for the annual Steve Nagy Sportsmanship Award.

Rookie of the Year candidates, in addition to Blanchard, are: Dennis Eklund, Sweden; Antonio Medina, Louisville, Ky.; Ron Mohr, Eagle River, Alaska; Jake Peters, Decatur, Ill.; and Kyle Troup, Taylorsville, N.C.

Nagy candidates are Jack Jurek, Lackawanna, N.Y.; Martin Larsen, Sweden; Tom Hess, Urbandale, Iowa; Kelly Kulick, Union, N.J., and Scott Norton, Costa Mesa, Calif. Jurek is a two-time Nagy winner. Kulick is the first woman ever nominated for the award.

PBA Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year are selected by the entire PBA membership plus a panel of veteran bowling writers. The Nagy Award is voted on by players who bowled at least half of the PBA Tour events during the past season. Ballots, full statistical data and voting instructions will be available to PBA members on the members-only section of PBA.com beginning April 25. Hard copy ballots will be mailed to bowling writers. The deadline for voting will be May 15.
